## Board Bans Sirens, Lights in Private Vehicles

U.S. Congressman Travis Childers visits Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors

At it's meeting Monday, the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors passed an ordinance banning sirens or top-mounted lights on private vehicles in the county.

Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, who was asked for comment at the meeting said that he supports the ban, and that none of his deputies had sirens in their private vehicles.

"It's good, because the public may disregard the urgency of real sirens if there are too many," said Whitlock.

As a point of interest he said that the only legal emergency signal is a siren - not lights of any color.

The board voted to have the Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum reimburse the county \$38,000 for some renovations done at the Old Courthouse that were done outside the authorized change order process. The county paid the contractor, Johnny Harber Construction, already, but needs the money put back in

the fund, the board explained. The reimbursement will be over four years and will be subtracted from their annual allocation from the county for operations. The \$9,500 each year will represent about a fourth of the Museum's annual allocation.

The board voted to keep the allocation of \$50,000 for the college tuition assistance program that began with this year's college freshmen. Board President James McDowell (5th), said that was the same allotment for the program as last year, and they had a little left over. This year they anticipate more people utilizing the fund, since this year's freshmen will be sophomores.

The board authorized payment of \$975 for rewiring of the tax collector's office, which is being fitted with a new computer system, mandated by the state, McDowell said. The state is providing all the computers and printers for the system.

The grand jury report was accepted into the record. They met September 13 through 16th and

the 19th, and returned 73 true bills and met with 19 witnesses, it said, as read by McDowell. On their assessment of the county courthouse and the jail, they made several recommendations, including replacement of all the ceiling tiles in the court house. They also made several observations about the jail's general need of repair. Whitlock pointed out that the inmates questioned may have higher expectations of the jail than are realistic of a correction facility.

The board approved a pay request by Mike Nelson Construction on work done so far at the Dennen Steel site.

At the end of the morning session, the board enjoyed a visit from U.S. Congressman Travis Childers, who discussed several national issues with the board, including how the new medical insurance laws would affect small businesses.

The board accepted a single bid, of \$612,000, from Master Craft Builders, on the replacement of the roof on a county building occupied by International Con-

Another potential candidate, Stevie Johnson, was denied qualification, based on residency issues, according to the clerk.

The election will be the first held at the new Burnsville city hall, at 38 Gross Avenue. The voting poll will be open on Saturday, October 16th from 8 a.m. until 12 noon for voters needing to vote absentee.

## Sheriff's Department & Special Task Force Round Up 25 Monday

Monday was a busy day for area law enforcement as they rounded up some of the numerous drug cases indicted by the grand jury.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department worked with county police departments, agents of the North Mississippi Narcotics Unit, and Prentiss and Alcorn counties to find and arrest at least 25 people indicted on drug charges during the September grand jury session.

On October 1st, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department joined with the North Mississippi Narcotic Unit. The NMNU will provide surveillance equipment, buy money, crime lab fees and investigative services to the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department. Several of the other local agencies are also part of the unit.

# Several Tishomingo Countians Minister to People in Haiti

Several people from Iuka and Tishomingo recently completed a medical mission trip to Haiti, where they ministered to the spiritual and physical health of Haitians, who are still living in desperate conditions after a January earthquake that devastated the already impoverished country.

Nurse Practitioner Teresa South, and Sharon Stegall went from Iuka Baptist, and Tishomingo Baptist had four people attend: Amelia and Charles Higginbottom, Bobby Scott and Regina Stanphill. The team leader was Gail Denton, and several others from the Northeast Mississippi area also went, including pharmacists and doctors.

The team was affiliated through Global Outreach Ministries, and in Haiti, they worked alongside other well-known mission groups such as The Samaritans Purse and Billy Graham Response Team. These teams stayed with missionaries David and Judy Heady on a 68-acre compound.

Four of the fourteen members who traveled to Haiti last week on a medical mission's trip recently presented a picture slide show and spoke of their experiences to the Tishomingo Baptist congregation.

Amelia Higginbottom,

a nurse practitioner, worked in a medical clinic directly with a Haitian doctor. She said that they were able to assist 1,419 patients with various sicknesses. Many forms of sickness were treated, including fever and various insect bites Haitians face. Malaria is one of the most common health problems. Amelia said that the most exciting part of her trip was that she was able to pray with the patients. There were 100 professions of faith made during her stay, she said.

It was the first mission trip for Regina Stanphill, a nurse who has worked with Magnolia Regional Health Center and local hospice agencies. Working as a float nurse in the mission clinics, she was just overwhelmed by the poverty level and the fact that nearly 80 percent of the 11 million people living in Haiti are uneducated. She also said that the majority of the people practice voodoo as their religion. Regina explained that while she didn't know their native language, French Creole, she was able to effectively

communicate with her patients using sign language to help properly diagnose each patient's health issue.

Team members Bobby Scott and Charles Higginbottom also assisted in the clinics. They said that the extent of the destruction caused by the 23-second earthquake was completely overwhelming. Bobby described how he saw people removing the earthquake debris using only their bare hands and wheelbarrows, and that 400,000 who lost their homes were living in tents scattered about the countryside. Charles spoke of his bewilderment of how they buried the 200,000 Haitians who lost their lives. He described how they took a bulldozer and dug a massive

grave and dumped the bodies into this mass grave.

Sharon Stegall, of Iuka, said that she worked in the pharmacy areas of the clinics some, but her favorite part was working with children who came into the clinics with their parents, or to be treated themselves. The team carried hundreds of toys, like dolls, jump ropes, necklaces with crosses, and crayons and coloring sheets that the children enjoyed. Sharon said she taught some to jump rope, and that was soon a favorite with them all.

As the team concluded, they shared their desire to return to Haiti and they urged others to consider for the future in helping the country of Haiti by going

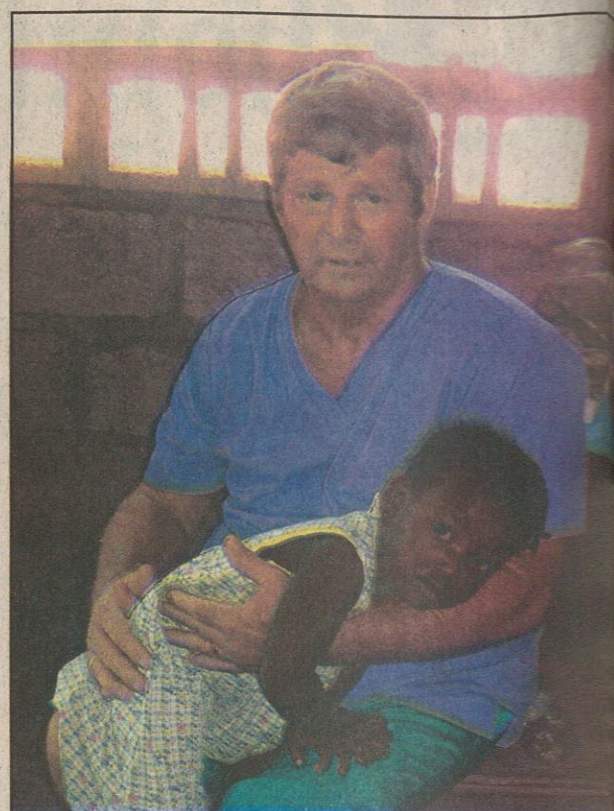


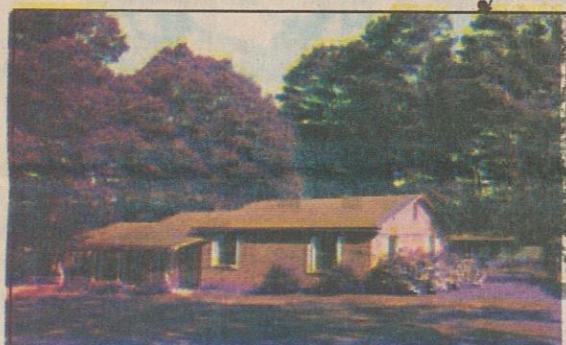

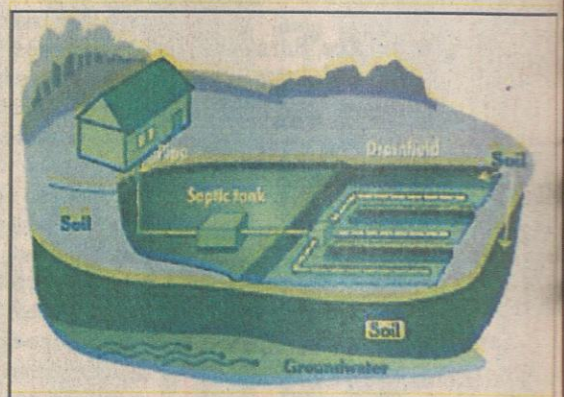
## Which watershed do you live in?

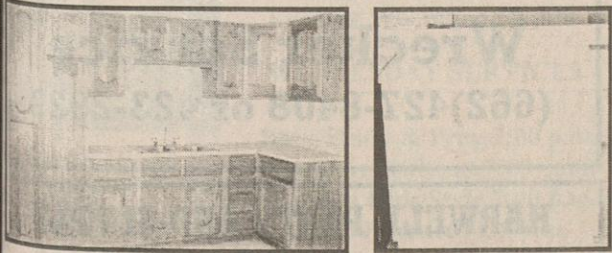
### Breast Cancer Awareness Month

A survey within Tishomingo County found the following statistics: 52% of the individuals surveyed reported possessing the knowledge to adequately administer a self breast exam; only 34% suggested that they do so on a monthly basis; 45% of the individuals surveyed reported that they have had at least one mammogram with 27% reporting yearly mammograms; 59% reported that "no money" is the primary reason individuals do not get mammograms; 47% reported fear of result for not getting a mammogram; 39% reported concerns such as "not believing it is important to see a doctor," 36% reported "being too busy" for a mammogram and/or "not realizing the importance" of a mammogram; 19% reported transportation issues. These are all significant reasons for individuals not taking precaution in regards to preventative measures. The statistics are clear—breast cancer is the second leading killer of women around the globe.

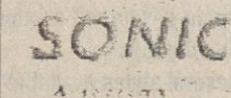

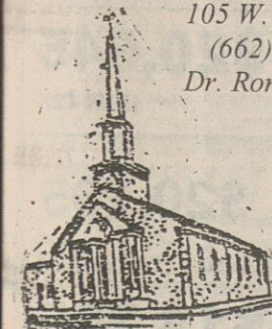
