### Several Injured in Burnsville Wreck Monday

One person was airlifted from the scene of a two-car collision on Highway 72 in Burnsville Monday morning, and others were transported by ambulance from the scene.

According to reports, a wrecker truck driven by a man from

Selmer, Tennessee, with one passenger, was traveling east on Highway 72, when a black Mitsubishi attempted to (possibly) turn east from Fulton Street onto 72. He was unable to avoid hitting the car, and the wrecker truck flipped several times, said eyewitnesses.

The passenger from the wreck-

er was airlifted from the field next to the Chamber of Commerce. Some of the people from the car, which had a Prentiss County tag, were transported from the scene by ambulance. Some children were involved, and at least one bystander said they appeared unhurt right after the wreck.

### Belmont Teen Killed in Wreck Friday

The Belmont community is grieving after the tragic death of 16-year-old Laken Young, following a one-car accident Friday night.

Laken Young was riding as a passenger in a 2003 Nissan driven by Zachery Woods, along Ridge Road in Itawamba County, when the single vehicle accident occurred. Woods had reportedly swerved to avoid a deer in the road.

Laken was airlifted to North Mississippi Medical Center with multiple injuries. She was pronounced dead Sunday.

Woods received lacerations but was not admitted to the hospital at that time.

Extra counselors were available to Belmont students on Monday, and will be again on Thursday, to help cope with the loss of Miss Young, said administrators. The mood Tuesday was very subdued, and students were honoring her memory with messages at a

display on her locker.

Zac's locker was also receiving encouraging notes from fellow students.

"This is so hard on everyone who knew her, and even more difficult for everyone involved," said administrators.

Students and faculty who attended the funeral on Wednesday were excused from afternoon classes at school.

### County Busts 2 Meth Labs; 4 Arrested

Four people face meth-related charges after the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department busted two meth labs October 27th.

According to a release from Tishomingo County Narcotics Officer Jeff Palmer, Jason White and Layla Hagelston were arrested at residence at 411 County Road 246 in Iuka, where officers found methamphetamine production equipment, commonly referred to as "a lab."

White has been charged with possession of 2 or more pre-cursors with the intent to manufacture methamphetamine, possession of methamphetamine, and conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine.

Also arrested at the same residence was Layla Hagelston. She has been charged with conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine.

The same night, deputies searched the residence of Pamela Sanders at 181 County Road 246 in

the Snowdown community. Sanders has been charged with possession of two or more pre-cursors with intent to manufacture methamphetamine and conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine.

Michael Johnson, 26, was charged identically at the same address, said Palmer.

The North Mississippi Narcotics Unit assisted in the investigation and seized a 2005 Honda CLX car.

### Voters Should Be Wary of National Committee's Involvement in District One Race

It goes without saying that during this time of year, political campaigns occupy more and more of the advertising blocks on our local network affiliates. It would be foolish to think that we could escape election season while only enduring sporadic 30 to 60 second segments of candidates touting their positions and how their education, experience, and values make them uniquely qualified to represent our interests at the national level. Sadly, this is the exception rather than the rule – especially when national campaign committees become involved, such as they are in our First Congressional District race between Travis Childers and Alan Nunnelee. These campaigns are apparently both geared toward tearing the opponent down, rather than building

their respective campaigns up – political mudslinging. And, while most of us have become desensitized to the unpleasantness of all the election season vitriol, many of us may be missing the point and making assumptions based on mischaracterizations and even flat out lies propagated by the candidate's national campaign committees. The best example is the Democratic National Campaign Committee's (DNCC) mischaracterization of the fair tax.

In multiple television spots, the DNCC asserts that Alan Nunnelee supports raising our taxes, citing the Fair Tax Act. Viewers may view the advertisement and come away with only "Alan Nunnelee wants to raise my taxes". However, use of the Fair Tax Act as a citation or supporting information is unacceptable. A prime example from a Childers' campaign ad appearing earlier in the month which portrays Nunnelee as supporting a 23% national consumption tax and uses the Columbus, Mississippi Commercial Dispatch as the source. This is misleading on two levels.

Firstly, and most importantly, the fair tax, as originally introduced in 1999

(and subsequently in every session of Congress) by Representative John Linder of Georgia, would effectively abolish our current federal income tax system. In the simplest terms, the fair tax would not be a tax in addition to what we currently pay – the fair tax would replace: payroll taxes, social security taxes, medicare taxes, capital gains taxes, estate taxes, corporate income taxes, and the alternative minimum tax. The fair tax should not be confused with the European model of the value added tax (VAT) or the flat tax. It is a unique and revenue neutral alternative to the confusing and punitive tax code that we have now. I would encourage all taxpayers to familiarize themselves with the fair tax. If you're interested in taking more of your 'take home pay' home, and you're interested in making April 15th just another day on the calendar – check out [www.fairtax.org](http://www.fairtax.org), or look for the books, jointly authored by the sponsor, Representative John Linder.

Secondly, the citation from the Commercial Dispatch came from an anonymous commenter to a story on their website about Childers visiting a local Lowndes County business. The article had absolutely nothing to do with the fair tax – yet the DNCC chose to use this anonymous comment from the Commercial Dispatch as the basis for their assertion that Alan Nunnelee supports their mischaracterization of the fair tax. In a subsequent article, the Dispatch had to refute the citation of the DNCC advertisement stating the need to "...call out the Childers campaign for the misleading attribution."

Does Alan Nunnelee support the fair tax? I haven't been able to find any information to indicate that he does or does not. Calls and emails to his campaign office have not been returned. However, that's not really the point. The moral of this story is voter awareness. If the DNCC will cite anonymous comments to a website and flagrantly mischaracterize the fair tax – what will any campaign do, from any political party?

I encourage all voters of the First Congressional District to learn more about the candidates and exercise your responsibility to vote with a better understanding of the candidates than you will receive from a 60 second television advertisement.

## Foot Washin' and Other Paden Entertainment

A couple of Sundays ago, our new preacher at the Methodist Church mentioned something about "foot washin'". He wasn't trying to schedule an event and I don't believe he ever had that particular sacrament since I've been a member. I do come from a long line of Primitive Baptists, so if it had occurred, it wouldn't have bothered me.

My great-great granddaddy, Jim Shackelford, was a Primitive Baptist preacher and so was his daddy. Grandpa Jim had eleven children and to my knowledge, none of them followed him into the ministry. The boys, in fact, seemed to go in the very opposite direction, at least the ones I knew. They were all very pleasant, lovable people. My two favorites were Sid and Stanley. I don't know where they fell in the order of age, but they were very close age-wise and, as all the others, they were required to attend each and every service, including foot washin'.

On this particular Sunday at the church there in Paden, they knew it was foot washin' Sunday, and earlier that morning, they had taken soot from the fireplace and put it in both of Grandpa Jim's shoes. At the end of the sermon, he pulled a chair up beside the podium and sat down to begin the foot washin' portion of the service, with the help of his deacons. He took off the high-top black shoes that he wore every Sunday and the first of his two black socks to reveal an equally black foot. A hush fell over the congregation. This was a man who took great pride in the dignity of his service and the sacraments of the Church. Uncle Stanley said, "he didn't say a word, he just looked straight at us".

That was not the only

time those two boys had rebelled at this required church attendance. My favorite story is the Sunday they shaved the back of their heads. I'm not sure how old they were, but these were pretty good sized teenage boys; and, as usual, they were required to sit on the front row. This particular Sunday, they waited until the congregation was fairly well settled and started walking down the aisle. Earlier that morning, they had taken the straight razor and shaved out a round spot on the back of each of their heads about the size of a saucer. They walked in, as usual, sat down, as usual and picked up the hymn books. At first, there was just a little muffled chuckling in the back, then one had to leave, then another and finally, whole rows were getting up to walk out. They couldn't contain themselves anymore. It broke up the service. When I was a young man attending church here in Booneville, we never had that much

fun.

These two boys, with the other four, eventually grew into manly, respectable citizens. I'm not sure how many of them were in the Army, but I know Uncle Sid Shackelford was, and on a particular Sunday around 10 o'clock, he arrived in Paducah by train for a week's furlough from the Army. This is in the days when train stopped everywhere. Burnsville, Paden, Tishomingo, Red Bay, you name it. If there was a wide spot on the track, they would stop. On this particular morning when Uncle Sid got off the train, he knew where the family was; and in the middle of his condition, (he was drunk), he headed down the church service. He had just settled in, when he slammed open the door and announced his arrival. Uncle Jim pointed to two of his deacons and said, "Take him to Tishomingo and put him on the train". They did, and his week-long furlough lasted about 15 minutes when we missed some transportation.

There wasn't a lot of entertainment at Paducah in those days, except homemade entertainment, and I think the Shackelford boys were probably good at it.

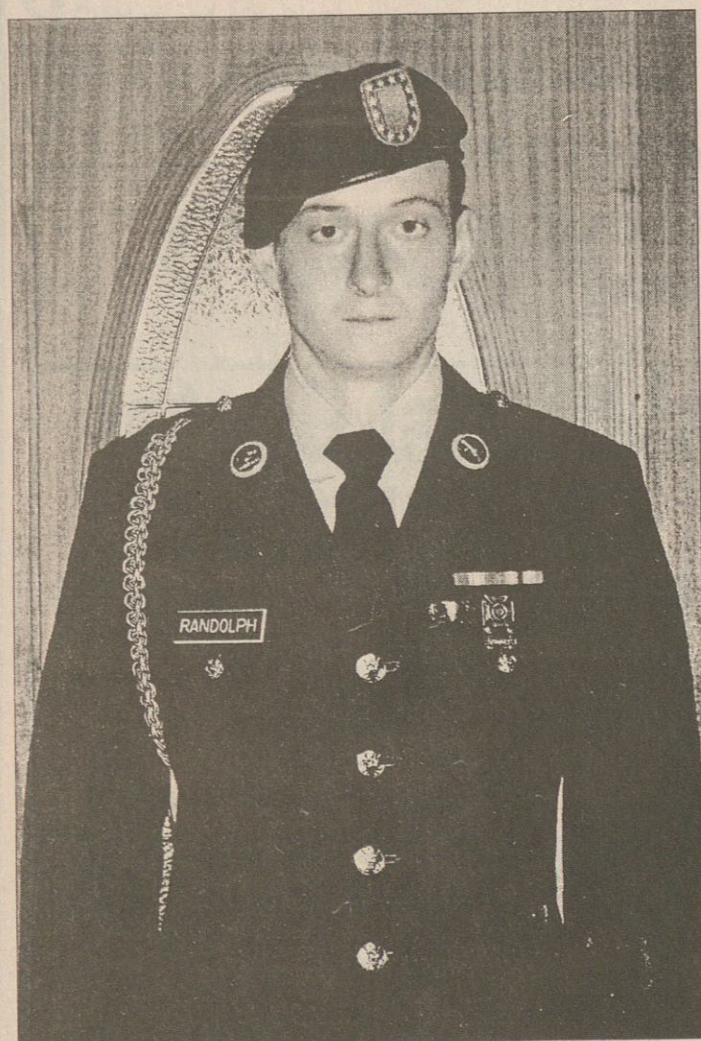

## Locals Assist Montana Couple With Research

Dianne Watson Armstrong and her husband, Ron, from Helena, Montana, visited Tishomingo County on October 16<sup>th</sup>, 2010, with the intention of locating the burial grounds of some of her family ancestors. The Armstrong's and their friend, Lynn Tamms, of Oshkosh, Wis., have been planning their trip to Tishomingo County for quite some time. Society member, Janice Switcher, who has been assisting Armstrong with her research online for several months, met the group in Tishomingo County to assist them with their visit.


After visiting Oak Grove Cemetery, where they were assisted by Tishomingo County Archives & History Museum Director, Jan Anglin, they were treated to a tour of the old Tishomingo County Courthouse. The group then met up with Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society President, Cindy Nelson, who carried them to meet Mr. James Stacy Cox. Mr. Cox led them to the isolated grave of Mrs. Armstrong's 3<sup>rd</sup> great-grandfather, Matthew Watson, which is located on privately owned property. Unfortunately, the grave

stone had been destroyed by recent harvesting activity, and only four pieces of the marker were found, none of which identified the grave. The day ended with a visit to the grave of her 3<sup>rd</sup> great-grandmother, Elander Watson, who is buried in the Rutledge Salem Cemetery. The Watsons brought their surname to this country from Ireland about 1803. As one of the last living members of the Watson family on her line, it had been a dream of Dianne's to see Matthews land where it all started to find his grave. Although the Tishomingo County Archives & History

Museum was closed at the time of their arrival on Saturday, given the long way they traveled, not only did the Society open up the building for her, but they went along with her to find the graves. Dianne was very impressed with all the records available in the museum's John Marshall Stone Research Library and is already planning to come back and spend more time as soon as she can. She brought pictures and other genealogical information to leave, became a member of the organization, and provided GPS readings to her ancestor's graves.

## Old Tishomingo Traces By June Bullard

One of the biggest men who I ever saw as a child was my father Olen Bullard's first cousin, John Curtis. I guess he looked bigger than he really was because my father was only 5'6". John was the second son of William M. and Emma (Bullard) Curtis. His siblings were: William, who died young; Tom, who married Lena White; Georgeanne married Mansel Mosley; Rebecca married Milligan; Fannie married George W. Tigner; Marshall married Minnie Means; Joe married Minnie's sister Alice Means; and Luther married their other sister Nettie.

John was born and raised in the North Crossroads at the south of Yellow Creek. The Curtis Family was a large family but they all worked hard and prospered. They were friendly and outgoing and loved to get together for fish fries, picnics and camping. John must have been very happy home because he stayed with his parents and looked after them until they died. He didn't marry until he was just past fifty; then he married a young 18-year-old lady by the name of Ethel Lamb. John and Ethel were the proud parents of four children: Berlin, Elton (Sis), Odie and Pete.

Jim Young, one of the Curtis grandchildren, told me he was at his grandpa's home day when John's brother-in-law Man Mosley came for a visit. John and Man started telling tales of their younger days as old men tend to do. Man said that one of the favorite pastimes for young men of the Crossroads area was to meet somewhere, usually in the woods, so as not to arm their mothers, and

wrestle. He said John was the top heavy-weight wrestler and nobody could best him, but he, Man, was the best light-weight.

As I said, John was a very friendly person and loved meeting people. One day, he saw this couple camping near his home, so he goes over to meet them. It turns out they were very famous people, at least to country music lovers. It was Curly Fox and his wife Texas Ruby. They were noted nation-wide back in the thirties and forties because they were regulars on the Louisiana Hayride and Grand Ole Opry; two country music shows that

old-times had their radios tuned to on Friday and Saturday nights. John invited them to his home and they put on a show for his friends and neighbors around Crossroads. Every time they were in the area, they would always go by to see John.

John lived a happy life in the North Crossroads section of Tishomingo County and died at the ripe old age of 90 and is buried by his wife Ethel at Hubbard-Salem. The picture shows John Curtis and his friend Estes Gardner in their younger days.

## Hiking for a Cause Through Tishomingo County

A man who hopes to be the first to hike the Natchez Trace Parkway from end to end was in Tishomingo County this week, enjoying some hill country hospitality, and letting his feet get healthy.

John Robb, 51, is a former Wall Street trader from Dallas who started hiking in 2007 as an outlet for his Type-A, competitive nature, he explained in an interview Tuesday.

The Trace hike is the second leg of his goal to hike all eleven National Scenic Trails, raising money for charities along the way. The ambitious agenda will take him to several states and all over the country to eleven hiking or driving trails designated by Congress as particularly scenic, including: the Appalachian Trail, Continental Divide Trail, Florida Trail, Ice Age Trail, Natchez Trace Trail, North Country Trail, Pacific Crest Trail, and Potomac Heritage Trail.

"There were eight when I started," he says in his website ([www.trekkingforacause.com](http://www.trekkingforacause.com)). "But the current administration designated three more in 2009." New England Trail, Pacific Northwest Trail, and Arizona Trail added 2,227 miles to his goal.

He started hiking the 444-mile-long Natchez Trace October 15th to raise funds for Be An Angel, an organization whose mission is to improve the quality of life for children with multiple disabilities or profound deafness ([www.beanangel.org](http://www.beanangel.org)).

In 2008, Robb hiked the Appalachian Trail, all 2,179 miles of it, and raised \$27,000 for Gilda's Club, an organization that helps people and families dealing with cancer. He did it to honor a friend who was suffering from brain cancer.

He's hiked an average of 16 miles a day, this trip, with a pack that holds everything he needs - tent, food, water, supplies. He pays all his own expenses, and people who meet him along the way, or hear of his hikes can donate directly to the charity, sponsoring him by the mile, or

with a one-time donation.

"It goes directly to the charity, I never touch it," he explained. Donors contact the charity directly; his contacts back home are notified, and they let John know that people are supporting his trek. He sends a "thank you" to each of them when he hears: an emailed or texted message with a photo of him on the trail, holding a "Thank You" sign.

He said hiking taught him, "You have to be adaptable."

"Something always goes wrong that you didn't plan for," he explained.

On the Appalachian Trail, Robb had the benefit of other hikers on the trail, to help in case of trouble. Lots of people hike parts of the AT throughout the year - but the Trace, well, there are many bicyclists, but the Natchez Trace Parkway authorities said they have never heard of anyone hiking the length of the Trace.

And trouble is a real possibility - Robb is a diabetic, so when his feet became blistered just a few days into his hike, he was in trouble. Bursting blisters is not recommended for people with diabetes, so he had to find a place to rest.

Enter local businessman L. O. Bishop. He met Robb while visiting Tom Hendrix's Wichahpi Commorative Stone Wall near Florence, just off the Trace. Robb was resting, due to the blisters, and needed a place to stay and recuperate, but he was many miles from home and help, and hiking solo.

Bishop heard his story, and invited Robb to stay with him a few days at his hunting house. No doubt he enjoyed meeting members of the 9:30 Coffee Club, with whom L.O. socializes on many a morning in downtown Iuka. And surely he enjoyed some fine Maud, Alabama (nearly Tishomingo County) hospitality, and some Bishop's barbecue, as well.

Robb intends to get back on the trail Wednesday morning.
