TCHS Coach Carter Resigns

Tishomingo County's head football coach has announced he is resigning after four seasons.

Steve Carter has not turned in his letter of resignation, said TCHS Principal Eddie Britton, but he has spoken to him about it and expects him to submit it in writing in a timely manner.

Reportedly, Carter told the football players after last week's game against New Albany.

Carter will be stepping down with a 14-29 overall record and two playoff appearances.

Under Carter's guidance, the Braves' best season was in 2007 when they went 6-5 and lost to Marksdale in the first round of the playoffs.

Iuka Soccer Closing Day Saturday

After ten weeks of youth soccer action, the players, parents and officials of the Iuka Youth Soccer League are closing another successful season this Saturday.

Beginning at 9 a.m., closing ceremonies will include awarding of trophies to teams in the top three age categories, and the annual league officer election.

The election is significant this year, because Scott Woodruff, president, and his wife, Beth Woodruff, who is treasurer, are stepping down after several years of excellent leadership, and hundreds of hours of personal and family time invested in the league.

"It's just time," said Scott Monday night. "We need a break, and it allows someone else to help out."

Under the current board's leadership, the league has built a new concession stand, improved the restrooms, and many, many improvements have been made to the fields.

Nominations will be entered, and voted upon at the Saturday event by league parents.

Nunnelee Rides Anti-Incumbent, Anti-House Leadership Wave into Congress

Allred Upsets Incumbent Whirley for Second District's School Board Position

Anti-incumbent.

That turned out to be the theme nationwide for the November 2nd election, and candidates at every level sailed into office Tuesday night on a powerful anti-incumbent wave.

Voters across the nation, dissatisfied with the current congress and presidential administration's health care reform efforts and lack of progress in economic recovery sent Washington a powerful message with Tuesday's general election vote.

Local Results

Locally, in Tishomingo County, the second district chose challenger Jeff Allred over school board incumbent Anthony Whirley. Allred received 565 votes (53 percent) of the vote to Whirley's 522 (48 percent).

In the First District Congressional race, incumbent Travis Childers was unable to keep hold of the seat he won just two years ago. Republican challenger, State Senator Alan Nunnelee, managed to nationalize the race, and make it a referendum on the unpopu-

lar Democratic House leadership. He won with 55 percent of the vote, to Childers' 41 percent district-wide.

Locally, about 43 percent of Tishomingo County's registered voters came out, and 61 percent of them (3,254 votes) voted for Nunnelee. Childers received 1,879 votes, or 35.5 percent of the votes.

Nunnelee's win returns the

First District seat to the Republicans, who had the seat for many years before Childers' won it two years ago.

In the only contested judicial election for Tishomingo Countians, Paul S. Funderburk did manage to easily keep his Circuit Court judicial seat against challenger Frank Liebling. In the District 1 Circuit Court, Place 2 contest, Funderburk prevailed with nearly 77 percent of the vote to challenger Liebling's 23 percent.

Courthouse Museum at Risk of Closing

The board of directors of the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse Museum is making some hard decisions to try and keep the facility, and the historical items within, available to the public.

Since the Tishomingo County Historical and Genealogical Society (TCHGS) became stewards of the Old Courthouse on Quitman Street in Iuka in 2004, a steadily growing collection of historical artifacts, fascinating exhibits and an excellent archive of historical and genealogical records have become available to not only Tishomingo County residents, but also people from, literally, all over the world.

Economic development studies have stated that Tishomingo County's strongest appeal is tourism based, and the Museum is obviously a draw. A spontaneous review of their guest book on Tuesday reflected visits by people from North and South Carolina, Tennessee, Missouri, Michigan, Georgia, Oklahoma, and even Great Britain.

Tuesday afternoon, a Georgia couple passing through after visiting Arkansas dropped in and enjoyed the exhibits that give visitors, and Tishomingo Countians, alike, a little taste of what Iuka, Burnsville, Tishomingo, Belmont, and many places that aren't even on the map anymore were like in years past. The institution is the only one of its kind in the county.

All these people visited our courthouse on different days, and that accessibility is at risk as the Society determines how it can operate the museum on about half of the normal amount provided by the county for operating the museum.

The county owns the building, and has in recent years, provided \$20,000 annually for the operation of the Old Courthouse. The total operating cost for minimum

operations at the museum is about \$35,000, said Cindy Nelson, president of the TCHGS. Dues and donations to the non-profit Society make up the rest of the budgeted amount.

But last month, the board of supervisors voted to cut that amount in half, to pay back a \$38,000 payment that the county had to make to contractor Johnny Harber to cover some work that was apparently outside the scope of the work covered by the Mississippi Department of History and Archives grant, and the matching county money, for roof replacement.

Strapped for funds itself, the county is replacing the county expenditure by taking it out of the Museum allocation over four years, taking out \$9,500 each year of their annual county allocation of \$20,000.

At the time, the board stated that it was about a fourth of the Museum's annual operating budget, but Museum officials say it is about half.

The Museum runs on a shoestring budget already, and has been hit hard by the economic downturn, like many non-profits who have decreased donations with which to operate.

The situation leaves the society with little option but to let go of its museum executive director position, currently held by Jan Anglin, and consider closing all but one day, or even a half day, each week to the public.

The \$20,000 [from the county] didn't even cover the salaries of their two part-time employees, explained Nelson. Many of the society members, and the employees as well, donate hundreds of hours to keep the Museum operating.

The Society pursues and receives grant money for operating the Courthouse, which, since it is on the National Register of Historic Places, has to operate within

strict guidelines, explained Anglin Tuesday.

A recent membership campaign has gained many new members, and some have chosen to become lifetime members.

"These funds would have allowed us to pursue these grants," said Museum Chairman Harold Lomenick. "But now the funds will be needed to just help us keep the doors open. We need more memberships."

"There's no question that

this is a serious financial blow," said Budget & Finance Chairman, Dustin Lambert. While the county allocation was a substantial portion of the museum's funding, we have other sources of income, such as membership support, donations, sponsorships, admissions and gift shop sales," he said. "We'll obviously have to do some financial restructuring, but museum operations will definitely continue."

one's efforts!" said McGaughy. "Everyone was so enthusiastic about this first town-wide effort, and we had excellent participation from many individuals and groups."



Public Notice Beaver Control Program 2011 for Tishomingo County

The Tishomingo County Soil & Water Conservation District Commissioners approved again this year to support the Beaver Control program for 2011.

You must sign up to participate in the Beaver Control Program. You may come by the office to return the form at the bottom of the page by December 20, 2010

Based on the funds received for the Beaver Control Program the limit will be set by the number of landowners who participate in the program. The amount paid is \$12.50 per beaver tail you bring in.

The Beaver Control Program will begin January 1, 2011 and will continue till December 1, 2011. Payment will be made at the time beaver tails are brought in. No lump sum payment will be made at the end of season. If the District Clerk is unavailable to write checks, checks will be mailed the business day.

The collection day for landowners who have signed up for the Beaver Control Program to bring tails to the Tishomingo County Soil and Water Conservation District parking lot is the 1st Tuesday each month from 9 am till 11 am

Please freeze the beaver tails individually in plastic. Bring them to the collection point to be marked and information recorded for payment.

You may trap or have anyone of your choosing trap the beavers. Payment will be made to you or you may designate that payment be made to your trapper.

We have a list of trappers in the office from past years if you do not know of anyone to trap for. We look forward to working with you on the Beaver Control Program. With your help we can have a successful program.

I give the Tishomingo County Soil and Water Conservation District or their representatives (Natural Resources Conservation Service) permission to enter on my property for the purpose of administering the Beaver Control Program. I will not hold the committee or its representatives responsible in an accident or injury in relation to the Beaver Control Program.

My name is Steven Shane Murray. I grew up in the Crossroads area and Burnsville. I have lived in Tishomingo County for thirty years. A couple of years ago, I received an impression to work on my genealogy. This endeavor was new to me and I had little knowledge of how or where to start. After talking to individuals in the community, I was told to

go to the Old Courthouse. I was told that the Courthouse had an infinite amount of information and that they could help me. Upon arriving I was greeted by Mrs. Jan Anglin who was eager to help.

Over the course of two years, I could not even tell you how much information on my family I have collected from the Courthouse. My family and I have been blessed by the endeavors of Jan Anglin and Christina Goss.

The Old Courthouse and its staff are a vital part of the community, the Nation and the World. The Courthouse houses information on the Civil War among other things. I personally found my great-great-grandfather's Civil War pension application. Anyone who has roots in Tishomingo County will leave the Courthouse with information on their family. Recently a couple from ENGLAND visited the Courthouse, as well as citizens of North and South Carolina, Kansas and Texas. This goes to show that the importance of the Old Courthouse can even cross the ocean.

I realize that in aftermath of the recent downfall of the economy that tough decision's have to be made.

However, I would like to ask the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors to take a long hard look at not cutting the Courthouse operating budget. Not only will you be affecting today's genealogical efforts, but also quite possibly affecting your own children's opportunity to do so.
