"We have had a 100 percent

success rate, thanks to the generosity of the people of this county," said Fulton.

It is suggested that sponsors spend \$50 to \$75 on younger children (infant to about 7 or 8) and \$75 to \$100 (age 8 and older) on older kids. Active toys (football, bicycle, etc.) and interactive toys (games, cards, baby dolls, etc) are encouraged.

"I'm proud of how hard they played, and really appreciative of the fan support. The student section went all out for every team today, and we really appreciate that."

Leading the Lady Braves in scoring was sophomore Shemei Carter with 16, followed closely by classmate Anna Claire Griffin with 15. Freshman Deidre Mc-

Coy had 12, and junior Danielle Blakney had 11.

J.V. Boys Win

The varsity girls' game came after a narrow win by the junior varsity boys. The game was within a few points through all four periods, and ended up at 37-36, with TC in the lead when it counted.

Scoring was lead by junior Cameron Dexter (11) and sophomore Tanner Whitaker (10). John Works lead the Bears with 13.

Bears Master Varsity Braves

The varsity guys' game was similarly tight, with just a few points separating the Braves and Bears throughout. Despite some heroic shots by Luke White, and junior Joey Shannon in the final minutes, the Braves just couldn't sink the ball, and the Bears... did. The final score was a heartbreaking 63-70. Alcorn Central's Jordan Wyke lead scoring with 23 points. TCHS seniors Tanner Pounders and Jake Walker had 17 points each, and Luke White 9.

I believe what happened to him happened in his home, but due to lack of knowledge and NEGLECT by the sheriff and his department we will never know, but the

person responsible knows.

The one consolation I have is knowing that I got to hug his neck and tell him I loved him when he left my house that morning alive and well. So many never get a chance to do that, so tell your loved ones each day that you love them for you never know it may be the last time you talk to them.

My prayers go out to the families of all these missing and murdered persons and I ask for your prayers in return.

Tax Money Going to AL, TN & Corinth...

This is pertaining to the petition in Tishomingo County to vote it wet for whiskey, beer, and wine.

Have you the people of Tishomingo County ever thought about how much taxes are going to Alabama, Tennessee and Alcorn County? There is approximately 20,000 people that are above the age of 21 years-old, out of all of these people you know at least 10,000 of them drink some form of alcohol.

If they go to the other states or county and buy \$15.00 worth of alcohol there is at least one dollar of that tax money that

will equal up to \$1,000 per week; \$4,000 per month that will equal \$48,000 per year tax money being given to other states and counties. Wouldn't you like for these tax dollars to stay in Tishomingo County? If you do you need to come to the Youth Center in Iuka Mineral Springs Park on Saturday, Nov. 20th from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. and sign this petition to vote Tishomingo County wet. Then the tax dollars will stay here in Tishomingo County.

These figures are on the low side, most likely instead of it being \$48,000 per year it will probably be close to somewhere between \$75,000 to \$100,000 per year.

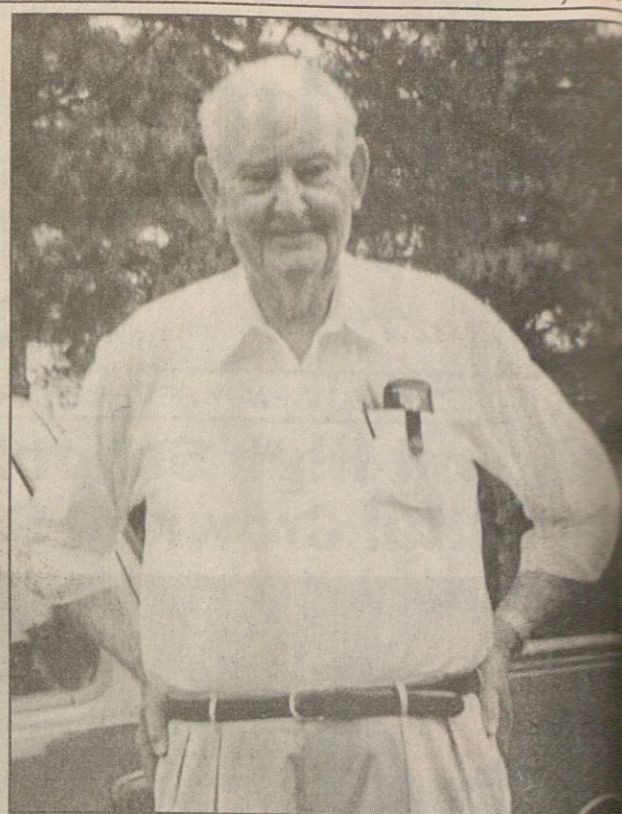
For every \$15.00 worth of alcohol, there is \$1.05 taxes on that. The average person is going to spend between \$20.00 to \$30.00 per week on alcohol. If they spend \$30.00 per week, that is \$2.10 per person, that equals \$8,040 per month. In 12 months that equals \$100,000 in taxes that are going to Alabama, Tennessee and Corinth, MS. When they raise your taxes and you didn't sign this petition to help get tax dollars here, don't get on the telephone, call your neighbors and complain because you set back and said "come on and

raise my taxes." If you don't sign this petition that is exactly what you are saying. Look at how much better off that Alabama, Tennessee and Corinth, MS and Lee County is compared to Tishomingo County. They are constantly growing, building new stuff everyday. What new has been built in Tishomingo County in the last 25 years? Fifteen years ago Belmont, MS was full of job opportunities, all the jobs packed up and moved to other places where the taxes were cheaper. Falcon was moved right across the line to Tennessee because the taxes were cheaper.

If there was alcohol taxes here most likely there would be jobs back here. No big company is going to build nothing in a dry county because the taxes are so much higher in a dry county than they are in a wet county.

I know some of you people say "the jobs are not going to help me because I draw Social Security or disability," what about your kids and your grandkids? Wouldn't you like to see them have a good job in their home town? I sure would.

When A Holy Kiss Becomes Unholy

Have you ever noticed that II Corinthians 13:12 says, "Greet one another with a holy kiss?" Several places in Scripture say this same thing, with a little variation in the wording. I Thessalonians 5:26 says, "Greet all the brethren with a holy kiss." I Peter 5:14 says, "Greet one another with a kiss of charity..." The kiss of charity has been a custom in eastern countries for centuries and is still practiced in many of them. Some people in American churches also practice the "holy kiss". Many of us may prefer a hearty hand shake. It is not wrong for Christians to practice the "holy kiss", as long as they keep it "holy". It has usually been a kiss on the cheek, with men kissing men and women kissing

women.

One of the saddest stories in the Bible concerns a kiss that was supposed to be a "holy kiss" of love and friendship, but it turned out to be everything but a "holy kiss". Luke 22:47-48 says it this way: "And while He -- yet spake, behold a multitude, and he that was called Judas, one of the twelve, went before them, and drew near unto Jesus to kiss Him. But Jesus said unto him, Judas, betrayest thou the Son of man with a kiss?" Matthew 26:50 shows that Jesus addressed Judas as "Friend". Can you imagine anything more dastardly than what Judas did? He pretended to be showing his love for Jesus by a kiss, while he was really only using the kiss to let the Jews know which one of the crowd in the garden of Gethsemane was Jesus! I

often wonder how many other people are paying only "lip service" to Jesus, perhaps by a show of friendship in the public eye, while in their hearts they really have no love for Jesus. A holy kiss becomes unholy when it is a deceitful action and really shows only contempt for the blessed Son of God. Let us make sure that our hearts are in agreement with our lips, when we "kiss Jesus". If one's heart is still rebelling against the truth of the Word of God, any "kiss" given to Jesus is still an unholy kiss!
