History Museum Gets \$10,000 Donation

A \$10,000 donation to the Tishomingo County Historical and Genealogical Society will give them some breathing room in their efforts to keep the Old Courthouse Museum open.

According to Dustin Lambert, Budget and Finance Director for the Tishomingo County Historical and Genealogical Society (TCHGS), an anonymous local donor made a \$10,000 donation to the society.

"This recent generous donation will allow us to set up a cushion account for emergency expenses and repairs, and to seek Grants for multiple projects that will benefit not only the courthouse but the entire county," Lambert said.

The board of directors of TCHGS met last Thursday to discuss recommendations of the Budget and Finance Committee.

The Tishomingo County Old Courthouse Museum is operated by TCHGS at a cost of more than \$34,000 each year. The county pays \$20,000 each year for support of the museum, and historic facility, since the county retains ownership of the building.

In October, the Tishomingo

County Board of Supervisors voted to reduce the annual allocation by \$9,500 for the next four years, to repay money that the County had to pay for courthouse renovations that exceeded grant funding for the project.

In order to make the 2011 operations budget of \$10,700 work, the Society had to cut its Executive Director position, all associational memberships and all education programs, including Camp Courthouse. They also had to cancel newspaper subscriptions which were being used in the archives and history library to

continue recording Tishomingo County history.

Additionally, the Society had to cut hours of operation, and programs in order to maintain the facility. They anticipated no money for improvements, and not enough money to fund major equipment needs.

The donation will help them with some of their most current needs, one of which is a new HVAC unit, said Museum Collections and Management Director Harold Lomenick. The existing units are not functional, and were installed around 1979. Additionally,

ly, a set of commercial pull-down stairs will be installed to access the units' filters in the attic.

"That's the most expensive item on the current need list," says Lomenick. The annex roof, which is not a part of the previous grant application continues to leak, adding to the interior damage in the library section of the museum. Other equipment needs include a security and fire upgrade, a digital camera, a projector, and ledger-sized scanning equipment.

Brooks and B&J's Grocery in Burnsville are even open Thanksgiving day until around noon for those emergency trips to the store.

"It's all worth it," said Davis, because the days after a holiday are probably a little slower, so we get to recuperate, maybe take some time off then."

Homestead Restaurant offers a particular deal for customers - they do the cooking for you!

Open from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Thanksgiving Day for the past two years, Homestead plans to be open, and they plan to be very busy.

"We anticipate a huge crowd," said owner Terry Vidal. "Plus, we

do a lot of carry out that day, and we have about 20 pre-orders of turkey and dressing that folks will pick up here to serve at their own home."

Vidal says he has seen that the restaurant seems to be a place to have some fellowship for people whose relatives are not visiting that day.

"These days, families don't live near each other like they used to, and it's harder for them to visit everyone every holiday," explained Vidal. He says he notices many customers coming in to eat who are free from the burdens of entertaining family members at home, but still want to do something special for the holidays.

Those that do have visitors are also taking advantage of someone else doing the cooking on Thanksgiving, and Christmas, too. The large banquet room, reserved for larger parties, is already booked for several different parties throughout the day, said Vidal.

The last two years, Vidal says they haven't advertised much, but this year they have, so they anticipate lots of patrons at both the Iuka and Tishomingo restaurants.

Last Saturday, the boys' beat the team from Lafayette.







Gresham's Mills Becomes Bay Springs

Visitors to Bay Springs can readily understand why early settlers took a liking to this scenic area with its development potential. Dr. William Clifford Morse, State Geologist in 1935, described Bay Springs on Mackey's Creek in the following way: "Perhaps no small area in the state is so picturesquely beautiful as this Bay Springs region." The Highland Church sandstone outcrops form cliffs and gorges through which Mackey's Creek meanders. The most famous cliff is Lover's Leap, which is steeped in Chickasaw legend.

About 1838, George Gresham and his family moved from the Mars Hill area near Florence, Alabama, and settled on Mackey's Creek. He quickly saw that the high sandstone cliffs made this spot an ideal location for a dam to furnish water power. At first, George Gresham probably operated a watermill on Gin Branch which drains into Mackey's Creek. Being a well-respected man, he was appointed in 1840 to be overseer of the road from Gresham's Mill to the County line.

In the early 1840s, George Gresham and his son, James Files Gresham, erected a sawmill and grist mill on Mackey's Creek. This was to help not only the Gresham family but also the area settlers.

Since this mill was the only one in that part of the County equipped for the manufacture of flour, the pioneers brought their wheat for quite a distance to have it made into flour. The Gresham's wa-

ter-powered sawmill supplied the neighborhood with lumber for the construction of new frame houses and barns. The Gresham family also saved a large portion of the lumber used in the later construction of the factory and other buildings.

A village, Gresham's Mills, sprang up. A blacksmith shop, a cotton gin, and a general store were built. The settlers were adjusting to their new homes; and progress was starting to show, especially at Gresham's Mills.

About four miles southwest of Gresham's Mills was the home of Robert Lowry. Located here were bay trees and clear springs in profusion. Lowry operated a store in which the first post office in that vicinity was established in 1844. The post office was called Bay Springs, and Robert Lowry served as postmaster. When he moved to Carrollville in 1845, the post office was moved to Gresham's Mills without a change of name. The budding trade center on Mackey's Creek was thereafter called Bay Springs. James F. Gresham then became the postmaster of Bay Springs.


