2010 Iuka Grand Marshals Make History

A brother and sister who embody a long history in Iuka will serve as Grand Marshals in the 2010 Iuka Christmas Parade.

Calvin Seay, 93, and Mary "Emmalean" Dilworth, 94, are lifelong residents of Iuka and are the first African-Americans to serve as parade Grand Marshals.

Both consider it a great honor to be selected and recall Christmas parades in Iuka in their youth.

"I remember the pretty floats they had, horses and trucks," Dilworth said.

For many years when the Jourdan Lumber Co. operated in downtown Iuka and Seay worked there, he remembers the parade coming through town.

"I think they stopped coming downtown because of the railroad and trains," Seay said.

Dilworth was the oldest and Seay the second child born to John and Lugenia Hill Seay, though John Seay had other children from two other marriages. Lugenia Seay died when Dilworth was eight years old, and the children were raised after that by their grandmother.

John Seay farmed in many areas around Iuka, Calvin Seay said, and he remembers working farmland in those years on property owned by Bob Carter that is now a housing subdivision near the water tower off Constitution Drive and the area where the Iuka Housing Authority now operates the Hiatt Circle housing complex.

"We used to live down by the railroad tracks where the post office is now," Mrs. Dilworth said. "It was Mary Scruggs' property back then."

Mrs. Dilworth married William Henry Dilworth Sr. and they had two children - William Jr., who lives in Corinth, and Emma L. Wright, who lives in Michigan City, Indiana. William died many years ago, but through the years Dilworth was a household worker for several different families, most recently Dr. Kelly and Martha Segars.

And, of course, many people know her for the pies she brought to sell downtown at the drug store/gift shop where they had two tables for the coffee drinkers, and the bank.

"She'd come in with the pies in a little woven

basket," said Gene Jourdan, president of BancorpSouth in Iuka.

Mr. Seay left Iuka as a young man for a brief time to work on the Fontana Dam in North Carolina, but returned to work at Jourdan Lumber Co. where, at 93, he still goes to work every day. He married Mollie Carter Seay from Alabama, who died many years ago. They had no children.

"I've known Calvin all my life," Gene Jourdan continued, whose great-uncle J.C. Jourdan owned the lumber business. "Mr. J.C. and Little Jim relied on him heavily if anything went wrong. He's considered part of our family. He's so industrious, always doing something or on his way to doing something."

Mr. Seay's family and members of the church he and his sister attend - Jones Chapel C.M.E. Church - know that side of him as well. He is faithful in his caretaking and work around the church.

"Their participation in church is astonishing," said Pastor Anitha Keith. "They don't let their age be a limit. They are dedicated, and I know in your 90s sometimes you don't feel good, but in spite of that they are supportive, dedicated and part of the picture there at church."

Their presence is motivating to all who know them.

"If in their 90s they can do it, what's my problem?" Keith asks. "They keep me going and going. They are constantly reminding me of how if you're obedient God, He will reward you, and I see their longevity as a reward from God."

Ershigs, Inc. Expanding Operations in Iuka; Project to Create 52 New Jobs at Tri-State

Officials from Ershigs, Inc., supplier of high-quality, engineered fiber reinforced plastic (FRP) products for the power, mining, chemical, pulp, paper and waste water industries, have announced the company is expanding its operations in Iuka, Miss., and will be constructing a new facility at the Tri-State Commerce Park. A \$1.62 million company investment, the new building will house large diameter cylinders manufactured by the company until they are shipped out by barge. The expansion will create 52 new jobs.

"Our location on the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway and the Tennessee River will give us a competitive edge in bidding on large diameter tanks," said Richard Spears, Ershigs site manager. "We are able to ship very large components anywhere in the world by water. I thank MDA and Tishomingo County for their support of this project."

MDA worked closely with company and local officials to help facilitate the project, providing funding to the county for public infrastructure improvements. Tishomingo County provided funding to assist with the project, as well.

"I commend Ershigs officials for choosing to expand their operations in Iuka and create new jobs for the residents of Tishomingo County. The expansion not only represents the company's commitment to Mississippi and its workforce, it further reinforces that Mississippi is in a prime location and has an excellent transportation network in place to accommo-

date any company looking to improve speed to market by quickly shipping materials in and finished products out," said Gray Swoope, executive director of the Mississippi Development Authority (MDA). "I am pleased we were able to provide assistance for this project, and we look forward to working with Ershigs again in the future."

Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors President James McDowell stated that "the board of supervisors is excited about partnering with Ershigs to grow new jobs for the citizens of Tishomingo County. The management of Ershigs has shown vision in their product line and the ability to deliver the goods. We are proud to have Ershigs as a part of our industrial family and look forward to years of growth for Ershigs and Tishomingo County."

The site work and foundation for the building have been completed and the advertisement for bids for erection of the building and installation of electrical, plumbing, and cranes is underway. Dean McRae Engineering, of Iuka, is the engineer on the project. Construction of the new facility is scheduled to be completed in January 2011.

State Supreme Court to Hear Sanders' Appeal

The Mississippi Supreme Court has scheduled oral arguments for December 7th in Keir D. Sanders' appeal of his 2008 conviction in the slaying of his grandmother.

Authorities say K.D. Sanders attacked his grandparents in their Tishomingo County home in 1985, then fled before standing trial. He was on the run until authorities arrested Sanders in Texas in 2005.

The grandfather, W.D.

Crawford, died in the attack, but the grandmother, Elma Crawford, died a few days later in a Memphis hospital.

In 2008, a Lee County jury found Sanders not guilty by reason of insanity in his grandfather's slaying but convicted Sanders of killing his grandmother, and sentenced him to life in prison.

The state Appeals Court upheld Sanders' conviction in March.

Tishomingo Plans for Approaching Picnic

Further plans for the picnic to be held at the Tishomingo County Agricultural High School on August 13, 1929, opening day, were announced Monday, following a meeting at the school to discuss the matter.

There will be public speaking, dinner on the ground, a string band concert and a baseball game on that occasion, and a committee was appointed on Monday to look after the cold drink stand which will be in operation. This committee is headed by Whit Fairless as chairman and includes the following: Neal Gray, Mrs. Grover Hardy, Rivers Long, Noonan Monroe, Gerrie McClung, Lucille McRae, John Albert Pace, Attie Lou Grimes, Mrs. Fay

Burns, Mrs. Roe Daniel, Artie Stephens, Cleetus

Loveless, George Page, Ernestine Smith, and Vret-tie Hellums.

Various rumors have been circulated about the school, one of these being that the opening date had been postponed for two weeks and the other that Prof. W. R. Nettles would not be connected with the institution this year. Both of these rumors are declared to be without foundation by those connected with the school. It is stated positively that the term will open on Tuesday, August 13, as planned, and that the picnic will be held. It is further stated that Prof. Nettles has already signed a contract to teach this year, and that this contract bears the names of four out of the five trustees of the school.

Further announcement as to the ball game, string band concert, and other features of the picnic will be announced next week.

Belmont School Sets

Mark for County

Belmont High School students have one more month of vacation, while pupils in the grammar school may

look forward to two more months of freedom before lessons start, according to an announcement made this week. August 30 has been

set as opening day for the high school department, comprising the ninth to twelfth grades, inclusive. The other grades will start work on September 27.

The annual report for the session of 1928-29 was completed a short time ago by Prof. J. W. Sumners, and

shows that the Belmont school enrolled a greater number of pupils during that term than any other school in the county, and also that practically every eligible white children in the district was included in the roll at some time during the year. The total enrollment for the year was 496, out of a total of 532 eligible white children in the district.

Winter Baseball Camps at Northeast in December

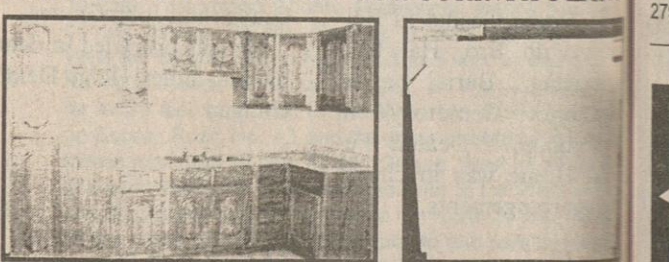

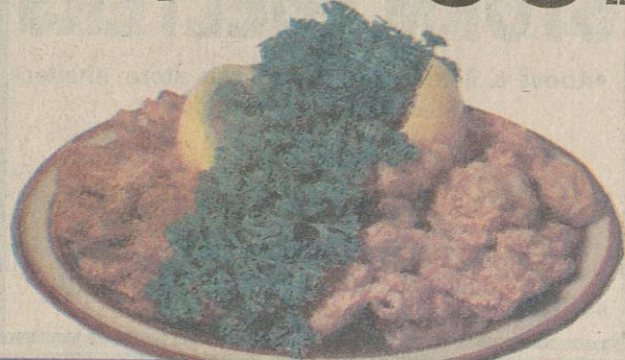
