Authorities Bust Meth Distribution Organization

Authorities have charged six people active in a methamphetamine-distribution network that includes Tishomingo County.

After a four-month investigation, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, in cooperation with the United States Marshal's Service and Birmingham Police, arrested Richard W. Foster, of Patrick Lane in Cherokee. Alabama in a suburban Birmingham hotel, said Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock. He has been charged with conspiracy to distribute methamphetamine.

Also charged with conspiracy to distribute methamphetamine, and arrested at the same time was Tammy Wells Burkhalter Six, of County Road 961, Belmont.

Seized substances at the time included one ounce of methamphetamine, four bags of marijuana, and approximately 100 Percocet pills, said Whitlock.


The two are currently in cus-

tody with the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department awaiting extradition to Tishomingo County.

In connection with this case, the following were also charged with conspiracy to distribute methamphetamine: Ronnie Henderson, CR 147, Iuka; Chasity Reeves, 32080 Highway 25, Golden; Glendon Ashley, 46 Main St., Belmont; and Jason Matthew Holley of 2318 Patton Flat Road, Fulton.

Investigators estimate that the Foster organization distributed approximately one pound of methamphetamine ice weekly in the region with an approximate street value of \$45,000. Based on the investigation, the organization distributed approximately \$2,300,000 in meth ice annually.

The investigation is ongoing, said Whitlock, and additional arrests are anticipated. The case will be presented to the next Tishomingo County Grand Jury, said Whitlock.


Bids were due by noon Wednesday, and the top three bidders will be invited to negotiations to offer more, so the investor gets the highest possible price, said Morris.

Highway 25 Bridge at Dennis Being Rebuilt

Last week, demolition began on the Dennis bridge, one of several bridge projects in process or completed in the fourth district in the last two years.

The \$300,000 project has been in process for some time, explained Fourth District Supervisor Steve Thorne. But the demolition just started last week

by Tri-County Construction of Guin, Alabama.

A new, two-lane concrete bridge will replace the single lane wooden bridge that has been in place more than 50 years. The bridge is about 30 feet above the tracks. Another similar bridge in Tishomingo was replaced with a grade crossing last year.

"The first inspection I can

find on it was in 1960," said Thorne. The bridge is on County Road 23 (old Highway 25) that goes beside the Dennis Woodman of the World building, just east of Highway 25. It carried traffic over the Redmont Railroad tracks, which were once very active, carrying passengers and cargo, but are now rarely used.

The town of Belmont is awaiting the completion of demolition to replace gas lines near the bridge, said Thorne.

Estimated completion date for the new Dennis bridge will be mid-February, weather permitting

Another bridge project is in it's final stages on County Road 961, between Highway 30 and

Crow's Neck. The \$167,000 project will replace a bridge over Pollard Mill Branch with a doublebarrel box culvert.

Work began on the Pollard Mill Branch bridge several weeks ago, by the same contractor (coincidentally, since it was esparately bid).

Two Charged in Meth Operation

Belmont Police and the Tishomingo Count Sheriff's Department have charged two with selling meth at a local business.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, on November 28th, officers with the sheriff's department, Belmont PD, and the Northeast Mississippi Narcotics Unit arrested Bret Smith, of Albertville, Alabama, and Kamilah Cruces for possession of methamphetamine with intent to sell and conspiracy to distribute methamphetamine. Authorities sieved approximately 30 grams of meth with a street value of \$3,000, and a Toyota Tundra.

The arrest was made at a local business following a month-long investigation. Authorities believe that Smith has been a major supplier of meth in Itawamba, Prentiss and Tishomingo Counties during the past year.
