Absentee Voting for Special Election Starts Monday

January 11th, 2011 there will be a special election to fill the Northern District Transportation Commissioner position left vacant by the death of Bill Minor on November 1st.

Absentee ballots for the special election will be available beginning Monday, December 20th at the Circuit Clerk's office in the courthouse in Iuka.

With the holidays, there will be less than a month to vote ab-

sentee, so it is important that you call the Circuit Clerk immediately, said Circuit Clerk Donna Dill.

The seven candidates seeking the office are: John Caldwell of Nesbit; Dennis Grisham of Dumas; Joey Hood of the Kirkville community in Itawamba County; Larry Lee of Grenada, Warner McBride of Courtland, Ray Monor of Holly Springs, and Mike Tagert of Starkville.

Unsolved Murder & Missing Persons Cases Plague Families, Authorities

After nearly a year of investigation, there are still no tangible results in the case of the brutal murder of 84-year-old John Holt in his Burnsville home, and family members are disappointed with what they see as a lack of progress.

But Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock says that the case is still an active, ongoing investigation.

Since December 23rd, when Mr. Holt was discovered beaten to death in his own living room, several people have been questioned, statements collected, polygraph tests administered and possible witnesses examined, said Whitlock.

"But no conclusive evidence has been found that would stand up in court," said Whitlock. No murder weapon has been found. The coroner ruled the death a homicide due to blunt force injuries.

Also since the murder, the Holt house has burned, and former family members have been indicted for attempting to cash checks on Holt's account.

Holt has one living sibling, brother Lloyd Holt in Kansas, who has said he would like to see some progress before he died, said Holt's niece Sherry Kogel, who lives locally.

Kogel says that the family has never been allowed to see the autopsy report, or pictures of the crime scene, and is just generally upset about the lack of progress in the investigation.

Missing Persons

The disappearances of two county residents are also still under investigation, confirmed Whitlock. But they are still miss-

ing persons.

Johnny Crosby, 67, was last seen December 18th, 2009 at his home near Tishomingo State Park, south of Tishomingo. The family said at the time he was on several medications, was acting erratically, and may have been disoriented.

The area was thoroughly searched several times, on different occasions, and there were some alleged sightings in Alcorn County, but no productive leads in Crosby's disappearance have been discovered.

Kimberly Clark, a young mother, disappeared from the Belmont area April 19th, and is still listed as a missing person.

Individuals have been questioned, statements collected, and thorough searches of her home and surrounding property have been conducted, but nothing has led to conclusive evidence of her fate, said Whitlock.

Both the Crosby and Clark cases are classified as Missing Persons cases, due to the lack of solid evidence of foul play.

The Mississippi Bureau of Investigation, along with other agencies, continue to investigate these three cases, said Whitlock. They believe that there are persons who may have conclusive evidence to offer to bring these cases to a close.

Crime Stoppers of Northeast Mississippi pays money for tips that lead to arrests and convictions of persons who have committed crimes, reminds Whitlock. If anyone has any information about the cases, they are urged to call the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department at 423-7000.

Early Monday morning the Grisham family escaped their home safely, but their County Road 169 home was destroyed by

According to Martha Grisham, her husband Vance, who said was up all night, saw the fire in their son's bedroom about 5 a.m., and managed to rouse her, their son, and escape safely. They were able to take shelter in a close neighbor's home. The temperature Monday morning was in

the low teens. Burnsville and Midway Fire Departments responded to the call, but the fire was fully involved, by the time they arrived, according to Tishomingo County 911 Coordinator Rickey Cummings, who responded with the Burnsville department.

"It was coming out both ends of the house by the time we got there," said Cummings. "All we could really do is try to protect it from spreading to the neighbors' home."

The cause of the fire was possibly a space heater, said Cummings.

The family was speaking with the Red Cross early Monday morning. The Red Cross helps fire victims with some money and other necessities, but the Grishams lost everything, including Christmas gifts, and their grandchildren's gifts. Contact the Red Cross to help the family through the cold weather and holidays.

Absentee Voting for Special Election for Northern District Transportation Commissioner

Absentee ballots should be available for the January 11th Special Election for Northern District Transportation Commissioner on Monday, December 20th, 2010, depending upon the release of the approved ballot from the Secretary of State's Office.

Anyone who would like to vote by absentee ballot should contact the Circuit Clerk's Office at 423-7026 as soon as possible to start the absentee process. There will be less than a month to vote by absentee and with the holidays coming up, it is very important that you call

immediately if you need to vote absentee by mail in order to have time to complete the voting process by mail.

Dates to vote in the office will be: Monday, December 20 - Thursday, December 23, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. (Courthouse will be closed Friday, December 24 and

Monday, December 27 for the Christmas Holidays.)

Tuesday, December 28 - Thursday, December 30, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. (Courthouse will be closed Friday, December 31 and Monday, January 3, 2011, for New Year's Holiday.)

Circuit Clerk's Office

will be OPEN on Saturday, January 1, 2011, 8 a.m. to 12 noon for absentee voting.

Tuesday, January 4 - Friday, January 7, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Saturday, January 8, 8 a.m. to 12 noon. This will be the last day you may vote by absentee ballot in the clerk's office.

All mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5 p.m. on Monday, January 10, in order to be eligible to be counted for the January 11 Special Election.

When an absentee ballot is requested, an application for an absentee

ballot will first be mailed to the voter. This application shall be completed by the voter and returned to the clerk's office. When the application is received, the ballot will be mailed to the voter. Absentee ballots may be delivered to anyone.

Any registered voter eligible to vote by absentee ballot in the clerk's office, five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail.

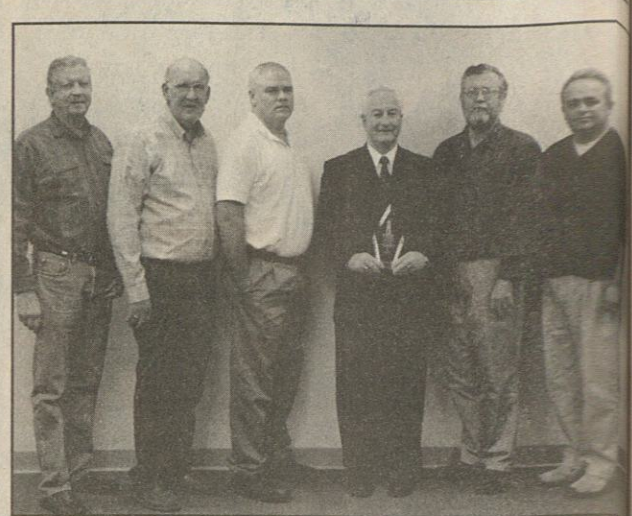
The auditorium was built from stimulus plan funds that also allowed new facilities to be built on every campus in the county.

Mr. Ronny Griffin giving us the opportunity to attend this.

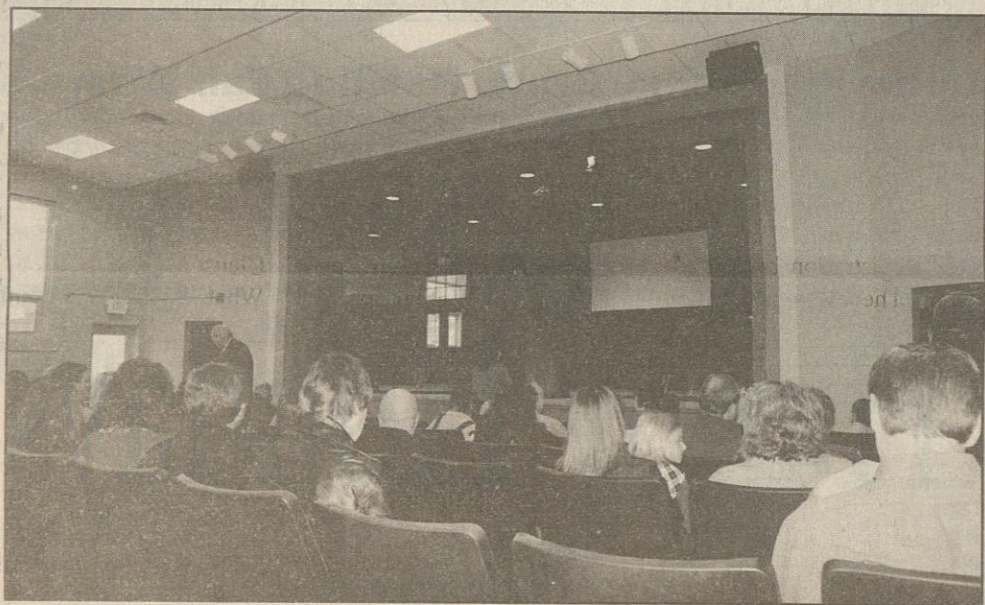

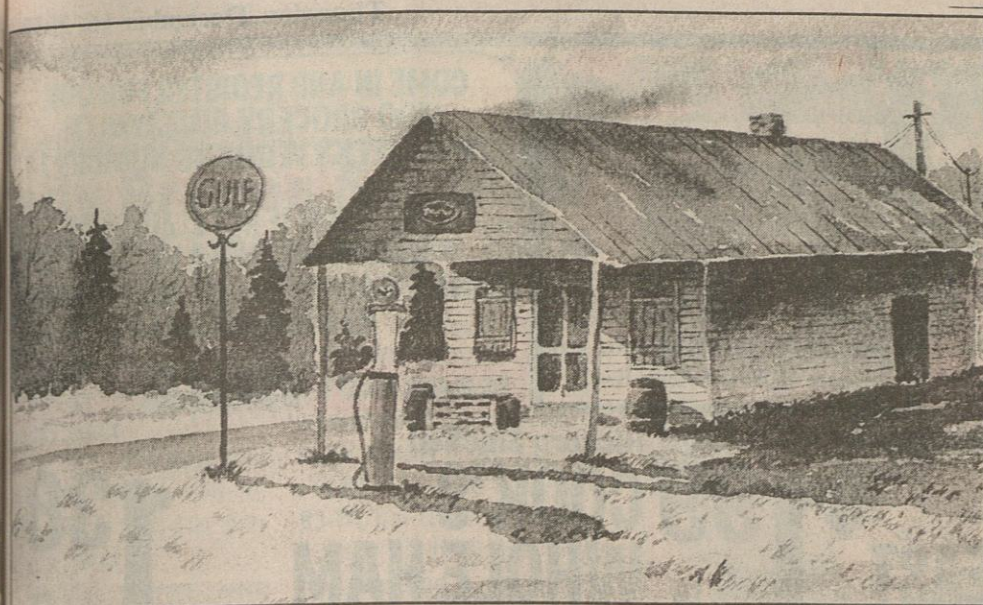

The old Fields' Store at Doskie

Memories of Estene Fields Reynolds

The song "Precious Memories" was brought to mind in the recent death of Doskie Community resident, Estene Fields Reynolds.

Though born in Fulton, MS, January 27, 1927 to J. C. (Colonel) and Leona Morris Fields, she was relocated at a very young age with her parents and two older sisters to Doskie, MS.

The Fields family farmed and later built a store, J. C. Fields Grocery across the road from their Doskie home. Farming was a family affair and the business was conducted by family members for over 30 years.

Although many hearts were truly saddened and many tears were shed, the beautiful memories of the life Estene lived brought joy to all who had the privilege of being a part of her life.

Estene was raised working the fields, clearing ditch banks, and working along side her parents as they supported their rural community meeting the needs of their neighbors and friends. The Fields store became a gathering place for anyone having the time for a game of checkers or wishing to stop by for a fast



lunch of crackers, cheese, bologna, sardines, and hot sauce. There was always plenty of RC cola to wash it all down with and a moon pie for dessert. Many tales were told and problems solved as the days unfolded.

In the early 40's, Ovel Reynolds came a calling and claimed the hand of his Doskie sweetheart. Having been acquainted as neighbors basically all their lives, the two had attended the same church services and community gatherings. Estene enjoyed playing her guitar, singing with the group, and was known for her love of yodeling at the box suppers.

Ovel & Estene took over the Fields store at the death of her father, Colonel Fields. In the mid 60's they built a new store building across from their home on the newly built 365 highway. Mr. Reynolds farmed, kept the store, and was known for the exceptional

quality of his sorghum molasses he cooked personally for many years. Mrs. Reynolds worked at the Luka Shoe Factory for 33 years. After a day's work at the factory, Estene always looked forward to stopping by the store where she waited-on and visited with their numerous customers. Her family's life was centered around the little country store for many years. And yes, late evenings were spent with neighbors and friends discussing current events and family matters. Special memories were made during those days and are brought to mind today by the Reynolds' children: Talmage Reynolds, Kathy Reynolds Williams, and Jamie Reynolds.

After retirement from the shoe factory and closing of the store, Estene became a caregiver living with and taking care of many elderly people touching their lives with her sweet and gentle spirit.

In the past five years, Estene was a resident at the Tishomingo Community Living Center where she continued to reach out and serve those around her with

her loving and caring spirit bringing good cheer. Many lives were touched by her joy for life and living. God called her home on Sunday, November 28, 2010.
