## Two Men Killed In Two-Vehicle Collision Near Tishomingo

Two Tishomingo men were killed in a two-vehicle collision last Thursday.

Just before 11 a.m., January 13th, near the intersection of County Road 23 and Highway 5 south of Tishomingo, a southbound 2001 Chevrolet Impala driven by Kirby McClung, 58, of Tishomingo, collided with a northbound 1997 GMC pick-up truck driven by Nick Starkey, of Tishomingo, said Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon.

Mr. McClung died at the scene, said Wilemon, and Mr. Starkey died later at Iuka Hospital.

The cause of the collision is under investigation, said Trooper Jay Hall of the Mississippi Highway Patrol.

## Board Protecting Citizens' Privacy

The county board of supervisors is looking out for its citizens' privacy, as evidenced at the Tuesday board meeting.

In the meeting January 14th, the board received three requests for collections of county information. They denied two, and tabled another pending review by the board's attorney.

One request was from an insurance salesperson, who requested the names and addresses of all the people over 18 years of age. The reason cited for the request by Ken Wells, an insurance salesperson in Belmont, was to market insurance to those individuals using the county information. This was denied by the board.

## ERSHIGS Erecting New Building at Tri-State

ERSHIGS, located at Tri-State Park, is erecting a \$1.8 million expansion that is scheduled to create 52 jobs for the area.

The construction contract was recently awarded to Master-Craft of Booneville, and work has begun on the 14,000-square-foot building.

information from the county's computer systems administrator, Delta. Core Logic said they would use the information in an online database that furnished real estate information to realtor services for 3,000 counties across the country. The board denied it also.

This information is public record, the board agreed, and anyone can come to the courthouse, and request to see these public records, in accordance with Mississippi open records law. But, explained purchase clerk Lynn West, these requests are to purchase a collection of county information.

Since the threat of personal information being used for solicitation, or possibly scams, is so prevalent in recent times, the current board implement-

ed a policy a few years ago to review all such requests to purchase masses of county information before the individual offices provided it.

"We always have several requests of this type each year," explained West. For example, timber companies might request the names of all individuals owning more than 100 acres in the county, she said.

In accordance with open records requirements, all public records information is available to persons who come to the courthouse to request it, but it is the distribution of large amounts of data that the board is seeking to, at least, review.

Another request was received, by the chancery clerk's office, to have the county fi-

nancial information online, and the board tabled that request, pending the review of board attorney Phillip Whitehead, because the chancery clerk's legal obligation to publish such information may differ from the board's, they said. Whitehead was reviewing an attorney general opinion on the matter.

In other county news, the supervisors thanked the county workers for their good performance handling the recent snowstorm. They also thanked the public for staying off the roads long enough for the crews to make them as safe as possible.

"Overall, it was commendable," said Board President James McDowell. "We were able to still hold the election successfully."

## TCEPA Warns of 70 percent Increase in December Power Consumption Could mean highest- ever winter power bills

The Tishomingo County Electric Power Association issued a warning Tuesday that energy consumption for last month was much higher than normal, and it's going to show up on power bills that are going out this week.

According to TCEPA Manager Robert Grisham, consumption was up 70 percent from the previous month on the sampling of bills they reviewed, and that could mean the highest-ever winter power bill for some TCEPA customers.

The significant increase in consumption is evident in the December 1st-January 1st usage period, which is just now being billed to customers, Grisham explained.

"We are just trying to head off a lot of calls," said Grisham. "The rates are twenty percent higher than last year, from TVA wholesale power cost increases."

TCEPA has not had a rate increase to increase its own revenues since April 2007, said Grisham.

The higher TVA rates, combined with the spike in consumption, are a double strike that will impact power customers' pocketbooks.

"The TVA rates are beyond our control," said Grisham. "But we can control consumption."

Average daily temperature in December was 37.6 degrees Fahrenheit, and it got as cold as 12 degrees on the morning of December 14th.

Grisham advised that power customers may wish to take extra measures to conserve energy if they want to lower their bills for the next billing period, which began January 1st.

## State & Local Lawmakers Addressing Latest Drug Craze

State lawmakers and local law enforcement officers are taking action to stop the latest drug craze taking over the area.

Ivory Wave Bath Salts, "salt," Ivory, is the second legal narcotic substitute to emerge within the past year. The effects are similar to that produced by crystal methamphetamine, and it is being injected or smoked by users.

Last year, lawmakers from city, county and state out-banned the sale and use of "spice," a drug that mimicked the effects of marijuana. Now, "salt," a substance that is actually a bath salt, is causing trouble locally, though not common in local stores, said law officers. It is about \$30 for a small portion, reportedly.

There is a steady stream of users in the county that is a particular concern, especially the officers who have had to arrest users under its influence. According to local law offi-

cers, suspects who are under its influence are wildly hallucinogenic, and paranoid.

Officers tell of responding to calls where they have encountered people under the influence of salt, who believe they are being pursued, or that something is coming to get them. A law officer responding to a call could be in serious danger from someone under such a delusion, especially if they are armed.

"They're wild as a buck," explained Belmont Police Chief Donald Reno this week of some suspects he's recently encountered that are under the influence of "salt." Currently, people using salt can only be charged with something like public disturbance, or public drunk - because salt is not illegal.

Reno responded to a call last week where two people were arrested, and three young children who were also in the home had to be placed in protective custody. They were charged with pub-

lic drunk, and were released on bond.

But the drug has attracted the attention of lawmakers, and efforts are underway to make use of the dangerous drug punishable by law.

State Senator J.P. Wilemon, Jr., (D-District 5), who represents part of Tishomingo, Prentiss and Itawamba counties, has co-authored Senate Bill 2226 with Senators Gray Tollison (D-District 9) and Sidney Albritton (R-Dist. 40) that would add "salt" to the list of Schedule I narcotics, and assign appropriate penalties.

According to Sen. Wilemon this week, the bill has been given to the Drug Policy Committee for review, and he hopes it will be brought before the full senate for consideration very soon.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors has also considered taking action to outlaw the substance, but opted to see how state legislation efforts progress.

## County Elected Officials Salaries Determined by State Law

With the county elections this year, several people have been by the county payroll clerk's office checking on how much the various county offices pay.

All the county office salaries are set in some way by the state, and are based on population, or assessed valuation of the county.

Supervisors and Justice

Court judges' salaries are set by the state based on the county's assessed valuation, according to the Mississippi Code.

In Tishomingo County, all five of the county supervisors, the two justice court judges, and the county prosecuting attorney are paid \$40,400, each, annually.

Supervisors' salaries can only change if the valuation of the county changes, or if the legislature passes legislation to do so.

The Sheriff's salary, according to Mississippi Code 25-3-25 (1)(f), is \$60,000 a year based on Tishomingo County's population of 19,000 in the last census. The code dictates this amount for counties with populations between 15,000 and 25,000.

The salaries of the Tax Collector and Tax Assessor are based on the assessed county valuation, which is currently \$147,000,000. The Tax Collector earns \$52,500 a year, and the current Tax Assessor, Diana Turner, makes \$54,500. The state allows up to \$2,500 more for an assessor if they are certified in certain state assessor and reappraisal programs, said Purchasing Clerk Lynn West.

The Chancery Court Clerk and Circuit Court Clerk are paid a percentage of the fees their offices collect for services, like filing a deed with the county, or with court fees on each case that comes through. They are capped at \$90,000. Both clerks were not available to provide average recent annual figures, at press time.

### To Judge or Not to Judge

Two positions for justice court judge are available in Tishomingo County this year. All that is necessary to qualify for justice court judge is:

- You are a qualified elector
- You have a high school diploma or GED
- You have been a resident of the county two years preceding the day of the election
- You do not have to be a judge or an attorney. In fact, you do not have to have any legal experience at all. You can be a carpenter, a factory worker, unemployed, etc.; it doesn't matter.
- The job pays \$40,400 a year, and you only have to

work a few days a month. Contrary to what many people have heard or believe, you can live anywhere in the county and run for south or north end justice court judge. There are no district requirements.
