## Wilson Home Destroyed by Fire Early Monday

The home of Adam and Sara Wilson, at 59 County Road 957 (Crusher Road), was destroyed completely by a fire early Monday morning.

At 3:26 a.m., Midway Volunteers got the call, and when they arrived, the fire was already partly involved, according to Mid-

way Chief Harry Bowman. They made two initial interior attacks, but the ceilings gave way, he said.

No one was hurt in the fire. The owners were away, and Mr. Wilson's mother, who was staying there, was awakened by the smoke alarms and got out safely, said Bowman.

The cause of the fire is under

investigation, but they believe it was electrical in origin, said Bowman.

Paden, Tishomingo, Snowdown-Pleasant Hill Volunteers, and the Iuka Fire Department all responded to help Midway fight the fire.

## Iuka Woman Charged with Abuse Sentenced Five Years on Unrelated Charges

An Iuka mother charged with child abuse and neglect was sentenced to jail, for unrelated charges, in a revocation hearing last Tuesday.

Jennifer Hale Belue, 30 was on probation for "uttering a forged instrument," so the felony charges of abuse automatically revoked her probation, explained court officials. She has been in the Tishomingo County Jail since the arrest.

Belue was charged with child abuse and felony neglect, when

Iuka Police arrested her January 3rd after finding her three-year-old in a critically injured condition in the home.

For breaking her probation agreement, Judge Thomas Gardner sentenced her to ten years in the custody of the Mississippi Department of Corrections, and suspended five. She must serve five years, and he ordered her to a restitution center upon release.

She will be tried at a later date on the abuse charges.

Courtroom observers said that Belue showed no emotion

during the proceedings.

Johnnie Lee Massengill, who also was charged with felony abuse in connection with the case, has been bound over for grand jury action, said Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock. Since he was bound over for grand jury, he is now a state prisoner, and has been moved to Monroe County, for his and other prisoners protection, said Whitlock.

Family members report that the child is out of the hospital and recovering.

Willie Stricklin, 72, of Burns, pled guilty to one count of embezzlement and was sentenced to 12 months with MDOC, all of which were suspended. He must complete five years post-release supervision, register as a

## Mike Tagert Wins Transportation Commissioner Post in Tuesday's Rainy Runoff

In Tuesday's runoff election for Northern District Transportation Commissioner, Mike Tagert beat John Caldwell, Sr. with 53 percent of the vote.

In Tishomingo County, with 19 of 19 precincts reporting, Tagert received 473 votes, to Caldwell's 228. Turnout was low, due to heavy rain most of the day; of Tishomingo County's registered, active voters, only about 6 percent voted, according to Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk Donna Dill.

Tagert will fill nearly the last year of a four-year term of Bill Minor, who died in October. In November, the commissioner post will again be on the ballot for a new four-year term.

Since they were both Republicans, it may have seemed there was not much difference between the two, candidates. But Tagert, is currently Executive Director

for the

Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway Authority, and is no doubt more familiar with Tishomingo County and Northeast Mississippi, along the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway, and that could mean great things for the county.

"We have not only the Waterway, but so much shoreline here, it will be great to have someone with the knowledge of how important water resources are to commerce and transportation," said Martha

## Booneville Man Killed in Friday Wreck in Belmont

A Booneville man died as a result of a collision at Red Bud Road and Highway 25 Friday evening.

Juan Montanez-Flores, 30, of Booneville, was a passenger in a 1999 Honda Civic driven by his brother-in-law, Favian Lopez, also of Booneville, reported Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon. He reported the time of death to be 5:27 p.m.

Lopez was eastbound on Red Bud Road attempting to

cross Highway 25 when they entered the path of a northbound Ford work truck driven by Chester Newcomb, of Iuka.

Lopez, who was airlifted from the scene, said he thought that the crossing was a four-way stop, said Wilemon.

The work truck was owned by Parsons' Earthworks, of Iuka, and Newcomb, along with three others, were returning to Iuka from a job in Fulton, said Wilemon. None of them were seriously injured.

The Belmont Lady Cardinals finished their regular season by defeating Burnsville for the Tishomingo County Championship. They then played their first game in the Five-County Tourney on January 25th against Walnut. The Cardinals defeated them 53-21. Elisiah Jones was the leading scorer with 17 points. Morgan Stephens had 15 points, Kerisa Thrasher had 5 points, Katie Lee - 4 points, Katelyn Nunley - 4

points, Nicole Moody - 2 points, Marcy Thorn - 2 points, Madison Poole - 2 points and Cassandra Smith 2 points. They played West Union on Thursday night and defeated them 53-27. Elisiah Jones was the leading scorer with 20 points. Morgan Stephens and Kerisa Thrasher had 10 points each, Katelyn Nunley had 8 points, Marcy Thorn and Katie Lee had 2 points each. Nicole Moody had 1 point.

The Cardinals then played on Friday evening against Corinth and won 39-26. Elisiah Jones was the leading scorer with 15 points. Kerisa Thrasher had 10 points. Morgan Stephens had 8 points, Katie Lee had 4 points and Nicole Moody had 2 points.

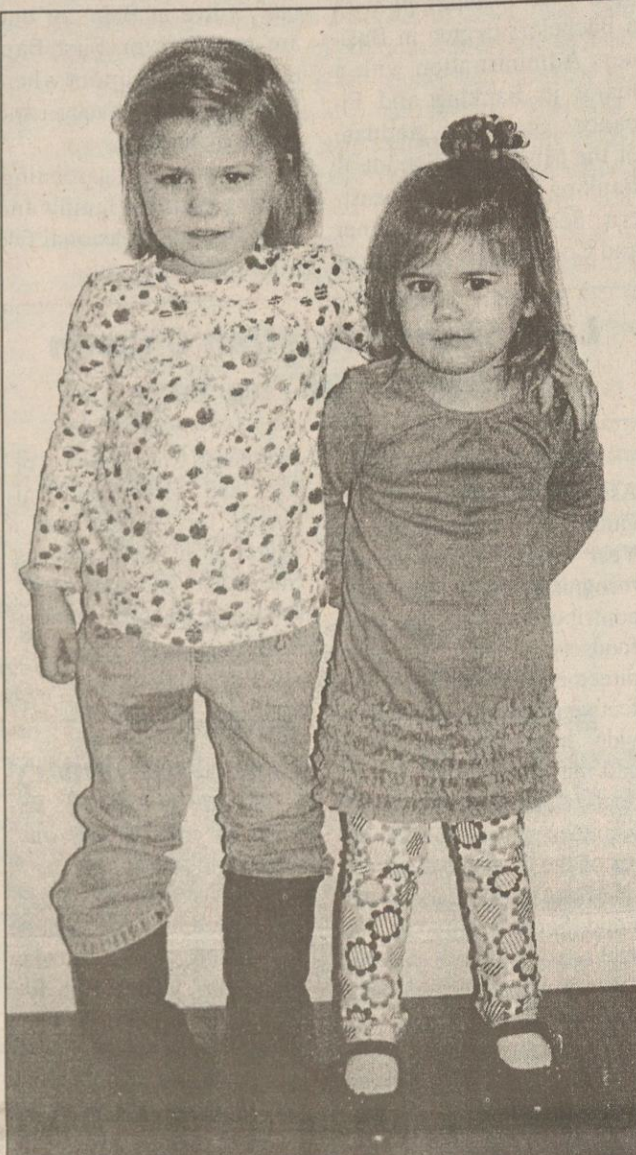

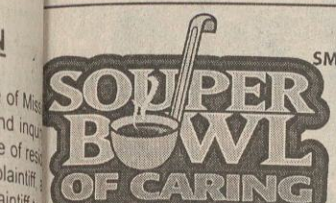

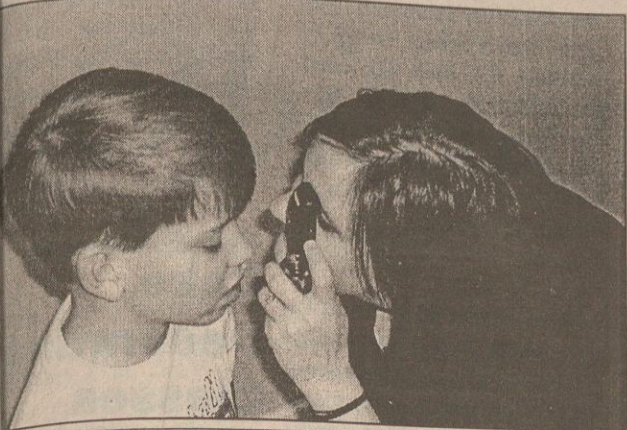

## Conservation Corner

The Pre History of Hunting and Fishing, Part 2  
by James L. Cummins

Last week, we explored the prehistory of hunting and fishing from 8,000 to 1,000 B.C. Now, let's review the period from 1,000 B.C. to 1,000 A.D., which is termed as the Woodland Period.

Hunting, gathering and fishing continued by the

means mentioned last week for hundreds of years until around 700 A.D. when the bow and arrow were introduced and implemented in hunting. The ease of use and efficiency of this weapon made it the favorite of hunters and warriors alike.

Let's advance to the pe-

riod of 1,000 to 1,542, which is called Mississippian. During this period, Indians learned how to hunt by the rivers and use them for transportation. Dugout canoes were crafted from cypress and sycamore and they also designed traps for

fishing. As they became more dependent on agriculture and other fishing methods, hunting became more of a recreational activity.

Fish weirs and traps were made of wood. Sharpened stakes of pine, hickory and sweetgum were placed in streams and small rivers with the stakes forming a funnel. At the small end, which was downstream, a cane trap was placed to catch the fish.

Next, was the period of European Exploration, which occurred from 1542 to 1650. The Europeans brought with them devastating diseases that the Indians had no resistance to and their populations were decimated. It was also during this period that the Indians used deer drives to hunt. They would form a "U" shape and close the circle and then walk inward, forming a small circle, where the deer could be easily shot. Another method to hunt deer was to use the head and hide of a deer and stalk them with bow and arrow. Finally, fire was used to drive deer and other game to a river or over a cliff.

Of all the meats, deer

was the most esteemed. The flesh was cooked, dried or smoked. The skin was used for clothing. Antler tips were used for arrow points. Dried sinew and entrails were used for bow strings, thread for sewing and for fish nets.

Bear was also useful. The skins were used for winter robes and bed coverings. The skin was also good for moccasins and hunting boots. Bear oil, which was made from fat, was used for cooking, dressing the hair and as a body rub.

Fish were speared with a gig, somewhat resembling today's frog gig. They sometimes poisoned the fish by grinding up nuts from the Buckeye tree and placing this powder in the water. They had learned that this would kill the fish from lack of oxygen but would cause no harm to the meat.

As you go out in the woods to hunt or on a lake to fish, try envisioning what it must have been like for our ancestors. You will realize just how far we have come. It is truly amazing.

Also, on May 1, 1896 Henry Roach deeded (donated) one-half an acre of land "to the citizens of Burnsville and vicinity". According to the county records Mr. Roach died November 1907 but the location of his burial site is unknown, possibly an unmarked grave at Burnsville Cemetery.

We have not yet determined if the Hines Family (Black-African American) portion of the cemetery is part of the properties donated by the above gentlemen or was part of another deed.

### How Many Disciples Said They Would Die With Jesus?

Often we hear people talk about Peter's denial of Jesus, which was definitely a wrong thing for a follower of Jesus to do. It may not have occurred to some people, however, that Peter was not alone in his commitment to go with Jesus all the way to death, if need be.

Matthew 26:35 says, "Peter said unto Him, Though I should die with Thee, yet will I not deny Thee, Likewise also said all of the disciples." Perhaps some people have never noticed that Peter was brought into the presence of the high priest by John (John 18:15-18). Peter was put into a place to be asked whether he were one of Jesus' disciples, while the other disciples never faced this exact temptation.

I do not doubt the good intentions of Peter and the other disciples, when they all said that they were willing to follow Jesus, even to the point of dying with Him, if need be. It may not be good for any of us to say

too much about our willingness to sacrifice for Christ, especially to the point of dying for His cause. When we get into the actual place of "laying our lives on the altar", we often flinch at the very prospect of giving up our physical lives for the cause of Christ.

We are often too eager to criticize others who may not have been too brave in the face of persecution or death, when we really do not know what it is like to face such opposition of Satan and his followers. It may be that

many of us would hope that we would be bold enough to die for the cause of Christ, but we might not be quite brave enough, should we face the chop block!

My challenge at this moment to all of God's children is that we use whatever boldness we have to live for Jesus, in the face of the opposition we are facing at the present time by the world of the unsaved around us. It is not likely we would die for Jesus, unless we are willing at this moment to live for Him! The need of the hour in America is for more people who will stand up and be counted as His followers by our willingness to stand up for the teaching of the Word of God!

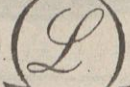

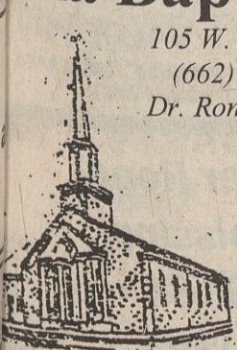
