## Arrest Made in Holt Murder Investigation

After 15 months of investigation, authorities have finally made an arrest in the 2009 murder of John Holt of Burnsville.

Holt, 84, was brutally beaten in his own home the night of December 22, 2009. Cause of death reported by the coroner at the time was blunt force trauma to the head.

Tuesday evening, around 7 p.m., Tishomingo County deputies and Burnsville Police arrested Linda Holt at her home in Burnsville, and charged her with

murder, said Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock. She is in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail, and bond had not been set at presstime.

Linda Holt is the widow of John Holt's adopted son, Wendell, who is deceased, explained family members.

Another person of interest in the continuing investigation is in custody for an unrelated conviction, said Whitlock. Other arrests in the case are certain to follow, he said.

"We appreciate the coop-

eration and diligence it took to finally get a break in this case," said Whitlock. "Thanks to the Burnsville Police, and the Mississippi Bureau of Investigation, along with my deputies, who have put hundreds of manhours, and months of investigation time into this one case."

"We got the call last night from Deputy Reynolds that there had been a break in the case, and that an arrest had been made," said a family spokesperson. "We are just so glad they finally had whatever they needed to arrest

her."

Several coincidental events happened following the Holt murder.

January 21, 2010, Linda Holt and her daughter, Terry L. Sparks, 32, were arrested by Corinth Police for uttering a forgery, when they tried to cash a check written on John Holt's account, and another where the \$40 amount

had been altered to \$140 on a check from Holt's account, according to reports at the time.

February 28th of 2010, firefighters responded to a fire at the former home of John Holt. Another family was living there at the time, and all escaped safely from the early Sunday morning fire.

The state fire investigator ruled that fire accidental.

## Vandiver Determined Fit for Trial for Whitlock Murder

Joel Vandiver, charged with the June 2008 murder of Hezzie Whitlock has been determined fit to stand trial, according to the district attorney's office.

Vandiver, 31 this year, allegedly shot Mr. Whitlock in his own living room, and it was witnessed by Whitlock's wife, who was in the room at the time, according to reports.

A mental health evaluation

was requested following his arrest, and Vandiver has been receiving treatment at the Mississippi State Hospital, in Whitefield.

"They have determined the legal issue of whether he has been treated sufficiently to assist his attorney in his defense," said Assistant District Attorney Arch Bullard Tuesday.

Vandiver remains in custody, said Bullard.

## IDEA Hears Advice from Tupelo Main Street Leader Brangenburg

Members of the newly organized Iuka Development and Economic Association (IDEA) heard interesting information about Main Street programs, and local information about zoning and property cleanup issues in Iuka.

Debbie Brangenburg, who has lead the Tupelo Main Street Association for 19 years, chaired the Elvis Presley Festival, and worked with the Tupelo Redevelopment Program (Fairpark area), told the group some basic principals to follow to help them get started up.

Brangenburg, who has a cabin at Eastport, and said she loves Iuka, was supportive of IDEA and helped point the group toward some goals. She advised them of possible issues that they may need to work through as they begin what is hopefully a long term of improving Iuka, and its economic health, in cooperation with the city leaders.

She said that one of Iuka's greatest strengths is the constant influx of tourists and weekenders that go to lake homes. Working toward drawing those people into town with retail and services that appeal to them, and getting the word to those people is some-

thing the group should prioritize, she said.

The group also heard from Brian Grissom, Iuka Fire Chief, Flood Plains Director, and Zoning Administrator. Grissom told the group of the procedures the city has been following to get nuisance or dangerous properties cleaned up.

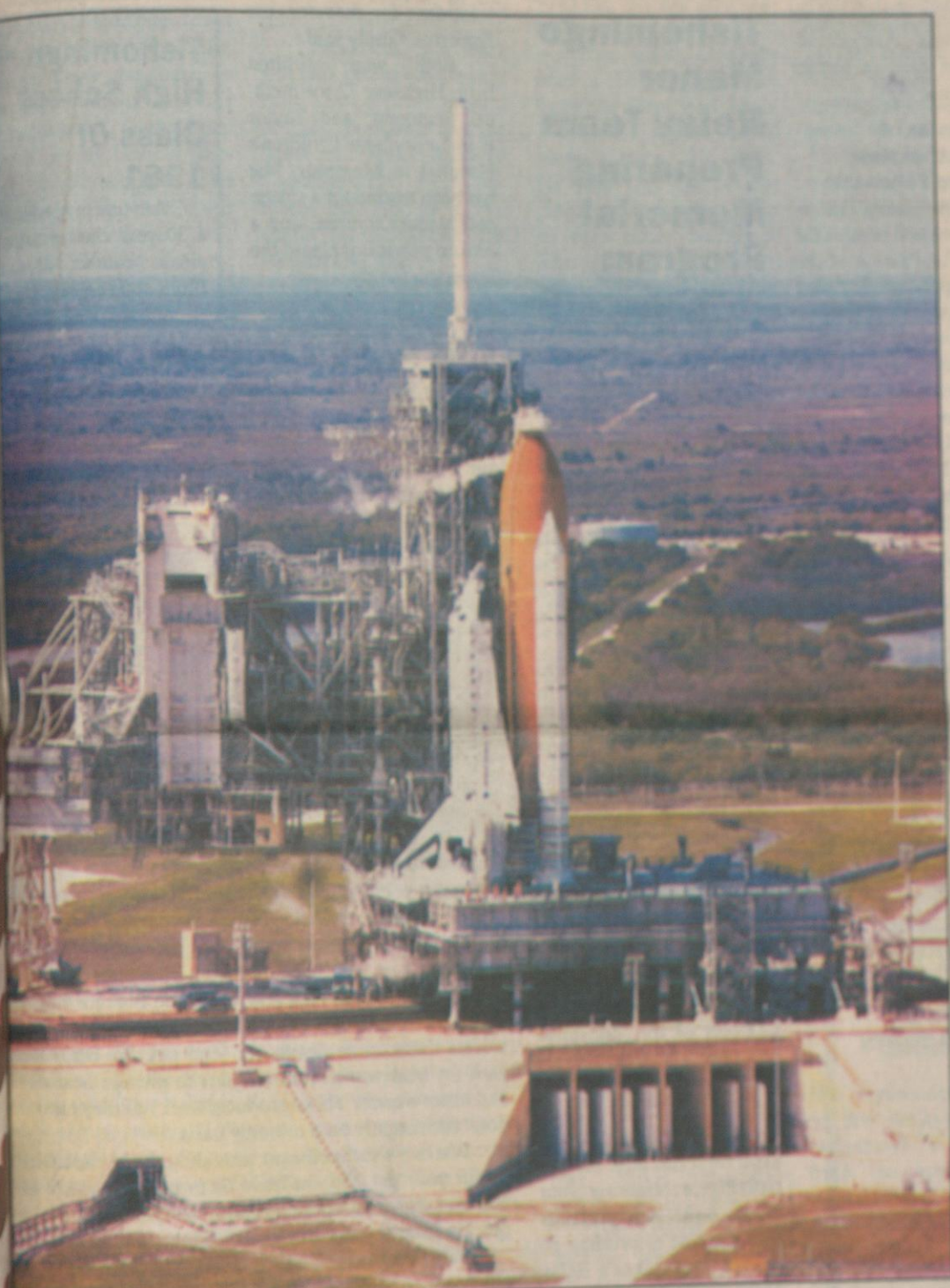
After proper notification procedures, which take about 30 days to complete, the city can clean up the property itself, if the owner is not responsive to city requests, and assess the cost to the owner's property taxes. The state legislature allowed the cities to have this ability, Grissom said.

Grissom said there have been about 6-7 reported cases, and that in all the cases so far the landowners have been responsive and cooperative.

"I've found if you are nice to people, they are pretty cooperative," he said.

Attendance at the meeting was a little less than usual, probably due to baseball and softball practices beginning.

## Iuka's Speece on Final Inspection Team for Discovery's Last Launch

Iuka native Robert Speece, was a member of the final inspection team for the last launch of the space shuttle Discovery on February 24, 2011.

Robert, a graduate of Iuka High School and Ole Miss, joined the NASA Kennedy Space Center teams as an Aerospace Engineer in 1987 working for the External Tank, Solid Rocket Booster and Mechanical System Branch.

His career at Kennedy Space Center started in 1979 as a Design Engineer for Planning Research Corporation in the Fluids Systems Design group. He joined the Martin Marietta External Tank engineering team in 1981, and moved to Lockheed in 1984.

Today he is still responsible for providing engi-

neering expertise and technical services to the Space Shuttle Program and other programs. He reports that some of his most memorable times at NASA have been serving on the Ice/Frost/Debris Team, (now called the Final Inspection Team), where he has been working since 1981.

Robert is the son of Frankie Speece of Iuka, and the late Bob Speece. Frankie and her sister, Billie Schell, of Jonesboro, Georgia attended the final launch of Discovery.

## UDC MEETING TOPIC: Marines for the Confederacy

The John Marshall Stone 394, United Daughters of the Confederacy met February 15, 2011 at the Iuka Library.

Mrs. Eunell Handy, President called the meeting to order. She led the pledge of allegiance to the American Flag. The salute to the Mississippi flag was led by Sarah Wildman and Sharon Hairrell led the pledge to the Confederate flag. The UDC Ritual was read by the president and chaplain.

Sarah Wildman, Secretary read the minutes from the previous meeting. They were approved as read. Jessica Wildman gave the treasurer's report. It was accepted as given. Mrs. Handy reported one applicant is working on her application papers.

Mrs. Vicky Durham read a Thank You card from the family of Mike Wildman who passed away January 21, 2011. He was the son of our president and father of two other members. Thoughts of concern were expressed for Mrs. Lessie Newcomb, UDC member who has returned home after a stay in the nursing home for rehabilitation.

There was no old business.

New business included a memo regarding the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the War Between the States. We are reminded of events each month that took place 150 years ago. It was in January, 1861 that Mississippi seceded from the Union and Mississippi's secessionists took over the Federal installations on Ship Island in the Gulf of Mexico.

February 1861, the governor commissioned the officers of the 2<sup>nd</sup> MS Infantry. These were men from Tishomingo, Itawamba, Tippah and Pontotoc counties.

The Mississippi Division UDC will be putting together an ancestry book of the MS daughters and their confederate ancestors. More information will be coming later.

Two certificates of awards were read, (1) 2<sup>nd</sup> place for most monuments dedicated and (2) 2<sup>nd</sup> place for newspaper coverage. We extend our thanks to the Tishomingo County News for their generous coverage of our events and programs.

There being no further business, Miss Sarah Wildman presented our program entitled, "Marines for the Confederacy".

The Confederacy Provisional Congress authorized creation of the Confederate States Marine Corps on March 16, 1861. It was helped by "old corps" officers who resigned from the U.S. military and offered their services to the South.

Among these were four captains, seven first lieutenants, and four second lieutenants.

Captain Lloyd J. Beall was selected as commander of the Confederate Marine Corps. His first and major problem was money. It was difficult to obtain badly needed clothing and supplies. These were ordered from time to time but some were lost at sea.

The marines served with the navy battery attached to General Joseph E. Johnston's Army at Centreville, Virginia and at stations scattered along the coast of the Carolinas and Georgia. They were involved in naval battles in the spring of 1862. After several confrontations with the naval units, the marines served for the next two years primarily in the coastal garrison, doing routine duty and serving as security guards about various vessels.

During the War Between the States, the material needs of the Confederate States Marine Corps were neglected, and sadly, its story has equally been neglected. Records were lost and/or destroyed making it difficult to document many of their battles.

They fought hard, maintained discipline and unquestionably lived up to their heritage, leaving behind a legacy of honor and courage which its services could carry into civilian life.

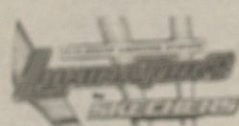

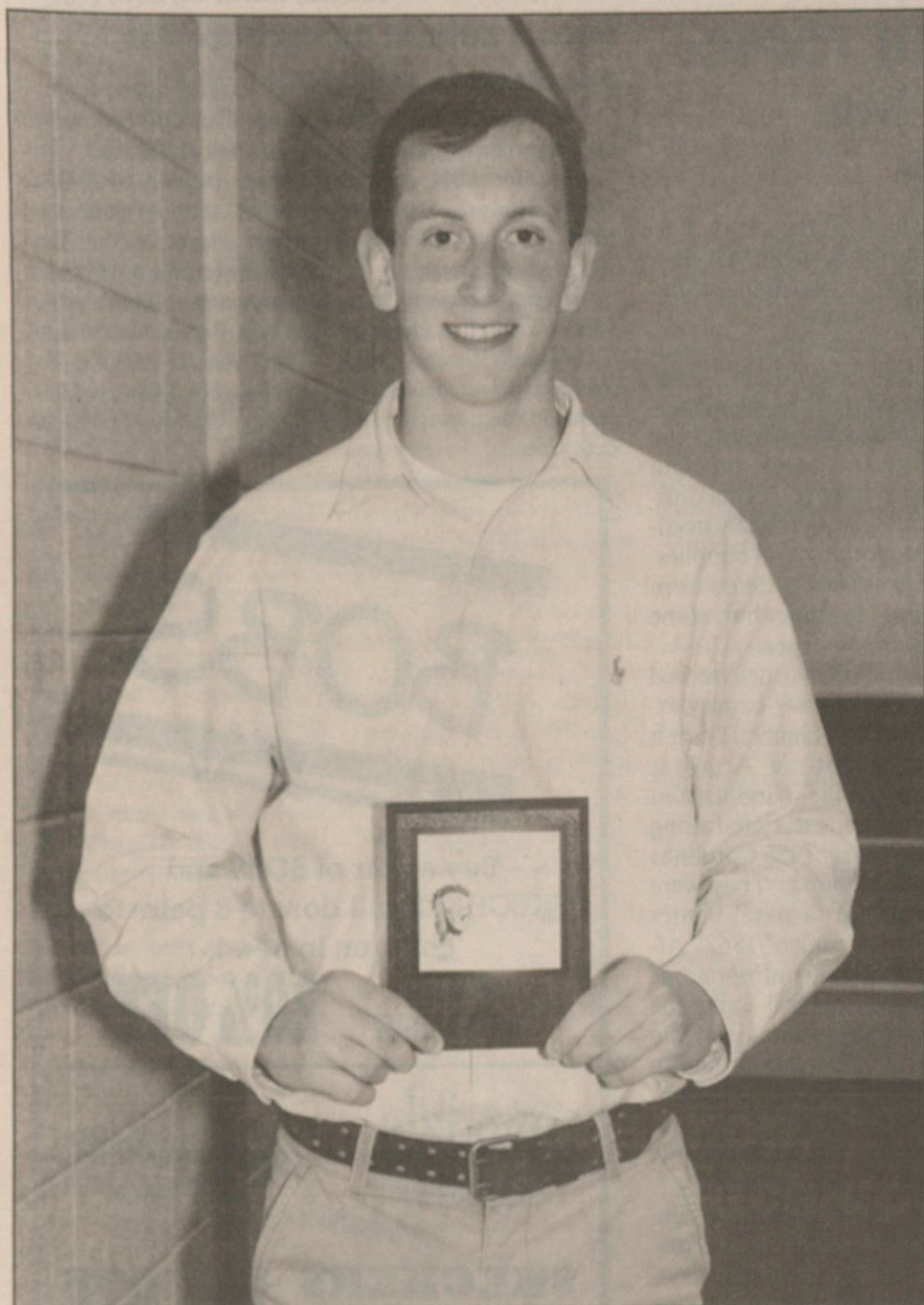

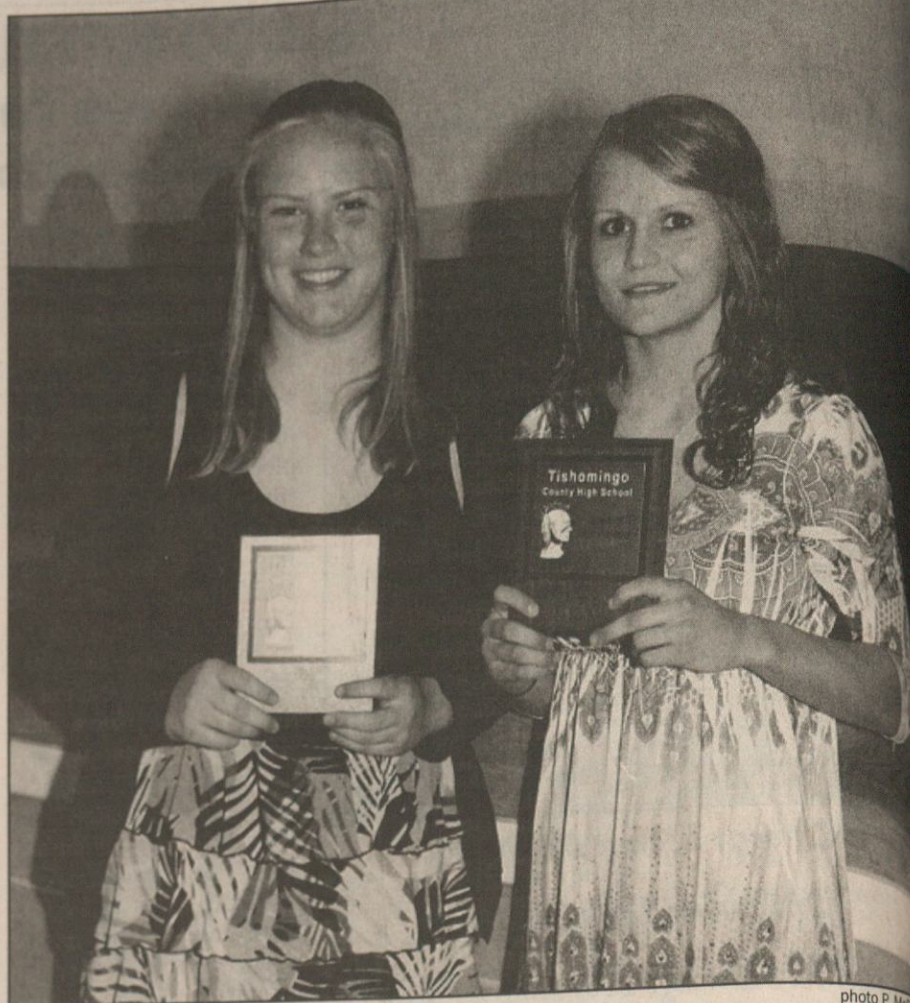

## Unmasked! Walker Among MSU Students to Show Final Work

People are usually most easily identified by their appearance. One has blond hair, another has brown eyes, and one has freckles. 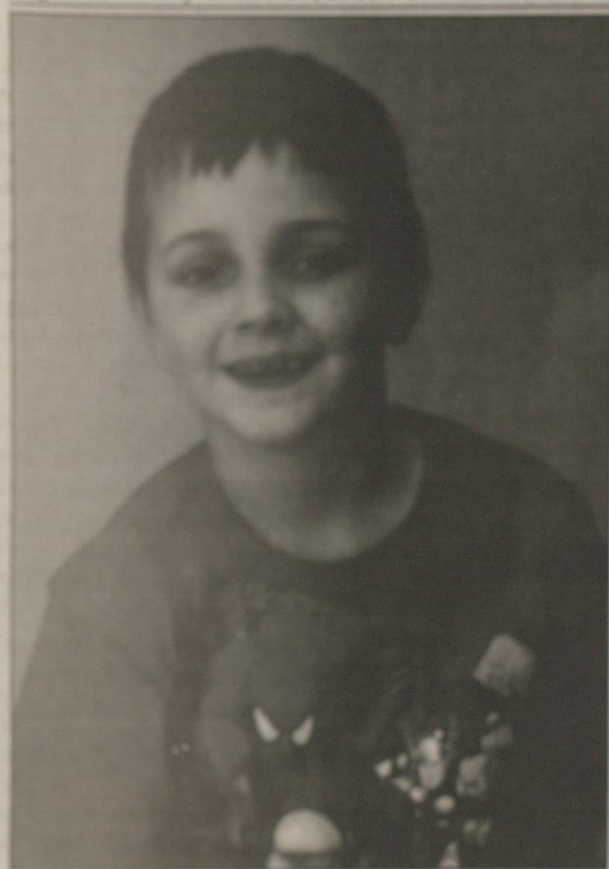

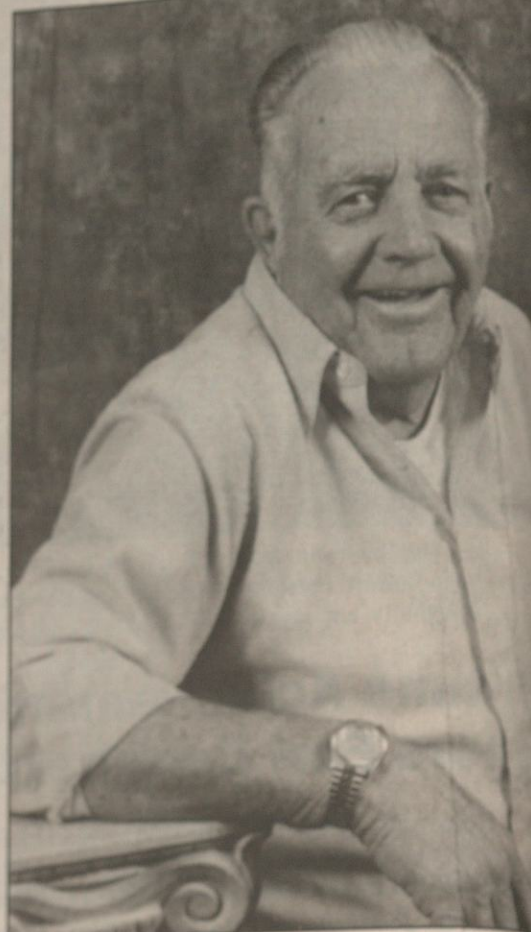

# Jackson Segars to Film "Evergreen" in June

"Evergreen," a short film set in Mississippi, will begin shooting in June, and writer/director Jackson Segars hopes to follow the steps of generations of Mississippi storytellers with the film inspired in part by his growing up years in Tishomingo County.

Segars, the son of Dr. Scott and Diane Segars, of Iuka, is a student at New York University's Tisch School of the Arts, one of the most prestigious and renowned film schools in the nation. He is gathering support for his original film project that he hopes will depict Mississippi and its people in a more complex light than the world usually sees.

"I'm always astounded when I try to think of films which have lent a comparably accurate or intelligent

a man struggling with the impending departure of his girlfriend Addy and with his duties to his aging father Jefferson, the patriarch of the declining family farm, who tasks Daniel with firing Riley, an old friend and farmhand. Meanwhile, Daniel's little brother Dalton and Riley's son explore the dense hill country backwoods in this meditation on legacy, love, and loss.

This mindset has drawn Segars back to the hill country of Mississippi for his story of Daniel Ames. Ames is

a chapter or short story, he explained. It sounds like a story that can be expanded, and will surely only whet the interest of the viewers, leaving them wanting to know more, and Jackson said that was a possibility, but right now he has his hands full with the business of directing, writing and producing the film.

Segars has some funding from NYU, but he and his crew are inviting investors in the project on an IndieGoGo website ([www.indiegogo.com/Evergreen](http://www.indiegogo.com/Evergreen)). Contributors can donate any amount, and be mentioned in the credits at certain levels.

Contributors will have the chance to receive souvenirs from the film, like scripts, or still photos from the filming process, done by another native Iuka artist, Caroline Walker, who

grew up with Segars here in Iuka.

"It's a chance for people to be involved in a film," explained Segars in an interview Tuesday. "They can support the project, and be more involved than purchasing a DVD."

Jackson was in town this week, spending time between his parents' and in Oxford doing casting for the film. Filming will be in June, in Como, Mississippi, just this side of the Delta. After wrapping up the filming by July, there will be a long editing process, but Segars plans to have it completed in the fall.

Segars plans to direct professionally someday, and with the NYU experience, he'll be well on his way. NYU film school alumni include Spike Lee, Martin Scorsese, Oliver Stone, Ang Lee, and many others.

The rigorous, intensive, and comprehensive curriculum at NYU is responsible for turning many of the students today into the filmmakers of tomorrow.

Jackson had to compete with 250 other film students for the NYU support and equipment to do Evergreen, which will be the culminating project of his film school career. He's learning much about the business of filmmaking, soliciting investors, and managing all aspects of the film's production, though he does have an actual producer, cinematographer and other crew members on board.

Segars plans to submit the film to not only national film festivals, but also to regional ones in Starkville, Oxford, and Tupelo. A local viewing may be possible after completion, too, he said.

## Review 'Maggie's House' is a Soundtrack of Small-Town Memories

Local artists Frank and Eddie Thomas are releasing a new album that sounds like the soundtrack for a movie about life in small-town Mississippi.

"Maggie's House" is a collection of just a few of the dozens of songs that Eddie Thomas has written over the past 35 years, and it offers a timelessly classic sound throughout the ten-song collection. Recorded, engineered and mixed by Frank, it's at times country, and sometimes a little jazzy. But the album always manages to sound like what you'd hear coming from inside the screen door, as you sit on a porch swing in the country.

The talented Thomas brothers are nationally known for projects like

"Angels on the Backroads", a collection of celebrated blues songs played and recorded in historic landmarks throughout the Mississippi Delta, and "The Natchez Trace: A Road Through the Wilderness," a narrative and musical accompaniment designed to listen to during a drive down (or up) the Trace.

Most recently, the brothers Thomas enjoyed internet acclaim with a Telly award for their "Pennsylvania" video project in June of 2010.

But this album, which Frank says is named after "Maggie's House - a real place in an imaginary sort of way," is purely Eddie's poetic words with his own accompaniment, often on acoustic guitar. Recorded right here in Iuka, the world

class, folk-inspired music is combined with lyrics that could easily stand as sweet poetry on their own. The melodies evoke images of life; of family times, party times, private and public times.

"Marie" and "You and Me" make you feel like you are dancing close with your sweetheart - maybe wearing one of those full-skirted dresses of the fifties and sixties, on a gymnasium floor. But lyrics like "my heart fell away right from the start, the very first time I danced with you in the dark" and "My life began with you," from "You and Me" have a timeless ability to melt a romantic's heart.

The music is overflowing with references to hill country life like evenings at the drive-in, grabbing nabs



and NuGrape, 4-H clubs, coon dogs howling, and whippoorwills. There's even a lenient sheriff at the door who offers more ice (for the party) from the machine down at the station, and the troublesome process of trying to remember where you hid your jar of White Lightning. Eddie includes just enough conversational abbreviations, soft drawl to his words, and poor subject/verb agreement (that we accept as perfectly fine 'round here, even from learned folks like school teachers,) that we feel right at home.

Most disturbingly, Thomas paints pictures of dancing around the kitchen to the radio or a jug band that I personally wonder if he's been driving down my own little country road on Saturday night during the

bluegrass show on public radio! He assures me he has not, but that is how realistic it seems, even to even my limited experience in Tishomingo County.

**The Release**

"Maggie's House" will officially be released Monday, April 11th at a very special Friends of the Iuka Library Lunch Break, from 11 to 1 p.m. Albums will be available at a special price of \$12, and Frank and Eddie will be available to sign copies. At 12:15, Frank and Eddie will perform songs from the album live, for free.

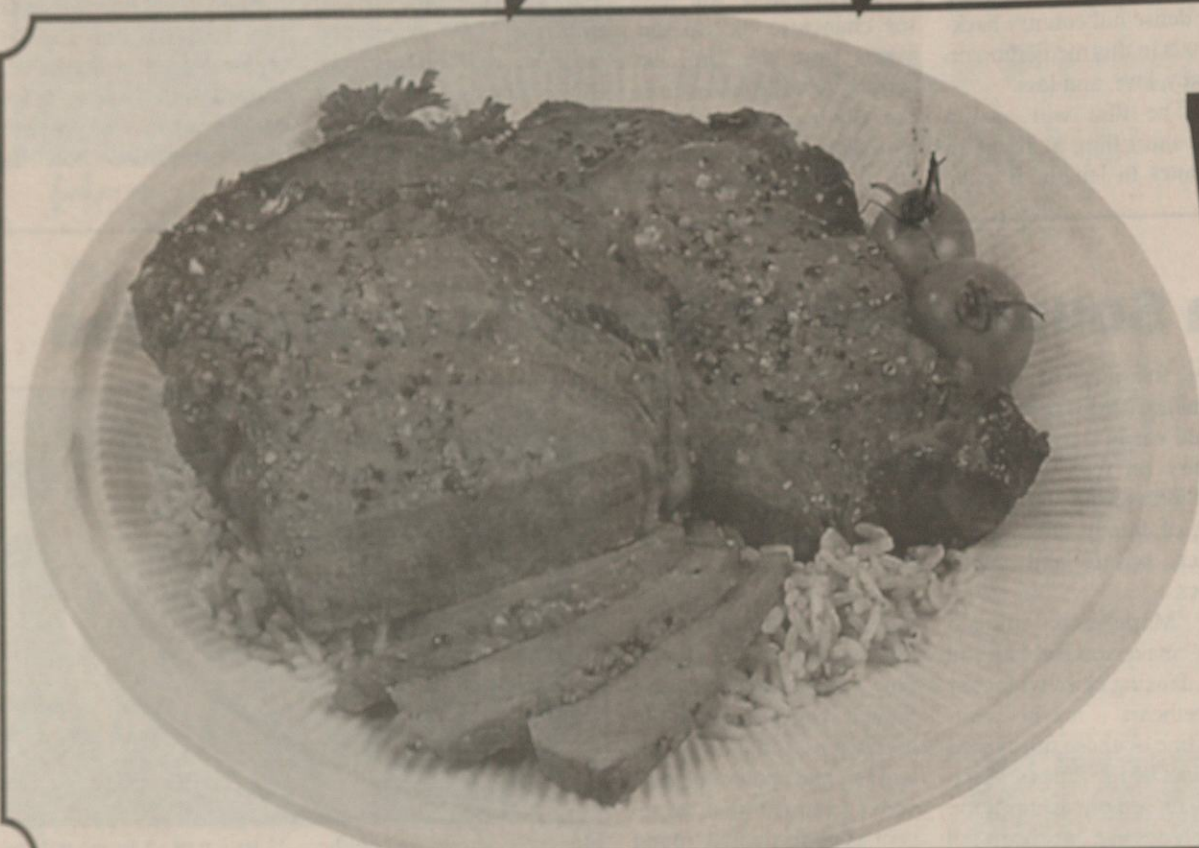

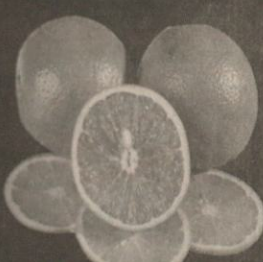

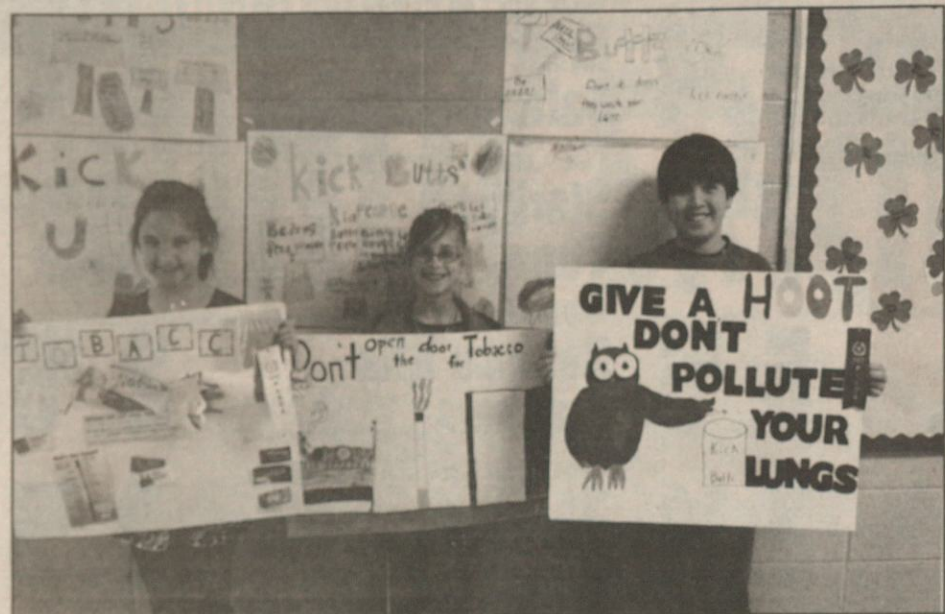


# Students Win “Kick Butts” Poster Contest

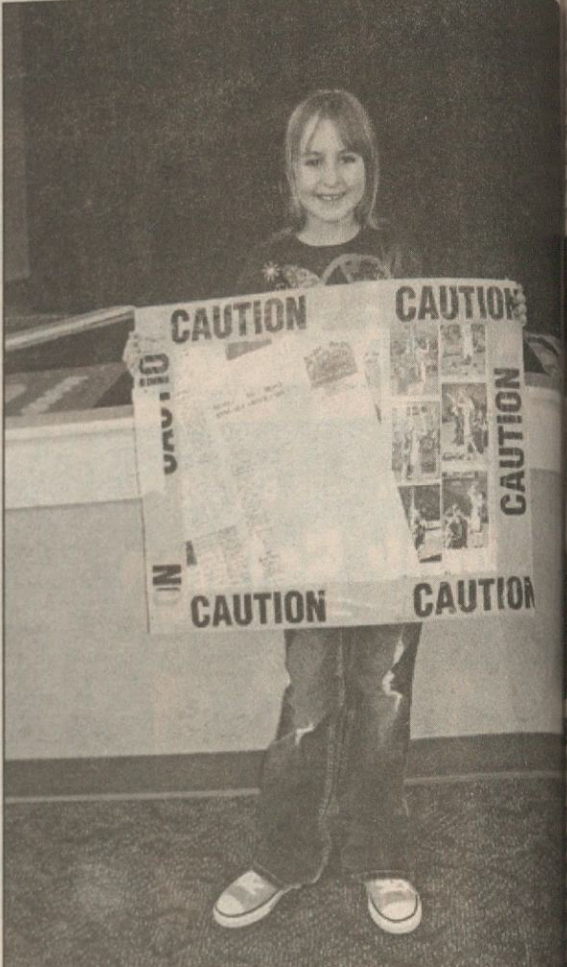

### Five Simple Steps To Cut Down On Gas Costs

Gas prices are rising across the country -- and the primary reason is the cost of fuel. While both supply and demand for gasoline have risen in the United States, worldwide demand for oil is up and the supply of crude oil is down. Middle East turmoil and loss of supply have further tightened markets. Increased crude oil costs have led to higher mandates for ethanol, which has made gasoline more expensive to make. Fortunately, there are five simple steps that you can take to offset higher gas prices and keep more money in your pocket. Here are five of them:

**1. Drive slower.**  
Driving at high speeds causes your engine to run at more revolutions per minute -- and use more fuel. And when your car is traveling faster, it's facing greater air resistance, which requires the engine to work harder. So don't push the accelerator unless it's an emergency. Driving 55 miles per hour instead of 65 miles per hour can improve your car's economy by about 2 miles per gallon.

**2. Avoid abrupt stops and starts.**  
The jerky-jerky trips most commuters are familiar with just give us headaches -- and cost us fuel. Starting a full stop is a particularly intensive activity for an engine. And the extra gas each time costs quickly adds up to a bigger bill at the pump.

So try to make your car rides as smooth as possible. Use back roads to avoid lights and traffic jams. Keep an ample distance between you and the car in front of you to avoid unnecessary braking and accelerating.

When approaching a red light, try to slow down gradually to avoid a full stop before speeding back up again. And when you're at a full stop, don't gun it after the light turns green -- gradual starts can use up to 40 percent less gas than abrupt ones.

#### 3. Don't overuse your air conditioner.

A vehicle's air conditioner works by compressing a cooling agent. That process requires energy. And in a car, that source of energy is the fuel in your tank.

On a blistering summer day, of course, it's fine to turn on the air conditioner. But once you've cooled down, don't keep the inside of your car at refrigerator-low temperatures. Over-erating low temperatures can reduce a car's fuel economy by up to two miles per gallon.

When it's a nice day, roll down the windows. And make a point to park in the shade.

#### 4. Plan your trips in advance.

Taking a series of short trips instead of a single long one can put many extra miles on an engine. Plan ahead to combine errands and cut down on short trips. Pick the kids up from school, buy groceries, and drop a package off at the

post office in one trip instead of three.

And consider carpooling. When you share a ride you aren't just splitting gas costs -- you're also cutting down on expenses like insurance and taxes and helping the environment.

#### 5. Maintain your car.

Too many American drivers don't get their vehicle the regular tune-ups it requires. Properly maintaining your car can dramatically cut down on gas consumption and save you money.

For example, properly inflated tires can improve fuel efficiency by up to 3 percent. When tires start losing pressure, the engine has a tougher time pushing the car forward -- and thus consumes more gas. The average vehicle on the road right now has its tires under-inflated by over 7 percent, which can cause about a 3 percent loss in fuel economy.

Removing excess weight in the cabin or trunk of the vehicle will also improve fuel efficiency. Simply removing this load can reduce fuel consumption and help to lower emissions.

Gas prices could continue to rise over the next few months. But even if they don't, these five simple steps will help you reduce your fuel consumption -- and conserve your cash.

## Jerry Clower Honored On Mississippi Country Music Trail March 26th

On Saturday, March 26, the Mississippi Country Music Trail will honor Jerry Clower with a marker in Liberty, Miss. The marker ceremony is scheduled for 10 a.m. at One Amazing Grace Lane (Clower's home) with the permanent marker being placed at the intersection of Highway 24 and East Fork Road.

"Jerry Clower's charisma, enduring spirit and clean sense of humor epitomized the warmth and hospitality of Mississippi and our people," said Mary Beth Wilkerson, director of the Mississippi Development Authority's Tourism Division. "As one of the best selling and most popular country comedians of all time, Clower deserves this recognition on the Mississippi Country Music Trail and will live on as an icon of Southern life and humor for audiences worldwide for many years to come."

A Liberty native, Jerry Clower (1926-1998) brought his colorful, observant, comic stories of southern life -- developed as a sales tool as he worked as a fertilizer salesman -- to live shows, recordings, television, best-selling books and, for over twenty-five years beginning in 1973, Grand Ole Opry broadcasts. He became one of the most successful and acclaimed country comedians of all time.

Born Howard Gerald Clower in Liberty on September 28, 1926, and raised on a farm nearby, Clower aspired not to a show business career, but to be an agricultural extension agent

working with 4-H clubs, like those who inspired him as a boy. After serving in the U.S. Navy in World War II, he worked his way through Mississippi State University on a football scholarship, receiving a degree in agriculture. He became the 4-H agent he'd wanted to be, then sold fertilizer for Mississippi Chemical Corporation for 18 years, beginning in 1954. Clower found that his gift for telling colorful, down home stories from his own life and Amite County friends' was a helpful sales tool and an attraction at industry conventions. In 1970, he was recounting some of these tales at a Texas Tech fertilizer industry panel as Big Ed Wilkes, a local radio director, was taping the whole conference. The following year, Wilkes put Clower's monologue out on the local "Lemon" label and eventually forwarded that regional recording to MCA Records, which signed Clower. The resulting album, "Jerry Clower from Yazoo City, Mississippi Talkin'," was on the country charts for thirty weeks.

There would be over two dozen hit albums, his audience expanding as he became a cast member of Nashville's Grand Ole Opry in 1973. Clower would be a prime comedy attraction there for the rest of his life, with a level of fame that also made him a natural, ever-present Southern spokesman in television commercials for trucks, fishing lures and barbecue equipment. Clower's deep, lifelong

commitment to Christianity was reflected not only in his storytelling, but in his 20-year involvement with the Southern Baptist Convention-produced radio and television program "Country Crossroads," his work as a lay minister and his testament and memoir, *Ain't God Good!*

He wrote four bestselling books in all, bringing to the printed page his resonant, rooted style both for fans and literary audiences. Clower was married to Homerline Wells Clower for 51 years and they had four children, Amy, Sue, Katy and Ray. Clower died following heart bypass surgery in 1998.

Much like the Mississippi Blues Trail, which now garners over 120 markers, the Mississippi Country Music Trail celebrates Mississippi's rich heritage of country music legends and chart toppers. The trail will feature a variety of country music artists, including Jimmie Rodgers, Marty Stuart, Mac McAnally, Conway Twitty, Faith Hill, Paul Overstreet and others to comprise the first 30 markers across the state.

## Old Tishomingo Traces

# Mauldin Old Water Mill

Mrs. Eva Burns placed the following information in one of the local Tishomingo County newspapers in about 1962 or so. In her editor's note, she stated that the article was of historical interest, and that the site of the old mill "is in the same area as the 70-acre lake that is being built on Tishomingo State Park property." She further stated that the lake would be near the Natchez Trace Parkway.

About 80 years ago, in 1882, there was an old water mill owned and operated by Mr. John Mauldin. It was located about 200 yards from where the dam site of the 70-acre lake which is under construction

on Mauldin Branch. At present, this property belongs to the Mississippi State Park Commission. This huge wheel, which was estimated to be about 24 feet in height was built by two of Tishomingo County's pioneer citizens, Mr. F. M. Blunt (father of Mr. Dell Blunt, affectionately called "Uncle Dell") and the Mr. J. J. Blunt (an uncle of Uncle Dell's.)

This wheel was composed of several spokes, 21 or more in number, and large wooden buckets were attached to each spoke of this wheel. Streams of water came into these buckets from a wooden trough which was erected from over-

head, causing the wheel to turn, and by so doing, corn and wheat were ground and cotton also was ginned there.

The water wheel was in operation for at least 30 years, and it accommodated the citizens from various communities, either by grinding their corn and wheat or ginning their cotton.

Mr. John Mauldin, owner of this antique mill, passed away 45 or 50 years ago, and he was buried at Highland. When he was a young man, he was married to Miss Martha Tolen and their family consisted of four boys and two girls. They lived within a quar-

ter of a mile of the old water mill. The markings of the old water mill site are still visible.

This information was given by "Uncle Dell" Blunt who lives with his daughter, Reba, at the old homestead at Highland. His age is 88 years, and he also has one sister living, Mrs. Alta McRae, widow of Mr. John T. McRae, age 83.

The old water mill site is two miles east of Highway 25. Natchez Trace Highway will be constructed in sight of the 70-acre lake.

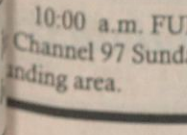
