Vikings Hand Braves First Division Loss

The sound of silence. Total lack of sound or noise. That's what you could hear at the North Pontotoc outfield as a fly to end the Tishomingo County Braves' chance for a winning rally Tuesday night. The Braves had started to rally, but after three innings of scoreless performance against the North Pontotoc Vikings, the Braves' hopes of just one

more run ended quickly, when senior Viking pitcher Kyle Robbins threw a 1-2-3 seventh inning, and that caught fly seemed to just shock the dugout and crowd into silence.

"I was proud of our kids for battling back, but you can't get down 6-0 and play like we did the first three innings, and win," said TCHS Coach Jerry Long.

The loss pushes the Vikings to 3-0 in the challenging 1-4A Division, and extends their winning streak to 13-0.

The Braves record is now 11-3-1, and 2-1 in the division. They meet the Vikings again Friday night, in Ecru.

Lady Braves Dominating

Meanwhile the Lady Braves were advancing their flawless Division record down in Shannon by trouncing the Lady Raiders in only four innings 16-1.

The girls play New Albany (6-8), Thursday at home, and Kossuth (9-2), Friday at Kossuth.

Iuka's Best Headed to Crossroads Chili Cook-Off in Corinth Saturday

Visitors to Saturday's Crossroads Chili Cook-off need to be on the lookout for a bandit.

Kenny Phifer is well known in the chili cook-off world of the Mid-South - as The Chili Bandit. Phifer regularly enters his popular, personal recipe for chili in regional contests, where he, "the Bandit," is purported to promise, "You taste my chili, it'll steal your heart!"

Last October, the folks attending the Paint the Town Pink event at the Old Courthouse ate up several gallons of his chili, Kenny said recently.

"We've kind of developed a following," he admitted.

"If Kenny doesn't win the cook-off, the judges don't know chili," said Teresa McGaughy, one of the organizers of the 2010 Paint the Town Pink event. "He's wonderful! Kenny is always willing to help out, and when he makes his chili it makes the event, no matter what it is!"

Last year, Phifer also participated in the Crossroads Chili Cook-off, and brought home a 2nd place ribbon for his efforts. But, better than that, his chili was voted People's Choice for best chili at the contest, which really pleased him more, he said.

Chili cook-offs are popular event in many downtowns across the region. Tupelo has a big one, and this will be the fourth year for

the Crossroads Chili-Cook Off, according to the Corinth Convention and Visitors Bureau, who organizes the event. Phifer said this is one of the larger festivals in the region.

Phifer is not sharing the recipe, which he says is one he developed himself. He has to cook the contest chili on site, but he cooks several gallons ahead of time to serve to the public at the festival.

In addition to Phifer's participation, local band Coon Dog Funeral will be playing during the festival, which will be from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Corinth Depot. More music will be provided by Breaking Grass, and the Courthouse Pickers.

The Chili Cook-Off will be going on in conjunction with the Corinth Green Market, Corinth's monthly Farmer's Market that happens the first Saturday of each month through November.

For about \$5, visitors will be able to eat samples of the chili contestants' offerings.

What Name Now?

I find, from the internet, there are 8,623 listed churches on the Mississippi Map under the cultural section. There are 88 listed churches in Tishomingo County. We attend the Iuka Baptist Church where Larry was a member when I came here after our marriage. I too am now a member. This map lists both Forest Grove Baptist Church (#554 on USGS topographical map), and Overton Chapel Church (#584). These are churches I attended in my childhood.

I have seen name changes of several churches I knew as a child. In the obituaries and weekly list of churches in Tishomingo County News, the first church I ever attended, one where my grandfather was pastor, is listed as Forrest Grove Baptist Church. This caused a mental dilemma for me because this church was called Forest Grove - like a grove of trees when I was a child. I also attended the Forest Grove School, a short distance from

the church, when I was in first grade. Later the school was dissolved and the children in our family were bussed to Tishomingo Elementary School.

On March 25th I took a bag to pick-up any litter on the Forest Grove Cemetery grounds, and went to see if I could figure all this out. Sure enough, the cemetery sign reads Forest Grove Cemetery. I took photos to substantiate this. I picked up flowers, around family graves dating back to my great-grandparents, evidently scattered by the wind or by a careless lawnmower.

Then I headed over to the church to get further clues. I found the sign by the church reads Forrest Grove Baptist Church. I'm confused. When and why was the church renamed? Does Forrest refer to a civil war hero, a major donor to the church, or Forrest, as a place to rest in God? Or perhaps when the new sign was ordered, an error caused by the sign company or by someone who ordered the sign. I asked my aunt, age 83, about this. She was not aware there had ever been a name change.

I tried to find a hint on the internet but was not able to do so. Does anyone know the answer?

Also, when did Overton Chapel become Bethel Baptist Church? You can

Public Records Are Open to YOU!

The Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983 is a piece of legislation that many people are unfamiliar with, but it is one of the most important rights granted by the legislature to the people of Mississippi. This act is intended to ensure the people's right to know what their public officials are doing.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors is required by law to keep minutes of their meetings, and these minutes are public records. The minutes are kept at the Chancery Clerks Office. In addition, cities are required to keep minutes of their board meetings as are boards of education; all such minutes are public record. I have viewed the minutes of each of these entities several times, and if you are interested in what your public officials are doing on your behalf, you should too.

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department is required to keep a book called the jail docket which lists the name and date of anyone that has been booked into the jail.

Also in the docket, you will find what the person was charged with and, if released, the time of their release. This book is a public record and is freely available for anyone to see. I have looked at the jail docket several times, and if you are interested about knowing who has been booked into the Tishomingo County jail, you can find that information in the jail docket. Incident reports are also public record; these are the initial reports filed by a law enforcement officer concerning an alleged crime. These are not to be confused with investigative reports which are not covered under the public records act, however; these reports can be released by the sheriff's department if they choose to do so.

The Tishomingo County Justice Court Clerk's office keeps documents such as warrants and affidavits, and these documents are public record after the warrant has been served concerning that particular individual. These items are also public record and can be viewed at the justice court clerk's office. I have looked at several documents at this office.

The public records act covers all state, county, and municipal governmental entities and covers many other records that I have not mentioned here. Remember, don't simply take my word or

someone else's word about what your public officials are doing or in some cases not doing, research for yourself and make your own determination. Please visit my website at www.thebigifms.com

Fines Could Increase for Officials Who Fail to File Economic Interest Forms

Elected officials are required annually to file papers disclosing their sources of income to the State Ethics Commission but some elected officials have been late in filing the documents.

Senate and House conferees worked out differences in SB 2596 and increased the fine on political candidates and office holders who do not submit their required "economic interest" forms.

Fines would be increased from \$10 to \$50 per day after 15 days of delinquency.

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is participating in an ongoing statewide effort to identify, locate, and evaluate children, birth through the age of twenty-one, who have a physical, mental, communicative and/or emotional disability. Early identification of children in need of special education experiences is most important to each child. Furthermore, this information gathered from contacts with parents and other agencies will be used to help determine present and future program needs as progress is made toward the goal of providing a free appropriate public education to all children with a disability.

Information which could identify an individual child will be maintained by this agency and will be provided to other agencies only in accord with the Family Rights and Privacy Act and EHA-B. As a parent, you are guaranteed the right to inspect any such information about your child and to challenge its accuracy. Access to this information is forbidden to any unauthorized person without informed consent.

Please contact Debbie Walker, Child Find Contact Person for the Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District, if you know any children who may have a disability by calling 423-3296 or writing her at the following address: Tishomingo County Schools, 1620 Paul Edmondson Drive, Iuka, MS 38852.

The Child Find Person implements child identification, location, and evaluation of children birth through twenty-one who have disabilities, regardless of the severity of their disability, who are in need of special education and/or related services. The Child Find Person works with the local Head Start, Human Services, Health Department, and Mental Health Agencies, as well as local education agencies, physicians, and other individuals to identify and locate children out of school and in school who may be in need of special education services.

Once a referral is made, it is the responsibility of the Child Find Contact Person to insure that the Referral-to-Placement Procedures are followed. She works with the Local Survey Committee at each school to implement these procedures. The following activities briefly described the procedures.

As a part of Child Study, parents are invited to attend a Local Survey Committee Meeting to review a child's educational record and performance and determine a need for an evaluation. Prior to an evaluation, copies of the Parent Information Pamphlet and Procedural Safeguards are given to the parents. District personnel explain these copies to the parents and insure that they understand the Procedural Safeguards. This process will be reviewed at each parent meeting.

After parental consent for testing is obtained, a non-discriminatory evaluation is conducted. Students are evaluated in all areas related to the suspected disability by qualified personnel.

Parents are invited to attend the Eligibility Determination Conference by the Multidisciplinary Evaluation/Eligibility Team to determine if a disability exists. If the child meets eligibility criteria for special education services and/or related services, an Individualized Education Program is developed and the parents are invited to attend the meeting. Parents must sign permission for placement before a child can receive services. Parents, teachers and students participate in the process. All students receiving special education services are reassessed at least once a year and reevaluated at least once every three years.

The Tishomingo County School District provides services to students who have a physical, mental, developmental, communicative, and/or emotional disability. It is the goal of the Tishomingo County School District to provide a free appropriate public education to all children with disabilities through age twenty-one.

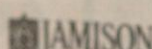
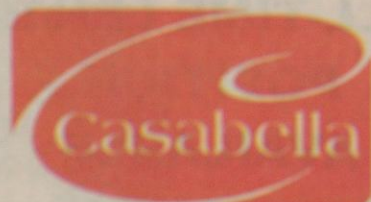
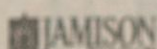
