Storm Slaps County Monday; 3,600 Without Power

A storm system that wreaked havoc from the Midwest to Georgia slapped Tishomingo County Monday with high winds that caused at least 3,600 homes, businesses, and schools to be without power during the late afternoon hours.

The system spawned seventeen confirmed tornadoes across the region, but in Tishomingo County, most all the damage appeared to be caused by straight-line winds.

Damage from downed trees on a 46 Kv line between Burnsville and Holcut caused more than 3,000 homes served by the Tishomingo and Holcut substations to be without power from about 2 p.m. until 4 p.m., said TCEPA General Manager Robbie Grisham. TCEPA crews worked from 2 p.m. until midnight Monday, getting the power back on, and then on Tuesday, they worked on more permanent repairs, including replacing at least six poles.

Over the rest of the county,

about 600 additional customers were without power in scattered areas, said Grisham.

Tishomingo County Schools announced around 1:20 p.m. that school would dismiss at 2 p.m., in an effort to not have students on busses during the storm, but the storm activity developed so fast it was at its peak at that time.

The storms are blamed for deaths in three states.

Tony Bullard, self-taught artist, from Corinth, Mississippi has been drawing pictures all of his life. At the age of 13, he began really concentrating on drawing. He practiced 5 to 7 hours a day after school trying to figure out different techniques.

Tony draws and paints a variety of subjects. His favorites are cars, trains, buildings and country art. He also enjoys drawing & creating original cartoon characters. Over the years, he has created over 30 cartoon characters. He also paints signs.

When Tony began drawing he loved sketching cars. He spent many hours getting the detail just right. At the time, the Dukes of Hazzard were still on TV & the General Lee was one of his favorite cars to draw. He also likes drawing 60s era Camaros & a few other muscle cars.

In the 1980s, he mainly did his artwork using markers & pastels combined and in 1989, he began working in oil paint. He liked the depth & vivid colors in oils. He has painted close to 100 oil paintings with several still unreleased.

In 1993, he took a hiatus from his art work. In the summer of 2002, while on vacation, he saw a real "General Lee" car in one of the towns he went through. He stopped & took photos of it from various angles and that inspired him to

begin drawing again. Since then he has produced more than 100 new pieces.

In 2003, Tony began drawing & painting oils of the Civil War era focusing on Corinth's part in that war. He likes painting Corinth's history from various eras. He has released a Coloring Book on Corinth's history called "Historic Corinth Coloring Book". It is designed to give an overview of Corinth's history from the Civil War to the present. He is now working on paintings from the Battle of Farmington.

In 2010, he released a brand new painting titled, "Hillbilly Show". It is presently on exhibit at the Alcorn County Courthouse. It pays tribute to one of Elvis Presley's visits to Corinth in 1955.

For the past several years, Tony has worked with elementary school students through the LINK organization in Corinth showing them techniques to improve their art skills.

Tony has been showing his art for many years. The Iuka Public Library is pleased to have the month long exhibition. Fredda Sanderson, librarian, invites everyone to visit the library during National Library Week to see Tony's art.

The Easter Bunny will be at the Hunt to bring your camera and make your child's picture.

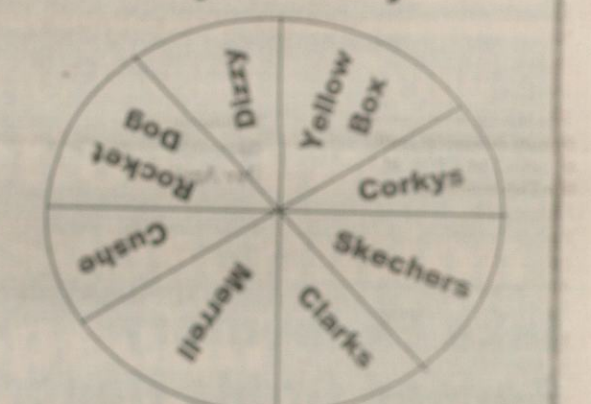
Don't forget the Easter Bonnet/Hat Contest & Parade will begin at 4 p.m. and the Egg Hunt at 4:30 p.m.

Elvis Presley Birthplace Expansion Begins in Spring

TUPELO, MISS. - The Board of Directors of the Elvis Presley Memorial Foundation held a meeting on Wednesday and voted to award the contract for the expansion of the birthplace venue to the apparent low bidder, Panola Construction of Batesville, Miss. The low bid for the base project was \$2,689,000. The Board agreed to accept Alternate #2 for \$38,600.

In additional action, Germantown Contracting's base bid of \$227,000 for audio-visual and theatre equipment, along with an additional alternate for \$21,000, was accepted by the Board.

This will allow the first phase of approximately \$5.6 million in construction at the Birthplace to include an event center, theatre, snack bar, archival storage and administrative space, and two patios for guest enjoyment. The construction is partially funded by \$2.8 million voted by the Mississippi Legislature in 2010 and administrated by the Mississippi Development Authority, along with matching funds from the City of Tupelo, the Elvis Presley Memorial Foundation, the Tupelo Convention and Visitors Bureau, and the Carpenter Foundation.

Construction will begin this spring.

March UDC Meeting

March 15, 2011 was the date of the meeting of the John Marshall Stone 394 chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy.

Mrs. Eunell Handy, President called the meeting to order. Sarah Wildman led the pledge to the American Flag and the salutes to the Mississippi Flag and the Confederate Flag. Mrs. Handy followed with the reciting of the UDC Ritual.

Sarah Wildman, Secretary read the minutes from the February 15, 2011 meeting. They were approved as read. In the absence of the treasurer, Mrs. Handy gave the treasurer's report. It was approved as given. The registrar's report included one prospective member who is working on her application.

The chaplain's report mentioned several friends' illness in the community. We urge everyone to keep these individuals in their prayers, visit and call them often. Also, Mrs. Marguerite Nixon, a former member, passed away. A card was sent to her sister, Mildred Hill.

Old business included a reminder of the Mississippi UDC Division Workshop scheduled for this week-end, March 19th in Jackson, MS. The Mississippi Division Convention will be held in Gulfport, October 30 - November 2nd, 2011.

We are in our 1st year of the 5 year anniversary of the War Between the States. Some of the happenings in Mississippi include, (1) From January 9, 1861 until March 30, 1861, the Bonnie Blue Flag was the unofficial emblem on the sovereign state of Mississippi. (2) March 27, 1861 Mississippi joined the CSA (Confederate States of America). The Magnolia Flag became the state flag and (3) Mississippi ratified the Confederate Constitution.

Miss Sarah Wildman presented our program entitled, "The Old Grey Ghost" as written by Barbara Roebuck McCamish, a member of the Charles S. Stewart 2390, Foley, AL.

There was once a 14,000 pound Confederate cannon that would not die. It is believed that the cannon came from the old federal Mount Vernon Arsenal in Alabama. This arsenal was taken over by the Confederates at the

outbreak of the war. Confederate soldiers had lugged the cannon and two sister guns up river to Fort Stonewall at Choctaw Bluff to defend against the enemy. After the war, a corporal from Illinois who had been stationed in Alabama during the Reconstruction days bought a large plantation at Choctaw Bluff. Several of the Fort's old cannons were on the plantation.

In 1926, a nephew of the plantation owner presented one of the guns called, "Old Grey" to the Alabama Department of Archives and History, asking that it be moved by riverboats and placed on the grounds of the capitol of Alabama in Montgomery.

Over the next few years, a U.S. Engineering boat got the gun aboard but couldn't get rid of it. The boat crew stumbled over the 14,000 pound gun because the water level was never right to unload onto the crumbling cotton docks. In 1928, while trying to unload the cannon, it was dumped into the muddy flats below the Montgomery depot, where it sat for the next 16 years.

Finally in 1942, as Major Roy Jones of Maxwell Air Force Field was heading ashore from a fishing trip, he spotted the bulk of the cannon near the old cotton docks. After checking into the history of the old gun, he petitioned the Alabama Department of Archives and History for the cannon to ornament Maxwell Field's grounds. He was told that if he could get it up, he could have it.

After much work by the Army Engineers, the old grey cannon was brought out of the muddy waters and placed at the entrance to the post headquarters.

In 1956, Maxwell Fields authorities decided to replace it with a jet airplane. After moving again, it has been placed on the grounds of the Department of Archives and History. It is no longer grey, but sports a shiny coat of black paint and sits proudly on the wall overlooking Mobile Bay.

The next meeting of the UDC will be April 19th, 2011 at the Luka Library at 6 o'clock, p.m. Anyone interested in becoming a member is invited to attend.

Working Like The Devil!
