Ershigs Opens New Manufacturing Facility at Tri-State Commerce Park

the company in Iuka.

The fifth of Ershigs' buildings in Tri-State Commerce Park, the 65-foot tall building is designed

to manufacture very large fiber-glass and composite structures. The company invested \$1,262,120 and Tishomingo County invested

\$313,799 in the new facility. Fifty-two new jobs will be created, report officials.

Ershigs, Inc., is a \$100 million per year company that provides high-quality engineered fiber reinforced plastic (FRP) products to the power, chemical, pulp, paper, and waste water industries. FRP provides a strong, lightweight, corrosion resistant and cost competitive alternative to high alloy stainless steel. Primary products are tanks, ducting, piping systems, and chimney liners, all products that are normally too large to ship by highway or rail.

"This facility will allow us to load and deliver a totally complete, fully assembled product to customers by barge – and Ershigs will be the only company that will be able to do that," said Rod Courtney, Ershigs vice-president in his remarks. "This positions Ershigs as the leader in the industry."

"We got a contract to provide this product," said Courtney, "and the county board of supervisors, and engineer Kirby McRae jumped through hoops to make it happen. We couldn't have done it without them, and it's hard to imagine anywhere else we could have done it. The economic devel-

opment support of Tishomingo County is what made this happen."

"Our location on the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway and Tennessee River will give us a competitive edge in bidding on large diameter tanks. We are able to ship any size component anywhere in the world by water," said Ershigs Site Manager Richard Spears.

The huge tank being manufactured at the ribbon cutting is scheduled to be delivered to Newfoundland, explained Courtney.

"The management of Ershigs has shown vision in their product line and the ability to deliver the goods," said Board of Supervisors President James McDowell. "We are proud to have Ershigs as a part of our industrial family and we look forward to years of growth for Ershigs and Tishomingo County."

Tri-State Commerce Park is a 3,500-acre industrial park with more than 400 jobs and seven companies and great potential for growth. There are still available industrial buildings and ready-to-build-on sites with rail and water access.

County Board Joins other Counties & Cities in Effort to Recoup Tax Revenue Lost Section 42 Property Owners

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors opted Monday to join other counties and cities in a statewide lawsuit to try and keep tax revenue that they have been losing, based on a recent interpretation of Senate Bill 3100 by the Mississippi Department of Revenue.

Bill 3100, passed in the 2005 regular session, prescribes the appraisal method of Section 42 property to be income based, rather than value based, which results in substantial tax breaks for Section 42 property owners, but also results in millions of dollars of lost tax revenues for cities and counties already hard pressed to meet financial demands, according to the Mississippi Association of Supervisors (MAS).

Tishomingo County is joining, as a plaintiff, other counties that are members of the MAS, as well as cities that are members of the Mississippi Municipal League in the suit against the Chairman of the Mississippi Department of Revenue in his official capacity of chairman.

In the county, Tishomingo, Iuka and Belmont are not joining the MML in the suit, and Burnsville has not discussed it with the board, as of press time. If the suit is successful, all counties and cities with Section 42 land would benefit, regardless of if they sign on as plaintiffs.

"The county has lost, in the past three years [this has been in effect], more than \$37,000 annually," said Diana Turner, county tax assessor. She explained that all other property taxes, for businesses, homes and landowners, are based on the assessed value, which is based on sale value; but these Section 42 owners are only taxed on the income they, as developer/owner receive from the

unit, or complex.

The Tax Credit Reform Act of 1986 created the Low Income Housing Tax Credit Program (LI-HTC), regulated by Section 42 of the Internal Revenue Code. The tax credit encourages developers to build affordable housing to meet the needs of the community. As a condition for receiving Housing Tax Credits, owners must keep the units affordable for a specified number of years. They are not always elderly or handicapped apartments, but many of Tishomingo County's are referred to as such. Rents in the individual units are adjusted according to the renter's ability to pay, which is substantially less than average rents; so the income of the property is much less than the figure for which the owner would sell it.

"For example, a complex in the county has an assessed value of \$600,000, and would pay \$7,000 a year if they were under the same rules as you or me," explained Turner. "The income-based value is only \$50,000 on the same complex, and they pay \$688."

"The loss would be proportionally less for a small town, but could have a bigger impact somewhere like Tishomingo, where the town's tax base is made up of largely of people over 65," said Turner.

The lawsuit, handled by MAS legal counsel Butler, Snow, O'Mara, Stevens & Cannada, PLLC of Ridgeland, seeks declaratory and injunctive relief regarding the way the Department of Revenue has implemented Senate Bill 3100.

"That means they want the court to make a declaration about the legality of the issue, as well as stop the practice while they determine it," said Board of Supervisors Counsel Philip Whitehead.

If your child has Special Needs, you are encouraged to register him/her. They will receive services through the Head Start program.

If you do not have a birth certificate, we will help you order one.



Tishomingo County Development Foundation members and others in Burnsville on April 11, 2011, at the new city hall. Board members discussed the status of several industrial projects.

Dennen Steel construction bids were received by the board of supervisors but were over budget. The county is negotiating with a low bidder on reducing cost to within the budget.

The new Ershigs building is completed and a ribbon cutting is scheduled for April 18 at 3 PM.

Board members discussed the status of a proposed industrial expansion announced soon.

Board members discussed the status of the TCEPA Alliance, an economic

development alliance of Tishomingo, Alcorn, and Prentiss Counties. The strategic plan is completed and we are working on a web site and other marketing materials.

The board of supervisors discussed the status of a small new company that is proposing to move into Tri-State Commerce Park.

Board members were reminded of the ribbon cutting for Iuka Hardware on April 14 at 2 PM.

Chairman Ken Cooley reported that it is time to make some personal contacts with potential TCDF members.

Theresa Cutshall reported that there are 96 members so far with an investment of \$20,400 not counting \$2,500 committed by TCEPA.

A listing of potential members was re-

viewed and board members agreed to make contacts.

Brad Thompson with Geek Express is updating and revising TCDF's web site. Geek Express is charging \$600 for this work.

Geek Express is also creating a new web site for the tourism council at a cost of \$600.

Brandon Grissom reported that the board of supervisors had competed for and won over \$14 million in private investment as well as over \$8 million in grants and loans to Tishomingo County for job creation during the last three years.

Board members discussed the new McDonald's in Iuka and several other potential commercial projects.

The next TCDF board meeting is scheduled for May 10, 2011.

Historical Society Attends Federal Technical Assistance Workshop in Starkville

Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society (TCHGS) President, Cindy Nelson and her husband, Bob, were at Mississippi State University on Wednesday, April 13, 2011, to seek out funding for the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse.

The tightening of the Federal budget has made the competition for grants more challenging than ever. The Federal Technical Assistance Workshop, held at the Hunter Henry Center on the Mississippi State University campus on April 13th, aimed at helping local municipalities and economic development agencies sharpen their grant seeking and application writing skills.

Several ARC representatives, including the agency's chief of staff and Federal co-chair, were on hand in addition to representatives from multiple Federal departments in Washington which will have grant money available in the coming year. Six different Federal agencies were on hand to answer questions about potential project ideas including the U.S. Department of Education, the Department of Labor, Housing and Urban Development, U.S. Small Business Administration, Appalachian Regional Commission, U.S. Department of Agriculture, and the U.S. Economic Development Administration.

Nelson spoke with two potential grant opportunities about funding to replace the 5-ton Rheem, 8 seer units which were installed between 1979-1980 with 7 new 5-Ton Trane 13 seer split system heat pumps.

Only two of the units work properly. The provision of new working units is part of an ongoing restoration project for the 150-year-old facility. Improper temperature control can cause damage to the artifacts, furniture, and building. Because the building is owned by the County, the Board of Supervisors must request the grant funds; however, Nelson is willing to handle the grant preparation work and supervise the work project.

"With the added responsibilities of acting as Executive Director due to a recent reduction in fund-

ing, and because we do not have adequate money for other staff positions, grant research is extremely hard for me as I attempt to support two to three volunteer positions when I am not working at my full-time out-of-state employment," says Nelson, who used three days of vacation to attend workshops on behalf of the Tishomingo County Archives & History Museum and the Burnsville community this week. "I am very appreciative of the opportunity to attend this workshop and collaborate with multiple agencies in one setting."







The second words uttered by Jesus were: "Assuredly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise" (Luke 23:43, NKJV). Jesus immediately forgave the man of his sin, assuring him that He would receive him into His kingdom that very day. Do we understand that Jesus waits for us to call out to Him, to ask Him to save us. If we ignore Him, do not ask Him for what we need, we will lose our opportunity of being saved.

Romans 10:13, NKJV, states, "For whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved." Of course, this has

to be a person's deep desire. Jesus is waiting. He will have compassion on whosoever calls out, whosoever calls, believes, and receives.

The third words uttered by Jesus were: "Woman behold your son! Behold your mother!" (John 19:26, 27) Jesus was concerned about His mother. At that time His brothers did not believe in His divinity, though later they believed in Him. Jesus knew a person's family could be their greatest enemy. Matthew 10:36. The fifth commandment is: "Honor your father and mother", Exodus 20:12. Jesus always obeyed His Father, God. He knew His disciple John would honor Him by taking care of His mother. John loved Jesus, therefore he obeyed Him.

The fourth words uttered by Jesus were: "My God! My God! Why have You Forsaken

Me?" (Matthew 27:46, NKJV) God would not accept sin. Humankind could not stop sinning. Therefore God sent His Son, Jesus, into the world to take upon Himself all the sin of all humankind. Then God sent Jesus to the Cross with all of that sin, to die upon the Cross. God allowed His Own wrath to come down upon Jesus wiping out all the sin. Jesus died, was buried, and was resurrected 3 days and nights later. With the burial of all the sin, all humankind were set free from their sin. The only problem is, is that not everyone will accept that gift of freedom from sin. Jesus was resurrected from the grave and was ascended back to heaven to be with His Father God. All humans that will accept the gift of salvation will one day be resurrected to their Heavenly Father. Have you accepted the free gift of salvation? It is

The fifth words uttered by Jesus were: "I thirst." (John 19:28, NKJV) Did Jesus want to see what the people would do? We do not know. Jesus could have meant He was thirsting to get back to His Father. Do we thirst after Jesus and God the Father? Jesus says, "But, whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst." (John 4:14, NKJV)

Jesus meant that He, Himself, was the water, the person, that people would need. He was the One who would love them and meet their need. The soldiers around the Cross gave Jesus sour wine, vinegar. They had no compassion.

The sixth words uttered by Jesus were: "It is finished." (John 19:30, NKJV) Jesus was saying to the people that He had done all He could do for them, and for all the generations to

come. It was up to them to accept the gift He was giving salvation to all. There is still time to receive that gift. Be sure you accept it.

The seventh words uttered by Jesus were: "Father, into Your hands I commit My spirit."

(Luke 23:46, NKJV) Jesus came from the Father. He finished His work, and was ready to go back to His Father. He trusted His Father, God, to receive Him back into His fold. You and I can receive the assurance of being received into God's fold if we will receive what Jesus did for us on the Cross. Please receive your gift.



Butter over 600 degrees. Mix sugar and cinnamon. Dip a marshmallow in butter. Dip the marshmallows in cinnamon sugar.






