## Wednesday Morning Storms Cause Damage in County

### Emergency Workers, Maintenance Crews and Workers to Keep Up with Damage from Wind, Rain

Early Wednesday morning, emergency crews, law enforcement, county and city workers, and volunteers were all out trying to assess, repair and respond to extensive storm damage throughout the county.

According to reports, just after 3 a.m. Wednesday, a storm tore through Belmont from the school/little league ball field area to the Belmont city maintenance facility just north of Falcon, east of Highway 25. An apparent tornado cut a path between the two areas, taking out huge trees that formerly lined the road into Belmont, as well as large ones on Ebenezer Street. Power lines were torn down, and power was out to the entire area. Several structures suffered extensive damage, includ-

ing some businesses on Sun Air Drive, and the Falcon building.

Red Bud Supply employees were on the scene at 7:20 in raincoats and boots, removing computers and office equipment from the demolished building. Red Bud Supply, a supplier of safety equipment had been in that location since 1991.

Tishomingo County Schools started notifying parents and students at 5:30 a.m. that classes for the day were cancelled. Belmont School didn't suffer damage, according to preliminary reports, but there was no way children could be moved safely.

Everyone will be anticipating how the administration will handle the now-extended school year. The year had already been extended to Memorial Day week-

end, and extra hours added to seven days to avoid going into June.

Tornado warnings, flash flood warnings, and thunderstorm warnings were in effect all Wednesday morning, and power company crews worked to restore power to numerous customers in Belmont, Burnsville and the New Salem area.

High winds destroyed a barn, and downed trees in the Highway 365 area south and north of Highway 72. Roof damage and fallen trees were reported, according to District 2 Supervisor Nicky McRae.

Flood damage to roads was also widespread, ironically one year from the early May 2010 storms that caused extensive damage to roads in the north part of the county.

The man was released to Tennessee Department of Corrections and Alcorn County Sheriff's Department on them by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department. McKinnon County Sheriff's Department and Chester County Sheriff's Department. Additional arrests are expected in this case.

The officers seized numerous items from the apartments and off Chicken Run Road used to manufacture methamphetamine. Dillard was released on a \$5,000 bond.

The sheriff's department requests that any information pertaining to controlled substances or any other crimes be reported to Crime Stoppers or the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department's web site. All information will be kept confidential and cash rewards can be given.

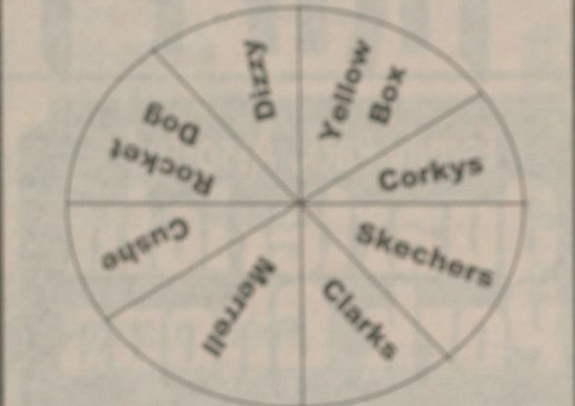
## Work Day For Local Scouts And 20th Century Club

 Utilizing a dome construction specification that supervisors say will help the Domes International manufacturing facility in Paden, the jail has a particular look, and many folks are driving by to check out the progress.  
 On Tuesday, Sheriff Glenn Whitlock toured the facility, explaining the design and purposes behind it.

The dome areas will ex-

tend from a conventionally-constructed building that will house the sheriff's department, dispatchers, and all prisoner-related activity for county inmates, suspects, and related persons.

The two dome areas extending to the west will actually house the dormitory-style open areas of county male and female prisoners. The two wings, as well as an east wing that will include solitary confinement areas for temporary mental patients, alcohol-related in-

mates, and other disciplinary problems, will all open to a central, raised, jailer pod from which all activities can be monitored.

The large domed building on the east side will house state inmates that can be used by the county for work programs. Supervisors who support the jail say that the state has agreed to house enough state inmates in the new facility, and pay approximately \$20 a day for them, to offset the cost of building the jail.

This is simply a little brain teaser for those who wish to think a little bit about what God thinks about His creation. Dogs never get a very good press report in the Bible, and cats are never mentioned at all, yet cats are represented by the lion in many places in Scripture. 

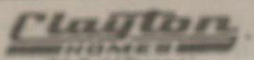
