Storm Disaster Recovery Throughout Region Continues

At 3:48 last Wednesday morning, when a tornado blew through Belmont, it was just the beginning of the county's problems with weather.

What has been now considered an F2 tornado began on Witt Road in Belmont, and a 50-yard-wide storm traveled miles with maximum winds of 25 miles per hour, reported by emergency manager Bill Strickland Monday, when the first weather reports were received. More than 19 homes received minor damage, 32 were classified as major damaged, and 10 more destroyed," explained Strickland. The businesses were heavily damaged or destroyed, but no fatalities were caused by the storms in Tishomingo, confirmed Strickland.

Also early last Wednesday, winds in the New Salem area, in the Campground area also caused high winds.

Many trees were uprooted. The fallen trees caused power outages, and some homes received significant damage, as reported in today's Board of Supervisors' meeting.

It was after midnight last week, at 3 p.m., when a powerful and now infamous wide storm moved through Mississippi and then Alabama, just south of Tishomingo, causing widespread devastation and death in

Smithville, Mississippi; Tuscaloosa, Alabama; and more. Eventually, the storms claimed 215 deaths across the South, including at least 35 in Mississippi, and fifteen in the Highway 25 small town of Smithville.

After the storms, the county received 6.8 inches more rain, damaging roads in the county, and making recovery and cleanup efforts a challenge.

Three dispatchers with the Tishomingo County 911 handled 1,264 calls, reported 911 Coordinator Ricky Cummings on Monday, and the county board reported that cooperation among agencies had been excellent all around.

Sheriff Glenn Whitlock said that sheriff's department personnel went into "support mode" in Belmont, where the coordination was handled by the Belmont Police Department. They used inmate manpower to help in the clearing efforts, and the inmates seemed happy to be helping alongside the many volunteers, said Whitlock.

One good thing about the new Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department website, explained Whitlock, was the Nixle system. It allows mobile phone users to receive weather warnings, which was useful Wednesday when power was unavailable in many areas.

Disaster Declaration for County

The State of Mississippi included Tishomingo County in a disaster declaration, opening the door for federal and state disaster assistance for affected properties.

Thirty-nine counties and the Mississippi Band of Choctaw Indians are listed on the declaration dated last week.

Regarding Tishomingo County being included in a federal declaration, Tishomingo County Emergency Manager Bill Strickland, and County Board of Supervisors President James McDowell were scheduled to meet with a representative of Congressman Alan Nunnelee's office Wednesday.

Warnings posted by the department go straight to a user's phone by text - so it helps even those without internet access on their phones.

Spirit of Community Shines

Tishomingo County's law enforcement, county crews, and numerous volunteers have worked in the county to help families recover from the severe storms, even through additional bad weather. Several teams have traveled to Smithville and other places to aid in recovery and cleanup efforts.

Iuka National Guard mem-

bers of C Troop, 1st 198th Cavalry worked in Smithville for several days, helping with law enforcement, and search and recovery.

A group with Iuka United Methodist went to Pine Flat outside Oxford on Monday to help remove debris and make homes accessible, said Rev. Jon Kaufman.

"We were a chainsaw crew," explained Rev. Kaufman. "The area was hit pretty hard, and a number of homes were demolished." The Pine Flat United Methodist Church is a distribution center that is feeding about

600 local residents and volunteers, he said.

Locally, the Tishomingo County Schools have been collecting supplies to take to Smithville, and the Red Cross has collected supplies, and tended to families in damaged areas. Iuka Baptist Church is collecting supplies to take in the next few days, as needed, to Smithville, or other places.

Longtime Belmont Mayor Bob Yarber Dies

Robert Henry "Bob" Yarber, Belmont, died Sunday, May 1, 2011 at Tishomingo Hospice House in Tishomingo after a long and courageous battle with cancer. He was born May 22, 1941 to Henry and Bess Green Yarber of Belmont.

Bob's entire grade school and high school years were spent in

Belmont where he graduated in 1959. Before high school graduation he became an Eagle Scout and was a member of the Order of the Arrow. Upon graduation, he attended Northeast Mississippi Community College, Itawamba Community College and graduated in 1963 from Samford University School of Pharmacy. In 1962

he married Quayle Ivy and she attended college along with him until his graduation. At this time they moved to Iuka where he worked a few months at Rushing Drugs. In 1964, he joined his parents in the family business, Yarber Drugs in Belmont. Quayle joined them in the business after their children, Terri and Robert were born. The

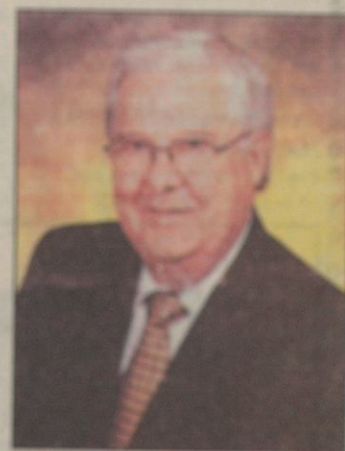
four of them worked together in the business until the death of Bob's parents. At this time, Bob and Quayle became owners and continued the operation until their retirement in July, 2007.

Bob's constant love for Belmont caused him to serve the Town of Belmont for eight years as Alderman before seeking the office of Mayor in 1989. He was successful in this election and later ran four additional unopposed terms. In 2009, he chose to retire as Mayor and shortly thereafter was diagnosed with lung cancer.

Over the years he was active in many areas of service to Northeast Mississippi. He loved promoting Belmont and Tishomingo County with the Tishomingo County Development Foundation. He served on the Board of Trustees at Northeast Mississippi Community College from 1974 to 1983. He was a member of CRE-ATE in Tupelo until his health no longer permitted. He was instrumental in obtaining the Redmont Railway Company and was active in numerous other economic development projects for Belmont and Northeast Mississippi. He enjoyed serving in these capacities but he was most proud to serve as deacon of First Baptist Church where he was a member for many years and was also active in the video ministry.

Bob will forever be remembered for his generous spirit, love for people and great story-telling ability.

Services were Tuesday, May 3, at First Baptist Church, Belmont, Mississippi, with Bro. Ray Burks, Bro. Kevin Tribble, Bro. Jack Maroon and Bro. Jerry Ginn officiating. Burial was in Belmont

No, we were not hurt but Shirley has heart problems and has had knee surgery and the supervisors and the fire department were more worried about trees in the roads than trying to help us save the things in our home. I called 911 at 3:48 a.m. when it first hit and was asked if we were OK and when I said "yes" he asked me "well, what do you want me to do?" now professional is that? I called all day long to try to get

I left a message on the Sugarloaf's phone and he never returned my call or anything. Wreath Placed At Monument

April 25th has been designated as Confederate Memorial Day. Mrs. Eunell Handy, President of John Marshall Stone 394 United Daughters of the Confederacy and Miss Sarah Waldman, Secretary placed a red, white and blue wreath at the Confederate Monument on the grounds of the Tishomingo County Museum, commonly known as the Old Courthouse.

This monument was originally placed at the mass burial site of 263 soldiers at the Shady Grove Cemetery by the United Daughters of the Confederacy. It was later moved to the current

area for a better visual site of more local and tourist visitors. It memorializes the brave soldiers who fought in the War Between the States.

The John Marshall Stone 394 meets regularly on the 3rd Tuesday evening at 6 o'clock at the Iuka Library. 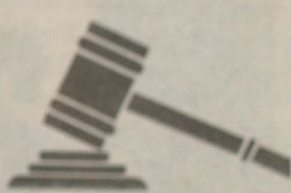

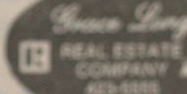



The 150th Anniversary of the War Between the States began this year and will continue through 1865. April 12th, 1861, the war began when Confederate General P.G.T. Beauregard opened fire on Fort Sumpter in Charleston Harbor, South Carolina. April 19th, 1861, a proclamation of a blockade of Southern ports was issued from South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, Florida and Texas. On April 29, 1861, Jefferson Davis announced the formation of the Confederate States of America.

An invitation has been received from General M.P. Perry 1608 and Sarah Lowery 32 United Daughters of the Confederacy inviting us to the Cross Dedication at Pontocola Cemetery in Pontocola County, Mississippi. This is an event of

April 23, 2011.

April 25th is designated as Confederate Memorial Day. We will be placing a wreath at the UDC Monument located at the old courthouse on Tuesday, April 26th, 2011.

Beauvoir, home of Jefferson Davis, CSA President, will be unveiling the newly restored United Daughters of the Confederacy Memorial Arch. It has been relocated to the Beauvoir Confederate Soldiers Cemetery. This planned event will be at 2 o'clock in the afternoon of April 30th, 2011.

Sarah Wildman presented the program entitled, "Drug Conditions", as written by Deanna R. Bryant, Historian General 2008-2010.

The War Between the States was wrought with medical problems. Prior to the war, doctors served as apprentices rather than attending medical school. They were totally unprepared for the massive wounds and sicknesses faced on the battle field. Surgeons were facing the needs for amputations and surgeries they were not trained to do.

The Confederacy's medical supplies came from three sources (1) through blockade running, (2) from smuggling through Union lines and (3) from captured Union supplies. Medical supplies, instruments and medicines were third to munitions and clothing as contraband transported by blockade runners.

The Southern druggists had to manufacture what they could from native barks, leaves, herbs and roots. The supply of whiskey was not as short as medicines; therefore, it was used when available, as an

esthetics. Other anesthetics used were chloroform, morphine and opium.

A Confederate surgeon who was placed in charge of a railroad hospital stated he 'had little else at my command except cold water dressings for wounds. I learned to improve on this by employing a decoction of red oak bark to the water. This acted as a disinfectant and...promoted the healing process'.

Some remedies used during the war contained a substantial amount of mercury. Many wounded and sick soldiers came in contact with a treatment containing mercury. Many medicines that were commonly used during the war proved effective and are still in use in modern medicines. Among these are morphine and atropine, an alkaloid of belladonna.
