After fourteen months of coling signatures on a petition to to a county vote the legal hase of beer, wine, and alol, an Iuka man submitted a ial list for certification - and he than 700 signatures have rejected.

Legal signatures on the petition must be those of Tishomingo County registered voters, and the addresses must be the same as the ones on the voter rolls.

"I've tried to tell people all the legal requirements, but the county addresses just didn't match up on a lot of them," said Aldridge.

Some of the names of signees may have been the same name, but the addresses on file didn't match any the election commission had for that name, so they were rejected.

Aldridge has not given up, though. He has mailed out letters to all those rejected by the circuit clerk, asking them to get their addresses right with the county, and to go sign the petition in the circuit clerk's office if necessary.

"I've been at this for fourteen months, and I'm not giving up until it comes to a vote," says Aldridge. "It's got a fire built under it now, and we just need to put the right wood on it."

To get on the election ballot this November, which will include all the county offices, and some state offices, too, the certified petition must be submitted to the County Board of Supervisors by their September 5th meeting. But Aldridge says he won't hesitate to push for a special election if necessary, which can cost more for the county.

"There's no deadline on this, I can keep collecting," said Aldridge.

If successful, it would be the first county vote on the issue since the 1960s.

Several Arrested on Drug-Related Charges

Three men arrested on drug charges in recent days as a result of cooperation of the North Mississippi Narcotics Unit (NMNU), the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, Iuka and Burnsville Police, and MDOT officers.

Two weeks ago, on May 19th, NMNU agents attempted to arrest Kristopher Lee Bush, 33, on an active warrant after his vehicle was reported as suspicious by a caller near Mineral Springs Park. He fled from officers, and they pursued him as he fled toward Alabama on U.S. Highway 72. Deputies were finally able to successfully deploy "stop sticks," which stopped the car, and apprehend Bush.

of controlled substances from intent to sell. Parrish remains in the window of his car, reported Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock.

Bush, of County Road 167 in corinth, remains in the Tishomingo County Jail on felony fleeing, and other numerous misdemeanor charges, and for the drug charge for which he was originally wanted, said Whitlock.

On May 20th, Burnsville Police and the sheriff's department arrested Mark Parrish, 42, at 41 Jefferson Street in Burnsville, on domestic violence and resisting arrest charges. During the arrest, the officers seized a quantity of controlled substances, and Parrish was arrested for possession of hydrocodone with intent to sell, and possession of Alprazolam with

custody at the Tishomingo County Jail.

On May 23rd, agents with NMNU and the Iuka Police arrested Ricky Bureau, 33, on two counts of sale of marijuana. Bureau, of 100 Pickwick Circle, remains in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail.

Two Face Drug Charges Following Investigation

Two Burnsville residents face drug charges after a month-long investigation.


On May 26th, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department and agents with the North Mississippi Narcotics Unit arrested Sara Dodson, 46, and Randy Walker, 53, for conspiracy to distribute hydrocodone and Alprazolam. Dod-

son was also arrested on charges of felony child abuse, according to a release from the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department.

The officers seized \$10,241 from Walker, 25 dosage units of hydrocodone and 40 units of Alprazolam from his vehicle, and then searched his residence at 240 Eastport Street, Burnsville.

There, they found 14 more units of hydrocodone (Lortab), and 203 units of Alprazolam (Xanax).

Walker was charged with possession of hydrocodone with intent to distribute and possession of Alprazolam with intent to distribute. Dodson was also charged with two counts of sale of hydrocodone.

"Jesus said in John 3.3. "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." "Nicodemus said to Him, How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born? Jesus answered, "Most assuredly," "I say to you unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that Fisaid to you, "You must be born again. The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear the sound of it, but cannot tell where it comes from and where it goes. So

is everyone who is born of the Spirit." John 3:4-8.

It is most important that one be born again. Jesus has paid the price for our redemption. He offers that gift to each and everyone freely. It is our responsibility to accept that gift.

When we accept Jesus' salvation sincerely we are born again. We have been accepted into the kingdom of God.

Let us understand the meaning of being born of the water and of the Spirit. Jesus came to John the Baptist, Matthew 3:13-17, to be baptized. John was baptizing people as they confessed their sin and repented. Jesus had no sin, but He told John, "let this be done in-

order that all righteousness be fulfilled." John 3:15, This was to be an example to the people. When one is baptized by water he or she is making a statement that they have confessed their sin and have repented of their sin. Now they desire to live for Jesus. As Jesus came up out of the water, God sent His Holy Spirit upon Jesus. This was the second part of being baptized. It is not the mode, method, of how one is baptized that is important, but it is what is happening. taking place, in ones heart. Yes, Jesus was immersed, and that is wonderful, but there is not always a big hody of water to immerse one in. The thief on the cross did not have any wa-

ter around him, but Jesus saved him anyway. Jesus always looks on the heart. It is a matter of our giving our total heart to Him. Jesus is not legalistic. So one can be immersed, sprinkled, or have water poured on him or her. At rare times water may never be used. Remember Jesus is looking at your heart, your attitude and desire for Him.

The baptism by the Holy Spirit happens at the moment one accepts Jesus as his or her Savior, John 14:23. God the Father and God the Son sends the Holy Spirit into ones heart when they accept Jesus, God's Son, as their Savior. The Holy Spirit is our seal, guaranteeing our inheritance in

the kingdom of God. Ephesians 1:13-14. Born of the water and of the Spirit is an act of faith. This faith is a receiving and believing in all that God has spoken and done. He is God Almighty. He is the creator of the whole world. Have you been born again? Be sure that you receive your proper birth. It is your passport into the kingdom of God, to live eternally with God.
