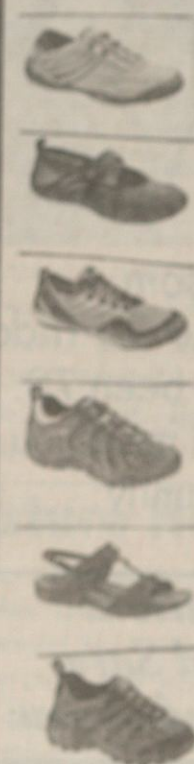
2011 Tishomingo Co. Gospel Singing Convention

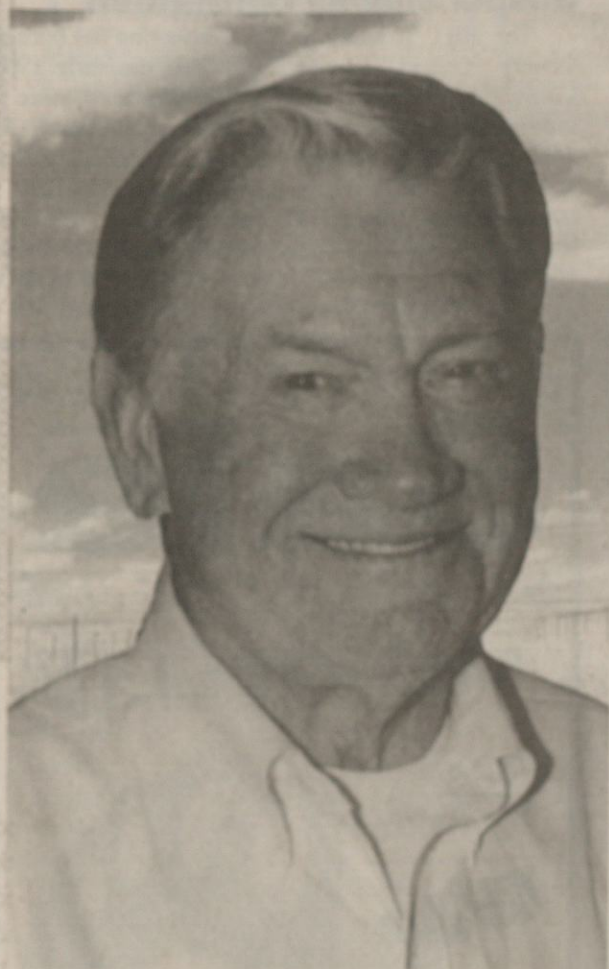

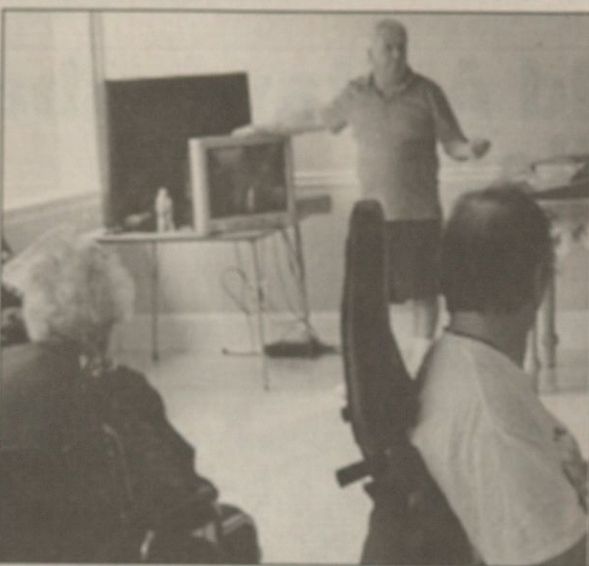

turned in two thousand four hundred and sixty-four signatures to the Circuit Clerk's Office at the Tishomingo County Courthouse. They accepted one thousand six hundred and ninety of them. The reason some signatures were thrown out was because they signed their own name more than one time. Your name can only be counted one time. Many people signed other people's names to the petition. They were rejected also. You have got to have 987 more registered voter's signatures of Tishomingo County. You have got to be a resident of Tishomingo County before your signature will be counted on this petition.

I will continue to try to get enough signatures before this year's election. It won't cost the tax payers of Tishomingo County between 18 and twenty thousand dollars to do a special election. If you do not want to see the county waste that much money on a special election, you need to come on out and sign this petition. I am not go-

ing to quit until I get an election on this.

It's not whether it goes wet or stays dry, I think the people should be able to vote on it and see what happens. Like I said before, I am tired of seeing all these tax dollars going to Alabama, Tennessee, and Corinth, MS. I believe we could use that three to five hundred thousand in tax dollars each year. Also if you sign this petition you have got to put the same address that you are registered under in the Tishomingo County Courthouse. If you have moved and you have not changed your address in the Tishomingo County Courthouse, they will reject your name. On this petition you have got to sign your name, print your name, and your correct address that you are registered in the courthouse and the place you go vote. If you have moved since you registered to vote, your address must be the same as in the Circuit Clerk's Office, they will disqualify your name. Get your address changed in the office and find out where your

voting place is. If you don't, your name will be dismissed. That is why many of these names were dismissed on this petition because the address on the petition did not match what they had on the courthouse. You need to get this straightened out before the election day, if you want your vote to count.

I have mailed out everyone a letter telling them that their name has been disqualified from the petition at the Tishomingo County Courthouse. There were about 700 names that were turned down. To mail all these letters out it has cost me right at \$900. So if you get one of these letters, make sure you contact Donna Dill at the Tishomingo County Courthouse and find out why your name was dismissed. As of May 26, 2011, I need 977 more legal registered voters with their correct address in the Circuit Clerk's Office, please fill this petition out and mail it to me. This will be the third time I have put this petition in the paper. This way it is a

lot easier on you and me and it is 100 percent legal. They have already accepted the other petitions that I got back from the newspaper. If you get a letter with a petition in it that means your name has been dismissed from this petition. You need to contact Donna Dill at the Circuit Clerk's Office in the Tishomingo County Courthouse at 423-7027. Ask them why your name has been dismissed.

You cannot blame the courthouse for this. The people have got to blame their selves. It plainly tells you what to do on the petition, these people did not fill it out right.

You can only vote one time. Read this petition that is below this very carefully and make sure you sign your name, print your name, print your address, and the name of the place your vote.

Also the Tishomingo County Supervisors are not involved with this in any way.

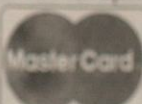

You Must Be Born Again!

"Jesus said in John 3:3, 'Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God.' "Nicodemus said to Him, 'How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?' Jesus answered, 'Most assuredly, I say to you unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again. The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear the sound of it, but cannot tell where it comes from and where it goes. So

is everyone who is born of the Spirit." John 3:4-8.

It is most important that one be born again. Jesus has paid the price for our redemption. He offers that gift to each and every one freely. It is our responsibility to accept that gift.

When we accept Jesus' salvation sincerely we are born again. We have been accepted into the kingdom of God.

Let us understand the meaning of being born of the water and of the Spirit. Jesus came to John the Baptist, Matthew 3:13-17, to be baptized. John was baptizing people as they confessed their sin and repented. Jesus had no sin, but He told John, "let this be done in

order that all righteousness be fulfilled." John 3:15. This was to be an example to the people. When one is baptized by water he or she is making a statement that they have confessed their sin and have repented of their sin. Now they desire to live for Jesus. As Jesus came up out of the water, God sent His Holy Spirit upon Jesus. This was the second part of being baptized. It is not the mode, method, of how one is baptized that is important, but it is what is happening, taking place, in ones heart. Yes, Jesus was immersed, and that is wonderful, but there is not always a big body of water to immerse one in. The thief on the cross did not have any wa-

ter around him, but Jesus saved him anyway. Jesus always looks on the heart. It is a matter of our giving our total heart to Him. Jesus is not legalistic. So one can be immersed, sprinkled, or have water poured on him or her. At rare times water may never be used. Remember Jesus is looking at your heart, your attitude and desire for Him.

The baptism by the Holy Spirit happens at the moment one accepts Jesus as his or her Savior, John 14:23. God the Father and God the Son sends the Holy Spirit into ones heart when they accept Jesus, God's Son, as their Savior. The Holy Spirit is our seal, guaranteeing our inheritance in

the kingdom of God. Ephesians 1:13-14. Born of the water and of the Spirit is an act of faith. This faith is a receiving and believing in all that God has spoken and done. He is God Almighty. He is the creator of the whole world. Have you been born again? Be sure that you receive your proper birth. It is your passport into the kingdom of God, to live eternally with God.

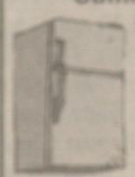

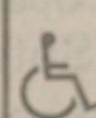
