Absentee Voting for the August 2 Democratic and Republican Primaries

Donna Henry Dill, Circuit Clerk, announces that absentee ballots will be available beginning Monday, June 27 for the Democratic and Republican Primaries to be held on Tuesday, August 2, 2011. You may come to the Circuit Clerk's Office to vote by absentee Monday Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The clerk's office will also be open on Saturday, July 2, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, Saturday, July 23, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, and Saturday, July 30, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, for absentee voting.

We encourage those who need to vote by mail to call our office as soon as possible so they will have ample time to go through the absentee process. When an absentee ballot is requested, an application for an absentee ballot will first be mailed to the voter. This application shall be completed by the absentee voter and mailed back to the Circuit Clerk's Office. When the application is received,

the voter. No absentee bal- Uniformed and Overseas lots may be hand delivered to anyone.

Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail. These five groups are:

- 1. A registered voter who is 65 years of age or
- 2. A registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county;
- 3. A registered voter who is temporarily or perabled; and/or
- 4. A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county or more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day.

5. All voters who are members of the Armed Services, Their Spouses, Dependents, and Overseas the ballot will be mailed to Citizens who fall under the

Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA).

All absentee applications and ballot envelopes 38873. must be notarized except for a registered voter who come and enjoy the day. is physically disabled, either permanently or temporarily. The disabled voter's application and ballot envelope must be witnessed and signed by a person 18 years of age or older. This witness does not have to be a regis-

All absentee ballots manently physically dis- requested by mail must be sent by mail to the voter and they must be returned by mail to the clerk's office. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered.

July 30 will be the last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office for the August 2 Primary Elections.

All mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, August 1, in order to be eligible to be counted for the August 2, 2011 Primary Elections.







Pastor's **Tidbits**

I Corinthians 9.24-27 says, Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain. And every man that stroveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crows; but we an incorruptible. I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air; But I keep under my body, and being it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway."

Paul was not necessarily an athelete in the sense that we may use that term today, but he was an athelete in keeping his body under subjection to his spirit, as well as to God's Spirit. Notice that all do not receive the prize in achietic events, neither do all receive the prize in spiritual "athletic efforts". Faul is not speaking about salvation here, rather, he is speaking about service that beings glory to God and souls to salvation by preaching the gospel, accompanied by godly living. The aduletes in physical feans seek to obtain a crown that will fade away, a wreath of flowers in Paul's day, but the good apostle was seeking to obtain an incorruptible crown from God.

Paul's efforts to keep his body under subjection was more than shadow boxing, it was a real battle against the lust of the flesh; the lust of the eyes and the peide of life. The apostle was aware that his preaching of the gospel was not a guarantee that he would not be rejected from service, should he fail to discipline himself concerning the physical body. This may seem strange to some people, but our physical bodies are a part of the equipment needed to carry the message of the cross of Christ. If we misuse the body, or if we allow its desires to get in our way, we will not get the job done for God that He has assigned us! The word "castaway" in our verses does not indicate a loss of salvation but a rejection from service. Those who have been chosen of God for His service should have a healthy fear of being put out of that service by disobetience and lack of discipline!






