General Henry Little's Descendant Visits Iuka

Great-Great-Great Nephew of Battle of Iuka General
Views Artifacts, Shares at TCHGS Board Meeting

Confederate Brigadier General Henry S. Little's great-great-great nephew visited Tishomingo County on May 19th. Mr. Tyler Lewis Tyler and a companion, Ann Caldwell Dearman, from Virginia Beach, Va., arrived for their first visit to Mississippi. Mr. Tyler promised it would not be his last.

Mr. Tyler and Ms. Dearman, members of the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society, spent the day at the Tishomingo County Courthouse visiting the new Civil War Interpretation Rooms and touring different facets of the museum. Later in the day, the couple visited Iuka Battlefield Commission President, Harold Lomenick, Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society President, Cindy Nelson, for a personal tour of the Battle of Iuka, including a visit to Oak Grove Cemetery and Lady Grove Cemetery. They also visited each of the Battle of Iuka interpretive markers where he took notes of the exact locations of the units.

Later in the day, they joined Beth Davis for a personal tour of her home, Twin Magnolia, which was used for Gen. Little's headquarters during the Civil War. Gen. Little was killed instantly by a Minié ball in the Battle of Iuka on September 19, 1862, and was returned to the home. Mrs. Davis has invited Mr. Tyler to stay in the "Bedroom" the next time he visits Tishomingo County.

Returning to the historic courthouse museum, Mr. Tyler and Ms. Dearman participated in the monthly board meeting. He displayed three of Gen. Little's diaries, which are most probably the only diaries from any Civil War general that have been matched. The last manuscript made by Gen. Little is his diary was written at 4 a.m. on the morning of September 19th, 1862. Later that morning, a chaplain wrote a notation that the general was killed in battle. Mr. Tyler stated that this is the first time those diaries have been returned to Tishomingo County in almost 140 years.

Also displayed to the board members were the bright red sashes from Gen. Little's uniform. Mr. Tyler has loaned the sashes to the county's museum for a period of two years. These sashes will soon be on display in the Civil War Interpretation Room that is in the previous location of the gift shop. This room will emphasize the history of the Battle of Iuka and will officially open near the end of June. The sashes will remain in Tishomingo County for the 149th and 150th anniversaries of the Battle of Iuka. Mr. Tyler graduated from the Virginia Military Institute and served in the military 28 years. He later retired as Executive Director of the Old Coast Guard Station in Virginia Beach, Va., after working in that capacity from 1995-2003. Being a descendant and understanding the many facets of Mississippi, Mr. Tyler was very complimentary of the Tishomingo County Archives & History Museum. He stated that he will look forward to his visit during the 150th anniversary of the Battle of Iuka in 2012.

Dynetics to Build Propulsion Test Facility at Tri-State Commerce Park

Dynetics, Tishomingo County, Miss., and Tishomingo's Tri-State Commerce Park have partnered to establish a multipurpose test facility that will provide affordable propulsion testing services to customers for various sizes of thrusters and engines. The new site, located in Iuka on the former Yellow Creek site, will be used for propulsion testing of small to medium-class thrusters, rocket engines and stages using various fuel types. It is one of only a few commercial hydrodynamic test facilities in the United States.

Harry King, director of Space Test and Operations for Dynetics, said, "This is an ideal location for this facility and supports our test schedule needs. Buildings and infrastructure are already in place, and by creating our own test capability, we are able to offer a more affordable and efficient option for testing."

Dynetics CEO Dr. Brian Brinkman added, "Dynetics is very excited about the partnership we have established with the state of Mississippi, Tishomingo County Board of

Supervisors and Tri-State Commerce Park. We are optimistic that with the future growth of space industry business, we will bring a positive economic impact to Tishomingo County and the city of Iuka."

James McCrowl, president of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors, said, "We are excited about the potential of Dynetics and we feel that advanced technology is the key to the future of our citizens. Tishomingo County is proud to welcome Dynetics and we are delighted to be a partner in the advancement of technology in the USA."

According to King, Dynetics officials have laid out options for a long-term plan for the site, which is divided into three phases. Phase I and II will involve upgrades and modifications to existing infrastructure, and Phase III plans may include building an additional building to conduct launch vehicle and/or payload separation and drop tests.

Tishomingo County District 1 Supervisor Brandon Grimes emphasized that Tishomingo County

"welcomes Dynetics and the cutting edge technology coming here," he said. "Dynetics is a respected name among companies that serve the aerospace industry and the military. We look forward to continued growth of the company."

There are to have the site operational by early July 2015.

"The Dynetics decision to have a test facility in Iuka is most positive," said U.S. Senator Thad Cochran of Mississippi. "The Yellow Creek site is a valuable asset to our state and to the nation. I am pleased it is being established to support rocket development activities in the region. With this site in North Mississippi and Brown Space Center in South Mississippi, our state will have the unique national capability to test rocket engines ranging from the very small all the way up to the world's largest. Finally, it will also help diversify the economic base in Tishomingo County. I commend the public-private cooperation that led to this development."

freed enough with \$300 million in state funding cuts the past three years.

- **Property taxes:** McCarley opposes reducing state financial support for kindergarten through 12th grade public schools, which would shift the funding responsibility to the local level – and require an increase in local property taxes on homes and vehicles.



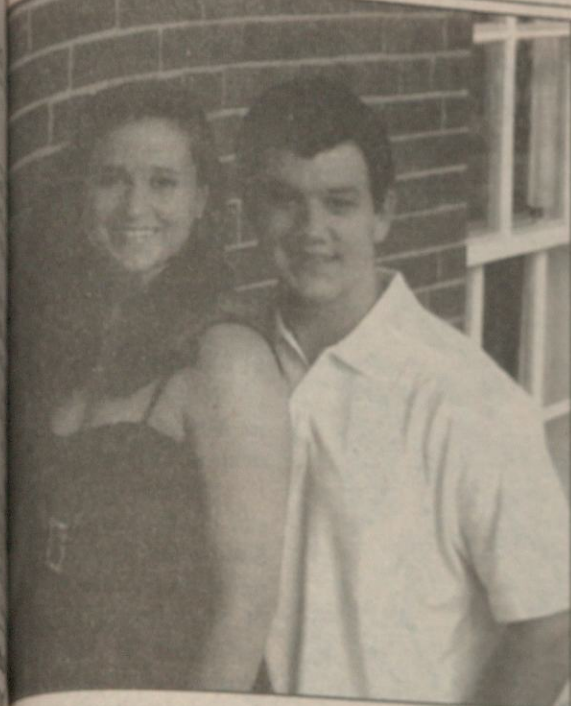

Absentee Voting for the August 2 Democratic and Republican Primaries

Donna Henry Dill, Circuit Clerk, announces that absentee ballots will be available beginning Monday, June 27 for the Democratic and Republican Primaries to be held on Tuesday, August 2, 2011. You may come to the Circuit Clerk's Office to vote by absentee Monday – Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The clerk's office will also be open on Saturday, July 2, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, Saturday, July 23, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, and Saturday, July 30, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, for absentee voting.

We encourage those who need to vote by mail to call our office as soon as possible so they will have ample time to go through the absentee process. When an absentee ballot is requested, an application for an absentee ballot will first be mailed to the voter. This application shall be completed by the absentee voter and mailed back to the Circuit Clerk's Office. When the application is received, the ballot will be mailed to

the voter. **No absentee ballots may be hand delivered to anyone.**

Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail. These five groups are:

1. A registered voter who is 65 years of age or older;
2. A registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county;
3. A registered voter who is temporarily or permanently physically disabled; and/or
4. A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county or more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day.

5. All voters who are members of the Armed Services, Their Spouses, Dependents, and Overseas Citizens who fall under the

Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA).

All absentee applications and ballot envelopes must be notarized except for a registered voter who is physically disabled, either permanently or temporarily. The disabled voter's application and ballot envelope must be witnessed and signed by a person 18 years of age or older. This witness does not have to be a registered voter.

All absentee ballots requested by mail must be sent by mail to the voter and they must be returned by mail to the clerk's office. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered.

July 30 will be the last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office for the August 2 Primary Elections.

All mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, August 1, in order to be eligible to be counted for the August 2, 2011 Primary Elections.

Roy Gray Speaks To The William Gray SAR Chapter

Compatriot, Roy Gray spoke on his Grandfather, William Gray at a meeting in Tupelo, Mississippi. The William Gray Chapter of the American Revolution.

William Gray, born in Wilkerson County, South Carolina, enlisted and fought in the Revolutionary War at the battles of Cowpens, S.C. and Mount Pleasant, N.C., important turning points in the Revolutionary War.

Sometime after the war, William along with his sons, Isaac & John, moved to Tennessee in the 1830's and later to old Tishomingo County, Ms. He purchased property in 1846, in a remote corner of northeast Tishomingo County, Ms. once known as "Gray Town".

There they lived with their numerous kin for many years. Records show that William Gray was living there with his son sometime between 1846 and 1850. Since he was living with Isaac on the property where the cemetery at "Gray Town" is located, and with no monument to mark his grave, it seems only natural to assume Patriot, William Gray is buried in the cemetery at "Gray Town" with close members of his family that do have identifying markers. The property became the cemetery was purchased by William Gray's

son Isaac in 1846 and today is still in the possession of his grandsons and has been in continuous possession by the Gray family since Isaac's original purchase in 1846. Many of William Gray's family still reside in the vicinity and in nearby counties.

In extreme northeast Tishomingo County encompassed by thirteen miles of wooded area that has never had electricity, the old school and church are now but memories of bygone days. The old cemetery, along with a home place or two marked by stone chimneys and others only by spring flowers is all that remains of old "Gray Town". Compatriot, Dr. John Fulwider stated "that many members and friends of our William Gray, S.A.R. Chapter have donated hundreds, if not thousands of hours in researching the Revolutionary War Soldier, William

Gray, the man for whom our chapter is named."

Ideas of how to preserve William Gray's memory in the area through a sign, plaque or monument etc. were discussed.

"This endeavor will give past, present and future members of our chapter a historical reference of the man for whom the chapter is named," said Fulwider.

The William Gray Chapter of Sons of the American Revolution was chartered February 22, 1984 in Booneville with Dr. Webster Cleveland elected to serve as the first President. Thomas Lee Wallace served as Vice President, and Gaines Griffin of Tishomingo County served as Secretary. H. Harold Daws Sr. served as Treasurer. Today, The William Gray chapter is the largest among the sixteen chapters in Mississippi.

I Corinthians 9:24-27 says, Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain. And every man that fighteth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible. I therefore so run, not as uncertainly, so fight I, not as one that beatech the air; but I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway."

Paul was not necessarily an athlete in the sense that we may use that term today, but he was an athlete in keeping his body under subjection to his spirit, as well as to God's spirit. Notice that all do not receive the prize in athletic events, neither do all receive the prize in spiritual "athletic efforts". Paul is not speaking about salvation here, rather, he is speaking about service that brings glory to God and souls to salvation by preaching the gospel, accompanied by godly living. The athletes in physical sports seek to obtain a crown that will fade away, a wreath of flowers in Paul's day, but the good apostle was seeking to obtain an incorruptible crown from God.

Paul's efforts to keep his body under subjection was more than shadow boxing; it was a real battle against the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes and the pride of life. The apostle was aware that his preaching of the gospel was not a guarantee that he would not be rejected from service, should he fail to discipline himself concerning the physical body. This may seem strange to some people, but our physical bodies are a part of the equipment needed to carry the message of the cross of Christ. If we misuse the body, or if we allow its desires to get in our way, we will not get the job done for God that He has assigned us! The word "castaway" in our verses does not indicate a loss of salvation but a rejection from service. Those who have been chosen of God for His service should have a healthy fear of being put out of that service by disobedience and lack of discipline!
