Corinth Man Takes Up His Cross to Spread Message of Hope

Christ exhorts his followers in the Book of Luke to "take up their cross and follow," and early this past week, a young Corinth man did just that in an effort to show passersby that there is Hope.

David Berryman, 33, of Corinth, began a trek Monday that started at Corinth and ended near Tishomingo County High School on U.S. Highway 72. Tuesday morning, friends carried him and his cross back to TC by vehicle, and he walked from there to the intersection with Highway 25.

"I'm doing it to give hope to the people driving by," explained

Berryman, who was lead to carry the cross just to encourage the world. "Who knows what might be going on in their lives, what they are feeling... Maybe they might see me and remember that all that really matters is Jesus, and to have hope, no matter what."

Berryman assists in the media department at the Church of the Crossroads, and some of his friends and fellow members followed him on his trek in support of his efforts.

Monday, in Burnsville, the weight of the 20-pound, 20-foot-long cross was getting difficult, and Shane Steed, who saw him struggling, stopped to carry it for

him a little ways. Steed is one of the staff ministers at Church of the Crossroads, and he continued on with Berryman the next day in his trek. Berryman also had the support and company of his wife, Christy, brothers John and Ellis Gray, and David Borden, who attached a wheel to the cross for him.

Berryman attracted a lot of attention in Tishomingo County; dozens of calls were received at *The News* reporting seeing him in different locations.

Berryman hopes to go south from Corinth to Booneville in coming weeks, and continue to spread his message of hope.

County Loses Beloved Educator John B. Moore

Last Wednesday evening, retired teacher, principal, and former county superintendent, John B. Moore died suddenly as the result of what many believe was a heart attack.

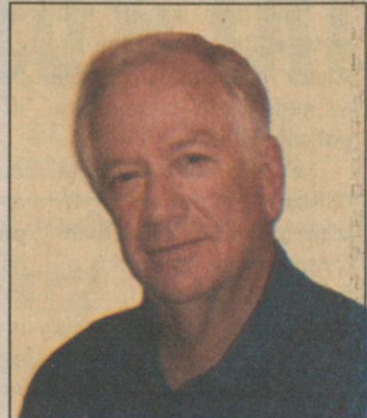
He and his wife Barbara had gone to return something to the Belmont Garage building (former Moore's Chevrolet), which they still own. According to a friend of the family, he collapsed when Barbara was looking away, and EMTs on the scene were unable to revive him. He was transported to Red Bay Hospital, where he was pronounced dead.

John Brewer Moore, Jr., 64, died Wednesday, February 2, 2011 at the Red Bay Hospital in Red Bay, AL. He was born June 19, 1946, in Booneville, MS to John Brewer Moore, Sr. and Byrd Greene Moore. He was a member of the First Baptist Church in Belmont. He loved his church family and served in many capacities including deacon since 1984, deacon chairman in 2011, and Sunday school teacher of Wisdom Seekers class.

A graduate of Belmont High School, NEMCC, and the University of Mississippi, John B. received his administrator's certification from Mississippi State University. His education career began in 1968 and ended with his retirement in 2006.

During his thirty-one year career, he was a math teacher at

Red Bay High School, guidance counselor at Tishomingo County Vo-Tech Center, principal at Belmont High School for 19 years, and Tishomingo County School Superintendent. He enjoyed his association with the NEMCC Board of Trustees and the hospital board of the North MS Medical Center in Iuka.

Services were held at 11 a.m. on Saturday, February 5th, at First Baptist Church in Belmont with Bro. Jack Maroon, Bro. Ray Burks and Bro. Kevin Tribble officiating. Burial was in the Belmont City Cemetery. Deaton Funeral Home of Belmont was in charge of arrangements.

Survivors include his wife of 45 years, Barbara Fancher Moore; three sons, Mike Moore of Belmont, Andy Moore and wife,

Several Face Drug Charges in January-February

Several people from the county face drug charges following investigations by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department in January and February.

On January 13, working with the North Mississippi Drug Task Force, sheriff's department deputies arrested Jerry Pruitt, at his home, 80 O. E. Barrett Drive in Iuka. Pruitt, 49, was charged with possession of a controlled substance, Endocet (oxycodone and acetaminophen tablets), with intent to distribute, and sale of a controlled substance. Pruitt was released on \$10,000 bond awaiting grand jury action.

On January 19th, Frances Grindle, 40, was arrested for three counts of sale of a controlled substance, hydrocodone and Xanax, at her home in the North Crossroads area, 35 County Road 333. According to Jeff Palmer, drug investigator with the TCSD, Grindle is currently being held in the Tishomingo County Jail, since she was already on probation for another conviction.

On January 25th, James New-

comb, 31, of 888 Highway 25, Dennis was charged with two counts of obtaining a controlled substance by fraud, said Palmer.

Newcomb was released on \$10,000 bond, awaiting grand jury action.

Malinda Cruise, 39, of 157 County Road 7 in Belmont was charged with one count of sale of oxycontin, said Palmer. She was released on \$5,000 bond until grand jury action.

On February 2, 2011, officers with the Iuka Police Department, North MS Narcotics, and Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department executed a search warrant at the residence of Debra Murrah located at apartment 601, Pickwick Circle Apartments in Iuka. As a result of the search warrant, Murrah, age 43, was arrested for possession of hydrocodone with intent to sell and possession of methadone with intent to sell. The officers seized 59 dosage units of hydrocodone with a street value of \$413.00 and 36 dosage units of methadone with a street value of \$360.00. Bond was set at \$10,000.00.

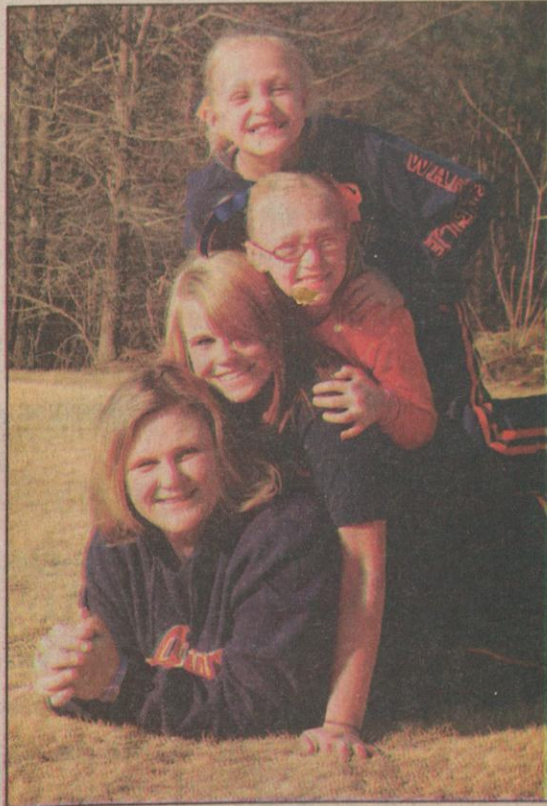
Iuka Mourns Death of Beloved Teacher, Daughter, Sister, Friend Jeanne Perkins Buntin

She worked to make science fun for her students and made it relate to everyday life. Her past and present students always had nice things to say about Jeanne and their love was evident at visitation Tuesday evening at the Iuka Church of Christ as both students and co-workers stood in line in the cold to pay their respects. There is no doubt that there will be a great void at IMS with her absence.

All those who knew Jeanne knew that her great love was her family, especially her three daughters. She had a special connection with each of them. She and her firstborn, Elizabeth, loved to laugh or cry while watching classic movies together. Megan, her first twin daughter, shared a bond with her mom through their love of animals. Megan would often go with her mom to help at her grandfather's animal clinic. Her second twin daughter, Morgan, shared her mom's love of sports and often sported Auburn attire just like her mom. Jeanne was born on July 31, 1970 in Opelika, AL, while her father was attending school at Auburn University to become a veterinarian. 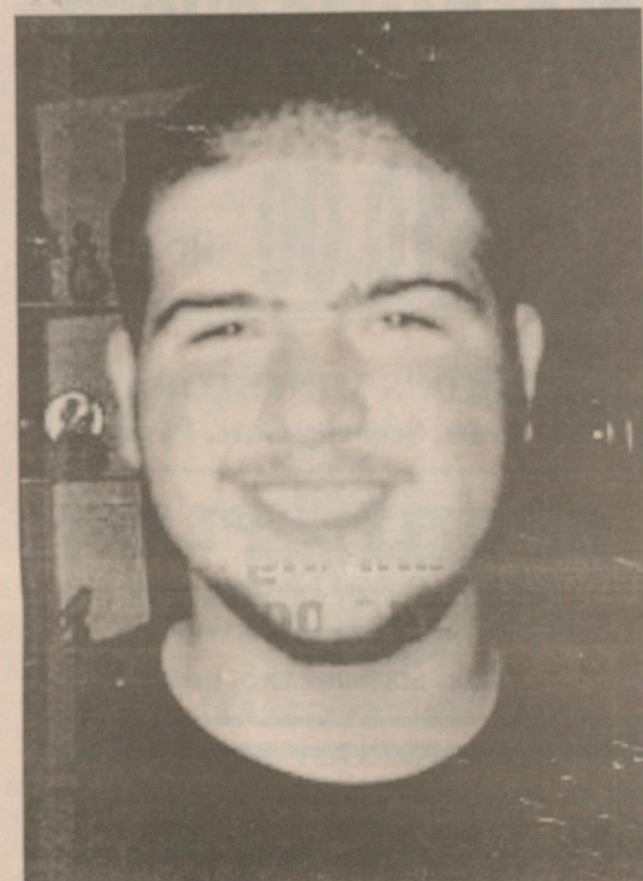
FEBRUARY IS NATIONAL HEART MONTH

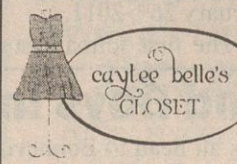

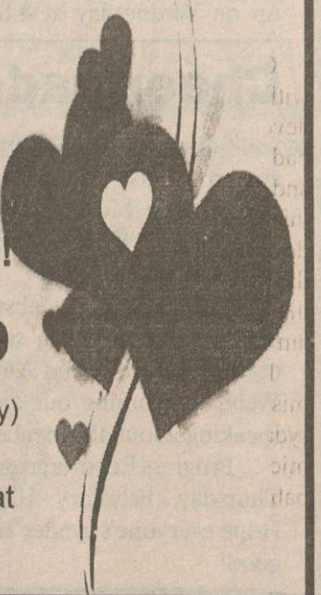

Favorite Iuka Restaurant, Country Cupboard, Closes Operation After 30 Years

For more than 30 years, owner and operator Norma Vandiver has closed the doors. The Cupboard, as well as that husband, Mackie, has been a determining factor in this decision. The opening of their business on Eastport Street in Iuka has been involved in the operation. The early days were located in the side of the present building. At that time, Mackie made the donuts distributed them out town. The bakery was filled with pies, brownies and bread. Delicious dishes were also made. The Vandiver's son, Becky (who now lives in San Antonio), baked and decorated wedding cakes, birth cakes and other delicacies.

As the business continued to grow, Norma employed many school boys and girls, many of whom she helped through high school and college years. She was affectionately referred to as "Miss Norma" and actually became much a part of their lives.

The highlight of Norma and Mackie's entire operation was a dinner around the holidays when their young 4-year-old grandson, Hunter Scheuk of San Antonio, Texas, donned his white apron and chef's hat and helped to serve the guests.

Through the years, Norma served old friends and hundreds of new ones all of whom she will truly miss. She is now focusing her attention on writing a cookbook requested by so many over the years. (We know it will be a best seller.)
