We Represent County at Mississippi Girl Choir

In February, 17th, 18th, and 19th, the Mississippi Girl Choir held its ninth annual Treblesong Honor Choir. The Mississippi Girl Choir is a musical organization that is based in Jackson, MS. Each year, this organization hosts an honor choir made up of exceptionally talented girls grades through twelve. Participants are selected by judges from auditions which were submitted in September.

Five local students took part in this year's Treblesong. Anna Claire Harwell, Sara Lyles, Savannah Howard, and Mary Steadman were selected from Tishomingo County High School where they are members of the choral program directed by Tara Castile. Madilyn McAnally was selected from Iuka Middle School where she is a member of the choral program directed by Jessica Robertson. The girls participated in

intense rehearsals of major choral works of music and performed these pieces in a concert on Saturday afternoon at Galloway United Methodist Church in Jackson, MS. They also met fellow musicians from all over the region.

The Treblesong choir was directed by Steven Roddy, internationally noted conductor and founder of the Houston Texas Children's Chorus.

Historical & Genealogical Society Awards Honors at Annual Meeting

Last Thursday wasn't a particularly historic day, but the Tishomingo County Historical and Genealogical Society (TCHGS) held several Tishomingo County folks, businesses, and organizations with awards for contributing to the preservation of the history of this great county. At the Midway School Building about 70 people of every age gathered for the annual meeting of the TCHGS to recognize recent success of the Society, and publicly honor those who help the organization in its quest to highlight and preserve the rich history of Tishomingo County. Due to scheduling issues last year, there was not an annual meeting so two years of awards were given out.

The Preservation Patron award highlighted one of the Society's most recent projects - the relocation and moving of the Burnsville Colored School.

been the victim of vandalism and neglect over the years. Superintendent Malcolm Kuykendall accepted a Patron award on behalf of the school district, and Dr. Kelly and Martha Segars accepted an award for providing land near their First American National Bank Burnsville Branch to which the school will be relocated. In its new home it will be more easily protected, and accessible for visitors.

Preservation Patron of the Year award for 2009 was presented to Gene Jourdan, of Iuka, and BancorpSouth, who made it possible for the Society to transfer the old Tishomingo County records to the local archives.

Old Tishomingo County included the land now known as Alcorn and Prentiss Counties before 1870, with Jacinto as the county seat. When the counties were split, our records went to Alcorn County, which turned out well, since the Tishomingo County courthouse burned, but now the records have been restored to Tishomingo County by the diligence and support of Mr. Jourdan.

Dr. Ben Kitchens, artist, musician, historian and author re-

ceived an Award of Merit, as did *The Tishomingo County News*, for outstanding contributions to the Society over a period of years.

The Spirit of TCHGS was awarded to Shelia Thorne (2009), who has pioneered a Local History course at Tishomingo County High School. The 2010 Spirit award went to Herman and Avanel Harrison for their work preserving many local historic cemeteries.

Volunteer of the Year awards for 2009 and 2010 were given to the Tishomingo County Master Gardeners Club, and to James Cole, respectively.

The Master Gardeners made great improvements to the landscaping of the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse in 2009, and Mr. Cole volunteers as a docent at the museum, and logged 125 volunteer hours there in 2010.

The Youth Volunteer of the year awards went to Meghan White (2009) and Mrs. Thorne's Local History class from last school year, for their many hours of compiling local history information, and volunteering at the Museum.

Mac McAnally to be Honored with a Marker as Part of Mississippi Country Music Trail

Tishomingo County's own Mac McAnally will be honored on Friday, February 25, 2011, at 1 pm at C. C. Shook Park in Belmont.

McAnally will attend the unveiling of a marker commemorating his important contribution to country music. The marker was funded by the Tishomingo County Tourism Council and will be erected by the City of Belmont.

Thursday night, McAnally will be among a select few to receive the Governor's Award for Excellence in the Arts in Jackson.

Music was the most obvious road for Lyman "Mac" McAnally to take from his Belmont, Mississippi hometown. He was a guitar and piano prodigy who performed in clubs at 13, wrote his first song at 15 and landed as a Muscle Shoals studio musician at 18. Mac signed his first record deal at 20 and launched two successful singles that were on the Billboard Hot 100. His songwriting drew the attention of Jimmy Buffett and Hank Williams, Jr., both of whom recorded his songs. Alabama took his "Old Flame" to No. 1 in 1981. The song cemented his status as a hit maker, a reputation that has never waned. Reba McEntire, T.G. Sheppard, David Allan Coe, Shenandoah, Ricky Van Shelton, Charley Pride, Randy Travis and Steve Wariner are just some of the artists who cut Mac's songs over the next 20 years.

Meanwhile, Mac's skills as a musician continued to bring calls that carried him into the studio. Over the course of his career he's built an enviable registry of credits that includes Roy Orbison, Hank

Williams, Jr., Amy Grant, Jimmy Buffett, Travis Tritt, Linda Ronstadt, Mary Chapin Carpenter, Dolly Parton and many more. And his guitar and vocal skills weren't confined to the studio as he joined Buffett's touring Coral Reefer band, an association that continues to this day. McAnally has also produced several of Buffett's albums and written many of his songs. In 2007, he was inducted into the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame and the following year the Country Music Association named him Musician of the Year.

The State of Mississippi and the Mississippi Development Authority/Tourism Division are celebrating the state's rich and unparalleled music heritage with the Mississippi Country Music Trail. The Mississippi Country Music Trail will initially consist of thirty markers that will span the entire state. The list of sites will commemorate Grammy winning Country Music legends, singer/songwriters, producers, historic sites, and the Mississippi events that shaped the culture of Country Music. Community and state leaders will attend the event. The public is also invited to attend this festive occasion.

Did You Know?

Experiencing a serious extended illness yourself or of having to care for a family member because of an extended illness is stressful enough without having to worry about losing your job. I have experienced both, an illness of my own, and that of caring for a family member. I am thankful that I had an employer that was sympathetic to my situation; unfortunately, that is not always the case. Until a short time ago, I was unaware that there was a federal law that gives some protection to people needing to take time off from work because of an illness of their own or that of a family member. The Family Medical

Act or FMLA addresses that very situation. Your employer should have the necessary paperwork to apply for the FMLA. The following is a description of the act:

The FMLA entitles eligible employees of covered employers to take unpaid, job-protected leave for specified family and medical reasons with continuation of group health insurance coverage under the same terms and conditions as if the employee had not taken leave. Eligible employees are entitled to:

Twelve workweeks of leave in a 12-month period for:

- the birth of a child and to care for the newborn child within one year of birth;
- the placement with the employee of a child for adoption or foster care and to care for the newly placed child within one year of placement;
- to care for the employee's spouse, child, or parent who has a serious health condition;
- a serious health condition that makes the employee unable to perform the essential functions of his or her job;
- any qualifying extenuating circumstance arising out of the fact that the employee's spouse, son, daughter, or parent is covered military member on "covered active duty," or Twenty-six workweeks of leave during a single 12-month period to care for a covered service member with a serious injury or illness who is the spouse, son, daughter, parent or next of kin to the employee (military caregiver leave).

With the help of Hot Quads Racing, an ATV parts suppliers in Opelika, Jordan and Brady have assembled highly tuned ATVs with top-end engines, tires and suspensions. The brothers will race as part of 12-rider Hot Quads' Top Gun National Race Team this year.

"Jordan and Brady have put in a lot of time over the past few years and it really shows on the track," Hot Quads manager Marc Smith said. "Riders for our national team are selected based on their racing resumes and past results; so it speaks highly of Jordan and Brady's level of commitment that they have been selected for the squad."

National circuit events begin in late February in Georgia, with events being held throughout the summer in Alabama, Kentucky, Maryland, Georgia, Illinois,

Pennsylvania, Ohio, Minnesota, New York, Michigan and Tennessee.

"Traveling is fun but we don't really think about the places we are going," Brady said. "When we are going to an event, our number one thing is getting ready to race. Nothing else really matters."

National series events are similar to weekend stops on the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series tour. Riders practice Friday, qualify Saturday and race Sunday.

Points are awarded depending on finishing order and accumulate throughout the 11-event season. The tour championship is awarded at the end of the season.

"The national circuit is intense competition," Smith said. "The best of the best spend their summers working throughout the circuit, so you are getting a fight each time you get on the course. Our guys usually do a pretty good job of handling it and we expect the same from Jordan and Brady. If they keep putting in the time, they should be

able to hold their own."

For enthusiasts such as Jordan and Brady, putting in the time shouldn't be an issue.

"We practice as much as possible," Jordan said. "To get good results at big events you have to practice, so we work as much as we can. For us, it's not really like practice. We love racing so we don't mind putting in the practice."

Brady echoed the sentiment.

"There is nothing else I'd rather be doing," he said. "I'd practice or race everyday if I could."

Jordan and Brady are the sons of Bruce and Rebecca Carson of Florence, AL. Grandparents are W.T. and Brenda Carson of Iuka and Tommy and Phyllis Brewer of Florence, AL.

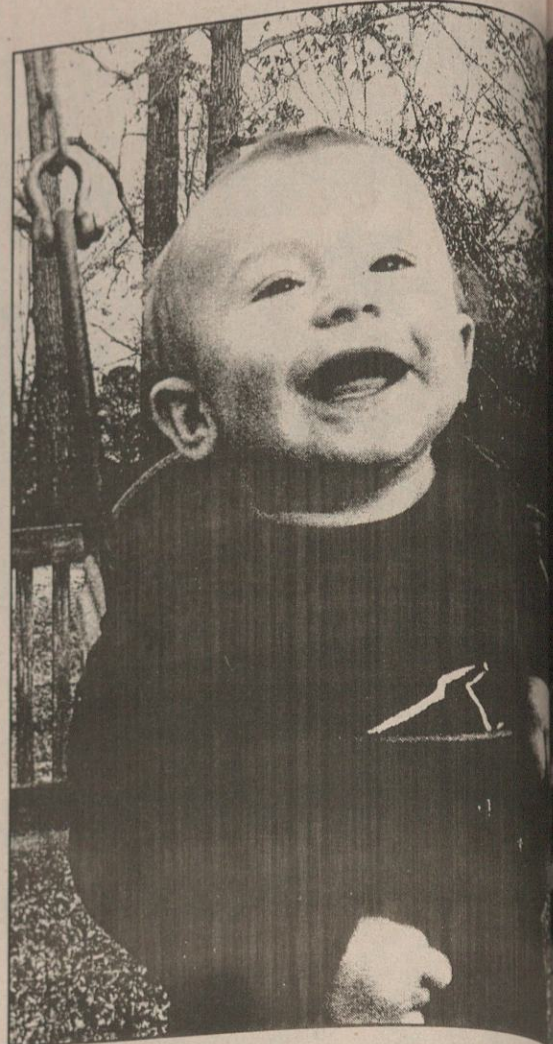

Burnsville Library Receives the Marshall Cavendish Excellence in Library Programming Award

The Burnsville Public Library, a branch of the Northeast Regional Library System, has been awarded the Marshall Cavendish Excellence in Library Programming award by the American Library Association.

Given annually, the Marshall Cavendish Award consists of \$2,000 and a citation of achievement. The award recognizes either a school or public library which demonstrates excellence in library programming by providing programs which have community impact and respond to community needs. Advocacy, partnerships and creativity of use of resources, regardless of the size of the library, are taken into consideration. Eligible programs or particular interest for consideration include: support of educational programs, library programs for children and adults, reading and literature programs for children, library programs for young adults, programming for multi-ethnic groups, community outreach, literacy programs and providing programs and services for persons with disabilities.

The Burnsville Library received the Marshall Cavendish Award for two programs that target elementary and pre-adolescent children: ALOFT ("A Learning Opportunity: Flight Technology"), a model aircraft construction class that is offered after school at the library; and SAFE ("Stop Abductions Forever"), an interactive program that teaches personal safety to elementary and pre-teen children.

Librarian Robert (Bob) Forbes created the ALOFT program in an effort to provide an activity for after-school children who might not otherwise have an opportunity for extracurricular involvement. Children construct model aircraft from kits provided by the library and learn the mechanics of flight. Upon completion of their projects, each student participates in a fly-in sponsored by local model builders clubs and gets to test fly his or her airplane. ALOFT is sponsored in part by local contributions and by a Library Services and Construction Act (LSTA) grant awarded to the library

in 2009 through the Mississippi Library Commission. Classes are free of charge. All participating students receive complimentary membership in the Academy of Model

Aeronautics.

The SAFE program was created by Forbes in response to the increased number of abductions taking place across the country in recent years. Available to church and school groups, civic clubs, youth organizations, and any agency that serves pre-adolescents, SAFE consists of interactive video, instruction, and role playing activities that teach elementary and pre-teen children how to avoid unsafe situations. SAFE has been widely received by local churches and schools and is recognized as a valuable tool for helping children avoid danger. Forbes will travel to New Orleans to accept the award at the American Library Association's annual conference this summer.

The Northeast Regional Library congratulates Bob Forbes for his hard work and dedication in making his library an integral part of his community.

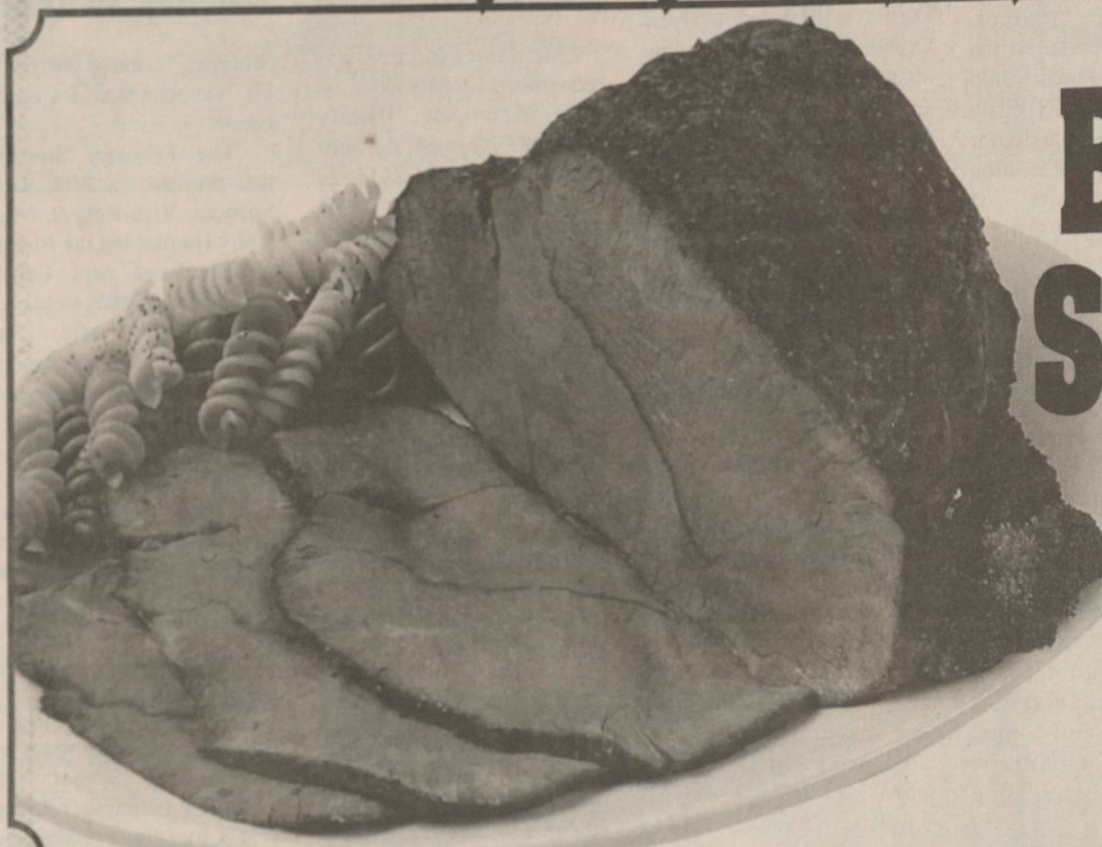

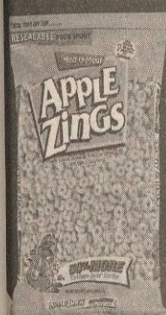

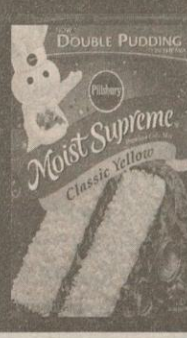

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors is seeking proposals from Health Care Professionals to provide "sick call" and medical care for inmates located in the Tishomingo County Jail in Iuka, Mississippi. The proposal will need to include:

Health care providers will be required to provide "sick call" for the inmates at the Tishomingo County Jail located in Iuka, Mississippi on a weekly basis. Sick call is defined as: "Sick call" is care for an ambulatory inmate with health care system requests that are evaluated and treated in a clinical setting. It is the system through which each inmate reports for and receives appropriate medical services for non-emergency illness or injury.

Sick call provides inmates with an opportunity to have their requests evaluated by health care professionals and responded to within a reasonable time. While it is difficult to give precise times limits in which these requests are to be met, as a rule, non-emergency requests should be triaged within 24 hours and the inmate seen by a qualified health care professional at sick call within the next 24 hours (72 hours on week-ends); and, when necessary, a referral is made for the inmate to see a physician within a week of the original complaint.

In general if an inmate reports to sick call more than two times with the same complaint and has not seen a physician, he or she should receive an appointment to do so.

"Triage" within this proposal is defined as the sorting out and classification of patient/inmate health complaints to determine priority of need and proper place of health care.

The proposal should include the provision for 24 hour emergency medical and dental care for jail inmates and include the following:

- On site emergency first aid and crisis intervention.
- Emergency evacuation of the inmate from the facility.
- Use of an emergency medical vehicle.
- Use of one or more designated hospital emergency rooms or other appropriate health care facilities.
- Emergency on call physician, dentist and mental health professional services when the emergency health facility is not located in the nearby community.

The contract period for the services requested will be from March 31, 2011 until January 2, 2012, and should include one month and six month renewal options and the price of those options.

The Supremacy Of Bible Doctrine

Does the religious world ever seem strange to you in our day, as many in it speak of the need to forget about doctrine and "just love one another"? My dear friends, love is itself a doctrine! Perhaps some people are trying to say that we should get away from divisive dogmas, and I could agree with this, as long as true doctrine is still proclaimed. Our word "doctrine" is defined from the Greek language as meaning "instruction (the act or the matter)". If anyone is saying that we do not need instruction in our day, rather we just need to love one another, he is poorly "instructed" in what the Bible actually teaches!

Paul the apostle gave great instruction to young pastor Timothy in I Timothy 4:13-16: "Till I come, give attendance to reading,

to exhortation, to doctrine. Neglect not the gift that is in thee, which was given thee by prophecy, with the laying on of the hands of the presbytery. Meditate upon these things; give thyself wholly to them; that thy profiting may appear to all. Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee." Paul told Timothy to give particular attention to three things: the reading of Scripture publicly, to exhorting or encouraging his people in the things of God and to doctrine, or instruction. I wonder how many churches today have the idea that doctrine is some dry, cold and irrelevant material that kills churches? The exact opposite is true; real churches are built on correct doctrine!

Did you notice in our verses that Paul told Timothy to meditate on the things that he had mentioned and to give his complete attention to them? This would be profitable for Timothy and all who might hear him. So, what is to be heard in churches is not just some kind of entertaining program, rather it is the doctrine of God, with encouragement to follow what has been publicly read from Scripture. This may not draw the biggest crowds, but it will get the approval of God. Which do you think is more important, in light of our verses above?

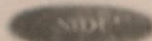
