and local government officials gathered at C.C. Shook Park for the dedication ceremony for a Country Music Trail Marker honoring Belmont's Mac McAnally.

Mac McAnally was born July 15, 1957, and christened Lyman Corbett McAnally, Jr. By the age of three he was signing gospel at Belmont First Baptist Church and by age 15 was earning money playing piano. By the age of 19, McAnally had his first record and a pop radio hit. Alabama,

Randy Travis, John Anderson, Ricky Scaggs, Ricky Van Shelton, Charley Pride, and Jimmy Buffett recorded Mac McAnally songs, and, by the 1990's, McAnally emerged as a producer, operator of a recording studio, performer, and song writer. Mac has won the Musician of the Year award multiple times and he has been inducted into the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame and the Mississippi Musicians Hall of Fame.

Conservation Corner Swamp Rabbits by James L. Cummins

Most Mississippi hunters are familiar with the cottontail rabbit, but less familiar with the swamp rabbit, or cane cutter as I call them. The swamp rabbit, also a member of the cottontail family, is a challenging quarry and possesses a number of unique characteristics.

Perhaps its most distinguishing feature is its large size relative to the cottontail. The swamp rabbit ranges in length from 18 to 22 inches and reaches a weight of over 6 pounds. In addition to its large size, the swamp rabbit can be identified in the field by the black to rusty-brown color of the fur.

Although swamp rabbits are found generally along streams and rivers, within these areas they are found in greater numbers where brush piles, fallen trees and dense vegetation provide optimum food and cover. Swamp rabbits are always found in close proximity to water, but they may temporarily utilize other areas in response to seasonal food availability.

The habitat value of wetlands to swamp rabbits is directly related to the size of the area. Typically, areas of at least 250 acres are more likely to maintain stable populations than narrow strips along streams or patches of wooded wetlands.

If you have the use of a pack of beagles, they can be a great help. How-

ever, beagles trained on cottontails often have difficulty with swamp rabbits, due to some special behavioral differences between the two. It is very important to hunt slowly, since swamp rabbits will often hide and remain still, allowing danger to pass.

Weather has a profound effect on swamp rabbit movement. When it is cold (below 40 degrees Fahrenheit), they tend to sit longer and are difficult to jump. As long as the temperature doesn't get into the single digits, cold weather is a benefit in that you are able to get close to the rabbits before they jump.

When the temperature is extremely cold, swamp rabbits tend to stay in hollow logs and trees for protection, and you may as well stay home. On warmer days above 60 degrees Fahrenheit, they tend to run before you get very close, often jumping out of gun range, then starting to walk again, a swamp rabbit will jump, providing me with a shot.

Historical & Genealogical Society Releases New Publications

Volunteers of the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society (TCHGS) diligently work long hours to serve the County on a historical level. Tishomingo County has a wealth of information sitting on its doorsteps, and the Society is dedicated to preserving and protecting those resources. The many genealogical accomplishments of TCHGS are no secret. The Society has published several resource books, developed a research library, and maintained these resources for the past 15 years, presented genealogy workshops, and publishes a quarterly journal. TCHGS has made great strides.

The Society publishes genealogical resources to assist the researcher and assist monetarily in keeping the historical archives and museum open to the public. The newest publications released include:

Obituaries of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Volume 1: A and B Surnames, 1845-1999

In 2007, the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society began compiling obituaries published in local newspapers. This obituary project snowballed into searching old microfilm and yellowed newspaper clippings in order to compile as many obituaries as possible for genealogical research. Due to the size of the obituary collection now available, it is necessary for the Society to offer this material in volumes. This first volume of local obituaries is offered for surnames beginning with A and B. These obituaries date back as far as 1845 and progress through 1999. The excerpts contain many informative facts. This 588-page book will be available on or about March 5th for \$25.00.

Sick call is defined as: "Sick call" is care for an ambulatory inmate with health care system requests that are evaluated and treated in a clinical setting. It is the system through which each inmate reports for and receives appropriate medical services for non-emergency illness or injury.

Sick call provides inmates with an opportunity to have their requests evaluated by health care professionals and responded to within a reasonable time. While it is difficult to give precise times limits in which these requests are to be met, as a rule, non-emergency requests should be triaged within 24 hours and the inmate seen by a qualified health care professional at sick call within the next 24 hours (72 hours on weekends); and, when necessary, a referral is made for the inmate to see a physician within a week of the original complaint.

In general if an inmate reports to sick call more than two times with the same complaint and has not seen a physician, he or she should receive an appointment to do so.

"Triage" within this proposal is defined as the sorting out and classification of patient/inmate health complaints to determine priority of need and proper place of health care.

The proposal should include the provision for 24 hour emergency medical and dental care for jail inmates and include the following:

- a. On site emergency first aid and crisis intervention.
- b. Emergency evacuation of the inmate from the facility.
- c. Use of an emergency medical vehicle.
- d. Use of one or more designated hospital emergency rooms or other appropriate health care facilities.

e. Emergency on call physician, dentist and mental health professional services when the emergency health facility is not located in the nearby community.

The contract period for the services requested will be from March 31, 2011 until January 2, 2012, and should include one month and six month renewal options and the price of those options.
