Tishomingo Man Dead After Chase in Margerum

A Tishomingo man is dead after a car chase in the Cherokee Monday evening, and an autopsy has been ordered.

Timothy Dale Hale, 47, of Tishomingo, was found about 150 yards from the truck in which he was a passenger Monday night, off Mill Creek Loop, in the Margerum area, west of Cherokee, Alabama.

He was pronounced dead by Colbert County Coroner Carlton Key, who transported the body Tuesday to Huntsville for an autopsy.

The Alabama Bureau of Investigation is heading up the investigation, said Colbert County Sheriff Ronnie May, since his officers were involved in the chase.

Officials said that Hale was a passenger in a truck driven by Greg Frederick, 50, of Tishomingo. Deputies attempted to stop the truck for improper lane usage. Reports indicate the driver would

not stop and led deputies onto Line Kiln Hollow Road before coming to a stop on Mill Creek Loop. Hale and Frederick jumped from the truck and ran, according to reports.

Kory Frederick, 30, son of Greg Frederick, another passenger, remained with the truck.

As deputies were searching for the two men who ran, they found Hale unresponsive and immediately called for medical assistance, according to state trooper Curtis Summerville, a public information officer for ABI.

Summerville said medical personnel were unable to revive Hale, and he was pronounced dead.

ABI officials said authorities are still searching for Greg Frederick.

Deaton Funeral Home of Belmont will be in charge of arrangements for Hale, following ABI release.

South Tishomingo County House District 19 Escapes Change...for now

Tishomingo County escaped some changes when the Senate killed the Mississippi House of Representatives re-districting recommendations Tuesday, but we still aren't out of the woods.

Late Tuesday afternoon, in an unprecedented move, the Senate tabled the House recommended plan, effectively killing it, explained District 1 Representative Lester "Bubba" Carpenter, of Burnsville.

"We're in new territory here," said Carpenter. "The Senate has never killed the House plan. The redistricting committee is essentially back to square one. It may

end up in the courts."

That means the probability of House elections this year, and again next year, too, since the re-districting process will likely extend past the June 1st qualifying deadline, said District 19 Representative Mark DuVall (D), of Mantachie. DuVall is one of a few democrats who voted against the Democratically-controlled house plan. He joined 48 percent of the rest of the house who voted against it, including nearly all the Republicans.

But DuVall's reasons for voting against the plan are more personal. His current district, 19, had parts of Tishomingo and Itawam-

ba Counties removed, and more of Lee County added, including downtown Tupelo. District 21, currently served by Donnie Bell-D, of Fulton, would take in the south east part of Tishomingo County.

"I was elected by a predominantly rural district," explained DuVall. "Belmont, Mantachie, and Mooreville have a lot of concerns in common, but I'm just not sure downtown and east Tupelo have the same similarities."

The proposed district changes

Tight Budget Helping County Pull Through Slow Economic Times

Tishomingo County is in prettied shape halfway through the 2010-2011 fiscal year, according to figures discussed at the Board of Supervisors' meeting Monday.

Keeping budgets tight, and county debt far below the \$21 million limit allowed by state statute, the county has been able to still provide matching money for economic development and job creation.

Because of recent increases in costs, Board President James Dowell asked for an update Monday from Purchase Clerk in West on how the heavy fuel-consumption departments of the mill and sheriff's department are doing on fuel costs.

"We know we have to do what we have to do, but we need to know if we need to make any adjustments to head off trouble," McDowell.

West reported that both de-

partments were within acceptable ranges for halfway through the fiscal year. The landfill was over budget \$600, and the road districts' fuel figures "looked good."

The general fund, from which all the elected officials' (tax assessor, sheriff's department, etc.) budgets come, stands at \$1,019,872.

The total county balance as of February 28th is \$8,081,070, and a year ago it was \$8,146,039.69. This number includes all county funds, including the general fund, road district funds, economic development funds for county building improvements to accommodate new and existing businesses, and the TVA *in lieu* funds. Chancery Clerk Peyton Cummings pointed out that much of this money is earmarked for certain purposes, and the county is not at liberty to

Consultants Advise TAP Alliance to Build on Regional Strengths

Tapping into regional strengths, and working together is the key to maximizing the potential for Tishomingo, Alcorn and Prentiss Counties, the coalition that makes up the TAP Alliance.

Tuesday afternoon at Northeast Mississippi Community College, Del Boyette of Boyette Strategic Advisors, urged a gathering of about 50 elected and economic development officials to

adopt a regional attitude when it comes to attracting business and industry to their corner of northeast Mississippi.

Boyette was hired by the TAP Alliance to help the recently organized alliance make a plan for success. TAP members have hopes of drawing an industry, like the PUL Alliance (Pontotoc, Union & Lee Counties) managed to do with Toyota.

Boyette's report pointed out strengths of the region with close proximity to Memphis, Tupelo, Jackson, Tennessee, and Huntsville, Alabama. Other assets are the river (Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway), and port (Yellow Creek Port); real estate potential; a predominantly manufacturing workforce; NEMCC; health care access and very low cost of living.

He said Downtown Corinth has the potential to be the type of downtown that will help attract young professionals to the entire region and this should be viewed as an asset by all, and not as competition by other towns in the region.

As other consultants and advisors have long said of Tishomingo County, the whole region does not seem to embrace its recreation potential provided by Pickwick Lake and Bay Springs Lake.

Some industries he said had promise for the future of the TAP area were: alternative energy, like bioenergy and solar component manufacturing; food manufacturing; metal fabrication/steel, transportation equipment manufacturing and automotive and aerospace suppliers.

spend it without the approval of various state entities.

"That's pretty good considering all the matching funds we have been able to add to economic development incentive packages that have brought a lot of jobs to the county this year," said Cummings.

Cummings said that the only bonded debt the county has is the \$5 million with which they are constructing the new jail.

Other Items

In other news, the board discussed the relocation of a 3-phase power pole in Tri-State Park which is impacting construction of the new building that will house Ershigs' new expansion. The company is scheduled to start producing the fiberglass tanks next week. The line is in the way of getting the, 60-foot tall structures down to the Tri-State Park dock for shipment down the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway.

The board was considering a \$10,033.90 quote from the Tishomingo County Electric Power Association to move the pole.

Cleanup for Illegal Dumpsites

West advised the supervisors to submit proper documentation for reimbursement of cleaning up illegal

dump sites in the county.

Census Report

Cummings reported that there have been some population shifts in the county, but all areas changed less than the 10 percent that would necessitate redistricting of the county supervisor districts.

The district with the most people now is the 5th District (3,996 total persons), followed by the 1st District (3,945), and then the 2nd District (3,930), and 4th District (3,872). The 3rd District has the least people with 3,850 persons.

did join some split voting districts like Cotton Springs and North Belmont which is desirable, he said.

Another concern is Bell, who DuVall said voted to take away Tishomingo County's much contested TVA in lieu funds, and also [Bell] was against resort status being granted to property on Bay Springs Lake. The resort status, awarded by the Legislature, made that Tishomingo County property and surrounding ones more valuable and marketable, even though the proposed resort has not materialized.

Carpenter said he was pleased with the proposed plan, except the odd western added area that includes Corinth High School. He said that there had been some opposition from Corinth officials to the move.

A Lifetime of Organic Eating!

Organic food. Today one hears so much about organic food. I don't remember ever hearing the word when I was growing up. If it was a common term, I didn't hear about it. Of course youth were kept in the dark about most things in the twenties and thirties. But when World War II broke out teens became men and were drafted to serve in the various military services. Times changed over night.

But back to why I'm writing about organic food. I have two or three stories about organic food, but I only want to share one.

At Christmas a friend of mine gave me a pack of organic ham. Why do I know it was organic? It was raised on home-grown produce, corn, vegetables, watermelon, fruit, slop (scraps from the kitchen), and everything home grown. No potions to speed up the growing process. I said "friend" and one is a friend who will give away organic ham. This ham happened to be "top of the line ham." I haven't indulged

in such gourmet meat since I was a child or maybe in the early years of marriage. I may not be a licensed connoisseur but I'd say this ham would win the blue ribbon in 4-H competition. I was careful to cook it only when I was alone. That way I received the full benefits of organic ham which one seldom gets and senior adults need this specialty!

While enjoying this treat my mind wandered back to the "good ole days" when everyone ate organic ham. In fact about everything was organic only we didn't know it was organic. Even tobacco was organic. We had to pick the worms off the leaves, put them in a tin can with "coal oil" (kerosene) to kill the worms. This was a chore I detested. You couldn't rake the worms off. That would bruise the leaves. They had to be hand picked off. No poisons on tobacco of yester-year.

Hog killing was a special day at our house as well as at our neighbors' houses. I never got to participate even after I married. I felt my students needed me more that day than

I was needed at home. I knew nothing about most of the chores since I'd had no training growing up.

The hog killing went something like this: first, the weather had to be cold. Not cold enough to freeze the meat because it had to absorb the salt, but cold enough to deter the presence of a fly.

On the evening before the big day everything was made ready. The meat box in the smoke house was cleaned and fresh salt ready. My dad would go borrow another wash pot. He always killed two hogs and sometimes the third one in late winter. It took lots of hot water to scald two hogs. The slabs were brought in. There was always a saw-mill nearby. (Kindling was splintered in abundance. Kindling is obtained from aged pine knots and sometimes trees). They had lots of rosin and burned great.

The pots were filled with well water and everything was ready for the big day. It was a big day for the adults but we kids were sent right on to

school. The hogs were sometimes our pets and we kids enjoyed watching them eat and yes, grow into four or five hundred pound porcine beauties. Each farmer prided himself by having the biggest hog from the same litter of pigs.

Three of my uncles, their wives and my grandpa and grandma were always the helpers.

Jack, the mule was harnessed and hitched to a ground-slide. Every farmer had a slide. The freshly killed hogs were lifted by the men onto the slide and Jack carried them to the house. The quality of meat depended upon this procedure.

Everyone knew his job and the hog killing went like clock-work. They had an assembly line in progress but didn't know it was so called.

My grandmother always cut off the leaf fat. She was so adept with a knife she never cut into the intestines. The leaf fat was used to start the cooking-out of the other fat to make lard. The lard would be put into five gallon cans or gallon glass

jugs. This was the year's shortening for cooking and seasoning. The cracklings, were delicious while hot and good for making crackling bread later.

The meat was cut up, carried to the smoke-house and salted down. They were careful to not let them touch each other and be completely covered with fresh salt.

The sausage was ground and seasoned with home grown sage and pepper and salt. Since there were no freezers or refrigerators the sausage and ribs had to be canned.

Mom would partly fry the sausage and ribs and pack them in hot jars. The jars were inverted, the fat helped seal the jars and there was no spoilage.

My grandmother made sacks from old white sheets. They were about one inch by five inches wide and about thirty-six inches long. These were filled with sausage, patted flat and hung in the smoke-house over the smoke and dried. The smoked sausage really tasted good in the summer when meat was scarce.

After all the meat was

taken care of everyone home with a flour sack with liver, sausage, tenderloin (loin) and ribs. They would carry a mess pressed (soupe meat) later.

After the ham, shoulders and middlings (bacon) taken from the salt they smoked. It was done by putting coal from the fire into a tub of ashes and dried hickory split wood coals for smoke only. The meat was kept going until the absorbed the desired amount of smoke. It's a wonder the smoke-house didn't burn. It didn't. It's still standing symbol of the wonderful organic meat we enjoyed knowing how healthy we were eating. I believe organic word and today we don't have anything that is so natural. It cost too much for preservatives put into our

poisoning the ground weeds and grass, as well as the plants to rid them of and bugs, could be the cause of cancer is rampant in our city today?
