## Iuka Heritage Festival this Weekend in Mineral Springs, Jaybird Parks

The 24th Annual Iuka Heritage Festival will offer fun for all ages this weekend, September 3rd and 4th.

The annual event will be held on September 3rd and 4th in Mineral Springs Park and Jay Bird Park in downtown Iuka. The festival is presented by the Iuka Her-

itage Committee, Inc. and their sponsors and is free to the public.

The annual festival includes an arts and crafts fair, party jumpers and a train for the kids, food and entertainment, the Wheels of Northeast Mississippi Annual Car Show, Tri-State Fly Wheelers Tractor Show and Parade, the

Rizpah Railroaders Transport Train, and the Scouts Heritage 5K Run/Walk.

Saturday morning will begin the Scouts' Heritage 5K Run.

One of the special features for this year include an appearance by the White Horse Dancers and Drummers of the Cherokee Tribe

of Mississippi, who will open the event in Mineral Springs at 10 a.m. Saturday.

Music kicks up beginning at 1 p.m. with the Smokehouse band, and at 2:30 the New Outlaws will play. Country music recording artist Leah Seawright, from Ft. Payne, Alabama will be the featured artist from 4:30 to 6 p.m., performing songs like "On the Backroads," and more from her album Country Girl 101.

The winners of the Iuka's Got Talent contest last Saturday will be performing a couple numbers after Leah Seawright.

### Historic Book Signing

Events at the historic Old Tishomingo County Courthouse include a book signing of Gunboats and Calvary, and Rosecrans Meets Price, two historical books about the Battle of Iuka and Eastport by Dr. Ben Kitchens.

There will be fun and food, and lots of arts and crafts all day in Mineral Springs.

## Cardinals and Braves Clash Friday Night in Belmont

In Mississippi high school football, all records and division classifications go out the window when it comes to rivalry games, and this week will be the biggest one around when the Tishomingo County High School Braves meet the Belmont Cardinals on their home turf Friday night.

Belmont leads in recent match-ups with the Braves - but the Braves are showing some promise with a new coaching staff, and some new potential.

The Cardinals are 1-0, after a win over Mantachie in their season opener last week, and they

reached the quarter finals of the playoffs last year. However, they lost several of their starters last year, including some 1,000-yd rushers.

Against Mantachie, seniors Byron Southward and Jordan Powell looked like they were taking up the rushing slack, though, and the Braves will have to deal with new quarterback Collin Harris, and Alexander Fancher also in the backfield.

## Dove Season Opens this Weekend, Sept 3rd

Jackson - One of the most popular hunting days of the year is quickly approaching with the opening day of dove season, September 3rd.

Hunters need to be sure their hunting license is current for the 2011 hunting season, complete with Harvest Information Program (HIP) certification which is required for hunting all migratory game birds.

The bag limit for mourning doves and/or white winged doves is 15 per day with no more than 30 in possession; collared doves do not count in the bag limit. The possession limit does not apply on opening day. Shooting hours are from 30 minutes prior to sunrise to sunset.

In previous years, the

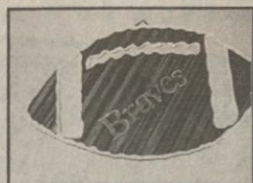
most common citation on dove fields has been no hunting license. Fewer license holders in Mississippi has a direct impact on the agency's ability to conserve our wildlife resources due to redistribution of federal aid dollars to other states. Hunters should also be sure shotguns are not capable of holding more than three shells, and be aware of how the field was prepared.

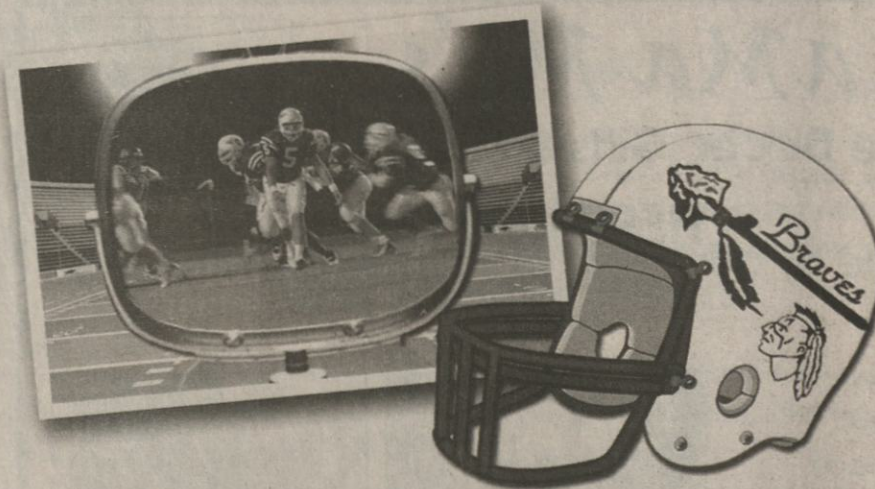

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing on its proposed budget for fiscal year 2011-12 Wednesday September 7, 2011 at 10 a.m. at Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors Room. At this meeting, a proposed ad valorem tax revenue increase in the proposed budget will be considered.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors is now operating with projected total revenue of \$10,977,798. \$3,484,865 of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. **When It Is Time To Leave Our Childhood**

It is very interesting to me that God has such a great plan for His church, the body of Christ. Far from some of the ideas we are hearing today about "how to do church", we have the plan of God clearly spelled out in the Bible. Ephesians 4:11-16 says, "And He gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some pastors and teachers; For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ: Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ: That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into Him in all things, Which is the head, even Christ: From Whom the whole body fitly joined together and compacted by that which every joint supplieth, according to the effectual working in the measure of every part, maketh increase of the body unto the edifying of itself in love."

I realize that this is too much material to cov-

er completely, but I will make a stab at it. First, we notice that God gave gifted men to equip His church. It is the job of these men to bring the church to maturity, as much as they can. It is also the job of the church body to respond to what these called men teach and preach. Then the saints are to be involved in the ministry, along with their leaders. This work of ministry is what will edify the body of Christ. Lazy Christians need not expect to grow into Christian maturity. God never intended that some Christians do nothing but warm a pew! We are to come to maturity through the "knowledge of the Son of God", not through some ear-tickling program that really teaches nothing about Christ. It is through this kind of maturity that we are no more children that fall for every hair-brained kind of spiritual teaching" that comes along! We can speak the truth in love, meaning that all of the body of Christ is to do it, so that the body grows by what every member supplies. The day of "stage entertainment Christianity" will not meet the criteria that is demanded in our verses, and it will not grow Christians who are no longer children!

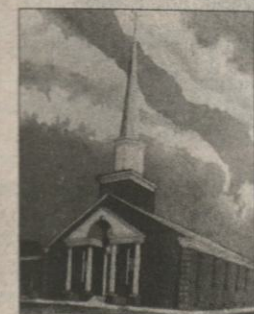

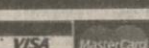
