McCalmon's Class Scores Perfect 300

A Burnsville teacher has been recognized by the Mississippi State Legislature for having the only perfect QDI score (300) in the Tishomingo County School District on last year's Algebra I tests.

Lorie McCalmon teaches seventh grade math, pre-Algebra and Algebra I at Burnsville Middle School, and last year, all her Algebra I students scored "advanced" on the state Algebra I test.

QDI is Quality Distribution Index, and is computed based on the scores of students on the state-wide SATP, or Subject Area Tests. Mrs. McCalmon's students

in 2009-2010 also all scored "advanced."

On Tuesday, Mrs. McCalmon was recognized with a resolution passed by the Mississippi House of Representatives, courtesy of First District Representative Lester "Bubba" Carpenter. Superintendent Malcolm Kuykendall, Assistant Superintendent Nancy Parker, School Board Members Jeff Allred and Michael Puckett, and Lorie's husband Michael were on hand Tuesday morning to present her with the signed resolution.

Lorie graduated with her bachelors degree in education from Mississippi State, and earned

her masters through Delta State. She has been teaching in Burnsville Middle School since 2004. Her philosophy is to teach each student as an individual, and to meet the needs of each child. She wants her students to know the importance of math and learn in a fun and effective environment. She accomplishes this by creating activities such as holding mock auctions to teach percentage calculation and matchbox drag races to learn distance, rate and time.

Lorie, her husband Michael, and sons Caleb, Stephen, and Josh, and his wife Morgan and their son Aiden all are members of Iuka Baptist Church.

Iuka Businesswoman's Heir Claims Life Insurance Money for Him, Not to Repay Loans

The son of an Iuka businesswoman denies his mother's life insurance should go to repay loans made to her by the local planning and development district.

Alvin Troy Marlar III of Burnsville filed suit in federal court recently to stop the \$600,000 payout from going to Northeast Mississippi Planning and Development District Inc. in Booneville.

The money would come from life insurance taken out by Beverly Ann Vatalaro Cummings to cover business loans for Carrington House, an Iuka personal care home.

Cummings' five loans were taken out from 2001-2002 through NMPDD. They were set to mature in 2012.

She died April 4, 2011.

Marlar said he is the beneficiary, while NMPDD claims his mother's estate owes it

\$653,506.94.

Marlar said he and another previous administrator told the district and its executive director, Sharon Gardner, that his mother "was misusing and had misused the loan funds." He claims nothing was done to investigate or to collect on the guaranties.

The defendants had no comment.

Planning and development districts make small business loans with economic development funds provided by state and federal governments (taxpayer money).

The applications usually include commitments to expand jobs.

Since Cummings' unexpected death and while the estate is being settled, the Carrington House continues to operate under temporary co-administrators of the estate who were appointed by Judge Michael Malski, confirmed attorney James Belue.

Power Out Sunday for 4,700 Due to Broken TVA Pole

A broken TVA power pole caused power to be out for about 4,700 Iuka area customers Sunday afternoon.

According to Tishomingo County Electric Power Association General Foreman Wayborn Bowling, a wooden pole supporting a 161,000-volt Tennessee Valley Authority transmission line broke, catching grass in the immediate area on fire, and breaking the electricity feed to the Iuka

Substation.

It took about an hour and a half for TVA to reroute power from west Alabama to the Iuka substation, while repairs are made.

Since it was September 11th, some people may have been concerned when all the power went out, but radio sources confirmed it was only a broken pole, and that Tishomingo County surely still lies near the bottom of any terrorism strike priority list.

Sheriff's Dept. Warns of Scam

Calls from Jamaica have been promising scholarships and monetary prizes... if you'll just wire the caller a "processing fee," it can be your lucky day!

Sound too good to be true? It is, of course, warns Chief Deputy Jamie Reynolds of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department.

Apparently, several people in the county have apparently received calls offering prize money, or scholarships and grants, in at least one case, reported Reynolds. He warns county citizens not to fall for these scams, and to never, ever give out personal or financial information, or promise to send "transaction

fees" to someone who calls you. "Also, advise your student-age children to beware of such scams," stresses Reynolds. He said that in one case, the junior college student received multiple scholarship and grant offers on his cell phone.

Jamaica seems to be the origin of many of the calls but they may have new codes that look like they are from the USA. As the calls are outside of the county sheriff's jurisdiction, those bothered by repeated scam calls are urged to call the Mississippi State Attorney General's office.

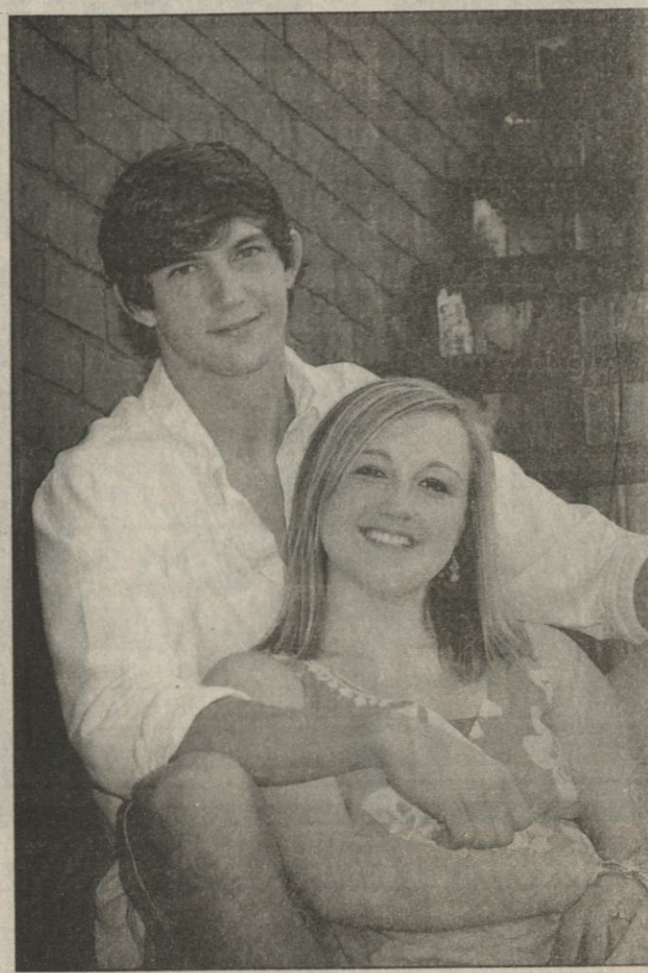
Williams-McCalmon To Wed September 24th, 2011

According to Reneta Smith, who organized the run in memory of her mother,

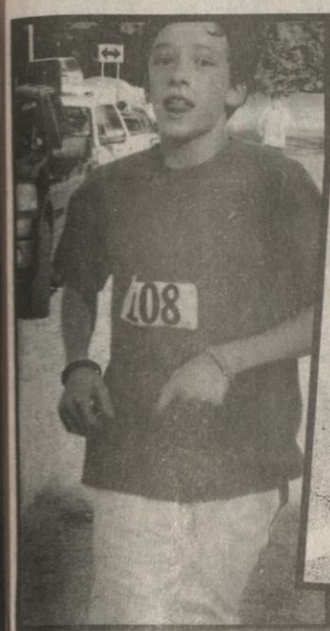

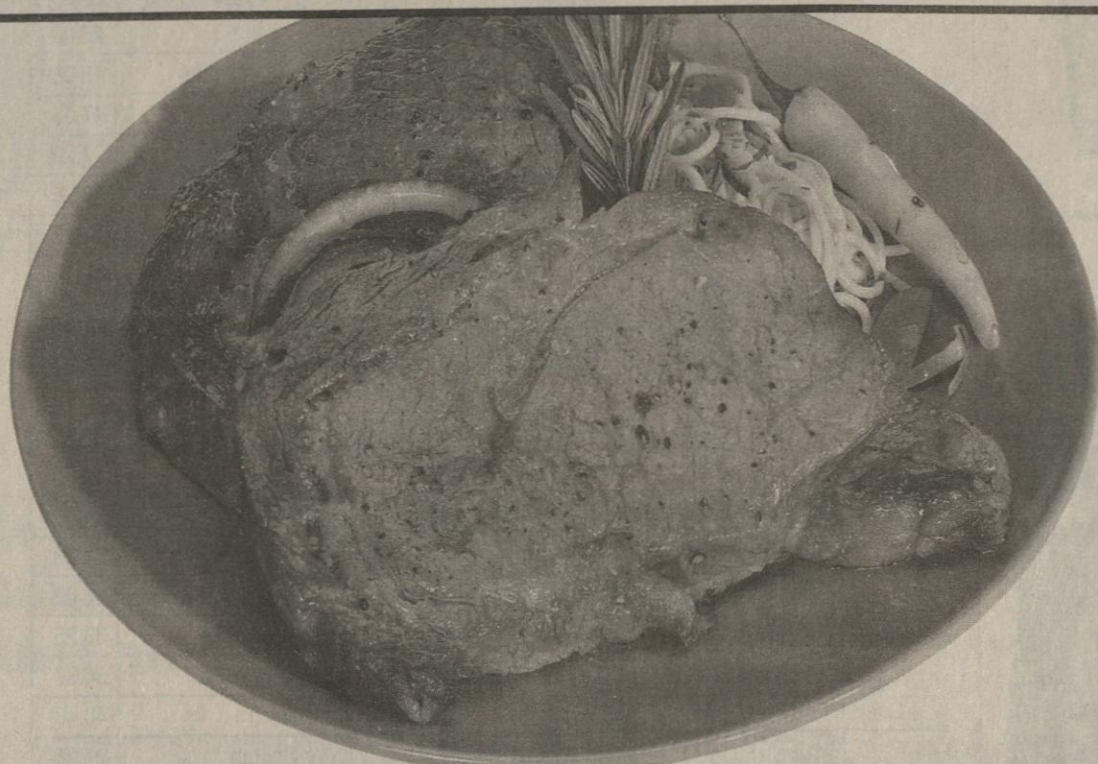

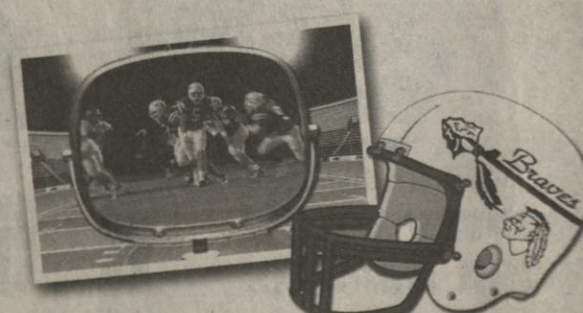

HOW TO HAVE FULL JOY

Our world is obsessed with the idea that human beings have a right to be happy. Through the years I have counseled with couples having marital problems. A common question that has often come from the lips of those seeking divorce has been: "Don't you think God wants me to be happy?" The anticipated answer was that in such cases a divorce was within the will of God. Of course, my answer was not that! Yes, there are a few cases in which a divorce can be granted on biblical grounds, but those cases are not nearly as many as some people think.

My point is that God does want us to enjoy life, and it is fine if God does give us happiness. Since happiness is

based on happenings, it is not likely that any Christian, or anybody else, will be happy all of the time. What we can have on a continual basis, however, is the joy of the Lord, and this article is designed to show how we can all have it, if indeed we are in the family of God by salvation.

It may be surprising to some people that Jesus Himself said that joy can come through spoken words! In John 15:7-10 we read: "If ye abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you. Herein is My Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be My disciples. As the Father hath loved Me, so have I loved you; continue ye in My love. If ye keep My commandments, ye

shall abide in My love; even as I have kept My Father's commandments, and abide in His love." Then John 15:11 tells us why Jesus gave the previous words (along with all the words of chapters 14-16): "These things have I spoken unto you, that My joy might remain in you, and that your joy might be full." So, we learn that the Word of God can bring full joy. John 15:7-10 tells us several things that should cause full joy: abiding in fellowship with Christ gets prayers answered; real discipleship means bearing fruit to the glory of the Father; Jesus loves us like the Father loves Him; keeping His commandments causes us to abide in His love. If we do not have fullness of joy, it is because we are not doing what Jesus has clearly told us to do! John wrote I John to bring fullness of joy. In I John 1:4 we read: "And these things write we unto you that your joy might be full." Perhaps most people are looking for joy outside the Word and will of God!
