WWII Veteran McRae Receives Replacement Purple Heart Medal

World War II veteran Edward McRae may have lost track of his original Purple Heart, but thanks to a local veterans' organization, McRae can once more proudly display the medal earned by his sacrifice almost 70 years ago.

Jim Weaver, commander of Corinth's Chapter 813 Military Order of the Purple Heart, presented the replacement Purple Heart medal to McRae in a ceremony at the Carrington House, in Iuka, last Friday.

Weaver learned of McRae a couple months back and made it his mission to get a replacement medal for "a gentleman entitled to a Purple Heart," which is one of his duties as a veterans' service officer.

There would be a road-block for Weaver's task, however. The building that housed the service records for McRae and thousands more, the National Personnel Records Center in St. Louis, Mo., burned in 1975.

Luckily McRae's family had held on to enough paperwork to establish the 94-year-old veteran's record in the army.

"I'm happy to make it official," Weaver said. "These awards have been entered into his permanent record."

The search revealed that McRae was the recipient of several more important awards - including the Bronze Star for heroism.

"You are to be commended for your bravery," Weaver told the infantry veteran.

McRae was born on Christ-

mas Eve, 1917, to John Thomas and Altie E. Blunt McRae in the Highland Community, southeast of Tishomingo. In 1941 he became one of the first Tishomingo County residents to be drafted into the Army. He was one of five brothers who would fight for America in the Second World War, and all returned home safely.

After training, McRae shipped out from the east coast, where he traveled south and then west through the Panama Canal. He remembers passing through the system of locks that control the canal's water level.

"I didn't know where I was going," he said.

He fought the Japanese in the Pacific Theatre. One of his most vivid memories is how he lived through a persistent grenade attack.

Early one morning on the island of New Guinea, McRae was inside a pillbox when the Japanese attacked.

"They threw grenades in the pillbox. They'd throw one in and I'd throw it right back out. They were going off before they hit the ground!" he remembered. "That's a close call right there."

In February 1943 he received the wound that earned his Purple Heart. He was hit by a rifle shot. The bullet passed through McRae's jaw from the right side and lodged in his left shoulder, where it remains.

"When the doctors looked at it and took x-rays they said it looked good, really shiny," McRae recalled. "They said, 'We're going to leave it in there - you'll go to your grave with that.'"

After his wounding, McRae was shipped back to the states, to a military hospital in Alabama.

"Sometimes you've got to be what you aren't just to get on."

"I was down there when Roosevelt died. When they said somebody was dead I just knew it was my daddy or mamma," he remembered.

For two months his jaw was wired shut and he had to subsist on a liquid diet. He got hungry, he said, but he made it through.

"They had my teeth wired together. They told me one day they were going to take these wires off tomorrow. So I got me a can of peanuts the day before," he said.

"The next day I ate that whole can of peanuts!" he said with a laugh.

The 94-year-old veteran is still active and glad to tell about his wartime experiences.

"I'm not ready to pass on," he said.

After hearing about the veteran's combat experience, one person at the ceremony said McRae must have been "a tough one" in those days.

"Maybe I was," McRae replied. "But sometimes you've got to be what you aren't just to get on."

September 2nd, James Rhodes, 39, was arrested on an indictment for possession of MDPV (bath salt). The Burnsville Police Department assisted in the investigation. Rhodes was released on a \$5,000 bond.

September 7th, Steven Belk, 50, was arrested for three counts of sale of suboxone. Belk was released on bond.

September 8th, Marie Malone, 36, was arrested for conspiracy to distribute cocaine and hydrocodone. Malone is currently still in

custody.

September 13th, John Garner, 50, was arrested for possession of hydrocodone with intent to sell and possession of Alprazolam with intent to sell and child endangerment. Garner was released on bond.

County Agencies Reimbursed by FEMA for April Tornado Work

At the regular third Monday meeting of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors September 19th, the Tishomingo County Emergency Management Agent's Office announced that the county has been reimbursed by FEMA for labor and other costs associated with cleanup after the April 28th disaster declaration.

The total amount paid, reported EMA Director Bill Strickland, was \$13,019.84.

Fire Departments and county districts worked to clear debris and handle the damage caused by severe storms, and at least one tornado, on April 28th.

The funds were distributed as follows: First District - \$5,533.26, Fifth District - \$3,279.74, and Sheriff - \$566.73. Additionally, the following fire departments split

\$3,592.86: Burnsville - \$756.75, Coleman Park - \$217.86, Eastport/Mill Creek - \$240, Harmony - \$360, Holt Spur - \$480, North Crossroads \$731.25; Snowdown - \$240, and Valley Grove - \$567.

Hannah Hamm, Floodplain Coordinator for the county said that several residents had received letters from their insurance companies requiring the purchase of flood insurance. Hamm said that people could come in to the office and get an elevation and analysis for their property to give insurance companies that could save \$4,000 a year in some cases.

Pending further information to be provided by Cindy Nelson, the board tabled a request from the Tishomingo County History Museum to consider helping fund some improvements to the county-owned Old Courthouse.

Doris Powell is finally settled into one place.

Powell, the severe profound special education instructor at Marshall Elementary, has connected with children with special needs in two Mississippi counties for nearly 40 years.

Fresh out of college, Powell started out as a special education instructor in the Tishomingo County School District in Iuka. In the 1980s, the Black Hawk native returned home to teach in the Carroll County School District. In a matter of years, she was back in northeast Mississippi teaching and helping students that relied on her on a daily basis.

Now at 58, Powell is home, and she doesn't plan on going anywhere else.

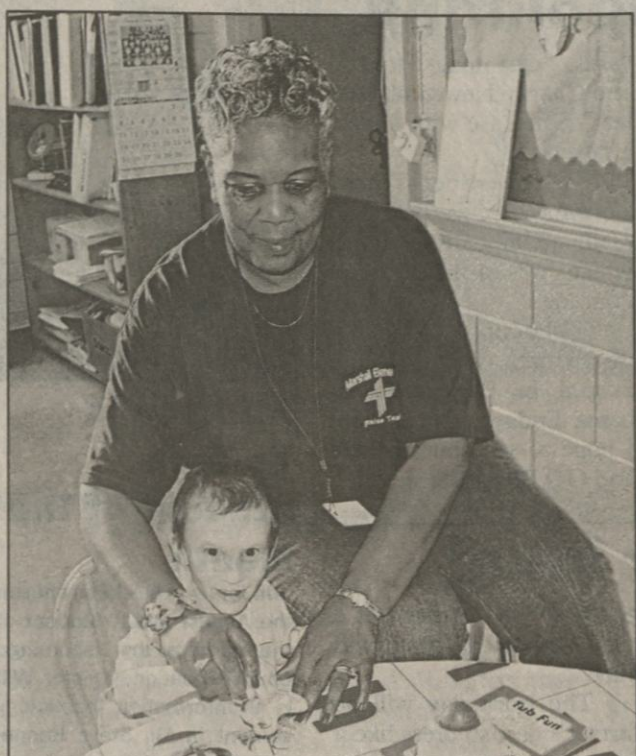
In the severe profound program, Powell instructs lower functioning children. It's something she has done for 34 years and is seriously dedicated to. Powell assists the children with things like communication and motor skills, among other activities.

"I love my job, and with these children is the only place I've ever enjoyed," Powell said.

Working with special needs children was a decision that Powell made several years ago, and over the years she has made herself one of the top special education teachers in North Mississippi.

"Special education has come a long way in Mississippi, and the Carroll County School District has a great program," Powell said.

The 1971 Vaiden High School graduate entered Jackson State University as an elementary education major. A year later, she realized that her skills were in special education. In 1972, she changed her major, and in 1975 she

graduated with a special education degree. Powell held on to the elementary education credits and finished with that as her minor.

In 1982, Powell returned to Carroll County as a teacher at Marshall Elementary. Three years later, she moved to J.Z. George High School until 1992. That year, she moved back to Tishomingo County. She returned to her native Carroll County again in 2005, this time at J.Z. George, and in 2009, she returned to Marshall Elementary.

"I did a little moving," she jokingly said. "This is where I want to be. Teaching is great, and I love seeing all

the familiar faces. I'm settled in now."

The Powells have two daughters and three grandchildren. Doris Powell is an active and dedicated member of Bethel CME Church in Carroll County.

Powell is the daughter of Lucille Streater and James and Lee Katherine Wright-Streater.

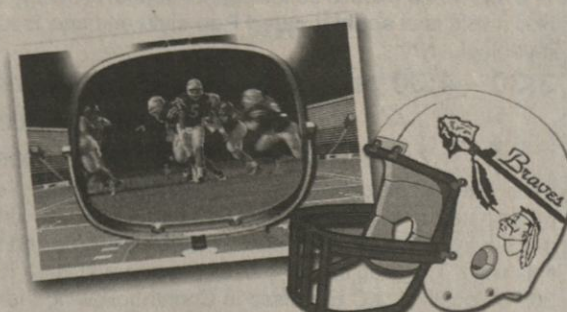

CCDF Board Meets at Wood Industries in Belmont

CCDF board members met on September 13, 2011, at Wood Industries in Belmont.

Board members discussed an upcoming expansion. The expansion is funded by a \$100,000 grant and a \$5,000 loan to the county. The construction will be advertised for late October. An announcement is forthcoming.

Board members discussed a potential new industry. The county has been promised a \$4 million loan and a little over \$1 million in grants for this project, if it happens. There are a lot of details to work out, so this is not a done deal.

Board members decided to hold the CCDF annual meeting on Tuesday, November 15, 2011. Details are forthcoming.

Board members discussed the status of the Schnadig Building. There are several prospects that appear to be considering the Schnadig Building. Another RFP is being worked on now. We do not want this potential interest in the Schnadig Building to build false hopes because industrial recruitment is fiercely competitive. For example, a recent project that considered the Schnadig Building ended up in another state. Mississippi put together financing and incentives worth around \$1.6 million. The other state offered over \$31 million. Small counties like Tishomingo County have a hard time competing with larger communities. Tishomingo County has won a number of projects over the past eight years, none due to outbidding the competition.

The board toured Wood Industries. CEO Jeff Wood reported that they purchased a Canadian company several years ago and moved the company to Belmont. Air compressors are our primary product. Our market is mid-level retailers such as Marvin's, Makita, Tractor Supply, and co-ops. We expect to double our sales over the next 12 to 18 months. We currently employ 35.

60% of our production is exported to Canada. We take pride in quality products and have an extremely low defect rate.

Board members thanked Wood Industries for hosting the meeting and conducting the tour. Home grown businesses and industries are the best type of economic development and benefit the community more than recruited industries.

Tishomingo County Fair Poultry Chain Auction

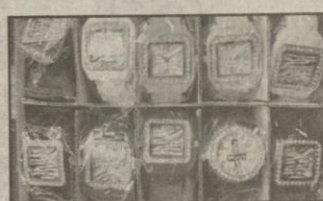

New Liberty Baptist Church Celebrates 100 Year Anniversary

New Liberty Baptist Church, located at 98 County Road 944, west of Burnsville in Tishomingo County has been celebrating 100 years during the month of September with roll call of members and testimonies from different periods of that 100 years.

September 25th will be the final celebration with day long activities which include old-fashioned Sunday, dinner on the grounds, testimonies, church history, roll call of early members, favorite songs of old, power point presentation from across the years and words from former pastors.

New Liberty was organized in 1911 with eleven charter members, J.T. Hall, Alice Hall, Mollie Hall, Pearl Hall, Garvin Hall, Walter Marlar, Mrs. Walter Marlar, Emmet Nagles, L.E. Frost, George Marlar and Ella Marlar.

Associational minutes of Tishomingo Baptist Association show that they were accepted into the association in September 1912 with 17 members.

For several years, they met in Holloway school and used Chapel Hill Methodist Church for revival meetings.

Around 1922 the first building was built on property donated by Mr. Charlie Benick.

A church minute from the early church showed record of a revival meeting which began January 1st, 1939 and ended on January 10th with 36 conversions and 54 total decisions. Bro. Otis Perry who delivered there sermons received



\$35.31 for his work. Mrs. G.A. Hall recalled that revival saying, "The weather was so bad that people could hardly get to the church but large crowds came. The power of the Holy Spirit was so greatly felt and when the invitation was given, people would flock down the aisle."

Soon after this revival the church felt it should relocate to a more suitable site since the main road had been moved. Mrs. Lou Thompson, a member of Chapel Hill donated the land. When the move began it was accomplished in one year without debt. The first service was held June 7th, 1942.

This white frame building, with improvements served the church until 1985. A new building was built next to the white frame, which was later torn down with basement left and turned into a fellowship hall. Bobby and Pat Kennedy donated additional land.

Pastors that served over the years were C.A. De-

loach, W.L. Norman, A.L. Spencer, M.C. Roland, J.E. Bolding, C.C. Perry, Horace Credille, Jimmy Bryant, Eddie Hamilton, Talmadge White, Raybon Richardson, T.E. Nethery, Lathon Bray, and at present Edwin Kennedy, who has just completed 18 years of service. Jesse Huggins assists as youth minister.

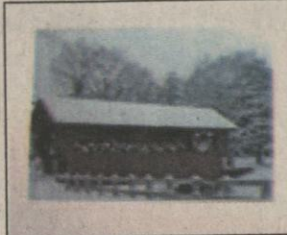
On July 8th, 2011 the church began tearing down the fellowship hall to begin construction of a new sanctuary with the present sanctuary to be turned into a fellowship hall.

From August 1911 to present time about 730 people have been a part of the fellowship of this church. At present, we have an average of about 80 for Sunday School and 100 plus for worship on most Sundays. We have an active Sunday night crowd studying in discipleship training, Wednesday night services with a large group of children, young people, and adults learning and growing in God's word. Precept Bible studies are offered

for those who wish to study more during the week.

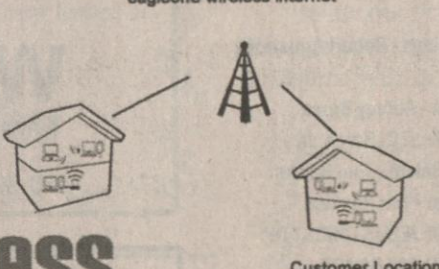

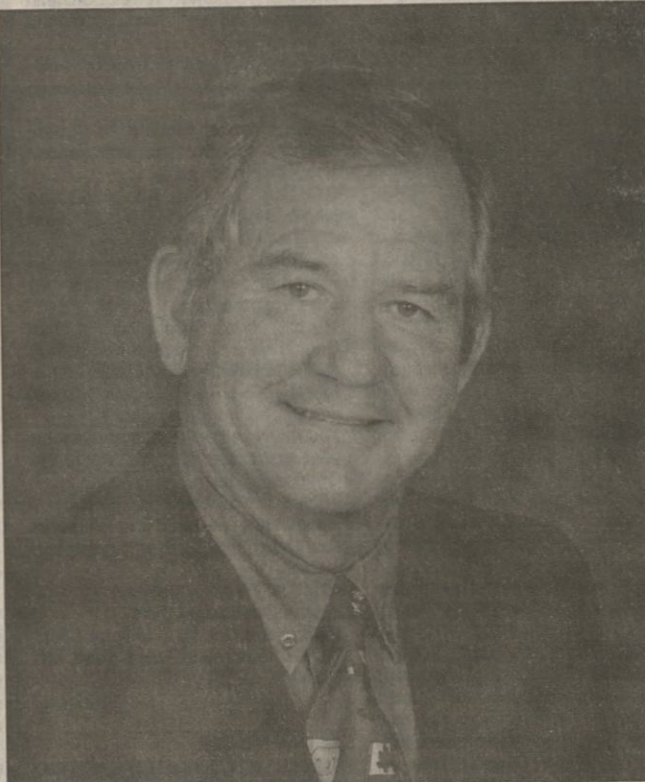

Take Your Best Shot Against the Flu

Iuka Medical Clinic wants area residents to beat the flu by getting a \$25 flu shot.

Influenza is a viral infection that can lead to a much more serious illness like pneumonia or bronchitis, and the flu shot is recommended for almost everyone 65 and older. The vaccination is also important for those with lung disease or other chronic conditions, and for those who spend a lot of time around sick or elderly people.

The flu vaccine does not cause the flu-it may result in a sore arm from the shot or a mild reaction, but not the flu. The body takes about two weeks after the vaccination to develop an-

tibodies, and the antibodies last about six months. Annual shots are recommended because the influenza viruses change.

The flu shot will not be given to anyone allergic to eggs. Individuals with acute respiratory or active infections or illnesses should not receive the vaccine until free from illness. Medicare covers seasonal influenza virus vaccination. Walk-ins are welcome for flu shots.

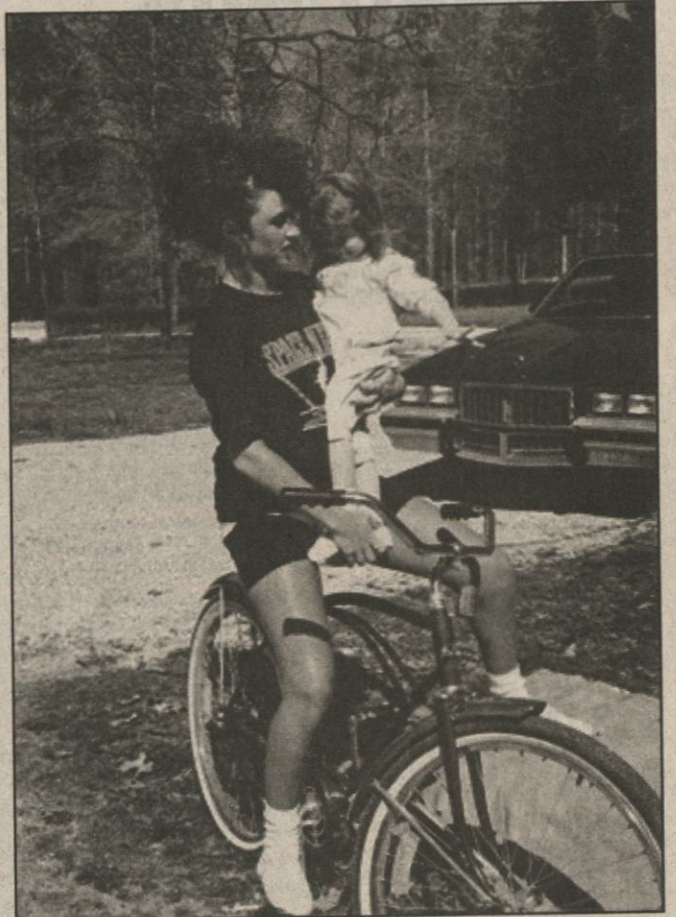

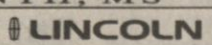
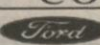
