

# **Funeral Services Held for Retired** Businessman, Merle L. Nelson

Merle L. Nelson, 87, of Iuka, fiel Saturday, September 24th, III. at the North Mississippi Medical Center in Iuka following

short illness. A well-known and respected usinessman in Iuka, Merle will ays be remembered for his wit, love for a good time, and his enerosity in donating to local hurches and fund raising events.

He was born May 11, 1924 in Holcut, one of two sons of Omer and Altye Callicott Nelson. In 1943, Merle and his brother, O. C. oined the United State Air Force. Merlereceived his "wings" in 1944 and served in the Air Force during World War II and remained in the reserves until 1953. He served in the Pacific Theatre, flying "Billy Mitchell's" B-25's. During his reserve years he received his B.S. from Ole Miss and served in the Korean Conflict. He also taught young cadets to fly single engine planes and B-25's while stationed

in Lubbock, Texas. In 1948 he married Helen Davis Nelson of Belmont, and after his enlistment was over, they returned to Tishomingo County to raise their family. The Nelsons owned and operated four businesses in the Iuka area beginning m 1953 when they purchased Mill Creek Boat Dock. They made their home at Mill Creek, raised two sons, and operated the mafina until 1967. They also operated Nelson Finance Company from 1963 to 1985 and he and his brother, the late O. C. Nelson, owned Nelson Hardware, where Barnett's Apothecary is now located. In 1972 Merle and Helen opened Nelson's Supermarket and remained active in the operation of the business even after their son, Steve and his wife, Sheri, moved to Iuka in 1993 to join the venture. Merle remained a vital part of the operation of the supermarket until it was purchased by Brooks Davis in 2009.

Merle, an avid sportsman, spent his time golfing (making hree hole-in-ones), tending cattle

on his farm, and bird hunting. A early riser. Merle enjoyed visiting with friends around town, and could be found at Williams' Service Station each morning catching up on the local news.

Mr. Nelson was a devoted member of the Iuka United Methodist Church and a member of the Iuka Lodge #94 F&AM.

Funeral services were held at 11 a.m. on Tuesday, September 27th, at the Iuka United Methodist Church with Rev. Jon Kaufman officiating. Burial was in Oak Grove Cemetery. Cutshall Funeral Home of Iuka was in charge of the arrangements.

Survivors include two sons, Steve Nelson and wife, Sheri, and Mike Nelson, all of Iuka; and three grandchildren, Stacey Nelson of Iuka, Mollie Nelson of Iuka, and David Nelson and wife, Erin, of Chapel Hill, NC.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Helen Nelson in 2004; his parents, Omer and Altye Nelson; and brother, O. C. Nelson.

# Want your Chance to Vote? Let your voice be heard! Sign Petition!

I will either get this to the polls to be voted on or go to my grave trying. It is too late to get this on the November ballot. I will have to call for a special election.

This is to the people of Tishomingo County that have not signed the petition to vote Tishomingo County wet. If you people can't see the hundreds of thousands of dollars that we are losing to Alabama, Tennessee, and Corinth every year, what would it take for you to see this? If you don't believe this is true, go to the Alabama State line on a Friday evening. Count all of the Tishomingo tags that come in there in a two hour period, from about 5 p.m. to 7 p.m., then drive down to the first stop, right across the TN state line, first store on the right, on a Friday evening from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. and count all the Tishomingo County tags. Go over to Farmington Rd. in Corinth, the first beer store you come to when you enter Alcorn County on the right, do the same thing right there. Go down 72 Hwy. in the city limits in Corinth, first store on the left, do the same thing and just count all the Tishomingo County tags you see there. Then you tell me that there is no alcohol being drank in Tishomingo County. If you are one of them folks that drink and don't want anybody to know about it, that's fine too. If you sign this petition and it becomes legal to be sold in Tishomingo County and you still don't want anyone to see you buying it, you can still go out of town and buy yours. At least help us get it wet over here where we can get the tax dollars off of these people that do drink it and don't care for folks knowing it, drive down your roads and look at all the beer cans, and whiskey bottles you will see. All these people that say it will cause more DUI's on the road, you need to get in your vehicle and go to the courthouse in a wet county and ask them to see their DUI records for one year. They have got to show them to you because they are public records. Then you come back to Iuka, MS, go to the Tishomingo County Courthouse, pull their DUI records but make sure if you do, a one year study in these other courthouses you do a one year study in the Iuka Courthouse. You will find Tishomingo County has between a 3 and 5% higher DUI rate than any wet county around here. You take Colbert Co., AL, it's a lot bigger than Tishomingo County. Take

Tupelo, it's way bigger than Tishomingo County. We have more DUIs than they do and we are a dry county. You know why that is...because the people have to drive so far to get the alcohol. If it was sold here in Tishomingo County you wouldn't have near the drunks on the road as you do now. Most people would buy it and go home with it. If they have to drive to AL, TN, or Corinth, they are not going to wait until they get back home. Just as quick as they pull out of that beer store, they are going to drink them one. Then they will probably run up on a buddy on down the road and they will stand there and drink several together and then talk. Then, when they leave there to go home, you've got 2 or 3, 4 or 5 maybe, people that's DUI trying to get home. You say how do you know this, because I'm one of them that used to do it. Go up to the beer store to get a beer, run up on 2 or 3 of your buddies. We'd all decide to sit on the road and drink one or two and talk. Well, that one or two most of the time turned into a half a case or more. Then we left there trying to get home, we were done too drunk to really be driving, but we done it just the same, though, didn't we? If it's sold right here in Tishomingo County, everybody and their buddy would be used to seeing each other all of the time. They'd get what they wanted to dink and tell each other, "I'll see you later." Don't get me wrong, some of them would still gather up like that. Go over here and meet on a back road, but the majority of the people would do what I just said. They would get their drink and go to their house with it. If you have done signed the petition, don't sign it again. If you have not signed it, please sign it and mail it in to me. I need your signatures very badly. I don't need but 552 more to get this done. So please fill this out, cut it out of the paper and mail it back to me. If you have done signed this petition, take it and try to get someone else to sign it too. If you can only just get one signature, it would help me a lot. If 500 people that have already signed this petition got one more person that is a legal registered voter of Tishomingo County to sign then I will have enough to do this. So please help me with this if you possibly can.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS FOR NOVEMBER 8, 2011 GENERAL ELCTION

ARE NOW AVAILABLE Donna Henry Dill, Circuit Clerk, announces that absentee ballots are now available for the General Election to be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2011. You may come to the Circuit Clerk's Office to vote by absentee Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The clerk's office will also be open on Saturday, October 29, 2011, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, and on Saturday, November 5, 2011, 8 a.m. to 12 noon for

We encourage those who need to vote by mail to call our office as soon as possible so they will have ample time to go through the absentee process. When an absentee ballot is requested, an application for an absentee ballot will first be mailed to the voter. This application shall be completed by the absentee voter and mailed back to the Circuit Clerk's Office. When the application is received, the ballot will be mailed to the voter. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered to anyone.

Any registered voter is eligible to vote by absentee in the clerk's office, but only five groups are allowed to vote absentee by mail. These five groups are:

1. A registered voter who is 65 years of age or

A registered voter who is temporarily residing outside the county;

3. A registered voter who is temporarily or permanently physically disabled; and/or

4. A registered voter who is the parent, spouse or dependent of a temporarily or permanently physically disabled person who is hospitalized outside the county or more than 50 miles away from his/her residence and will be with that person on Election Day.

All voters who are members of the Armed Services, Their Spouses, Dependents, and Overseas Citizens who fall under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA).

All absentee applications and ballot envelopes must be notarized except for a registered voter who is physically disabled, either permanently or temporarily. The disabled voter's application and ballot envelope must be witnessed and signed by a person 18 years of age or older. This witness does not have to be a registered voter.

All absentee ballots requested by mail must be sent by mail to the voter and they must be returned by mail to the clerk's office. No absentee ballots may be hand delivered.

November 5, 2011, will be the last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office for the November 8, 2011 General Election.

All mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, November 7, 2011, in order to be eligible to be counted for the November 8, 2011 General




