Eminent Domain, and Voter ID Initiatives Pass; Personhood Amendment Fails

Mississippi voters Tuesday defeated a ballot initiative that would have declared life begins at fertilization, a proposal that supporters sought as a way to prompt a legal challenge to abortion rights nationwide.

The "personhood" initiative was rejected by 58

percent of statewide voters, but in Tishomingo County 58 percent supported the amendment. If it had passed it was assured to draw legal challenges because of the conflicts with current abortion law, as directed in the 1973 Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision.

The measure divided the medical and religious communities and caused some of the most ardent abortion opponents to question the overwhelming effects that were possible if "personhood" was defined as from the moment of fertilization.

Voter ID

The requirement of voters to show some kind of government issued identification at the polls passed state-wide with 62 percent

County Loses Powell in Senate, DuVall in House as GOP Gains Ground in Legislature

Tishomingo County will be represented by Republicans in three of its four Legislative seats after two incumbents were upset in Tuesday's election.

Senate District 4

In the State Senate District 4 race, Republican Rita Parks Potts narrowly defeated incumbent Democrat Eric Powell by about 284 votes in unofficial district-wide totals. Powell said he suffered from widespread

negative advertising from the Republican party.

"I just hate that the Republican Party got as nasty as they got," he said. "I could have gone very negative, but I chose to take the high road and not go negative."

Powell said he has strived to work across party lines during his time in office. Indeed, though he lives in Corinth, he represented the northern part of Tishomingo County, and, as a much-loved native son of Tishomingo, worked to support all county issues. Tishomingo County gave

him 52.33 percent of their votes.

Parks is from Corinth, and appeared at several events throughout the fall in Iuka. She stressed her conservatism in campaign advertising.

House District 1

House Representative Lester "Bubba" Carpenter (R), of Burnsville, won his district with 66 percent of the district wide vote, defeating Democratic challenger Thomas McCarley, who had 34 percent district wide. In county, Carpenter had 65.9 percent of the vote.

Senate District 5

With all precincts reporting, incumbent Democrat J. P. Wilemon, Jr. of Belmont won 56 percent of the vote, to hold his District 5 Senate seat. Republican challenger Jerry Don Keith earned a respectable 44 percent. In Tishomingo County, Wilemon got 59 percent of the vote, and Keith received 40.8 percent.

House District 19

Mark A. DuVall, the incumbent Democrat fell to Randy P. Boyd, the third

Incumbents Hold Seats in County Election

Most all the winners of local offices who won in the August primaries and run-offs withstood the test of the general election, with no upsets.

In the most highly contested race, for Tishomingo County Sheriff, Glenn Whitlock earned 53 percent of the vote to serve another four years.

Retired state troopers Leslie Blaylock and Jerry "10-Speed" Boyd split most of the remaining vote; Blaylock got 25 percent, and

Boyd 20 percent. W. James Williams Jr. earned 90 votes county-wide.

Supervisors Nicky McRae and Danny Ryan defeated Republican challenges. McRae received 74 percent of the Second District vote to James L. Skinner's 25 percent.

In the Third District Danny Ryan received 68 percent of the vote to Republican challenger Sean Bullard's 31 percent.

For the South Half Justice Court Judge seat, Donny Joe Sparks handily

defeated challenger Freddie Means by getting 72 percent of the vote.

Harold Lynn Barnes put up a strong fight for North Half Constable against long-time incumbent Tim Bivins. Bivins had 58 percent to Barnes' 41 percent.

The South District Constable also went to the incumbent, Jeff Kemp, who got 63 percent of the vote over W.R. "Bob" Lambert's 36 percent.

All the other races were decided in the August primaries.

of the vote. In Tishomingo County, support was high, as well, with 70 percent of voters supporting the measure.

Opponents feared that such a requirement would diminish minority voting.

All that will be required will be any government issued picture identification, including a driver's licence, which the majority of voting age people already have.

Eminent Domain

The hot-button issue of government seizure of private land was addressed Tuesday, and 73 percent of statewide voters said that government should not be allowed to seize private land in order to sell it to other private entities for various purposes, usually economic development.

In Tishomingo County, support was even stronger to prevent government seizure; 80.54 percent supported the measure.





Burnsville opened the doors to its Community Sparkplug project as it hosted the Mississippi Appalachian Community Learning Project's "Results and Learning Celebration" on November 3, 2011, at the Burnsville Area Chamber of Commerce. A total of 54 delegates from Maben, Burnsville, Byhalia, Crawford, Duck Hill, Eupora, Kilmichael, Noxapater, and Starkville attended to celebrate the completion of projects in these revitalized communities.


Burnsville was chosen as the location for this event, and it gave the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society and the Town of Burnsville the opportunity to share their experiences in the restoration and renovation of the Burnsville One-Room Colored School.

Mrs. Cindy Nelson, president of the historical society, shared the experiences of the volunteer team that heroically took charge and performed the physical labor to restore the historic Burnsville One-Room Col-

ored School to its former state. The team working on the schoolhouse was comprised of Matt Alred, Corrie Linton, Brandy McClain, Cindy Nelson, Janice Switcher, and Shelia Thorne. The team expected to improve the economic and civil development of Burnsville, Miss., by restoring the one-room schoolhouse, which is a Mississippi historical landmark, and they were successful.

The support of the Tishomingo County community was phenomenal. A total of 71 volunteers participated, and a total of 1,441 volunteer hours were amassed. Donations included equipment, a vehicle, and fuel to move the schoolhouse from its previous location to its new Fulton Street home. The installation of a tin roof was donated by a local contractor, a door and refurbished windows were donated from local homeowners, and some of the replacement wood flooring from a local business.

After the meeting, the attendees enjoyed a delicious luncheon prepared the Harmony Hill Baptist





Broadwalk Through Ancient Cypress Opens

On November 3, 2011, Governor Haley Barbour, First Lady Marsha Barbour and others announced the opening of the 1,750 foot-long Sky Lake Boardwalk in West Central Mississippi near Belzoni.

It meanders through, what experts say, are "some of the largest and oldest cypress trees that remain on earth and they have international scientific significance." These ancient trees can be seen from a beautiful boardwalk through the forest canopy. Some of the largest trees adjacent to the board walk are over 16 feet in diameter, over 46 feet in circumference and are over 1,000 years old. At least two of the trees along the board-

walk each contain enough lumber to build 5 or 6 medium-sized homes.

"Rarely does a First Lady have the unique privilege of seeing a dream come true in her state. As Chair of Wildlife Mississippi's Advisory Council, I had the opportunity to be in on the ground level of this amazing project. It has exceeded my expectations. The formally hidden treasure of these ancient forest giants is now easily accessible, making it possible for generations of Mississippians and tourists to appreciate and enjoy their beauty and grandeur," said Marsha Barbour.

Cypress are in the same family as the giant sequoia and redwood of California, and some of the Sky Lake giants approach the diame-

ter of the famous sequoias.

According to Clarke Reed, Chairman of Wildlife Mississippi, "The extreme scarcity of old-growth cypress forests only heightens the value of Sky Lake as an educational resource and tourist draw for the citizens of Mississippi and this nation."

In addition to the boardwalk, also constructed were restrooms, an amphitheater, a pavilion with picnic tables, a walking track and a canoe/kayak trail through the ancient cypress. The canoe/kayak trail will be available for use in February after the winter rains. Interpretative signs exist all along the boardwalk.

Wildlife Mississippi played a key role in promoting the acquisition of Sky

Lake and constructed the Sky Lake Boardwalk.

The project was a cooperative effort by Wildlife Mississippi, the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks, the Federal Highway Administration and the Yazoo-Mississippi Delta Levee Board. The project was designed by Pryor & Morrow Architects and built by David Smith Construction.

Pastor's Tidbits

Do you Know God, Or Does God Know You?

Often we hear people say, "Oh, I know God". What do people mean by such statements? Do they mean that they know Who God is? Do they mean that they have heard some Sunday School lessons about God? The important thing is not that we say that we know God, rather it is that we are known of God! Galatians 4:8-11 says, "Howbeit then, when ye knew not God, ye did service unto them which by nature are no gods. But now, after that ye have known God, or rather are

known of God, how turn ye again to the weak and beggarly elements, wherunto ye desire again to be in bondage? Ye observe days, and months, and times, and years. I am afraid of you, lest I have bestowed upon you labor in vain." The letter of Paul to the Galatians was actually a letter written to a number of churches in the region called "Galatia". Those who received this letter had some problems very closely related to some church problems today; they were holding to things that had been outdated by the death and resurrection of Christ. They were observ-

ing special days, months, times and years, which had been proper observances in the Old Testament, but had become of no significance, since the Christ they pictured had come to earth and died to complete the picture! People who are so meticulous about observing the things mentioned here have never come to understand the cross and the grace of God.

Paul said that the Galatians might claim to know God, but the really important thing was that God knew them as His children. I am not saying that they were not saved, for most likely most of them were. Paul had a fear, however, that he had wasted his labor among them, if they were truly still trying to be justified by the observance of Old Testament days and customs. Some Judaizers

were teaching new Christians that they had to keep the law of Moses to be saved, so Paul was combating that teaching here. My dear friends, if you are trusting anything for salvation other than the shed blood of Jesus and His resurrection you are not yet "known of God" as His child! My plea to such people is that they will come to Christ and trust His sacrifice alone as the means of their justification! Paul said that any ties to the observance of days, months, times and years was only the cords that brought bondage to those who followed such teachings! Are you free in Christ? We are not free to sin, but we are free from sin, as well as Old Testament ritual!

The following information was retrieved in part from The Tishomingo County News (Iuka, Miss.), April 30, 1987.

Banking Begins in Iuka
Banking in Iuka, Miss., had its beginning in the Hyatt Building adjacent to the former Iuka Guaranty Bank structure on the west side. This bank was named the Bank of Iuka. It was established in 1889 and was operated by Captain C. J. Hyatt. An Iuka branch of Tishomingo Savings Institution was established in 1905 on Fulton Street. J. W. Jourdan was the cashier and operated this bank in the rear of the old Post Office building. Also, Tishomingo Savings Institution was managed by E. A. Mitchell, with a Mr. Taylor heading the operation

as a branch of a Corinthian bank. It was located in the W. S. Brown building from 1908 to 1907 and ended in failure. The bank building, which now houses Bancorp South, was completed in 1905. A legendary story suggests that Indian Chief Iuka, for whom the town was named, is buried under this building. It was built by W. T. Ross and bore his name for many years. The first bank in the newly constructed corner landmark was the Citizens Bank with a capital of \$25,000. W. T. Ross was president and E. T. Hammerly was cashier. The Tishomingo Banking Company assumed the Citizens banking business in 1907. James H. Faircloth was elected president of the bank and L. W. Walker was bookkeeper. The Tishomingo Banking Company failed and was closed in 1911.
