pm to 7 pm.

Presley has also invited representatives from the wireless industry to attend the public meeting to hear directly from customers who have little or no wireless service in their area.

During the "Connecting Rural North Mississippi" tour, Commissioner Presley is visiting areas with little or no cell phone coverage. Presley said that Iuka, and

the surrounding area in Tishomingo County, has been a source of many complaints over the past several months.

"Iuka, and the surrounding area, is one of the places where we have received a lot of complaints, particularly about AT&T wireless service," Presley said. "I want to draw the attention of the wireless industry to the issues in this community to make sure they

know the problems the people are facing and give them a chance to share what steps are being taken to fix it."

Commissioner Presley said it is imperative that the wireless industry respond to the needs of rural Mississippi . "Bringing everybody into one room will help move us to a solution for the people in Iuka and the surrounding area." Presley said.

Residents wishing to submit complaints are encouraged to visit the PSC's website at www.psc. state.ms.us and click the tab for "Zap the Gap" for more information. "Zap the Gap" was begun by Presley in 2009 and to date has received over three thousand, three hundred (3300) surveys from citizens in the Northern District who have reported areas with poor cell coverage or none at all.
