

## Wreck Claims Life of Election Commissioner

A one-vehicle wreck Wednesday resulted in the death of a 76-year-old Tishomingo man.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Jack Wilemon, about 4:40 p.m. November 9th, a southbound 2001 GMC pickup truck, driven by Floyd Lavon Ware, left Highway 25 near the intersection of County Road 14. It left the road, crossed the right of way, went over a creek and collided with the other creek bank. The

bag did deploy, said Wilemon, and Ware died from trauma.

Mr. Ware was the Tishomingo County Election Commissioner for the Fourth District, and had left the courthouse just a few minutes before the accident. The day before was the state and county general election.

Mr. Ware was also very active in the American Legion in Tishomingo, where he was Post Commander. He and his wife, Geneva, worked many years producing the annual Veterans' Day program at Tishomingo School, where Geneva was secretary for years. His smiling face, under his American Legion hat, was missed by the many school children and teachers Thursday morning during the annual Veterans' Day presentation at Tishomingo.

## Numerous Drug Arrests in the Past Month

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department has made several arrests in the past month, including many that were drug related.

Two men face meth-related charges as a result of a traffic stop October 14th. Donald Flanagan, 42, and Joshua Williams, 23, were charged with possession of pseudoephedrine, and conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine (meth), after sheriff's deputies stopped their vehicle because they were under suspicion of meth production activity. Williams remains in custody, since he was already on probation with the Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC).

October 18th, after his vehicle was stopped for improper equipment, Russell Cormier was charged with possession of meth and conspiracy to manufacture meth. He remains in custody, since he was already on probation with MDOC.

October 27th, Terry Lee Lambert, 42, was charged with possession of marijuana with intent to sell, and possession of a Schedule I controlled substance.

October 27th, three men were charged with burglary of a water vessel in connection with some burglaries of boats at Eastport Marina back earlier in the summer. Investigation is still ongoing. Gregory Lambert, 19, Joshua Parson, 19, and Adam Williams, 20, were all charged, and additional arrests are anticipated.

November 1st, Cinderella Backer Clever, 31, was picked up on a grand jury indictment for sale of hydrocodone.

Aggravated assault charges resulted on November 1st for Cody Glover, 33, David Armendariz, 38, and Kenneth Bowers, 44, after they allegedly beat someone up. The investigation continues, and additional arrests are anticipated.

Carey Scott, 55, was charged November 2nd for attempting to obtain a controlled substance by fraud.

November 3rd, deputies and the North Mississippi Narcotics Unit arrested Gregory Pounds for conspiracy to manufacture meth, in an ongoing investigation.

Cody Jones, 29, was charged November 3rd with possession of hydrocodone with intent to sell and two counts of sale of hydrocodone.

November 9th, Jimmy Frank Borden, 29, was picked up for an indictment for sale of hydrocodone.

On November 12th, deputies stopped a vehicle suspected of being involved in possession of precursor chemicals, and manufacturing meth. Lee Austin, 31, Edward Don Smith, 38, and Dustin Martin, 29 were arrested for possession of pseudoephedrine. The North Mississippi Narcotics Unit assisted in the investigation, and the subjects were arrested for possession of pseudoephedrine. The North Mississippi Narcotics Unit aided in the investigation, which lead to items used in meth production being seized in an Alcorn County residence, with the assistance of the Alcorn County Sheriff's Department. Martin remains in custody, since he was already on probation with MDOC.

## Presley to Address Poor Wireless Service in County at Meeting

In response to results from the "Zap the Gap" program to improve wireless cell phone service in rural areas, Public Service Commissioner Brandon Presley will continue his "Connecting Rural North Mississippi" tour with a visit and public meeting in Iuka on Wednesday, November 29, 2011, at Tishomingo County Courthouse, located at 1008 Battleground Drive, in Iuka, MS 38852, from 6

pm to 7 pm.

Presley has also invited representatives from the wireless industry to attend the public meeting to hear directly from customers who have little or no wireless service in their area.

During the "Connecting Rural North Mississippi" tour, Commissioner Presley is visiting areas with little or no cell phone coverage. Presley said that Iuka, and

the surrounding area in Tishomingo County, has been a source of many complaints over the past several months.

"Iuka, and the surrounding area, is one of the places where we have received a lot of complaints, particularly about AT&T wireless service," Presley said. "I want to draw the attention of the wireless industry to the issues in this community to make sure they

know the problems the people are facing and give them a chance to share what steps are being taken to fix it."

Commissioner Presley said it is imperative that the wireless industry respond to the needs of rural Mississippi. "Bringing everybody into one room will help move us to a solution for the people in Iuka and the surrounding area," Presley said.

Residents wishing to submit complaints are encouraged to visit the PSC's website at [www.psc.state.ms.us](http://www.psc.state.ms.us) and click the tab for "Zap the Gap" for more information. "Zap the Gap" was begun by Presley in 2009 and to date has received over three thousand, three hundred (3300) surveys from citizens in the Northern District who have reported areas with poor cell coverage or none at all.
