Mayor Jackie Bryant awarded the Business of the Year award to Mike Nelson Contractors.

Tishomingo County Economic Development Authority Chairman Jimmy Ramsey awarded the Volunteer of the Year award to Ken Cooley.

Peyton Cummings awarded the Development of the Year award to Butch's Garage.

Ken Cooley awarded the Bob Yarber Leadership award to Buddy Wiltshire.

"This year we have a new award named for long-time mayor and community leader Bob Yarber who passed away this year. Bob is greatly missed," said Cooley. "The purpose of the award is to honor and thank a leader who has

gone the extra mile for the community."

Tishomingo County Tourism Council Chairperson Mary Ann Grant gave the tourism report. "The Tishomingo County Tourism Council worked hard during the year to promote the county's tourism and recreational resources. The Tourism Council paid for advertisements in national travel, sporting, retirement, and tourism related magazines and other publications. TCTC is a member of the Natchez Trace Compact which helps to promote communities along the Natchez Trace Parkway. TCTC is also a mem-

ber of the region's historic and cultural heritage. TTTT was a great success this year and we are busy with plans for the 2012 Trash and Treasures event. The TTTT event brings visitors to Tishomingo County and many of our businesses reported increases in sales of up to 75% during the event.

"The Mississippi Development Authority conducted a study that found that tourists spent over \$10,531,000 in Tishomingo County in 2010. Tourism spending has created 175 jobs in Tishomingo County according to the MDA study.

Two Face Federal Charges for Stealing Mail

Two regional postal employees stand accused on multiple federal counts of stealing mail, including one case in Tishomingo.

According to reports, Anna C. Terry, 38, of Tishomingo, and Yolanda A. Jones, 29, of Plantersville, were indicted October 19th with arrest papers dated November 16th.

Four charges against Terry

say she intentionally embezzled and stole \$1,385 in cash from the Tishomingo post office, and two packages containing knives.

If convicted, she faces up to 30 years in prison, and \$1 million in fines.

According to federal court in Aberdeen, her trial date is set for January 3, 2012.

Jones is accused on five counts

of intentionally embezzling and stealing letters and packages intended for delivery to addresses in Tupelo, Brandon, New Orleans and Flowood.

Among the items she allegedly stole were a necklace, two Walmart gift cards, \$60 in currency and an MP3 player. If convicted, she faces up to 25 years in prison and \$1.25 million in fines.

Iuka Man Faces Federal Charges for Shooting Bald Eagle

William "Bill" Branum of Iuka faces two federal counts of shooting a protected bald eagle.

Branum, 78, was indicted September 21st, but the charges were not posted publicly until this week.

He is accused of two counts, according to court officials in Aberdeen: Use of a bald and golden eagle for scientific study and purpose; and killing or possessing migratory birds.

The counts are in connection with charges he unlawfully hunted and shot a bald eagle on March 31st.

If convicted, he faces up to 18 months in prison, and a \$200,000 fine.

Last week, Branum made his initial appearance in court before Magistrate Judge David A. Sanders. He was released on his own recognizance.

His trial in federal court is scheduled for January 9, 2012, according to court officials.

Initially, reports were that the injured bird found in the Burns-ville community, near Tishomingo County Road 306 was a golden eagle, but later it was identified as an immature bald eagle.

Officials offered a \$2,500 reward initially, which was doubled to \$5,000, later.

The bird had a bullet in its left wing, and due to its injuries, the bird could not have flown far from where it was shot. The two-year-old bald eagle is currently undergoing rehabilitation at the Jackson Zoo. Authorities say it possibly will not fly again. Bald eagles are protected by both federal and state wildlife laws. Violations of these laws carry maximum criminal penalties of up to \$100,000 and/or one year in federal prison.

Lady Braves Defeat New Site for Tournament Title

For the first time in five years, the New Site Lady Royals were defeated at home last Saturday, and the victorious Tishomingo County High School Lady Braves took home the New Site Tournament trophy.

The 68-59 victory, which was New Site's first loss of the season, was the icing on the cake for the 2011-12 Lady Braves, who have a record so far this season of 5-1 under first-year Head Coach Lauren Whitson. New Site was second in state last year in 2A, and they have already also defeated Ripley, last year's 3A state champion

team.

Last Thursday night, also in the New Site Tournament, TC handily defeated the Booneville Lady Blue Devils 93-57.

"They played extremely hard," said Coach Whitson of the girls' Saturday performance.

"At times we played very smart, though we had some mistakes; overall they played hard and well."

"Every single player contributed to the win. We overcame a 15-5 deficit in the first quarter, plus the psychological hurdles of New Site's record, on their home court, I am very proud of them,"

said Coach Whitson.

Junior Anna Claire Griffin led the scoring with 22 points, followed by senior Danielle Blakney with 16, sophomore Deidra McCoy with 13, and junior Shemei Carter with 10.

McCoy had 15 rebounds, 7 defensive, and 8 offensive, and Carter had 8 rebounds.

Hunting Swamp Rabbits in Josh Pond

It was my sixteenth birthday and my Uncle Marvin had just given me my Great Granddaddy Cadle's old single barrel 12-gauge shotgun. It was long and heavy and kicked like a mule on my sixteen-year-old shoulder. Paw had bought it new at a hardware store in Dennis for \$12.

That day he took me to the "Josh Pond" to hunt. I had heard of the "Josh Pond" but really didn't know where it was or what it was. In my mind, a pond was just a small pool of water behind the barn where the cow and the mule drank. I could not have been more wrong.

The "Josh Pond" was immense—stretching for miles south of Paden all the

way into Prentiss County, a true wilderness. It was the last one in this part of the world. We

know it today as Bay Springs Lake.

It was indescribably beautiful; monstrous old cypress trees; clear cold water gushing from dozens of springs. There were things living in there that didn't live anywhere else—bobcats, panthers, and even stories of a "Bigfoot." If we had a Bigfoot, it would have

lived there.

"Josh" was actually Joshua Adams, Father or Grandfather of Roy Adams, long time Highway Commissioner, or so I've been told. He must have owned thousands of acres down in that endless bottom. Of course, it was of little value in his day; couldn't farm it, and couldn't cut much timber. Had there been a market for water moccasins, he would have been a millionaire. Chancery Judge John Hatcher has personal knowledge of the numbers and sizes of the snakes that call it home.

It saddens me to this day that we had to lose such a majestic place, headwaters of the Tombigbee River and home to literally thou-

sands of wild animals.

On this particular day in my sixteenth year, as we walked into the heart of that prehistoric wilderness, me, lugging that big ole gun, we were hearing and seeing everything imaginable. Thank goodness I was born in December. I would not have set foot in there in July.

We walked over bent-down saw grass that must have been six feet tall in the summer. Dozens of small creeks meandered in and through the "Josh Pond" and this particular one we followed was about ten feet wide and deep. Just around the turn we saw something swimming toward us. A dog. What was a dog doing in a creek in December in the middle of the "Josh Pond?" He was obviously crazy. Rabies. He would see us and come out of the water and I would have to kill him. It was Old Yeller

all over again.

My uncle said, "You better put a shell in."

He saw us and just kept on coming. Uncle Marvin was really supposed to take the gun and do the shooting. I was no Atticus Finch. I wouldn't know his name for years. What if I missed?

The thing kept on coming, no slowing down. The closer he got, the stranger he looked.

This was no dog; it was a rabbit, a swamp rabbit, a cane cutter. It was and still is the biggest one I have seen.

"Shoot him! Shoot him," Uncle Marvin said. I did.

Retrieving a monstrous swamp rabbit from a creek is no small task, but I was determined and finally I drug him out.

Long, wet, cold and heavy, he wouldn't even fit in my hunting coat so I tucked his head under

my belt, his feet drug the ground.

On this my first hunt with this treasured family heirloom, I had killed enough meat to feed the entire family.

"Mommy" Cadle can fry it for supper and make biscuits and gravy," I said.

"Well, I don't know about that," my Uncle Marvin said. "She's funny about cooking rabbit."

"Why" I wanted to know. It was a long story about living through the Depression and how she had struggled to feed those kids and had to cook a lot of rabbit.

"I think it reminds her of the Herbert Hoover days," he said.

He was right. We had to give away my prize rabbit. But, I understood how she felt.

And so, at sixteen, I came a Democrat.

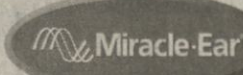

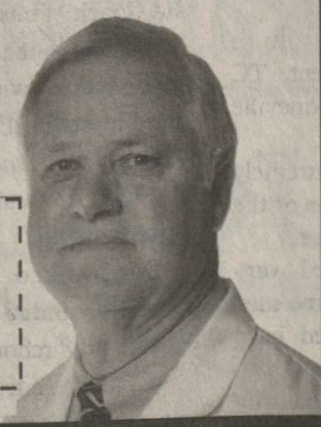

Jacob South Earns Eagle Scout



Jacob South earns the rank of Eagle Scout. He is a scout with Troop 75 of Burnsville, a freshman at TCHS, and the 15 year old son of Marvin and Sharon South.

On August 25th, 2011, Jacob South earned the rank of Eagle Scout. The Eagle Scout Award is the highest award to be earned in the Boy Scout Program. To earn the Eagle Scout rank, a boy must first pass the ranks of Tenderfoot, 2nd Class, 1st Class, Star, and Life requirements. He must also earn 21 merit badges and demonstrate leadership and character requirements in his daily life. He then must develop and lead a team of volunteers to carry out a service project benefiting his religious institution, school, or community. When all of these requirements have been completed, a committee of 3-5 adults interview the scout and by unanimous decision deem the rank has been earned. Jacob's project was to provide much needed school supplies for the K-4 teachers at Burnsville School. Jacob lead a team of volunteers in compiling a needs list, securing funding from local businesses and collecting and distributing the needed classroom supplies to the teachers. Jacob is a scout with Troop 75 of Burnsville and his scoutmasters are Tommy Bonds and Alex Schiel. Harmony Central Volunteer Fire Department is Troop 75's charter organization. On November 12th, Jacob was awarded his Eagle Scout pin in a recognition ceremony at Harmony United Methodist Church with his family, troop, and many friends in attendance.

Scott Shipp, a 24 year old, from Lexington to New Market into battle. The unit of 257 cadets, ranging in age from 15 to 24 years, lost five KIA, five MWIA and 47 wounded.

Tishomingo Yesterdays Remembering Former Student Claude Humber

Today, I attended the funeral of one of my former students. In fact, he could have almost been my boyfriend and a good-looking one he would have been, but I was already taken and he wasn't interested in girls as yet.

It seems so many of my students have died and as I say sometimes "much too young". John David Humber, like me, had lived four score plus, but teachers never like to learn of the passing of a student. John had been my student in the seventh and eighth grade at the little one-teacher school at Boggs Chapel about a mile from my house.

My son carried me to the funeral and on the way, I began reminiscing of events that happened when John was a student. I must admit I was not a math teacher but was working on an English major at the time. We would be working math at the big wide boards painted black. I would read the problems and John could work them faster than I. I have been

told that in the Army, John would figure load placement for ships. I do know it's a fact he could walk to the back of a truck and in no time flat, tell you exactly how many board feet of lumber there was on the truck. His father, Mr. Claude Humber, was a saw-miller and John loved working with him. He was allowed to haul lumber to Luka.

An incident I'll never forget and laugh every time I think of it was not funny at all. Terrible!

The children in the fall, when the leaves had covered the ground would build playhouses behind the school building. The leaves were swept with brush brooms (brooms made from usually...dogwood limbs tied together). The children chose different students to comprise a family. The leaves were used for beds, room dividers, and walk-ways. It was like a little village on the hillside with colorful pieces of broken glass for dishes. On this particular day Verlene Scruggs (Tidwell) swept into a yellow

jacket's nest/den. Yellow jackets swarmed out and began to sting Verlene. "Mrs. Dawson" the alarm sounded so urgent, I knew something had happened and out the door I ran just as John passed me with a pine top swinging from one side of his head to the other, crying "yellow jackets". I was allergic to stings, but ran toward Verlene. Everyone was running except her. I cried "run, Verlene," but when she'd start toward me, I'd run from her. Kids were running everywhere. Only Verlene wasn't running. A yellow-jacket would sting her legs, she'd scream, "Mrs. Dawson!" I'd shout "RUN!" and here I'd go! Some teacher wouldn't you say? It is ironic that they stung no one except Verlene. It was, I guess, the most serious incident that ever happened during my tenure of teaching and yet I get tickled and laugh every time I remember it. Thank God, she wasn't allergic to the stings, but school was out for the day. They were all over the hillside. Her daddy came and burned the den but as I recall,

I went to school in a Ma el A, I believe it was called. Chester used the rumble to have a dog coop. It had an "on" and "off" switch for gas under the dash. Some times after all the children live down the hill had loaded in, it wouldn't crank. The students would push me and finally I'd remember "I had turned on the gas." I'd laugh my forgetfulness and one of John's brother, Claude Deaton said "you are the first person I have ever seen that will laugh when a car won't crank." One day, I still find things funny when I'm not supposed to laugh. I have so many pleasant memories down through forty plus years of teaching. Maybe I'll write a book before I get old and have time. I don't lose any sleep waiting to read it. I have too much time to do right now. Prov. 17:22
