Tishomingo County Economic Development Authority Chairman Jimmy Ramsey awarded the Volunteer of the Year award to Ken Cooley.


Peyton Cummings awarded the Development of the Year award to Butch's Garage

Two Face Federal Charges for Stealing N

Two regional postal employees stand accused on multiple federal counts of stealing mail, induding one case in Tishomingo.

According to reports, Anna C. Terry, 38, of Tishomingo, and Yolanda A. Jones, 29, of Plantersville, were indicted October 19th with arrest papers dated November 16th

Four charges against Terry

say she intentionally embezzled and stole \$1,385 in cash from the Tishomingo post office, and two packages containing knives.

If convicted, she faces up to 30 years in prison, and \$1 million in fines.

According to federal court in Aberdeen, her trial date is set for January 3, 2012.

Jones is accused on five counts

of intentionally embezzling and stealing letters and packages intended for delivery to addresses in Tupelo, Brandon, New Orleans and Flowood.

Among the items she allegedly stole were a necklace, two Walmart gift cards, \$60 in currency and an MP3 player. If convicted, she faces up to 25 years in prison and \$1.25 million in fines.

luka Man Faces Federal Charges for Shooting Bald Eagle

He is accused of two counts, atording to court officials in Abeden: Use of a bald and golden eagle for scientific study and purpose; and killing or possessing mi-

If convicted, he faces up to 18 months in prison, and a \$200,000 fine.

Last week, Branum made his initial appearance in court before Magistrate Judge David A. Sanders. He was released on his own recognizance.

His trial in federal court is scheduled for January 9, 2012, according to court officials.

Officials offered a \$2,500 reward initially, which was doubled to \$5,000, later.

The bird had a bullet in its left wing, and due to its injuries, the bird could not have flown far from where it was shot. The two-year-old bald eagle is currently undergoing rehabilitation at the Jackson Zoo. Authorities say it possibly will not fly again. Bald eagles are protected by both federal and state wildlife laws. Violations of these laws carry maximum criminal penalties of up to \$100,000 and/or one year in federal prison.

ndy Braves Defeat New Site urnament Title

For the first time in five years, the New Site Lady Royals were defeated at home last Saturday, and the victorious Tishomingo County High School Lady Braves took home the New Site Tournament trophy.

The 68-59 victory, which was New Site's first loss of the season, was the icing on the cake for the 2011-12 Lady Braves, who have a record so far this season of 5-1 under first-year Head Coach Lauren Whitson. New Site was second in state last year in 2A, and they have already also defeated Ripley, last year's 3A state champion

Last Thursday night, also in the New Site Tournament, TC handily defeated the Booneville Lady Blue Devils 93-57.

"They played extremely hard," said Coach Whitson of the girls' Saturday performance.

"At times we played very smart, though we had some mistakes; overall they played hard and well."

"Every single player contributed to the win. We overcame a 15-5 deficit in the first quarter, plus the psychological hurdles of New Site's record, on their home court, I am very proud of them,"

said Coach Whitson.

Junior Anna Claire Griffin led the scoring with 22 points, followed by senior Danielle Blakney with 16, sophomore Deidra Mc-Coy with 13, and junior Shemei Carter with 10.

McCoy had 15 rebounds, 7 defensive, and 8 offensive, and Carter had 8 rebounds.





Remembering Former Student Claude Humber

by Ruth Dawson Today, I attended the funeral of one of my former students. In fact, he could have almost been my boyfriend and a good-looking one he would have been, but I was already taken and he wasn't interested in girls as yet.

It seems so many of my students have died and as I say sometimes "much too young" John David Humber, like me, had lived four score plus, but teachers never like to learn of the passing of a student. John had been my student in the seventh and eighth grade at the little one-teacher school at Boggs Chapel about a mile from my house

My son carried me to the funeral and on the way, I began reminiscing of events that happened when John was a student. I must admit I was not a math teacher but was working on an English major at the time. We would be working math at the big wide boards painted black. I would read the problems and John could work them faster than I. I have been

told that in the Army, John would figure load placement for ships. I do know it's a fact he could walk to the back of a truck and in no time flat, tell you exactly how many board feet of lumber there was on the truck. His father, Mr. Claude Humber, was a saw-miller and John loved working with him. He was allowed to haul lumber to Iuka.

An incident I'll never forget and laugh every time I think of it was not funny at all. Terrible!

The children in the fall, when the leaves had covered the ground would build playhouses behind the school build-The leaves were swept ing. with brush brooms (brooms made from usually...dogwood limbs tied together). The children chose different students to comprise a family. The leaves were used for beds, room dividers, and walk-ways. It was like a little village on the hillside with colorful pieces of broken glass for dishes. On this particular day Verlene Scruggs (Tidwell) swept into a yellow

jacket's nest/den. Yellow jackets swarmed out and began to sting Verlene. "Mrs. Dawson' the alarm sounded so urgent, I knew something had happened and out the door I ran just as John passed me with a pine top swinging from one side of his low jackets". I was allergic to stings, but ran toward Verlene. Everyone was running except her. I cried "run, Verlene," but when she'd start toward me, I'd run from her. Kids were running everywhere. Only Verlene wasn't running. A yellow-jacket would sting her legs, she'd scream, "Mrs. Dawson!" I'd shout "RUN!" and here I'd go! Some teacher wouldn't you say? It is ironic that they stung no one except Verlene.
