## Iuka Loses Long-Time Businessman Olen Jourdan

David Olen "Oley" Jourdan, 83, of Iuka, died Thursday, July 19th, 2012, at Magnolia Regional Health Center in Corinth.

Once again Iuka has lost a favored son in the death of David Olen Jourdan, Jr., affectionately known as "Olen" or "Oley". A successful businessman, Mr. Jourdan was owner of Jourdan Hardware in downtown Iuka for many years, was owner of the Iuka Drive-In during the 50's and 60's, and was co-owner of the J. L. Jourdan Lumber Company which was located near the railroad tracks in downtown Iuka before moving to Airport Road. He was a much-loved employer by the many men who worked for him.

A fun-loving, happy man, he was a good friend to many and was totally devoted to his family, his church, and his Lord. In 2002 he suffered a stroke that took him away from his daily work but did not keep him from living a full life, enjoying his family, and going to the 9:35 Coffee Club each morning.

Olen Jourdan was born to O. and Mary Aliene Ragland Jourdan on February 16, 1929. He graduated from Iuka High School and the University of Mississippi School of Business. While at Ole Miss he was a member of Beta Theta Pi Fraternity. He married Betty Jane "B.J." Harris Cherokee, Alabama while on leave from the U.S. Army. He was stationed in Fort Benning, Georgia before being deployed to Korea. After his service as a Second Lieutenant during the Korean Conflict, Mr. Jourdan returned to Iuka where he entered the family business.

Oley's roots ran deep in Iuka and Tishomingo County and he was passionate about many local activities. He was a member of the Iuka United Methodist Church where he served on the Administrative Board and as chairman of the Finance Committee for many years. He served as chairperson of the Mississippi United Methodist Foundation and continued to serve as a board member. He was a member of the Board of Directors of Wood Community College, and was a long time member of the Iuka Rotary Club, where he received the club's highest honor being named a Paul Harris Fellow. He was on the Board of

Directors of Iuka Guaranty Bank and a member of the Friends of the Iuka Library. A loyal Rebel, Oley served as president of the national Ole Miss Alumni Association, served on the Ole Miss Athletic Association Board, the Ole Miss Athletic Committee, and the Northeast Mississippi Ole Miss Alumni Association.

Services were held at 2 p.m. on Saturday, July 21st at Iuka United Methodist Church, with Rev. Jon Kaufman officiating. Burial was in Oak Grove Cemetery. Cutshall Funeral Home was in charge of the arrangements.

Pallbearers were Bob Brown, Clinton Brown, John Castleberry, Tony Gaines, Robert Grisham, Gene Jourdan, Raymond Jourdan, and Bill Turner.

Survivors include his wife of 61 years, B.J. Harris Jourdan of Iuka; one daughter, Jane Jourdan Rhea of Iuka; one son, D.O. "Bubba" Jourdan, III of Iuka; six grandchildren, Bo Rhea and wife, Rebecca of Memphis, Jourdan Rhea and wife, Carey of Memphis, Harris Rhea and wife, Kathryn of Tupelo, Mollie Jourdan Seymour and husband, Dixon of Birmingham, AL, David O. Jourdan, IV and Katie Rose Jourdan, both of Iuka; and three great-grandchildren, Ellie and Lucy Rhea of Memphis and Clayton Rhea of Tupelo. ## District 3 & 4 Will Elect School Board Members November 6th

School Board Members for Supervisor Districts Three and Four will be on the November 6, 2012 General Election ballot. The qualifying period for School Board Members is Wednesday, August 8 through Friday, September 7, 2012. Candidates for these positions can only qualify during this one month period.

People interested in these positions must complete the following steps to be eligible to seek these offices:

1. Must live in school board district that they are seeking election;

2. Must get 50 registered voters in the district in which they live to sign a petition for them to become a candidate;

3. Must bring Petition with 50 signatures to the Circuit Clerk's Office for signatures to be certified that they are registered voters in that particular district;

4. Must file Statement of Intent along with certified petition of names with Circuit Clerk's Office by 5 p.m. on Friday, September 7, 2012, which is the last date to qualify for office;

5. Must file a Statement of Economic Interest within 15 days of qualifying to run for office with the Mississippi Ethics Commission. This statement is to be submitted electronically at [www.ethics.state.ms.us](http://www.ethics.state.ms.us)

6. Once papers are filed, must file Campaign Finance Reports in accordance with State Law with the Circuit Clerk's office by 5 p.m. on date due;

7. After election is over, must file a termination report for Campaign Finance with the Circuit Clerk's office.

All necessary forms, the Petition, Statement of Intent, and Campaign Finance Reports, may be picked up the Circuit Clerk's office. There is no party affiliation for school board members; therefore, there is no primary election.

The Tishomingo County Election Commission must rule on School Board Candidate qualifications. Names of qualified candidates will be released after the Board has ruled on all candidates.

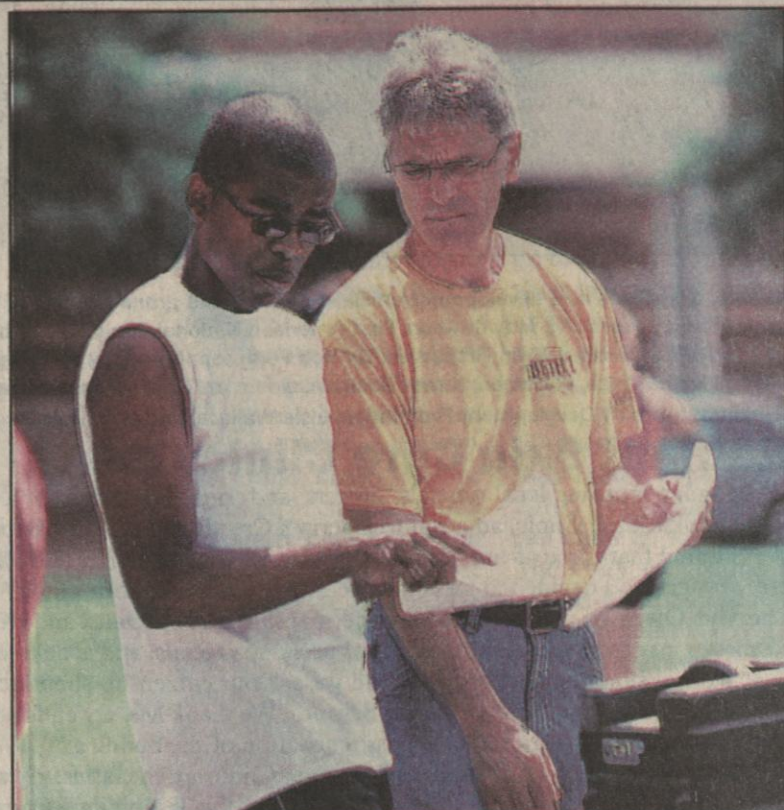
There will be NO RUNOFF for school board member. The high vote wins.

## Sales Tax Holiday this Saturday

The annual Sales Tax Holiday begins 12:01 a.m. Friday, July 27, 2012, and ends at midnight Saturday, July 28th. Clothing and footwear items under \$100 are exempt from sales tax.

The items exempt from sales tax during the Sales Tax Holiday are identical to those items exempt in prior years. Clothing and footwear items, meant to be worn next to the body and cost less than \$100 per item, are exempt from sales tax during this period. Accessories such as jewelry, handbags, wallets, watches, backpacks, and similar items do not qualify for the Sales Tax Holiday. Cleats and items worn in conjunction with an athletic or recreational activity are other sample items not eligible. School supplies and computers are not included.

## County Schools Gearing Up for 2012-13 Year

School begins August 3rd, and there will be an Apple on every teacher's desk, several new teachers throughout the district, and some capital improvements.

In a lease-purchase agreement with computer giant Apple, each teacher in the county has received a new Apple desktop computer, and the students will also have new Apple machines in labs and other locations, reported new Tishomingo County School Superintendent Dr. Benny McClung during an interview Monday.

McClung took the reins of the Tishomingo County schools earlier this summer, and has been using the summer months to come up to speed on the district.

"I've liked what I've seen so far, and we are just taking it slow," said McClung.

Over the summer, McClung reported capital improvements at each of the county's campuses, mostly including cosmetic improvements like tile replacement and restroom renovations.

Several personnel adjustments and new hires have been made, he said, including, at the administrative level, a new principal at Burnsville, Danny Smith. In the administrative office, Joel Robertson will change to director of human resources, and former IMS principal Jimmy Smith will be supervisor of building, grounds, and buses.

## New School Admission Residency Requirement for 2012/2013 School Year

Due to state accreditation auditing mandates, Tishomingo County School District will be requiring two (2) proofs of residency when parents/legal guardians enroll their children for the 2012/2013 school year. The two forms of verification of address that shows proof of where the student lives (Proofs of Residency) is required to ensure students are attending school where he/she is zoned to attend. A list of acceptable proofs of residency is provided below (Post Office Boxes will not be accepted).

Filed Homestead Exemption Application Form, Mortgage documents or property deed, Apartment or Home Lease, Utility Bills, Driver's License, Voters precinct identification, Automobile registration, and any other documentation that will objectively and unequivocally establish that the parent or guardian resides within the school district.

Both Proofs of Resi-

dency documentation must be listed in the student's parent/legal guardian's name. The parent/legal guardian must also be the individual who registers his/her student and will be required to sign documentation ensuring the proofs of residency provided are factual.

If two (2) proofs of residency are not provided, students will not be able to register.

## Iuka Man to Plead Guilty to Shooting Eagle

According to U. S. District Court records, William "Bill" Branum of Iuka recently waived a jury trial and will enter a plea of guilty to shooting a young bald eagle in Tishomingo County. The order was entered last Wednesday by Judge Sharon Aycock. Branum had pleaded not guilty in November, but earlier this month agreed to a change of plea. No date has been set for the change of plea and sentencing in U. S. District Court in Aberdeen.

Federal officials say the eagle was shot in the left wing in March of 2011 on County Road 306 near North Crossroads.

It has also been released that the eagle died in January at the Jackson Zoo from a fungal infection that continued to thrive in the bird's hollow bone in the broken wing after the pellet could not be safely removed.

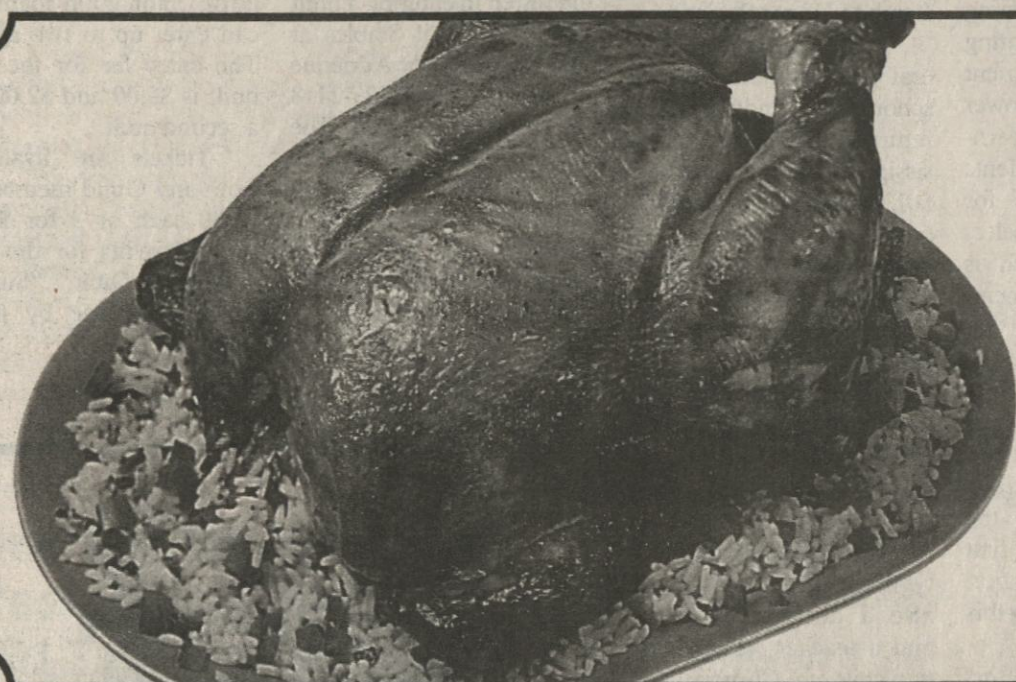

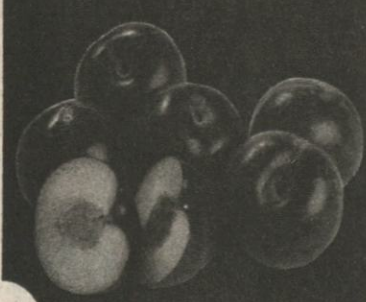

### NMMC-Iuka ACT Center to Host Sign-ups for Free Smoking Cessation Program—Iuka, MS

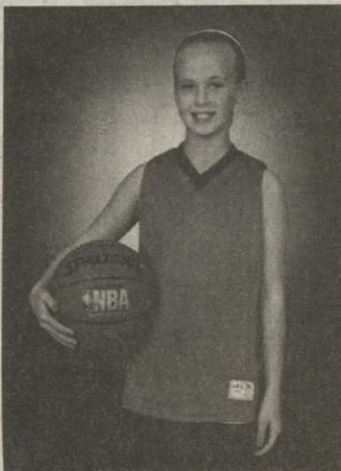
Individuals who are seeking assistance to quit smoking or tobacco use can find a helping hand as the North Mississippi Medical Center-Iuka's ACT Center program will host an open enrollment on July 31, 2012. The center, based at NMMC-Iuka, is staffed by respiratory therapists certified in helping people quit using tobacco using an evidence-based planning method that is recognized state-wide for its effectiveness. The treatment for clients involves a six-week course and provides some medications in order to help people kick the tobacco habit.

### What Is Really Important In Life?

I suppose we could get dozens of different answers to this question from the general public, but Jesus gave only one. Matthew 6:33 says, "But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you." The next question that many people have will be: what does it mean to seek the kingdom of God? First, we need to realize that every kingdom must have a



king.

In the case of the kingdom of God, Jesus Christ is the Father's appointed King, although the Father Himself is also recognized as being King. Actually, Revelation 22:3 speaks of the "throne of God and of the Lamb", indicating that both the Father and the Son will be seated on the eternal throne in the next world. Perhaps some people have not yet recognized and received Jesus as the King of their lives, thus they cannot seek first His kingdom, until they

have received Him as their King. It is very natural, yet not spiritual, for human beings to think that they should be the masters of their own lives. That is a very dangerous thing; it accounts for all of the sin that is presently in the world. The human race is a fallen race, therefore we do not have either the desire or the ability to govern our lives without God's help.

If we are to seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, this means we are not seeking our own kingdom or our own righteousness. Christ's righteousness is the only acceptable righteousness before a holy God. We must have Christ's righteousness put on our account, if God is to be pleased with us (see Romans 5:12-21).

By the way, what things

did Jesus have in mind when He said, "...and these things shall be added unto you?"

The things that are viewed in Matthew chapters 6 are the natural provisions of life: food, clothing etc. Jesus promises that those who put His kingdom and righteousness first in their lives will have the necessities of life supplied. This does not mean that we are to sit in our recliners and wait for Christ to bring these things to us, but it does mean we do the work that He has given us to do, that He will see to it that we have needs met. I can testify this truth, since He has met my needs for 67 years! In the way, what is first in your life?
