David Olen "Oley" Jourdan, 83, of Iuka, died Thursday, 1y 19th, 2012, at Magnolia Reonal Health Center in Corinth.

Once again Iuka has lost a wored son in the death of Dad Olen Jourdan, Jr., affectionely known as "Olen" or "Oley". successful businessman, Mr. urdan was owner of Jourdan ardware in downtown Iuka for any years, was owner of the ka Drive-In during the 50's and y's, and was co-owner of the J. Jourdan Lumber Company hich was located near the railad tracks in downtown Iuka fore moving to Airport Road. e was a much-loved employer the many men who worked for

A fun-loving, happy man, he as a good friend to many and as totally devoted to his family, s church, and his Lord. In 2002 suffered a stroke that took him vay from his daily work but did t keep him from living a full e, enjoying his family, and gog to the 9:35 Coffee Club each orning.

Olen Jourdan was born to O. and Mary Aliene Ragland urdan on February 16, 1929. en graduated from Iuka High hool and the University Of ssissippi School Of Business. hile at Ole Miss he was a memof Beta Theta Pi Fraternity. He rried Betty Jane "B.J." Harris Cherokee, Alabama while on ave from the U.S. Army. He was tioned in Fort Benning, Geora before being deployed to Koa. After his service as a Second ieutenant during the Korean onflict, Mr. Jourdan returned to ka where he entered the family

Oley's roots ran deep in Iuka d Iishomingo County and he as passionate about many local tities. He was a member of the ka United Methodist Church here he served on the Administive Board and as chairman of e Finance Committee for many ars. He served as chairperson of Mississippi United Method-Foundation and continued to rve as a board member. He was member of the Board of Direcs of Wood Community Cole, and was a long time member the Iuka Rotary Club, where he eived the club's highest honor being named a Paul Harris llow. District 3 & 4 **Will Elect School Board Members November 6th**

School Board Members for Supervisor Districts Three and Four will be on the November 6, 2012 General Election ballot. The qualifying period for School Board Members is Wednesday, August 8 through Friday, September 7, 2012. Candidates for these positions can only qualify during this one month period.

People interested in these positions must complete the following steps to be eligible to seek these offices:

1. Must live in school board district that they are seeking elec-

2. Must get 50 registered voters in the district in which they live to sign a petition for them to become a candidate;

3. Must bring Petition with 50 signatures to the Circuit Clerk's Office for signatures to be certified that they are registered voters in that particular district;

4. Must file Statement of Intent along with certified petition of names with Circuit Clerk's Office by 5 p.m. on Friday, September 7, 2012, which is the last date to qualify for office;

5. Must file a Statement of Economic Interest within 15 days of qualifying to run for office with the Mississippi Ethics Commission. This statement is to be submitted electronically at www.ethics.state.ms.us

6. Once papers are filed, must file Campaign Finance Reports in accordance with State Law with the Circuit Clerk's office by 5 p.m. on date due;

7. After election is over, must file a termination report for Campaign Finance with the Circuit Clerk's office.

All necessary forms, the Petition, Statement of Intent, and Campaign Finance Reports, may be picked up the Circuit Clerk's office. There is no party affiliation for school board members; therefore, there is no primary election.

The Tishomingo County Election Commission must rule on School Board Candidate qualifications. Names of qualified candidates will be released after the Board has ruled on all candidates.

There will be NO RUNOFF for school board member. The high vote wins.

Sales Tax Holiday this Saturday

The annual Sales Tax Holiday begins 12:01 a.m. Friday, July 27, 2012, and ends at midnight Saturday, July 28th. Clothing and footwear items under \$100 are exempt from sales tax.

The items exempt from sales tax during the Sales Tax Holiday are identical to those items exempt in prior years. Clothing and footwear items, meant to be worn next to the body and cost less than \$100 per item, are exempt from sales tax during this period. Accessories such as jewelry, handbags, wallets, watches, backpacks, and similar items do not qualify for the Sales Tax Holiday. Cleats and items worn in conjunction with an athletic or recreational activity are other sample items not eligible. School supplies and computers are not included.

County Schools Gearing Up for 2012-13 Year

School begins August 3rd, and there will be an Apple on every teacher's desk, several new teachers throughout the district, and some capital improvements.

In a lease-purchase agreement with computer giant Apple, each teacher in the county has received a new Apple desktop computer, and the students will also have new Apple machines in labs and other locations, reported new Tishomingo County School Superintendent Dr. Benny McClung TCHS Band Members Matthew Ward during an interview Monday.

McClung took the reins of the Tishomingo County schools learning the new routine. earlier this summer, and has been using the summer months to come up to speed on the district

"I've liked what I've seen so far, and we are just taking it slow," said McClung.

Over the summer, McClung reported capital improvements at each of the county's campuses, mostly including cosmetic improvements like tile replacement and restroom renovations.

Several personnel adjustments and new hires have been made, he said, including, at the administrative level, a new principal at Burnsville, Danny Smith. In the administrative office, Joel Robertson will change to director of human resources, and former IMS principal Jimmy Smith will be supervisor of building, grounds, and buses.

New School Admission Residency Requirement for 2012/2013 School Year

Due to state accreditation auditing mandates, Tishomingo County School District will be requiring two (2) proofs of residency when parents/legal guardians enroll their children for the 2012/2013 school year. The two forms of verification of address that shows proof of where the student lives (Proofs of Residency) is required to ensure students are attending school where he/she is zoned to attend. A list of acceptable proofs of residency is provided below (Post Office Boxes will not be accepted).

Filed Homestead Exemption Application Form, Mortgage documents or property deed, Apartment or Home Lease, Utility Bills, Driver's License, Voters precinct identification, registration, Automobile and any other documentation that will objectively and unequivocally establish that the parent or guardian resides within the school district

According to U. S. District Court records, William "Bill" Branum of Iuka recently waived a jury trial and will enter a plea of guilty to shooting a young bald eagle in Tishomingo County. Federals officials say the eagle was shot in the left wing in March of 2011 on County Road 306 near North Crossroads.

It has also been released that the eagle died in January at the Jackson Zoo from a fungal infection that continued to thrive in the bird's hollow bone in the broken wing after the pellet could not be safely removed.

NMMC-luka ACT Center to Host Sign-ups for Free Smoking **Cessation Program—Iuka, MS**

Individuals who are seeking assistance to quit smoking or tobacco use can find a helping hand as the North Mississippi Medical Center-Iuka's ACT Center program will host an open enrollment on July 31, 2012. The center, based at NMMC-Iuka, is staffed by respiratory therapists certified in helping people quit using tobacco using an evidence-based planning method that is recognized statewide for its effectiveness. The treatment for clients involves a six-week course and provides some medications in order to help people kick the tobacco habit.

The ACT Center will have two open enrollment periods on July 31, 2012, at the hospital from 9:00 - 11:00 AM and from 5:00 - 7:00 PM for people to come by and enroll or just see what the program is all about. The ACT Center program is designed to help people quit using tobacco, and many people each year make this commitment, but are unable to succeed without the proper assistance.
