Illegal Hazardous Waste Dump Identified by Authorities

Last week, Department of Transportation officers found this dumpsite of hazardous waste just off Highway 350, between Pickwick Dam and Highway 25.

It is the second time that such hazardous waste has been found, following the clean up of the former location of Dynasteel, at the nearby Yellow Creek Port, said Bill Strickland, Tishomingo County Emergency Management Agent.

The waste included dried up epoxy that was probably used in marine applications by Dynasteel. The brand name indicates the 5-gallon metal buckets contained Hempadur, a selfprimed coating for ballast water tanks and as a primer for epoxy systems for atmospheric or in-water service, e.g. ship hulls, according to the product data sheet.

According to EMA's Strickland, the former Dynasteel site was ordered

cleaned up, and the job was contracted out to local representatives of SafetyKleen. The lot numbers on the containers matched some still at the former Dynasteel site, said Strickland.

The waste did not pose a critical danger to anyone at this time, said Strickland, but such materials are required by law to be disposed of in a safer manner.

2012 Saw Progress in Industry, Business & Tourism for County

The year of 2012 saw many good things begin in Tishomingo County, as development officials welcomed new industries, and festival organizers accomplished the most successful festival ever to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the county's Civil War battle.

Business/Industry Openings

In January, McDonald's opened in Iuka, and has been going strong ever since, proving that Tishomingo County was definitely a good market for the Amory-based franchise group to expand into.

In April, Contract Fabricators opened shop at Iuka's Yellow Creek Port, and in October Dennen Steel and CFI had official ribbon cuttings, promising hundreds more jobs in the next few years at the very successful Port.

In September, development officials announced that Comfort Revolution, maker of high-end sleep products will locate in the 432,650-square-foot building formerly occupied by Schnadig Furniture Corporation in Belmont. Two hundred jobs will be created, and Sealy will also locate distribution operations in the same facility as Comfort Revolution.

Battle of Iuka Spurs Tourism Spike

Also in September, Iuka hosted thousands of visitors for the 150th Anniversary commemoration of the Battle of Iuka. After months of planning, efforts

of countless volunteers paid off when an estimated 20,000 people visited the Iuka area, giving an economic boost of 21.2 percent for August and 21.3 percent for September. A grand ball, concerts, driving tours, educational programs and historical reenactments that included everything from Generals to drummer boys drew thousands to the first major observance of Iuka's Civil War heritage in decades.

Public Fails to Support Funding Tax

Despite such successes, industrial development and tourism officials struggle to promote the county, due to significantly less operating funds than surrounding counties and in Northeast Mississippi. They supported a one-percent restaurant tax that failed to draw the interest of enough voters, and failed in the November election.

"We feel that people just didn't understand it, despite our efforts to explain and advertise it," said Tishomingo County Development Foundation President Neil Davis. It's hard to get people to vote for anything where the legislature requires you to print "for the Tax," said officials recently, even though it would only have been one penny per dollar spent at larger restaurants in the county. It meant the loss of thousands of potential dol-

lars to be spent promoting Tishomingo County for its tourism strengths and to industrial clients.

Potential Impacts of Legalization

In 2013, Tishomingo County citizens will probably have the chance to voice their support for or against

any potential economic development benefits, and needed

tax funding that could result from legalized liquor sales in the county, or in just Iuka. Petition efforts are close to getting enough signatures to put the issue to a county or city vote in Iuka, and the pressure just increased a few weeks ago, when Corinth supported legalized liquor sales in a referendum.

2013-Year to Watch

The opening of dozens of small businesses throughout the county, and positive attitude and effort of a few that have brought significant progress this year shows that "things are looking up" in the county. The following year could be pivotal in Tishomingo County's history - depending on how the people of the county get behind efforts toward progress, instead of looking for a highly unlikely gift from the government (think NASA, or TVA) to increase our economic situation, said one development official recently.

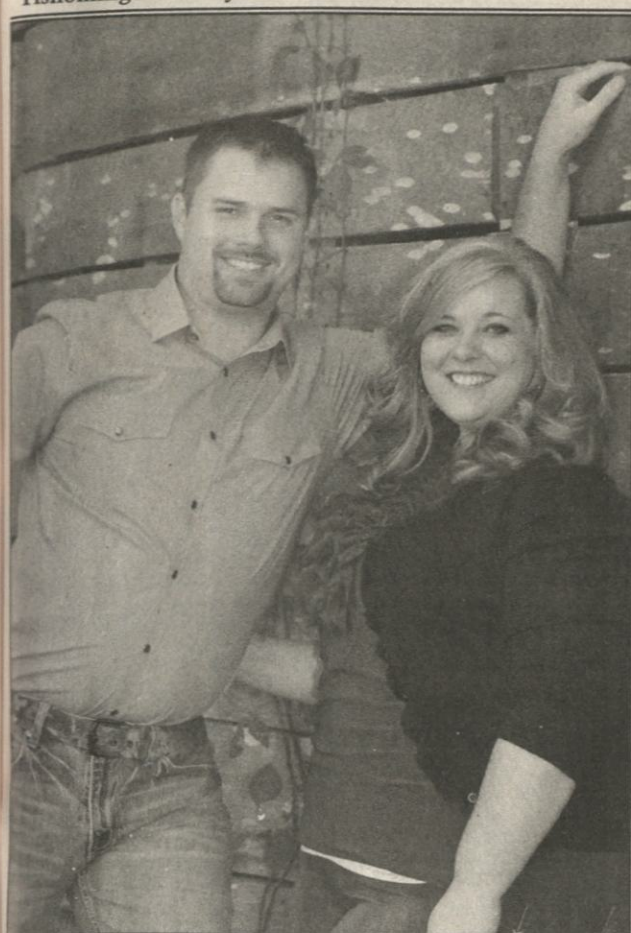

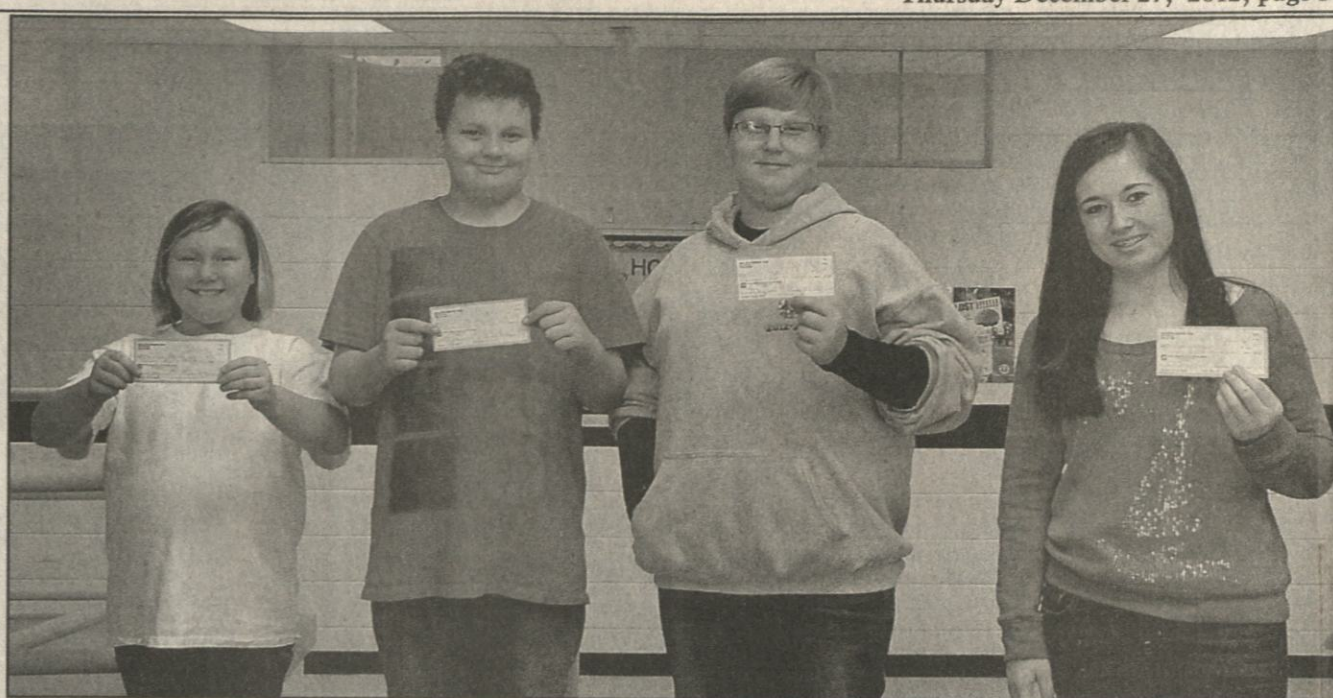
LeAnne is a 2008 graduate of Alcorn Central High School. She received

The Marks Of A Life Lived After The Flesh

It seems that there is a question that continues to be asked concerning how a Christian should live, or how he actually will live. We have every sin under the sun being justified by those who claim to be members of the body of Christ! Perhaps we can get some real help from the Book that was given for the very purpose of showing us how to live the Christian life. Galatians 5:19-21 says, "Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, envyings, murders, drunken-

ness, revellings, and such like; of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God." This list of sins would be a good place to start in showing what Christians will not practice as a lifestyle! Yes, it is possible for a saved person to commit these sins, but he will not be allowed to practice them, for God's chastening hand will fall on him (see Hebrews 12:8).

Perhaps we need to understand the "hard words" in our list. All of us know the meaning of some of these words, so I will not define them. I will say that the first four sins could involve sexual misconduct; the first two

are certainly sexual sins; the next two can also sometimes include sexual sins. This is interesting, in light of the moral looseness of today's society! The word "uncleanness" can mean things that are either physically unclean or morally unclean. Lasciviousness means "licentiousness" which also means to be morally unclean. Variance means: "quarrelsome, wrangling"; emulations means: "jealousy, indignation"; seditions means: "division, disunion"; revellings means: "carousal, rioting". So, we can see up front that these are not things that fit the Christian life. It is amazing to me that some people who practice these sins want to claim that they are Christians, but our verses say, "no"! By the way, I do not have to do any "judging" to say what I am saying here, for the Bible itself has already made the judgment; I am simply passing along what God, the judge of all, has said in His Book called the Bible! I often chuckle, and then I cry, when

I think about the fact that so many people want to use the Bible as some kind of "good luck charm", or they want to get some "inspiration" from it. Although it does inspire us, it also can be very hard on the lifestyle that does not fit its teachings!

The Fruit Of The Spirit Of God

There is a way Christians are supposed to live, and those who claim Christianity and never have any interest in living the way the Bible prescribes need to quit kidding themselves about being Christians!

Galatians 5:22-25 says, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law, And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts. If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit." Someone asked me recently if all of these fruits would ever be present at the same time in the life of any Christian. I

think they all may very well be present at the same time, yet it seems that most Christians do not have all of these fruits at the same time. We must realize that Christians are all at different levels in their Christian growth, yet this does not exempt any of us from being obligated to allow the Spirit of God to produce all of these fruits in our lives. It does not mean that one is not a Christian if he does not possess a certain one of these fruits, but it does mean that something is lacking in his growth and commitment to Christ. I think all of us would have to admit that we have often failed to allow the Spirit to produce some of these fruits in our lives at certain times.

Perhaps I need to define a few of these fruits that may not be familiar terms to some readers. I will not define those that are well known to most of us. Long-suffering means: "forbearance" (with other people); gentleness means: "moral excellence"; goodness means: "virtue";

meekness means: "gentleness, humility"; temperance means: "self-control". When we look at this entire list, including those that I did not define, we get a good idea about what a Christian should look like, how he should act! If none of these fruits are ever present in one's life, it seems quite evident that he is not a Christian! I could base the statement on verse 24 of our verses that says those who belong to Christ have crucified the flesh with its affections and lusts. The reverse side of this is that Christians have replaced fleshly lusts with the fruit of the Spirit. Then we have Paul's admonition that all who are alive in the Spirit should allow their lives to be one continuous walk in the Spirit. So, the power of the Spirit of God is not present in the believer to give him strength to jump over the church pews, rather the power to run straight when he hits the ground again!

Clothing Store Burglarized, Reid Bros. Suffer Loss—Men's Clothing and Luggage Taken in Bold Break-in Sunday Night

Thieves entered the Reid Brothers clothing Store sometime Sunday night January 17, and took clothing and merchandise valued at several thousand dollars. The break-in was discovered about 4 a.m. Sunday by the luka night marshal, Alton Coker.
