Last Thursday, deputies and the Mississippi Narcotics Unit arrested Tonja Wren, 39, of Dickey Road, Ramer, Tennes-

see in Burnsville with thirty dosage units of Suboxone, a Schedule III controlled substance, with a street value of approximately \$450. She was apparently selling the drugs from the ice cream truck, according to Sheriff Glenn Whitlock.

Wren was charged with two counts of possession of a con-

trolled substance, after the nearly month-long investigation. Wren remains in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail since she was already on probation.

Wren, and her ice cream truck had also "been in business" in Alcorn County.

Burnsville Couple Faces Meth & Child Endangerment Charges

A Burnsville couple faces serious meth-related charges after Tishomingo County Sheriff's deputies found a meth lab, and their one-year-old child with unbelievable amounts of methamphetamine in its system.

According to Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, deputies and North Mississippi Narcotics Unit officers executed a search warrant at 1014 North Highway 365, Burnsville last Friday that resulted in charges of conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine, possession of two or more precursors with intent to manufacture meth, and felony child endangerment for Samantha Stewart Wright and

Rodney Wright.

Their one-year-old child was removed from the home at the time of the arrest. In accordance with state law, the child was tested, because a toxicity level of 300 mcg/kg results in charges of child endangerment. Approximately 35 percent of children found in meth labs test positive for toxic levels of chemicals, including meth, in their bodies. The Wright child's meth toxicity level of 3,297 was detected, said Whitlock.

Whitlock said that additional arrests are expected in connection with the ongoing investigation.

Iuka Man Perishes in Fire Tuesday Night

An Iuka man perished of probable smoke inhalation during a house fire about 10:40 Tuesday night.

According to Coroner Mack Wilemon, Franklin O'Neal, 58, was the only fatality from the fire in the three-unit home at 708 Gaines Street in Iuka, near the covered bridge.

When Iuka firefighters responded, fire was already billowing out the front window, said Chief Brian Grissom. They knocked down the fire, and entered the dwelling to find O'Neal, who neighbors had indicated was probably still in the house. They found him in a smoke filled area, and he was already dead.

It was a three-unit complex; one was empty, and firefighters woke another person and brought them out safely.

The cause of the fire is under investigation, and the state fire marshal and county fire investigator were on the scene early Wednesday.

There were smoke alarms in the home, but the batteries were seriously outdated, said Grissom.

"We urge everyone to change their smoke alarm batteries at least once a year, and a smoke alarm needs to be replaced too, after ten years," said Grissom.

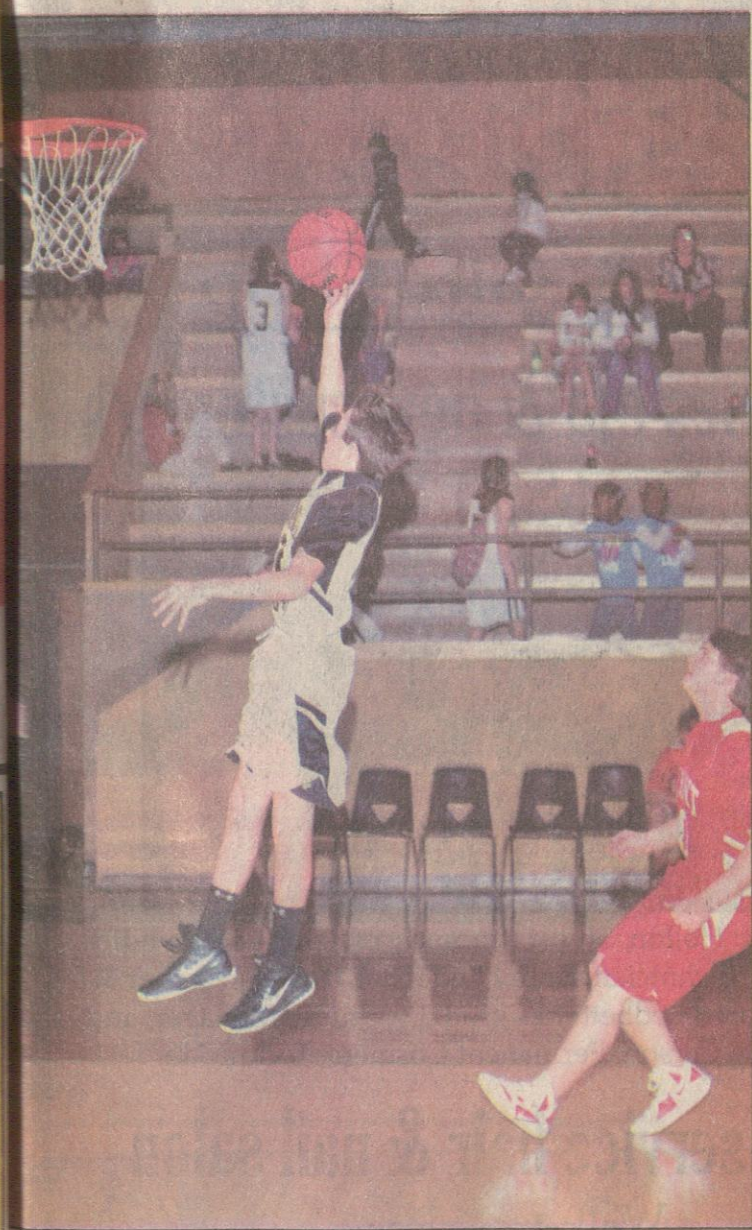

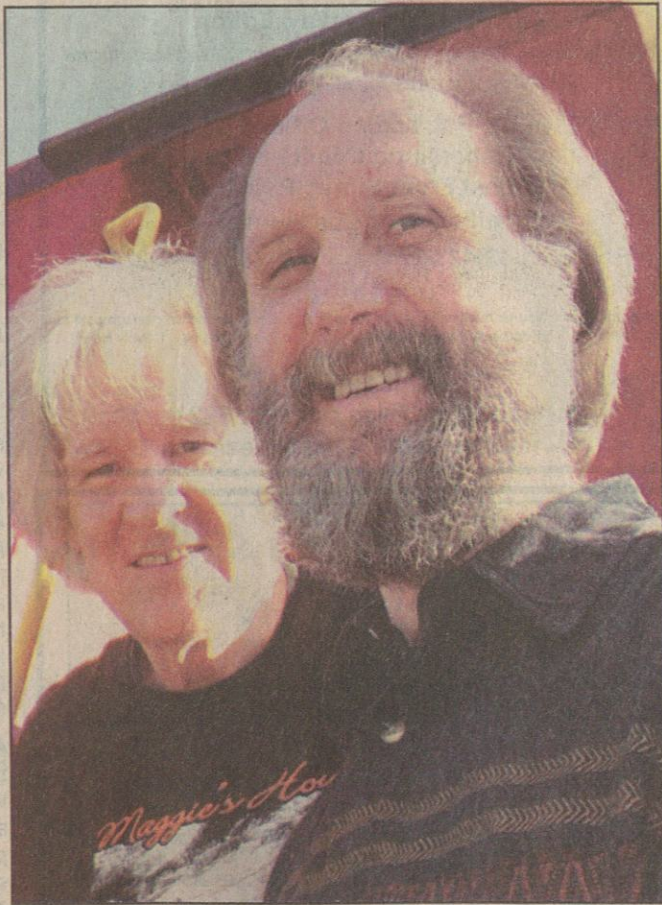

Dangerous Curve on 365 Needs Caution Signs

I am writing this letter as a concerned citizen of Tishomingo County and of the Holtspur Community. I live just off of 365 S. in Burnsville and right before you get to my house there is a very dangerous curve. There have been numerous amounts of wrecks in this curve since I have lived here and that has been 13 years. There is no telling how many occurred before I moved here. I am very surprised that there hasn't been any road signs put up warning drivers about the curve ahead of them. I contacted our supervisor concerning the signs and he informed me that I would have to contact the State Dept. He also stated that many people had requested those signs to be put up. He was very helpful on the matter, so I would like to thank Nicky McRae for his time and concern on the matter. However, I know MDOT is aware of the curve due to all the accidents that have occurred in the curve and also one of our neighbors retired from MDOT. The curve is directly across from his house, which makes it dangerous on him when leaving his home. I called MDOT on Friday, January 6th to request that they put two "dangerous curve ahead signs" up, one from each direction. The gentlemen was out to lunch, but did return my call. I explained to him my request, I told him that I realized that everyone did not pay attention to road signs, he said and I quote "if we put it across an iPhone then they might read it." It's sad but true and people, you need to put the cellphones down while you are driving. I'm just as guilty as the next person, but we are putting people's lives in danger, some people just can't talk and drive, but nobody should text and drive. If you feel like it's necessary, then please pull off to the side of the road. I then told the man that I knew some of the people that had almost lost their lives in that curve and if I could just save at least one person's life, it would be worth it. He said he would have to see what he could do. I then began to get

a little upset, he seemed unconcerned about the matter. I then told him that he could contact the Highway Patrol and ask them because I know each of them have worked at least one wreck in this curve, if not more. He then told me he would have to pull the traffic records, really I thought to myself, you have to be kidding me. So I then told him he could just go look at the skid marks on the newly paved highway and that would be all the proof he should need. I was never disrespectful one time with him through the conversation, I then told him to have a Blessed day. Our children travel this highway daily going to and from Northeast Community College, a lot of 18 wheelers and much more traffic. This is a very busy highway and people who are not familiar with it do not realize that curve is there. Please correct me if I am wrong, but it is our tax dollars that pay for these type of things to be done. They put up signs that say double fines, put lines across the roads to count how people drive down that certain highway, then they have those signs that tell you how fast your going. None of those will save anyone's life, I'm trying to save someone's life and they are giving me grief over it.

So to MDOT, I will not give up on this until those signs are posted, one from each direction. May God Bless You.

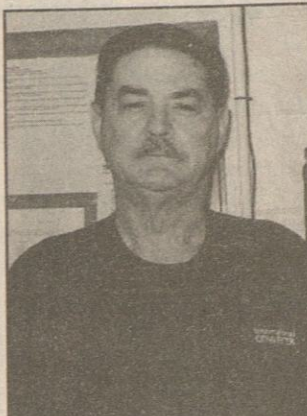

Master Gardener Training Begins in Tishomingo County

Do you want to be a Master Gardener? Applications are being accepted in Tishomingo County for anyone who wants to sharpen their horticultural skills and share that knowledge with others. Mississippi State University's Extension Service is conducting the Master Gardener training program on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. beginning February 21st and

January is recertification time for ALL recipients. Be sure to bring the following items with you to the courthouse basement to aid in this process.

Recertification Requirements are:
1. proof of residency (MUST be a resident of Tishomingo County, MS; generally use util-

Weather and Election Top Stories for 2011

Weather-related issues seemed to have the most impact on Tishomingo County in 2011.

Tornadoes at the end of April devastated the town of Belmont, and they would spend the rest of the summer cleaning up damage. Thanks to help from neighbors and many other sources, says

mayor Buddy Wiltshire, they made a remarkable recovery. No deaths were caused.

"People came and helped and volunteered their services, many of whom didn't even know if they would be paid," said Wiltshire, expressing thanks in retrospect last week.

In the same storm, the Har-

mony, North Crossroads and Coleman Park areas suffered heavy wind damage.

In September, flash floods killed a man as he and other passengers tried to cross the low-water crossing at Coleman Park.

After a historic 2010 white Christmas, January brought more than 8 inches of snow in a record snowfall. It also snowed heavily in

February. School was out so many days that the school year was extended by having the students (and teachers!) stay longer for several days.

In an election year, there is a huge amount of election news, but this year was relatively conflict-free. There were two runoffs after the Democratic primary, but in the end only the Fifth District

Supervisor changed in the county offices. Voters in our area did get a new state senator, Rita Potts Parks, and a new state representative for the south end - Donnie Bell.

Big news in a small town was the anticipation of a new McDonalds in Iuka. It finally opened in January of 2012.

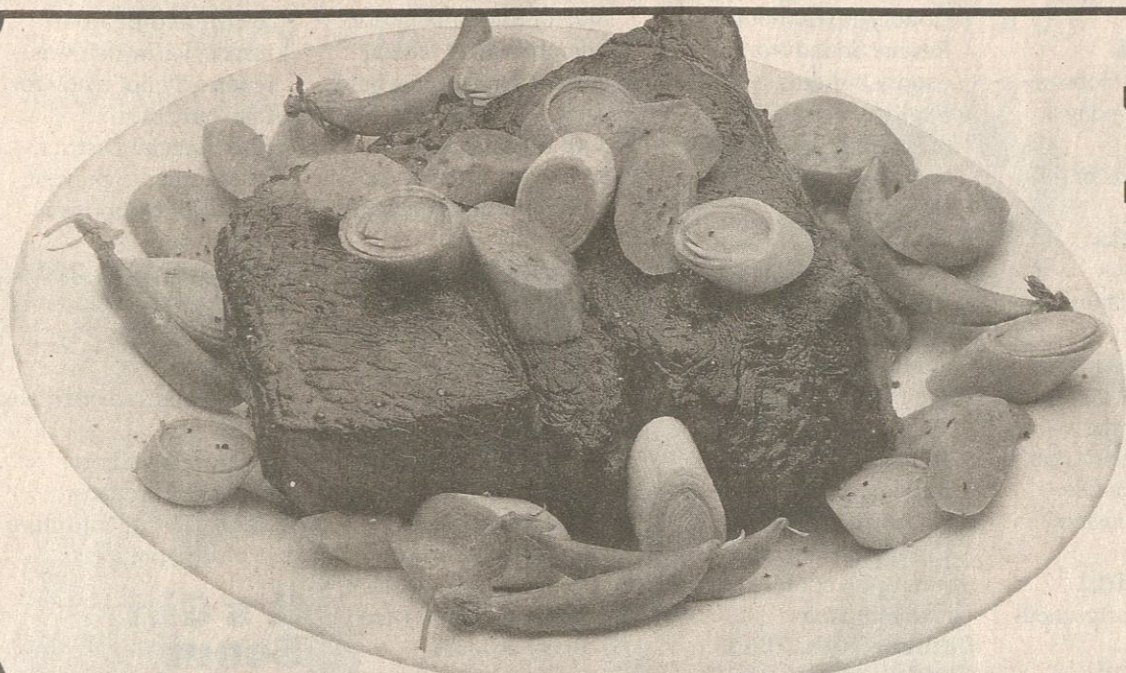

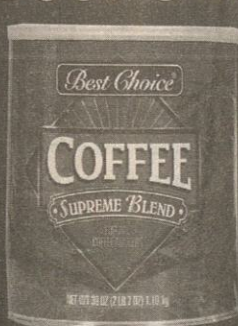

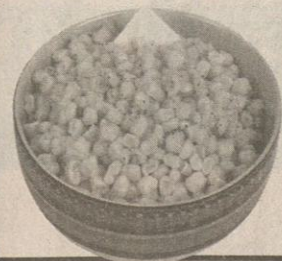

New Year Brings New Chapter in Life of Attorney Arch Bullard

A new chapter is opening in the life of local attorney Arch Bullard, but the story of his lifelong commitment to the law and public service remains the same. Bullard spent just over 15 years as an assistant district attorney in Corinth, handling cases primarily in Alcorn, Prentiss and Tishomingo counties. The beginning of the new year brought his departure from the district attorney's office as a new administration took over and a move into a new area of legal practice. Bullard will now be working with Bill Davis in the Corinth office of the firm of Clayton O'Donnell, a large Northeast Mississippi law firm with a wide ranging focus on complex business and commercial litigation, civil cases and other work for corporations, municipalities, businesses and individuals.

The attorney said he's excited about the new challenges and opportunities to be found in his new job and looking forward to continuing to serve people through the practice of law. "I'm really scared and excited and intrigued about the opportunity to enter a different area," he said. In some ways, the move is a return to his roots. Early in his career, Bullard worked for two and a half years in a small firm in West Point doing a wide range of civil and criminal work. He then went on to serve as a

clerk for U.S. District Judge L.V. Senter where he was involved in a huge range of federal litigation.

For this son of an attorney who also counts two of his siblings as fellow lawyers the law is much more than a job, it's been a lifelong calling and remains at the core of who he is.

"I knew what I was going to do when I was three years old," he said.

Bullard said the lessons learned by watching how his father practiced law and dealt with people created in him a desire to use the law as a means to care for others.

"My dad instilled in me a really strong belief that a good lawyer helps people. You should be helping people whatever you're doing," he said.

He believes the law is the core structure that holds society together and said the practice of law, no matter the area, is rooted in helping people navigate the laws and helping improve their lives.

Bullard said he was also drawn to the law because he is a naturally scholarly person and the practice gives him a chance to study and learn about not only legal matters but countless other areas he comes across during the course of working on cases.

The lawyer said he's so grateful for all those who have reached out to him and his family in the weeks since this transition in his life began. He's received countless

letters, phone calls and other messages of support from people throughout the area and it has meant so much to him.

"It's just been humbling for both me and my wife and my family," he said.

He's thankful for the opportunity provided by Clayton O'Donnell that will allow him to stay in this area he now calls home and continue to practice.

"To leave here was going to be very difficult. We love it here. We've raised our children here. It was a relief to be able to go in with Bill Davis and to stay

here in Corinth," he said.

Looking back on his years at the district attorney's office, he said he's most proud of the opportunities to help those struggling through some of the most difficult times of their lives and of the relationships he's forged with area law enforcement as he's worked with them to help keep the public safe.

"I just can't say enough about law enforcement and how hard they work. What a joy it's been to partner with them," he said.

John M. Flexneer, M.D.

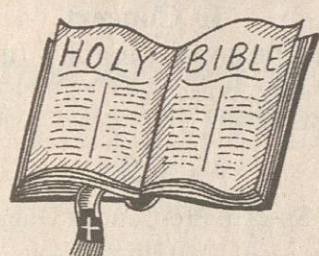
John M. Flexner, M.D., Professor Medicine Emeritus at Vanderbilt University, died at Vanderbilt University Medical Center on December 27th, 2011 after a brief illness. He was 85 years old and was married to the former Glenda Skinner of Burnsville. After two years in the U.S. Navy, Dr. Flexner received his A.B. from Yale in 1950 and his M.D. from Johns Hopkins in 1954. He completed internship and residency at Vanderbilt and Yale before completing fellowship training in Hematology at Vanderbilt. After completing his postdoctoral fellowship in 1959, Dr. Flexner enjoyed a lengthy career teaching and practicing medicine at Vanderbilt, the Nashville Veterans Affairs Medical Center, Nashville General Hospital, and Meharry Medical College.

In 1974, he was selected for membership in the Alpha Omega Alpha national medical honor society. He was the American Cancer Society Professor of Clinical Oncology at Vanderbilt from 1981-1991, one of only 17 in the U.S. Memberships in professional societies included the American Association of Cancer Education, American Society of Clinical Oncology, American Society of Hematology, Davidson County Medical Society, Johns Hopkins Medical and Surgical Association, Nashville Academy of Medicine, and Sigma Xi Fraternity, a national honorary medical fraternity. He published more than 80 medical articles, mostly in the field of leukemia and lymphoma, and wrote book chapters on death and dying, and the management of cancer pain.

He was a Distinguished Alumnus of the Webb School in Bell Buckle, where he graduated in 1944. A favorite of Vanderbilt medical students, he was regularly honored with inclusion in the yearly student composite picture in the 1970s and 80's. Dr. Flexner wrote several highly-cited papers regarding the clinical course of T-cell lymphomas, and contributed to seminal work in the immunological classification of lymphomas. His passion however, was his work regarding the role of the physician in the care of dying patients. Together with Dr. David Barton, with whom he taught the "Death, Dying, and Bereavement" course at Vanderbilt, he founded Alive Hospice of Nashville in 1975. He considered this his greatest legacy.

Dr. Flexner is survived by his wife, Glenda Skinner of Nashville; four children, John Lindsey Flexner of Landenberg, PA, Charles Williams Flexner of Ellicott City, MD, Anne Conley of Marietta, GA and Morris Carter Flexner of Athens, GA; ten grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

The Burial Office was said for Dr. Flexner at Christ Church Cathedral in Nashville on Friday, December 30th at 2 p.m. A reception followed in the Parish Hall. In lieu of flowers, the family requests that memorial donations be made to Alive Hospice of Nashville.
