Tishomingo Man Charged with Murder after Weekend Shooting

William "Monroe" Walden, 22, of 3055 County Road 961 in Tishomingo, was charged with murder in the shooting death of his cousin over the weekend. His bond was set at \$1 million Monday in Itawamba County Justice Court.

Walden is charged in

the shooting death of 30-year-old Rosa Ables.

According to Sheriff Chris Dickinson, Walden and Ables were first cousins and after getting into an altercation, he reportedly shot her in the back with a 12-gauge shotgun.

Medical Authorities Report Several Cases of Flu

Dozens of students have been absent this week in Iuka, and local clinics confirm that they have seen many confirmed cases of the flu.

So far, the cases they have seen have been mild, said Teresa South, nurse practitioner at Segars Clinic. But, it's not March, yet, she warns.

Most of the patients at Segars' have been elementary school aged.

Iuka Medical Clinic also confirmed that they have seen several cases, but in people of all ages.

Iuka Elementary seems to be where the most cases have been, according to unofficial reports. Iuka Middle School has started to see some cases, too, but Burnsville, Belmont and Tishomingo campuses report few or no cases.

Everyone is urged to take precautions to prevent a major outbreak. The Cen-

ters for Disease Control issue the following suggestions:

Preventing the Flu: Good Health Habits Can Help Stop Germs

The single best way to prevent seasonal flu is to get vaccinated each year, but good health habits like covering your cough and washing your hands often can help stop the spread of germs and prevent respiratory illnesses like the flu. There also are flu antiviral drugs that can be used to treat and prevent the flu.

1. Avoid close contact.

Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick too.

2. Stay home when you are sick.

If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. You will help prevent others

from catching your illness.

3. Cover your mouth and nose.

Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. It may prevent those around you from getting sick.

4. Clean your hands.

Washing your hands often will help protect you from germs. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub.

5. Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.

Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth.

6. Practice other good health habits.

Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious food.

Dozens of Pleas Heard in January Circuit Court

The January session of Tishomingo County Circuit Court met during the past few weeks, and dozens of defendants and their lawyers negotiated plea bargains, resulting in presumably lesser sentences in return for avoiding a criminal trial.

Judge Jim Pounds presided over the following pleas in Tishomingo County Circuit Court.

Jennifer Hale Belue, of 499 CR 989, Iuka, pled guilty to felony child abuse, deprivation of necessary health care and knowing of continuing child abuse, in connection with the January 2010 that involved her then 3-year-old son. She was sentenced to 40 years with Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC), 15 suspended, and 25 to serve, and 5 years PRS; and must pay fines and court costs.

David Garland, 41, appeared for sentencing on 3 counts, which had been previously deferred, reportedly for the defendant to spend time with his sick mother. He was being sentenced for 3 counts, including obtaining a controlled substance by fraud; conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine, and possession of a weapon by a convicted felon. He requested that the sentence be deferred, so he could "spend time with his critically ill mother."

According to a report the judge quoted, Garland was charged with public drunkenness shortly after his sentencing was deferred, and he also had tested positively for marijuana. Judge Pounds, therefore, refused

his request to, again, defer his sentencing, and sentenced him to 20 years, 16 of which are suspended, and 4 to serve, conditional on future good behavior. He also had to pay court costs and fines related to the 3 charges.

Michael Johnson, 27, pled guilty to possession of methamphetamine in connection with a June 23, 2011 incident and was sentenced to 8 years with the MDOC with credit for time served and the remainder suspended, to run consecutively with a sentence he is currently serving.

William Eric Russell, 32, pled guilty to burglary of a dwelling in connection with a November 6, 2010 incident in which some rifles were taken from the home of Raines Russell, the defendant's father. Russell is currently serving a sentence for a previous charge. For the burglary, he was sentenced to 10 years with MDOC, with credit for time served, and the remainder suspended; the sentence to run consecutively with the sentence he is currently serving. He also has to pay fines and court costs.

Joe Wesley O'Neal, 47, pled guilty to a charge of aggravated assault, in connection with an August 5th, 2011 incident that involved his mother, Barbara Ann Ward. He was already on probation for a previous charge, and was sentenced to 20 years with MDOC, with 16 suspended, and 4 to serve; as well as 5 years post-release supervision (PRS). He was ordered to

not have any contact with the victim. He also had to pay court costs and fines.

David Riggs, of Corinth, pled guilty to a charge of fondling and was sentenced to 15 years with MDOC, all suspended, and 5 years PRS; and must pay fines and court costs.

April Taylor, 59 Collier Road, Golden, pled guilty to possession of morphine and was sentenced to 8 years with MDOC, with credit for time served and the balanced suspended; and must pay fines and court costs.

Mark Carpenter, 117 CR 150, Iuka, pled guilty to 3 counts of obtaining a controlled substance by fraud and was sentenced to 5 years with MDOC, 1 year suspended, and 4 to serve; 1 year PRS, and must pay fines and court costs.

Laken Smith, 18 CR 1191, Booneville, pled guilty to manufacturing methamphetamine and was sentenced to 10 years with MDOC, all suspended; 5 years PRS; and must pay fines and court costs.

Jamie Moore, 68 CR 180, Iuka pled guilty to possession of 2 or more precursors, and was sentenced to 10 years with MDOC, with credit for time served and the balance suspended; 5 years PRS; and must pay fines and court costs.

Joseph Allen Obrecht, 145 CR 226, Iuka pled guilty to aggravated domestic violence, and was sentenced to 7 years with MDOC, 5

Four Injured in Saturday Wreck

Four people were taken to area hospitals Saturday for treatment of injuries resulting from a one-vehicle wreck on U.S. Highway 72.

According to public information MHP officer Ronny Hall, about 3:30 pm, Saturday, January 21st, the officers responded to a one vehicle accident on U.S. Hwy. 72 near the scales. Upon arriving it appeared Troy Keller, 24, of Cherokee, AL, was driving a 1994 Mercury vehicle, traveling east, when he apparently lost control of the vehicle.

The vehicle traveled down an embankment, collided into a tree then impacted a culvert.

Keller was transported by ambulance to NMMC in Iuka with serious injuries. He has been released from the hospital since the accident. He was not wearing a seatbelt.

The vehicle was occupied by four passengers: one adult, two children and one infant.

The adult passenger was identified as Pamela S White, 19, of Cherokee,

AL. She was an NMMC in Tupelo life-threatening. She remains hospitalized. She was not buckled in the vehicle.

The two children were transported to NMMC in Iuka with minor injuries. They were treated and released. Both children were unbuckled.

The only non-injured passenger was a 1-year-old infant who was fastened in a child seat.

Donna Hancock, 68 CR 180, Iuka, pled guilty to a count of possession of 2 or more precursors and was sentenced to 15 years with credit for time served, and the balance suspended; 5 years unsupervised probation; and must pay fines and court costs.

Dakota Johnson, of 22 CR 250, Iuka, pled guilty to a count of possession of morphine and was sentenced to 8 years, all suspended; 5 years PRS; and must pay fines and court costs.

Travis E. Luttrell, of 5 CR 328, Iuka, pled guilty to a count of sale of oxycodone, one count of sale of alprazolam and one count of child endangerment. He was sentenced to 20 years with credit for time served, and the balance suspended; was admitted to the house arrest program; 5 years PRS; and must pay fines and court costs.

Brandon Stacy, 1449 East Quitman, Iuka, pled guilty to a count of sale of marijuana, and was sentenced to 3 years, all suspended; 3 years PRS; and must pay fines and court costs.

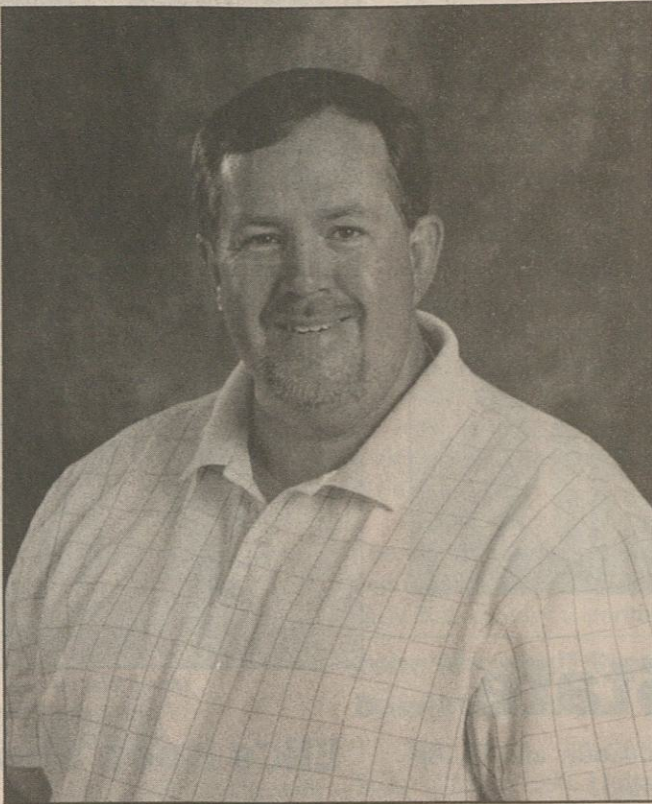

Bobby Patrick Named Band Director of the Year by the National Association for Music Education

Mr. Bobby Patrick was chosen as the 2012 National Band Director of the Year by the National Association for Music Education and the US Army on January 5th in an award ceremony held in San Antonio's Alamodome in conjunction with the US Army All American Bowl. Mr. Patrick is in his 11th year as a band director and his 11th year as director of bands at Phil Campbell High School Elementary School in Tupelo, Mississippi. During his tenure the band program has tripled in size. The program has consistently received Superlatives at the Alabama and District Concert Festivals and has received numerous Best in Class Awards. The band program has grown to add a jazz program and a wind guard and percussion program. The Phil Campbell Band Program has produced many All Area, District and All State members through the years, including producing band directors.



Bobby spent five summers as a visual instructor, a caption head and a designer with the DCI Capital Regiment in Columbus, Ohio, Memphis Sound from Louisville, Tennessee and a cheerleader from Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He has been an adjudicator in Alabama and Tennessee. Prior to becoming a band director, he worked as a Purchasing Agent for a subcontractor of NASA in 1990-1994.

On April 27th, 2011, a massive EF-5 tornado tore through the small community of Phil Campbell, Alabama, killing 26 residents. The high school was hit, with the band room taking a direct hit, losing its entire music library, the entire band facility and approximately 90% of instruments and equipment were destroyed. Through the donations of hundreds of individuals and many corporations through the Facebook page "One Brick at a Time" and grants from Warner Music and the Glee Give a Note Competition, the band has received approximately \$225,000 in monetary donations, which has brought the band program back from the brink of extinction to a functional entity once again.

"The Army has a long, proud history of producing great leaders and outstanding musicians," said John Myers, Director of Strategic Commu-

nications, Marketing and Outreach, U.S. Army Accessions Command. "Mr. Patrick exemplifies both of these traditions, providing great leadership to young student-musicians. We congratulate him on being recognized as Band Director of the Year and thank him for all he does to make young Americans stronger, as musicians and as people."

The National Band Director of the Year Award honors the band director who has been an inspiration to students and music educators, and who by his or her actions, embodies the U.S. Army's core values. The award was added to the U.S. Army All-American Marching Band program as part of its efforts to acknowledge the contribution of music education to the development of America's youth.

Mr. Patrick holds a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration and a Bachelor's in Music Education from the University of North Alabama, where he graduated Summa Cum Laude. He is a member of NAFME, the Alabama Music Education Association, the Alabama Bandmasters Association, the Northwest Alabama All Area Band Association (where he served as treasurer for 5 years) and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia. He lives with his wife Jodie and his daughter Kaitlyn (who aged out in 2011 as a member of the Phantom Regiment Drum and Bugle Corps Color Guard) in Tuscumbia, Alabama. They are members of Our Lady of the Shoals Catholic Church where Bobby and Jodie teach 7th and 8th grade Sunday school classes. Mr. Patrick is a native of Iuka.

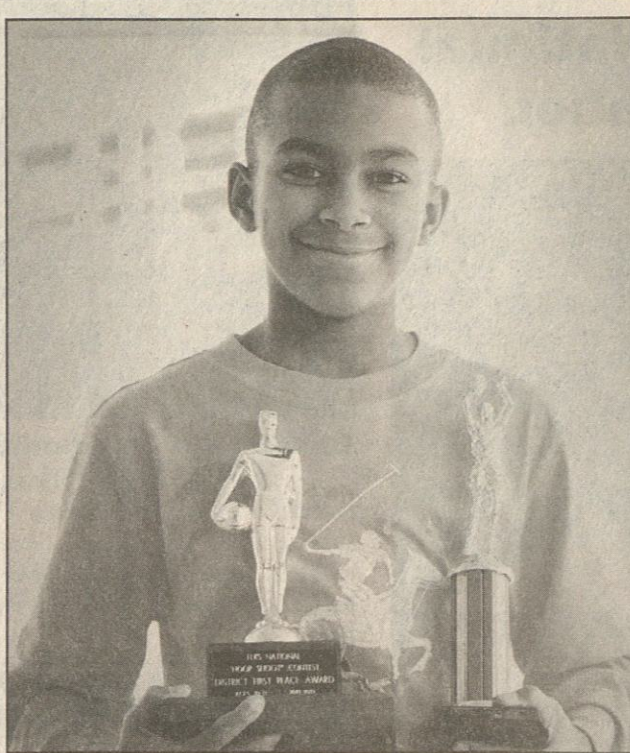

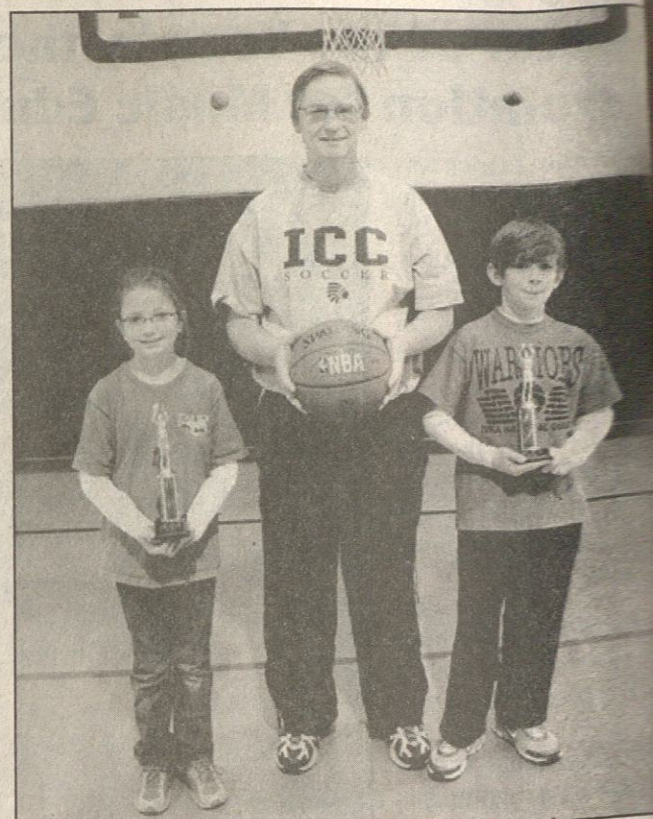

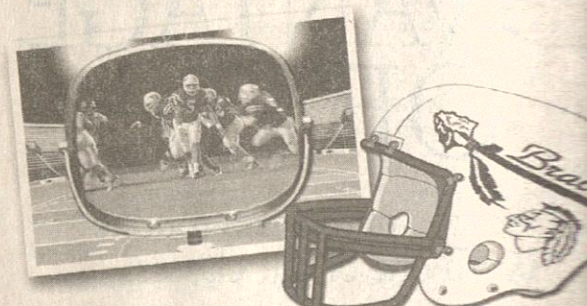

Financial report was given and material turned over to new Treasurer for 2012.

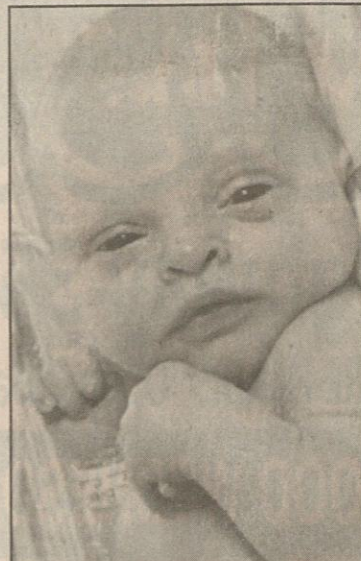
