Community, Family and Teens Shocked After Accidental Shooting Death Saturday Night in Walmart Parking Lot

The Iuka community is mourning the loss of a teen-boy following his accidental shooting death in the Walmart parking lot Saturday night.

Eighteen-year-old Bryson was apparently sitting in a car in the parking lot of the store with a friend around 11 p.m. when the 44-Magnum over he was fooling around was discharged.

There were other teens in the lot, and one called 911. Iuka police and firemen responded. Bryson was pronounced dead at the scene, said Tishomingo County Sheriff Mack Wilemon.

When the time officers went to inform the family, they had already heard of the shooting, and were on their way to the scene, explained Iuka

Police Chief Randy Stringer.

Within an hour, friends of Bryson started gathering at the Walmart parking lot, in disbelief that the fun-loving, charming guy with his whole future ahead of him was gone.

The truck had already been removed from the scene.

Dill had just signed on with the Army, and, based on the investigation, had no apparent issues that might have indicated the event was anything but an accidental shooting, explained Stringer.

Students at Tishomingo County High School, where Dill still had many friends, were offered counseling opportunities on Monday, and many of them took advantage of it, said counselor Diane Byars.

Body Found in Lowndes County Could Be Missing Iuka Man

Authorities are working to determine if a body found in the Tennessee River Waterway in Lowndes County is that of a missing Tishomingo County man.

Robert Paul Martindale, 55, last seen December 6th by family members who live on East Road in Iuka. A truck driver, not unusual for Martin to be away for short periods of time. Family became concerned in January when Martin's 1993 Ford Explorer was found on a road in Lowndes County.

The body was pulled from a dock along Bud Price Road in Lowndes County.

He was caught in an area between the dock and stairs," said

Lowndes County Coroner Greg Merchant. Merchant estimated the middle-aged man had been dead for 2 1/2 weeks. No trauma was visible on the body, he said, which was in the water. He said a cause of death is unknown pending further investigation.

"The description is similar, and the timing is consistent with our missing Robert Paul Martindale," said Tishomingo County Chief Deputy Jamie Reynolds. "We are awaiting the results of DNA testing to see if it's the same man."

Bud Price Road is about seven miles south of the center of Columbus off Nashville Ferry Road East.

The call came in about 1:48 p.m. Friday from a homeowner who found the body lodged in his boat landing, Merchant said.

TC Sweeps Kossuth; Falls to Belmont Next Night

For the TC girls, last week was a marathon of games, with six games in eight days, and though they lost four and won two, they have performed admirably against their opponents, who continue to be the best teams in the state.

The TC girls had good Division 1-4A wins over Shannon (59-49) last Tuesday, and Amory (63-45) this week, giving them a 6-4 division record. They meet Amory again in the first round of the Division 1-4A tournament next week at ICC. If they get a third win on the Lady Panthers then, it would earn them a place in the

North Half Tournament.

Junior varsity and varsity Braves and Lady Braves enjoyed four wins over Kossuth in make up games last Thursday night. The JV boys rallied after a crowd-pleasing dunk by freshman Blake Hawkins, winning 40-27, and the Lady Braves came back against the Lady Aggies for a 63-61 win in the final seconds. The Braves came back when junior Hunter Pounders found his 3-pointer groove in the final period, forcing an overtime, and a final score of Braves 54-Kossuth 50.

The Lady Braves continue to let the cross county rival Lady Cardinals outplay them, and they lost 66-41 Friday.

The Braves fell to Belmont 47-44 Friday night in the final seconds (free throws do count) of a rowdy county rivalry game.

The Lady Braves record now

stands at 15-12. The Braves stand at 11-13, with a 5-5 division record.

TCHS hosts Alcorn Central Thursday night in the final home game of the regular season. Senior players will be recognized between varsity games.

TRIAD Installing Free Smoke Detectors in Special Program

Tishomingo County TRIAD is heading up a program to provide free smoke alarms in homes of elderly and disabled people in the county.

TRIAD is a coalition of law enforcement, safety and health agencies that work to help educate our county's older population about safety issues. They meet monthly in Burnsville, Iuka, Tishomingo and Belmont.

Using grant funds from Mississippi State Fire Marshall's office, volunteer firemen or sheriff's

deputies will install, free of charge, new smoke alarms in homes that meet the following criteria:

- You have to own your own home
- You have to be over 65, or have someone over 65 living in the home, or have someone disabled living in the home
- Or the home has a disabled child under 14

There are also alarms for hearing impaired persons.

Volunteer installers will only come if the homeowner requests it, assured Iuka

Fire Chief Brian G. They will be sheriff's deputies or volunteer firemen and will identify themselves. They will ask a Home Fire Safety that they will come help your home be as possible.

TRIAD has more than 500 of the alarms available for installation in homes that meet the above criteria. To find out more call the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department at 423-7000, or ask at the TRIAD meeting in town.

Master Gardener Training Begins in County

What Songs Does Your Church Sing?

This may be considered a "sister article" to one that I wrote before, but it has a different slant. Here I am asking what you and your church sing when you gather for worship. It may seem strange that I, an evangelist, should ask such questions, because this may not generate more meetings for me! Frankly, I am not too concerned about meetings, rather, I am concerned about biblical worship and praise! I have the idea that some of what is being sung in many churches in our day panders to the flesh more than to the spirit! When human bodies sway, twist and turn in the song service, so that the opposite sex is attracted to the body, something is wrong and needs to be addressed! I often wonder what has happened to the old songs that had lyrics that glorify God for His salvation offered to the human race through the shed blood of Jesus Christ. I wonder what is wrong with songs that put the emphasis on Who God is and what He has done, rather than on who we are and what we are doing for God.

Colossians 3:16-17 will give us the help we need to get back on track with church music. (By the way, I thank God that I attend a church, when I am home from preaching engagements, that still uses songs that glorify God!) Now here are our verses from Colossians: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by Him." What a great formula for worship and singing we have here! First, our singing should be based on the Word of God, which is to dwell in us richly. I think many songwriters would do well to study theology a few years, before they ever pick up their pens to write! We have no right to sing anything, anywhere that is against the Word of God! Notice that we are to teach and admonish one another by what we sing. The lyrics of our songs of worship should be psalms, hymns and spiritual songs, or words that fit spiritual themes. We are to sing with grace in our hearts, not with a snarl on our faces! Does God rejoice with you when you sing in church; when you sing around the house or when you listen to others sing on the radio or television? If we call our songs "worship", they should have a biblical content, for that is where we learn about true worship!
