Barge Runs Aground in Penn-Tom Waterway

 Officials with the Tennessee Tombigbee Waterway confirmed Wednesday morning that a barge developed a problem and ran aground sometime Friday night at mile marker 100 near the Tri-State Commerce Park in the Pickwick Lake area of the waterway.
 According to Larry Merrihew, president of the Warrior Tombigbee Waterway Association in Mobile, one of the barges in the group started taking on water and so the towing crew repositioned it from the other barges, but it aground so that its condition could be evaluated while the cargo moved on.

He did not indicate what the barge was carrying. He said that divers were on their way to the site to see if the damage could be repaired, and assess the situation.
 The barge was pushed out of the path of transport; there is at least 140 feet of clearance around it, so it is not stopping other barge traffic on the heavily traveled Tennessee Tombigbee Waterway. The Coast Guard was working the navigation issues involved and warning marine craft, said a representative from the Ohio district Wednesday morning.
 Staff at the Yellow Creek Port were aware of the situation, but no one answered calls at county-owned Tri-State Commerce Park. The barge was not docking at, or being used by either the Port or Tri-State, it seemed from the reports.

Sheriff Announces More Arrests Resulting from Grand Jury Action

Authorities arrested a man during the investigation of the 900 pounds of metal stolen from a Tishomingo factory.
 Matt Day, 24, has been charged with grand larceny in connection with the case. TBEI, on Highway 25 just north of Tishomingo reported that at 900 pounds of scrap metal had been stolen from its facility. Investigators were able to track down to a recycling place in Iuka, where Day reportedly received \$600 for the scrap.
 Day is released on bond, and his case will go before the next grand jury, said sheriff department investigator Jeff Palmer.



Tishomingo Policeman Injured in Saturday Night Collision

 The Mississippi Highway Patrol is investigating a two-car collision involving a Tishomingo police officer Saturday night.
 Troopers and dozens of county emergency personnel responded to the scene about 8:45 p.m. on Highway 30, less than fifty yards west of Highway 25, where a 2008 Nissan Altima driven by Joseph H. Kain, 21, of Burnsville, had apparently collided with a 2006 Crown Victoria driven by

Officer Tim W. Williamson, 47, of Iuka. According to Trooper Ronny Hall, Williamson was patrolling on Highway 30, north of Tishomingo, headed west, and Kain was eastbound when they hit head on.
 Emergency responders had to extricate Williamson from the car. He was wearing a seat belt said Trooper Hall. He was airlifted from the scene to North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo, and later to the MED in

Memphis. According to reports, he had surgery on a broken leg, and hip replacement.
 Kain, who is serving with the U. S. Air Force, was pulled from his vehicle before it caught fire, said emergency workers at the scene. He was also airlifted to NMMC in Tupelo where he was treated for serious, but not life-threatening injuries, and has since been released.
 The cause of the accident is still under investigation.

The Hero of the Battle of Corinth - Colonel Williams P. Rogers - Sword Returns to the North Mississippi Town One-Hundred and Fifty Years Later

Corinth, Mississippi, February 15, 2012: On Saturday and Sunday, March 3 and 4, 2012, the public will get the opportunity to view one of the most poignant relics from the Western Theatre of the American Civil War at the annual Corinth Civil War Relic and Military Show and Sale sponsored by the Colonel W. P. Rogers Camp of the Sons of Confederate Veterans.

The sword and scabbard belonging to Colonel William P. Rogers of the 2nd Texas Infantry will return to Corinth for the first time in the 150 years following his death at the Battle of Corinth in October 1862. Colonel Rogers is considered

to be the "Hero of Battery Robinett." He died in a Confederate effort to retake Corinth from the Federal Army. General Williams S. Rosecrans, in charge of defending Corinth from the Confederate assault, ordered Rogers buried where he so gallantly fell. Both the sword and scabbard were cut from Rogers' body as souvenirs of war and were scattered among various owners for almost 150 years. In early 2010, collector Allen Wandling (wandling@charter.net), who lives near St. Louis, Missouri, was able to reunite the sword and scabbard. Now, as a marble obelisk near the Corinth Civil War Interpretive Center marks Colonel

Rogers' grave, the Corinth area will commemorate the Sesquicentennial of the American Civil War by displaying this prominent piece of history.




Annual Revival At Iuka United Methodist Church


Volunteers Being Sought for Shiloh's 150th "Grand Illumination"





Historical Society 16th Annual Meeting Held at Midway School

The historic Midway school building teemed with people and energy as the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society held its 16th Annual Meeting on Thursday, February 16, 2012. In her keynote address, President Cindy Nelson, stated that "volunteers are the dash in the dash." She explained that our headlines will display an "X" marking our birth date and death date. These "X"s will be separated by a dash. That little "X" represents how we mark our life and the difference that we make in the life of someone else.

Volunteerism is the heart of selflessly giving our life to something we believe—free of pay. As a person volunteers, though they may not earn money, a feeling of self-worth is fostered, and volunteers earn respect and favors instead of money. During 2011, a total of 102 individuals donated 19,475.5 hours of service work to the Society.

Board members and staff were introduced and acknowledged in appreciation as Mrs. Nelson presented a program on the history of the Society from 1906 to 2012. The Society, which was founded in 1906 to collect, preserve, and protect the history of Tishomingo County, has made great strides in their quest. Located in the Old Tishomingo County Courthouse, the John Marshall Stone Research Library is a state-of-the-art genealogy museum that tells the story of the county. Preser-
