## Primary Elections March 13th for Democrats & Republicans

March 13th the Democratic and Republican primary elections will be held, and Tishomingo Countians will be able to choose a candidate for president, U.S. Senate, and U.S. House of Representatives.

The Circuit Clerk's Office will be open Saturdays (March 3rd, and 10th) for absentee voting from 8 a.m. to noon for those who will be unable to cast a ballot March 13th. The Circuit Court Clerk's office will also be open regular business hours for this purpose, but the last day to vote absentee is March 10th.

Voters will have to choose which primary to vote in at the polls - Republican or Democrat, but you don't have to be registered as either one. If there is a runoff election necessary, it will be on Tuesday, April 3rd, 2012.

## School Board Approves Recent Improvements, Begins Search for New Superintendent

The Tishomingo County School Board is dealing with one of the most important decisions of their term - selecting a new superintendent to replace retiring administrator Malcolm Kuykendall.

The board issued an invitation to interested applicants last week and March 9th is the deadline for submitting the formal letter of interest, application, resume and appropriate certifications.

"We are blessed to have great students, teachers, administrators and parents in our school district that have led to our successes," said Board President Michael Puckett. "We have had tremendous leadership the last six years and the Board is focused on hiring another great leader and motivator for our district."

**Board Authorizes Facility Improvements**

In other school board news, the board recently approved funding for a soccer practice field for Tishomingo County High School, including drainage improvements. Though the team plays games during their winter season on the football field, they have been in need of a safe practice area that is regulation size. Currently, both girls' and boys' teams practice on the same field, usually at the same time.

The board also approved the building of a permanent outfield fence at the TCHS softball field, and work will begin when a decision is made on where to place it, as fast-pitch and slow-pitch teams both play there. There have also been several improvements made to the backstop area of the softball field, including a brick wall and new protective netting, in preparation for the 2012 season.

At Belmont, the board has had to make a decision to maintain a field where softball can be played, in accordance with federal Title 9 requirements, according to superintendent Kuykendall. The softball team has been using one of several fields at the city-owned Dixie Youth fields as their home field, sharing time with the

Dixie Youth leagues. According to Belmont Mayor Buddy Wiltshire, the parking, practice, and schedule congestion and conflicts caused by the high school playing there has become a bit of a problem, and they asked the school board to see if they could help with the issue.

According to district administration, since they will no longer have full access to that field for the girls to practice and play games, and because the boys do have a nearby, fully accessible field, to meet the requirements of Title 9, which guarantees equally accessible facilities for girls and boys sports, they were faced with several difficult choices:

- Have Belmont share a field with TCHS, alternating use of the TCHS field for both programs. In accordance with Title 9, the baseball program would also have to move to TC, as the girls' programs must be equally accessible.

- Dissolve the Belmont school softball program - but Title 9 would force them to also dissolve the baseball program.

- Convert the existing baseball field into a girls' softball field, and try to find land wherever it could to build a new baseball field, including extensive costs associated with clearing, filling and preparing the site.

- Buy adjacent land for a field that would meet Title 9 requirements for a field - difficult in Belmont, where land doesn't come up for sale often, said Kuykendall.

The board opted to purchase some land that adjoins the campus, located behind the visitors' side of the stadium, near the new gym, and have parents help build the facilities like the backstop and dugouts at their cost. The district would furnish lights and fencing. The parcel, which was a deep hole in the ground that has been filled over the years, and finished in preparation for construction of apartments, is 2.81 acres and was purchased from Tim Burton.

Every February, Americans celebrate Black History Month. This tribute dates back to 1926 and is credited to a Harvard scholar named Carter E. Woodson. The son of former slaves, Woodson dedicated his life to ensuring that black history was accurately documented and disseminated.

In an effort to bring national attention to the contributions of black Americans, Woodson organized the first annual Negro History Week in 1926. He chose the second week of February in honor of the birthdays of pivotal black supporters Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln.

### Planned Parenthood Gone Awry

My daughter had an abortion. She died. Maria thought she was protecting her family from embarrassment. Her father took her to a family planning clinic. He did not leave his telephone number, just told her to call him when it was over. It was never over. She was taken from this clinic by ambulance to St. Luke Presbyterian Hospital - now University of Illinois Hospital - where she died at the age of 22. I had not known she was pregnant. She had not confided in me. I thought that aura around her was caused by happiness. She was 23 weeks pregnant.

Maria was an exceptional teen. She played the piano,

soccer and was the youth choir. She often won races in track and loved to dance. We were sure her ability to draw beautiful pictures would allow her entrance into an art school. She attended the same church from age four year through high school. She participated in many activities there. She was not a druggie; nor did she drink alcohol. She was shy, except with family, but could converse intelligently with others. Maria worked hard for less than exemplary grades. Her 1995 high school graduation took place at Willow Creek Church, the church she had attended for her entire life. She was an ordinary young woman with a future; less than perfect but mine.

Politicians, at this time, are arbitrarily purporting their

many and varied stances on "planned parenthood" funding and mandating religious backing for birth control. Some persons have lost their jobs over issues to fund or not to fund abortions. Many schools in our nation already provide free birth control pills and condoms. I talked with an acquaintance who told me, knowing my daughter had died, that parents should teach their children to abstain from sex then there would be no need for abortions.

I believe that we were good parents. We tried to provide a solid background for our daughters. Unfortunately, parenthood is not graded as are most endeavors. Maria was an adult out on her own doing - not what we had planned for her - but living her own life.

Maria knew about birth control pills. For whatever reason, she did not use them.

Parents become necessary in emergency situations when children grow up. We (I should have known she was pregnant.) did not handle this one very well. If my daughter had been stopped from having this abortion, perhaps giving her child up for adoption, she would most likely be alive today. She died March 25, 2000. The life of a little baby was terminated too. Out lives have a huge vacancy because of this tragedy.

Before you vote for a politician supporting abortion, please think twice.

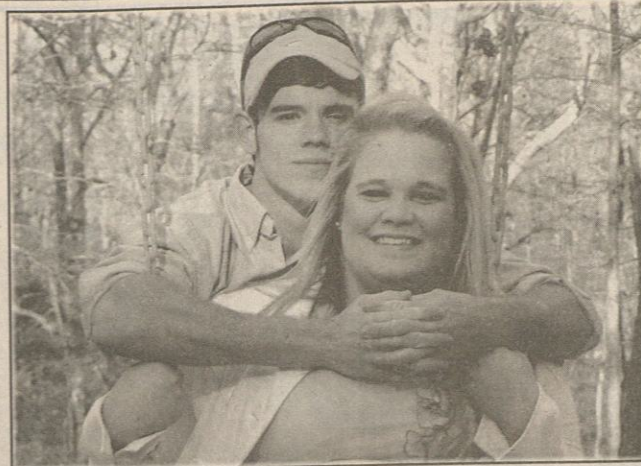
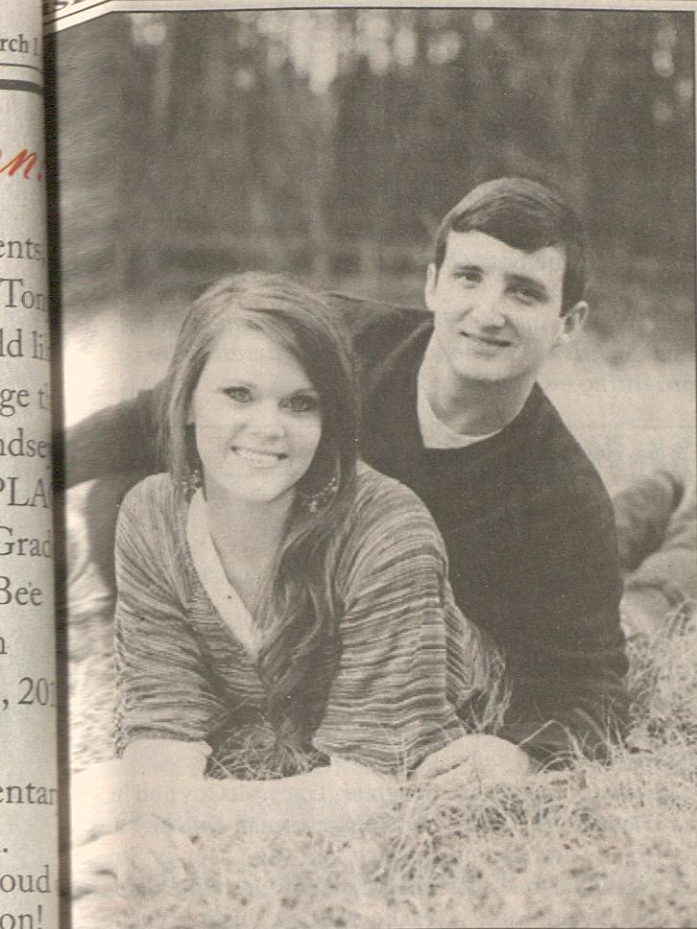

### Anticipation Builds for the Opening of Spring Turkey Season

Excitement among turkey hunters in many parts of the state is building as the 2012 spring turkey season gets closer. The 2012 spring turkey season will open on March 15th and will run through May 1st. Two years ago, MDWFP biologists reported that the 2010 hatch was well above average, which should translate into an abundance of 2-year-old gobblers to greet hunters this year. "Two-year-olds are the age group that generally account for the highest percentage of the harvest, so when that age group is up, so too are harvest rates," stated Dave Godwin, the MDWFP Wild Turkey Program Coordinator. Adam Butler, MDWFP Turkey Program biologist, indicated that this increase in reproduction yielded a spike in jake observations last season, and these birds have been carried over for the 2012 season.

"This should be one of the better seasons we've had in awhile," said Butler.

Bag limits for the 2012 spring turkey season are 1

adult gobbler or gobbler with at least a 6" beard per day, 3 per spring season. Youth hunters age 15 and under may harvest 1 gobbler of choice per day, 3 per spring season. To participate in spring turkey season, Mississippi residents, ages sixteen through sixty-four, must possess a valid hunting license, except while hunting on lands titled in his/her name.

Hunters that wish to hunt on Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs) are urged to check the area-specific regulations before going afield as season dates and bag limits on some WMAs may differ from the statewide framework. Hunters must also purchase a WMA User Permit prior to hunting on any WMA. 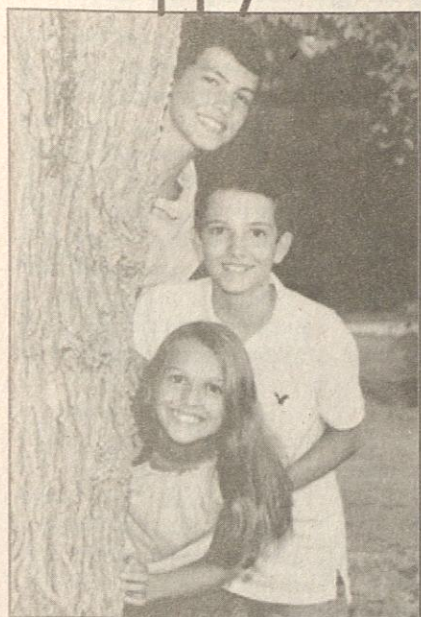

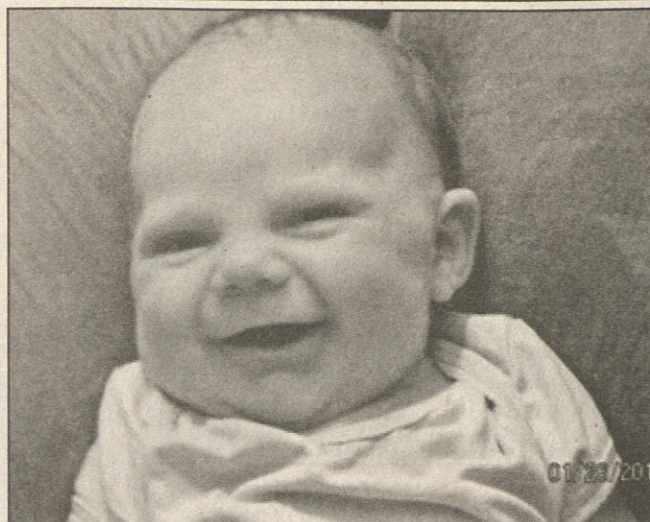
### Valentine Party Enjoyed by Tishomingo Industries
