Jail Issues Top Agenda at County Board Meeting

At the regular first Monday meeting of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors, Sheriff Glenn Whitlock received authority to hire three additional jailors, and buy supplies to stock the "state inmate" portion of the new jail.

Last week, the new \$5 million jail was inspected by Ron Welch, a lawyer authorized by a state court order to do the required state inspection. According to Sheriff Whitlock, the state inmate area was approved to house 80 inmates, a few more than the number that has been referred to in the past. These are the non-violent offenders that the state is supposed to pay the county a daily fee of \$20 to house, and the money received from the state is supposed to pay for the jail, authorities say. They can also be used to do some county jobs, like garbage pickup, the board has said.

Whitlock to the board Monday, that after the successful inspection, all the prisoners were moved in, and all the offices, too.

But, to open the "state inmate" side, Whitlock says he needs to hire and train new personnel, and stock it, and he was looking for an assurance from the Board that they were going to fund that action, before he requested Mississippi Department of Corrections to send some inmates.

"We've gone this far, we need to go ahead and get them up here," said First District Supervisor Brandon Grissom. Grissom moved, and Third District Supervisor Danny Ryan seconded that they authorize the funding.

To deal with county budget issues, the Board has recently ordered cuts to county department budgets, and laid off personnel and reduced hours for others in the departments they directly control. So they said they would meet to decide later where the funding would come from.

Whitlock went on to say that there are some outbuildings and storage containers at the old jail site that still need to be moved, and the board said they would use their own equipment to help with that this week.

The Board discussed some options for what they would use the old jail for. In the meantime, they authorized Whitlock to cut out some of the metal beds and plumbing, so that the cell areas could be used to store old files that have to be maintained in a

secure location.

The Board has also authorized Whitlock to use some county-owned land near the landfill property to grow vegetables for prisoner consumption, and they would start preparing that area soon.

The Sheriff said that they have an auction scheduled for later this month to sell surplus vehicles, parts and guns.

The Sheriff's Department is also participating in a national "Take Back" day on April 28th, where citizens are urged to bring old or unused prescription drugs to a collection point, and then law enforcement will destroy them properly.

Tishomingo County Emergency Manager Bill Strickland met with the board to give them the TVA emergency action plan for Bear Creek and Pickwick Lake, in the event of a dam failure. They authorized him to attend the County Emergency Management Program training conference in New Albany. Strickland also requested the board reconsider their decision to park his EMA vehicle at the courthouse, instead of Strickland parking it at his residence during off hours and weekends. In the six weeks it has been parked, Strickland said, he has been called out for emergencies every weekend. Twice he didn't go since he would have had to drive twice as far to go to the courthouse to get it, and then drive to the response site, and once he responded in his personal vehicle, he said. Additionally, since it isn't being driven regularly, it doesn't start reliably, despite a new battery being installed in December. The Board said they had other "personnel" issues to discuss during executive session, and would talk about the decision.

The Board approved travel for Pam Rogers in the tax assessor's office to attend floodplain management courses at no additional travel expense. On March 5th, they approved Tax Assessor Diana Turner as the new floodplain manager. She took over for Hannah Hamm, who resigned from her positions as floodplain manager, and in the assessor's office.

The Board tabled a request for \$50,000 county funding for the tuition assistance program from Northeast Mississippi Planning and Development agency. The board had budgeted for \$25,000 for fiscal 2011-12, and has already paid it. The previous year, \$50,000 was budgeted, but not all of that

was used, so they only budgeted \$25,000 for 2011-12, explained Purchasing Clerk Lynn West.

The Board approved the appointment of Richard Pharr, of Tishomingo, as the new Veteran's Service officer for the county. Pharr will work starting the 15th, the board said, and will work with Donnie Williams through May, until Williams' retirement.

The Board approved John White and Nancy Dexter travel expenses for mandatory training.

Iuka Baseball League has asked the board to use the fairgrounds building when they host the 11-12 year old state tournament, and the board said it should be ok, but would make sure insurance requirements would be met.

County Extension Agent Danny Owen asked the Board to consider letting the farmer's market use the grassy area beside Wal-Mart, near the old jail, for the Iuka Farmer's Market, since "most people seem to come to that area instead of downtown," where they currently hold the farmer's market. The Board said it would discuss the issue.

The Board said that a resolution to ask the Mississippi State Legislature for a local-and-private bill to allow a 2 percent tourism tax at county restaurants and hotels be put on the November ballot was not approved, and that they had been requested to reduce the

Phifer, an insurance salesman in his "other life," has won the People's Choice award for his

fine chili for the past three years, and will surely be a favorite to win again this year. His team includes his lovely wife, Nan, and Jeff and Beverly Butler, and Jeff will be the "front man" again this year, pulling in browsing visitors to taste the Chili Bandit offerings. There are at least 17 entrants in the People's Choice division.

Chili Cook-off visitors can enjoy tasting all the chili recipes for a fee of \$2, and then they can vote for their favorite.

The Chili Bandit still faces the challenge of the judged category, though, as Kenny explained Monday. He's never placed lower than third place with the judges, but he's looking to improve his record in the judged category. The judged winners win cash prizes!

Registration for the Corinth Crossroads Chili Cook-off continues until 9 a.m. Saturday.

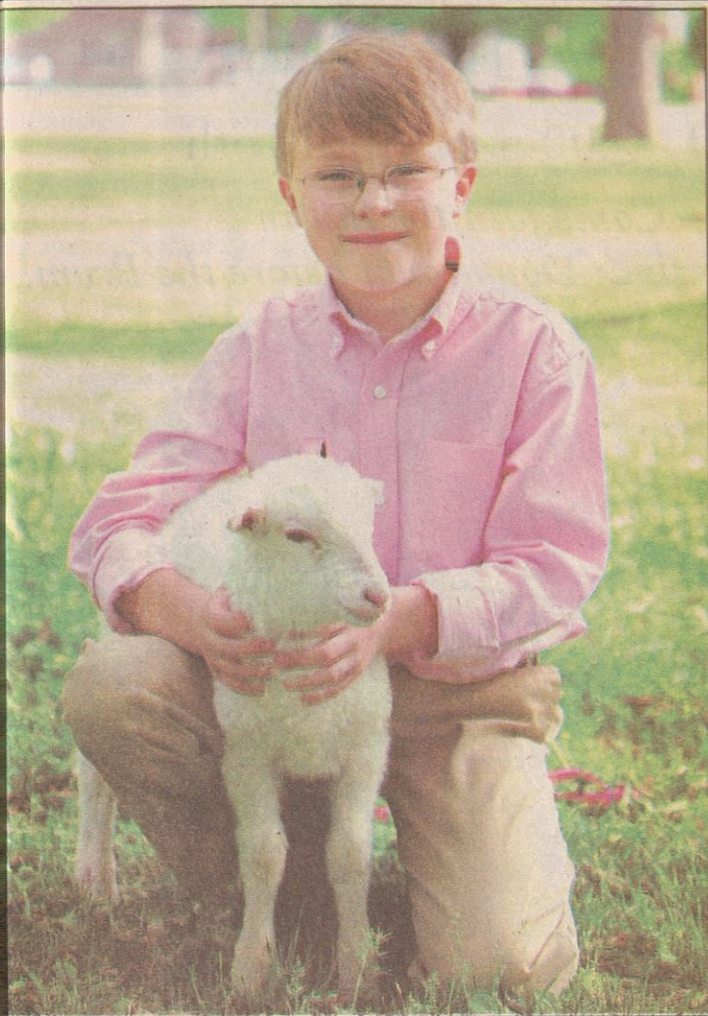

County Helps Neighboring Agencies Nabbing 130 on Drug Charges

Monday, officers with the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, Itawamba County Sheriff's Department, Belmont County Sheriff's Department and Golden Rule Department assisted Officers from Franklin County, Alabama in a drug round-up.

At the end of the day, the officers arrested approximately 130 subjects for controlled substance violations. There were approximately eight subjects from Mississippi arrested in the round-up. Three subjects are currently in custody in Tishomingo County pending extradition to Alabama. The three subjects in custody have drug related charges in

Tishomingo County pertaining to the sale or manufacture of methamphetamine.

Officers from the United States Marshall's Service, Franklin County Sheriff's Department, Russellville Police and Red Bay Police initiated the round-up. Sheriff Whitlock stated that the operation was a great success for not only the citizens of Franklin County, but also to the citizens of Tishomingo County. The state line does not stop people that sell or distribute controlled substances and when law enforcement works together, it makes the entire region safer for the citizens.

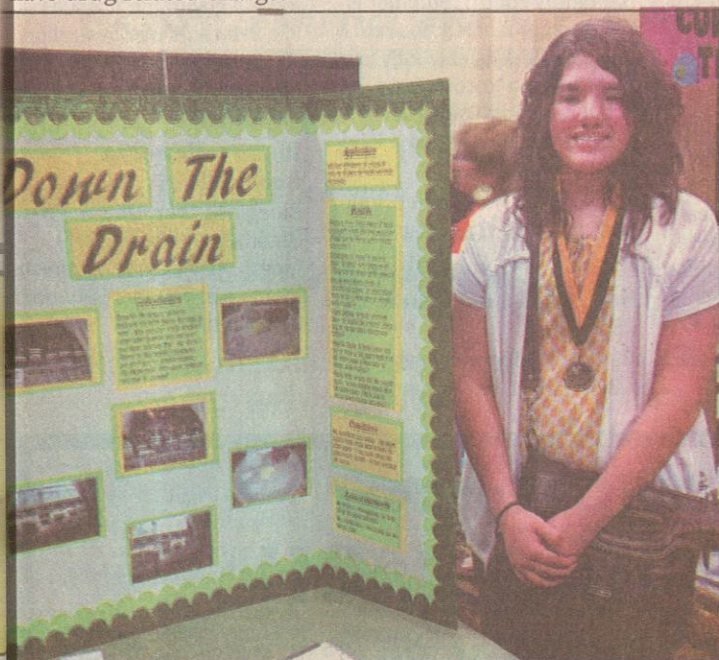

Tishomingo eighth grader Brandi Smith won first place with "Down the Drain" science project at the Mississippi State Science Fair in Biloxi last week.

Fifteen science students from Tishomingo County took their projects and tables down to Biloxi Monday to participate in the state contest. They qualified to go to State when they placed 1st at the Regional Fair at Northeast Mississippi Community College last week before.

Brandi was one of the young-

est students from the county to go to Biloxi. Her second place at the Regional qualified her, and at State, she won first place in the Chemistry-Class 3 division!

In her project, she tested which type of paper material would break down quickest - with practical applications for septic tanks or wastewater systems. (Paper napkins broke down quickest)

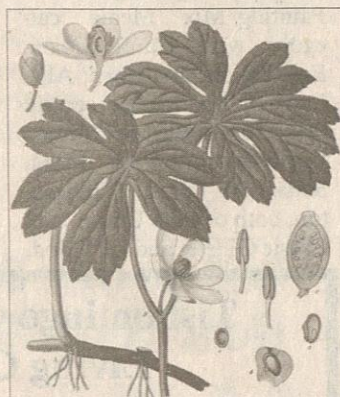
Conservation Corner

Mayapple

The mayapple is a herbaceous plant. It is found primarily in woodlands and partially shaded hillside seeps. This plant goes by several names including: duck's foot, Devil's apple, wild lemon, hog apple, love apple, Indian apple and umbrella plant.

Mayapple grows to between 1 and 2 feet in height. Some plants produce a single leaf from a long stalk. These plants do not produce a flower. Mayapple plants with two leaves produce a single nodding flower that blossoms below the leaves. The plant typically bears lobed leaves that span up to 1 foot across and 1 foot in length. There are between 5 and 9 lobes per leaf that are deeply divided. The flower that is produced is about 1.5 inches across and has between 6 and 9 white petals. The blooming period occurs from mid- to late spring and lasts about 3 weeks. Each flower is replaced by an egg-shaped berry that resembles a lime, is fleshy and contains several seeds. Two inches long and yellow when ripe, this berry is produced



only when cross-pollination of the flower occurs. Mayapple often produces dense vegetative colonies that exclude other spring flowering plants.

All parts of the plant, except the fruit, are poisonous. Even the fruit, though not dangerously poisonous, can cause unpleasant indigestion. Ancient records show that American ethnic groups drank a fermented preparation from the dehydrated and crushed rhizome of mayapple as a medication to cure worms in the intestines. They also used the substance as a remedy for snakebites and as a laxative to clean the bowel.

Later, mayapple was used as an ingredient for preparing a laxative and sold over the counter as a medicine called "Carter's Little Liver Pills." Today,

herbal practitioners use different parts of the mayapple to treat things such as warts or moles and have used them to combat some skin cancers.

According to researchers, podophyllotoxin, (the fatal ingredient of the herb), stops cell division and also possesses the ability to restrain tumor production. Of significant note, the Federal Drug Administration (FDA) has approved two drugs – etoposide and teniposide – prepared from podophyllotoxin for use in the United States.

Etoposide is administered as a treatment for testicular and small-cell lung cancers and rheumatoid arthritis. Teniposide is used for conditions including brain tumors, infancy leukemia, a variety of lymphomas and other neoplastic diseases. However, the FDA has banned the use of mayapple as a laxative due to the highly toxic nature of the plant which makes dosing difficult to calculate.

Podophyllotoxin is too toxic for home use due to its caustic nature and products for oral use have been withdrawn from the market for safety. Topical preparations of podophyllotoxin require professional application and must be rinsed off after 1 to 4 hours. Because human poisoning can result from topical application, as well as ingestion, it is important that you be able to identify this plant in order to avoid contact.

Why Were Our Schools Different Years Ago?

I finished high school in May of 1961, and that has been a few years ago! I attended the same school for twelve years (we had no kindergarten in those days). I cannot remember any time after the first grade that I did not have a pocket knife on me when I went to school. By the 7th grade, many of us were trading knives on a regular basis. I remember one time, when I was in the 7th grade, that I went to school with 9 knives 7 in my pockets and 2 in scabbards on my sides.

That would probably earn one 20 years in prison today. No, I am not advocating that we send kids to school with knives today, nor with guns, for that would not work in our day. My question is: what has made things so different in our schools? I never saw a policeman on our school campus in 12 years; I never knew of anyone having been cut with a knife. Nobody ever assaulted a teacher. My last principal, from my grades 9 through 12, was Mr. W. D. Kirk. He stood a good 6 feet 4 inches and had a good frame to go with his height. He

knew how to swing a paddle, yet he was always a very kind and considerate man. Even our bus driver had a paddle under his seat, and every classroom teacher had one and knew how to use it.

I doubt that the paddles were the biggest thing that made the difference, so what was it? Perhaps it was the devotional time every morning in our homeroom classes, or maybe the teacher who asked: "How many of you attended Sunday School and church on Sunday? Maybe it was the literature teacher, who had us memorize the beatitudes of Matthew 5:1-11; the 23rd Psalm; I Corinthians 13 and a host of other passages. These were also good literature, as you should know. Why is it that Bibles are not allowed in schools today? We have dealt with the psychological hang-

ups of children professional counseling but maybe something to help.

Wherever I go, I will keep your word. With my heart have I sought you, O Lord. O let me not wander from your commandments. Thy Word have I hidden in my heart, that I may not sin against you. Could it be that the children and time-tested virtues of the Bible are no longer valid today? Maybe that's the thing that God commanded in the Bible. There are several levels of what Dr. Spock has in his? Perhaps it's for America to smell the dirt and maybe our parents' grandparents were a little dumb after all!

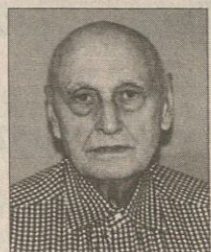
Trudy Reid
