Authorities are investigating cause of a May 10th fire that troved a home north of Iuka. The owners, Robert and Ta-Locke, were out of town en firefighters arrived at 2770 Highway 25 about 1:30 in morning last Thursday. They und it fully involved, with mes out the roof, said Harmo-Central Volunteer Fire Departent Chief Tommy Bonds.

Iuka Police had spotted the noke and reported it, and Harony Central was assisted by ka and Coleman Park voluners. Fire fighters worked to try id locate anyone in the home on arrival, said Bonds, since ere were two cars in the garage. ter they were told the owners ere out of town, the fire fighters anaged to get a car and truck It of the garage, but were unable

to rescue the structure.

The cause of the fire is still under investigation, according to Tishomingo County Fire Investigator Jesse Jones.

Other Fires

April 30th, at 11:30, Iuka firemen responded to a fire at the home of Misty and Jeremy Glidewell on Cross Creek Lane.

An insurance inspector surveying some property in the area for damage from recent hailstorms noticed smoke coming from a bedroom window, said Iuka Fire Chief Brian Grissom.

Firefighters managed to keep the fire damage to the stairwell, laundry room and a bedroom, but the rest of the home suffered smoke damage.

Grissom said the fire possibly started under a staircase, and might have been caused by a clogged dryer vent.

That same evening, Iuka Fire Department also responded to a house fire at 206 Rowena in Iuka

Apparently, said Grissom, the owners had cleaned out a storage unit, and were using one of the bedrooms for storage. They stacked stuff in front of a wall heater that came on. The house suffered much smoke damage and was uninhabitable, said Grissom.

'We try to tell people so often to take every precaution to avoid a house fire, like having your dryer vent cleaned out, and never, ever to put any furnishings or other items near wall heaters,' said Grissom. "Wall heaters must have the power actually disconnected from them, or be shut off at the breaker box, because some will come on automatically at certain temperatures.'

"I Did Not Know That There Were Anymore **Bootleggers Left In** Tishomingo County"???

In 1982, Colbert County, Alabama went wet. The reason that I know that it was the year of 1982 is because it made me mad when it went wet. I'had just stopped drinking in 1991 and I stayed sober for 13 years and 19 days. To the best of my knowledge, that is when the Tishomingo County bootleggers were put out of business. After that, it got so bad that the Moonshine Makers, which is known as wildcat whiskey, had to almost quit making it. There were a few of them around in the AL and MS hollers. When the legalized whiskey came, sugar got so high that a feller could buy that legal whiskey for the price that he could buy the illegal whiskey. What we always called it was ROT-GUT WHIS-KEY. The people that made Moonshine whiskey could not compete with the price of the legal whiskey. The whiskey makers and bootleggers tried to find work to support their family not just their habit, but a lot could not find any work. The majority of them have moved away from Tishomingo County to find work. The way it is now, there is hardly any work around this county. There were many more jobs back then than there are here now. At least we had a few paper-wood yards, sawmills, a shirt factory and a shoe factory. These were not the best of jobs in the world but at least you could afford to buy your wife and kid's food and groceries. Belmont, MS had about 7 to 10 factories in it. What do we have now? HARDLY ANYTHING. I was at the Tishomingo Courthouse on May 10, 2012 and a couple of people talked to me about this article that was in the Tishomingo County Newspaper. I do not personally know Mr. Roger D. Carter and the people I had a conversation with told me that he had not even lived in the Tishomingo County area in

Dying Man's Last Wish

His name is not important, not for this story. He was the Mayor of Paden. He was sick, he was dying, and he knew it.

We sat there in his room at the hospital, me and my cousin, Junior, who was also one of the Paden Alderman, and the Mayor's wife. We didn't have much to say, there wasn't much we could say. We had come to see him because we liked him and we knew how bad off he was. After a while she got up and left the room. It was just us, it was quiet.

It was a struggle for him to breathe much less talk, but he raised his hand and motioned for us to come to his bedside. We stood there beside him. "Boys," he said, "Boys," and coughed a couple of times and then just looked at us. It is sad to see someone dying, knowing there was nothing we could do for him. He had always been a healthy man, robust, a hunter, a fisherman, extremely active.

He wasn't from Paden, he had married a Paden girl, a cousin of mine. He had worked all of his life in Memphis and then retired down here.

He was of that old school. He was a gentleman and he had been a good mayor. He grew up during the time that men didn't share their secret habits openly, a time that women didn't

drink at all, or we SO thought, and men did their drinking down at the barn or at the smoke-

He said, "Boys, I'm not going to leave here," he coughed and struggled again trying to talk, "and there's something I need for ya'll to do for me."

At that time I had never been asked to honor a dying man's last request. I wondered if this was some legal matter, something to do with the Town or a personal matter he didn't want his wife to know about. He coughed. You could see the sadness in his eyes. He started again.

"In that cabinet by the garage door at the house is nearly a full fifth of whiskey. If she finds it she will pour every bit of it out."

"I want you boys to get it."

Looking back, I don't know if it meant that much to him or if it was the only thing that he could think of that he could do for us. We took it to my cousin Sue's house in Tupelo and told her to save it for Christmas.
