Nationally Known Country Radio Consultant Sammy "Rusty Walker" Darwin Dies

Nationally-known country radio consultant Sammy "Rusty Walker" Darwin, 59, died Monday after suffering a heart attack while bike riding with friends Saturday near Iuka.

The people of Iuka, as well as the country music world, are shocked at the sudden passing of an award-winning programmer, radio consultant, who was inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame in February. Darwin's company, Rusty Walker Programming, is one of the most influential in the entertaining industry, and he was named as Consultant of the Year by Billboard magazine seven of the eight years an award has been given. He was honored as one of three of Country Radio's Greatest Programmers of the Twentieth Century and also served as a Director-at-Large in the Country Music Association.

Here in Tishomingo County, Rusty Walker was better known as Sammy Darwin, husband, father, and recently grandfather. He was riding bikes, spending time at his family, spending time at his cabin on the lake, and generously contributing his time and resources to the community he loved.

It was during a fun day of bike riding with friends that Darwin suffered a heart attack. He and six others from his church's biking group were riding bikes near River Road on Saturday, when he complained of lightheadedness, and dropped. With a car on the way to pick him up, Darwin took some pain, and walked around a bit, saying that he felt better.

When the car arrived, friends tried to drive him to the hospital, but on the way, he lost consciousness, and they started administering CPR. By the time they got to Mt. Evergreen Church, they had an ambulance on the way. His friends continued to administer CPR, as they waited for the ambulance. At Iuka Hospital, they continued to try to revive him, but according to reports, he never regained consciousness. He was flown to Tupelo hospital, where they performed emergency surgery. On Monday morning he passed away surrounded by his family.

Disbelief swiftly traveled throughout the community as the news of Sammy's death spread. Early in March, his 17-year-old daughter, Kinsley, died suddenly after a short illness. She would have graduated from TCHS on Thursday evening.

Rusty Walker (Sammy) was a much-loved member of the radio community, with more than

40 years of broadcast experience, including time as a programmer, consultant and on-air personality. He launched his firm in 1983, and from little Iuka, Mississippi, it grew to be one of the most powerful consultants in country radio.

During his career, Sammy has either programmed, advised, created, consulted, overseen, served as a strategic partner, or performed as an air personality for more than 750 radio stations since he started his radio career in 1970. He turned pedestrian stations into sharp, award-winning country powerhouses. If they were already powerhouses, he took them and made them unstoppable community forces. There is little doubt that the majority of country radio listeners knew nothing of this man, but he certainly knew all about you and what you wanted to listen to.

Radio and music industry professionals are united in grieving the loss of such an important figure. Even Reba McEntire tweeted well-wishes to Walker before learning of his death.

On a personal level, Sammy was a charismatic and endearing presence who brought life and good stories from his hometown of Iuka with him wherever he went. He quietly brought many a famous Nashville name to Iuka, treating them to small town treats like the famous slug burgers at Ellie's Café (now Front Street Café). Those in the country music world who knew him said, "He made time for everyone—from the new guy in the building to the most seasoned programmer. He loved to brag on his daughters and was quick to share their wedding photos."

James Samuel Darwin died Monday, May 21st, 2012, at North Mississippi Medical Center, in Tupelo. He graduated from Corinth High School in 1971, worked as a radio broadcaster and married his sweetheart, Teresa Bryant of Iuka. The couple left Iuka to pursue Sammy's broadcasting career, but returned in the 80's to make Iuka their home, raise their family, and begin his programming business. He soon became an active and dedicated member of his community. He was an enthusiastic supporter of the Tishomingo County School System, and volunteered in many civic capacities, including serving as the regular emcee of the Iuka Christmas Parade and as a member of the Iuka Heritage Day Committee Board of Directors.

Sammy was an active member of Mt. Evergreen United Methodist Church, where he served in many key church positions. He was a Christian, who despite suffering heartbreak from the untimely death of two of his children, never lost faith in God and lived his life serving God and helping others.

Visitation is scheduled for 4 until 8 p.m., Friday, May 25th, at Mt. Evergreen United Methodist Church. Funeral services are scheduled for 1 p.m., Saturday, May 26th, at the Tishomingo County High School Gymnasium. The body will lie in state at the gymnasium from 11 a.m. until service time on Saturday. Services will be officiated by Rev. Robert Armstrong and Rev. Ron Norvell. Interment will follow in Oak Grove Cemetery. Cutshall Funeral Home of Iuka, is entrusted with

He is survived by his wife of 38 years, Teresa Darwin of Iuka; his father and mother-in-law, Jackie and Burnette Bryant of Iuka; two daughters, Nikki Darwin Clark and husband, Nathaniel, of Iuka, and Beth Darwin Huntley and husband, Ryan, of Jacksonville, FL; one brother, Harold Darwin and wife, Jeanette, of Corinth; one sister, Sarah Darwin of Iuka; two grandchildren, McCarthy Huntley and Alexander Clark; a sister-in-law, Lisa Locke and husband, Jerry, of Iuka; a brother-in-law, Keith Bryant of Iuka; and four nieces and nephews, Logan Locke, Carrie Darwin, David Darwin, and Elora Crabtree.

He was preceded in death by a son, Jay Darwin; a daughter,

Kinsley Darwin; and his parents, Jimmy and Mollie Darwin.

City of Iuka Petition Planned

THIS IS TO THE PEOPLE THAT LIVE WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF IUKA, MS OR ANYONE THAT IS REGISTERED TO VOTE ON A CITY ELECTION ONLY

I am going to do a petition drive, but I cannot do it until July 1, 2012. The state law prohibits me from doing this petition until that date. This will be the date that this new law takes effect on how you can hold city elections. There will be a petition drive for people to sign if they would like to see the city limits of Iuka legalized for the sale of alcohol. The petition that will be for the city limits of Iuka, MS are for the people that are registered in the city limits of Iuka, MS. Those are the only people that can sign it. It does not pertain to the county petition at all. If you live within the city limits of Iuka, MS or Tishomingo County and you are a legal registered voter of Tishomingo County, you are still able to sign the Tishomingo County petition to vote it wet. This is the petition for the county and only the county. The petition that will be for

the city of Iuka, MS, going wet, are the only people that are registered with the city hall of Iuka, MS that can sign it. Do not get confused and mix the two petitions up. The county petition is that if, anybody is a legal voter in the Tishomingo County can sign it. The only people that are registered at the Iuka City Hall are the only ones that can sign it for the city of Iuka election. On the petition for the city of Iuka, you must be a registered voter at the city hall. The city hall in Iuka, MS will be a petition for the city limits of Iuka, MS only. On the county petition, anyone in the Tishomingo County can sign it. Anyone that is not a registered voter at the Iuka City Hall cannot sign or vote on the Iuka City election. If there is anyone that would still like to sign the county petition, all you have to do is write to me. I will be glad to send you a copy of the petition to sign. My address is: Charles Aldridge at 1899 Indian Creek Rd., located in Iuka, MS. Do not forget that I cannot start the city petition until after July 1, 2012, that is a state law.

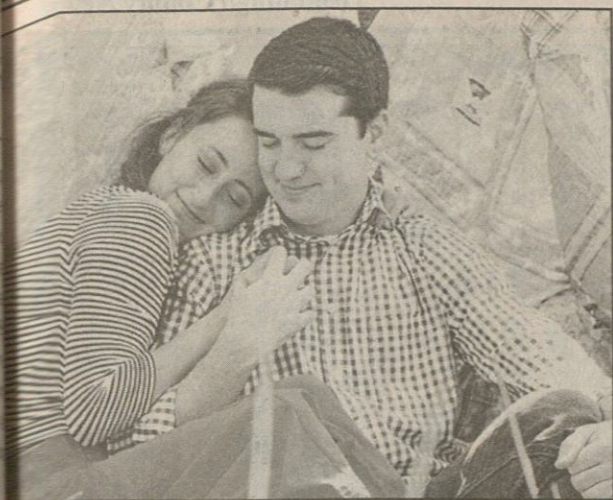

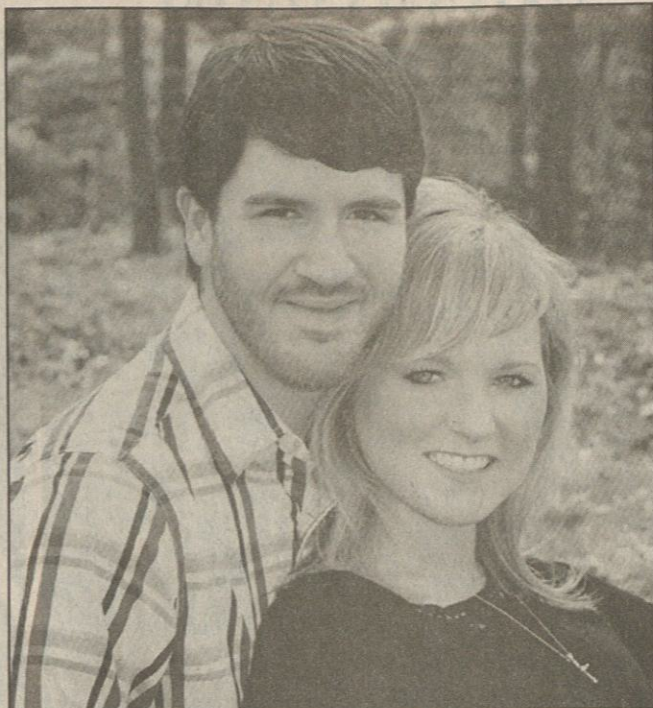

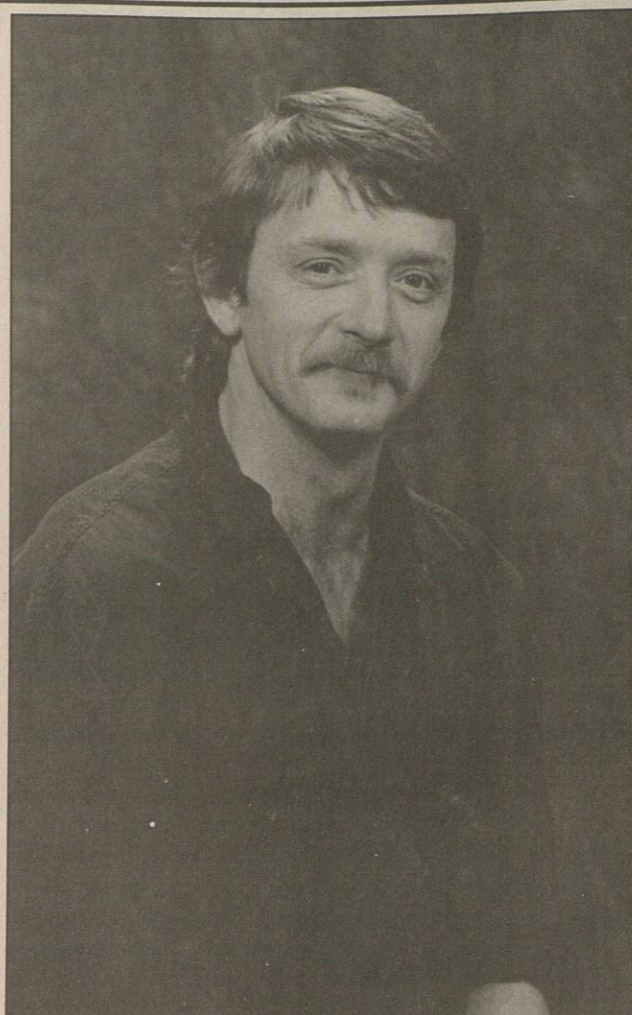


3rd Donation to Locks of Love

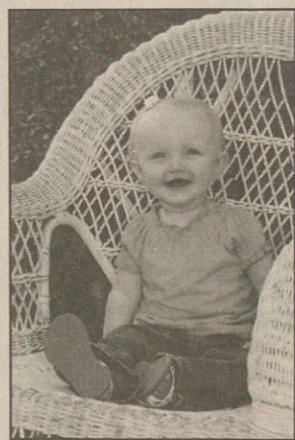
"Wait until you see it, they are all just perfect," said McRae, excited about her first theater experience outside of high school and church. "It is so funny!"

Local Spanish Students Score Well

Congratulations to several world language students from Tishomingo County High School who attained national recognition for excellent performance on the 2012 National Spanish Examinations. Each year students at TCHS are offered an opportunity to voluntarily take the National Spanish exam in order to see how they are doing in comparison to other Spanish students in the nation. In March, approximately 40 Spanish students in levels one and two took the two-part test, which rates abilities in grammar, vocabulary, listening and reading of Spanish. At the end of the test, the students received their raw scores which would be then compared with other students nationwide. At the end of the test, five students held the high scores for their respective class periods. Dallas Stricklen-1st period, Veronica Smith-5th period, Kelsey Davidson-2nd period/Spanish 2, Carolyn Davidson-3rd period, and Mayuka Nix-4th period. When the scores were returned at the end of April, students Dallas Stricklen and Veronica Smith earned honorable mentions. An honorable mention is a score of 50 or above. "Attaining a medal or honorable mention for any student on the National Spanish Examinations is very prestigious," said Kevin Cessna-Buscemi, National Director of the

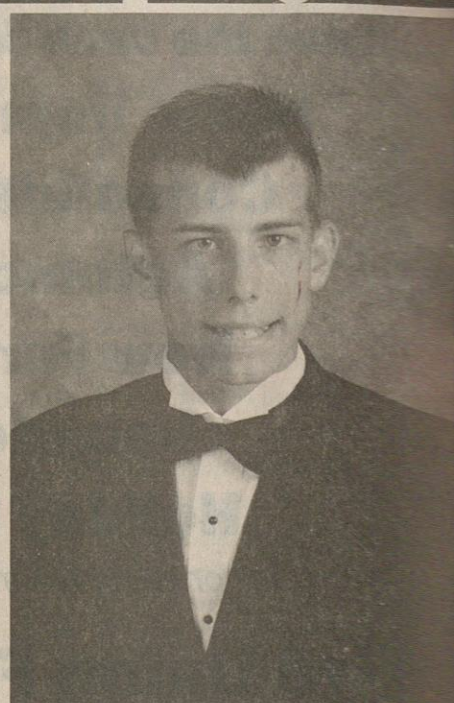
The Senior Class of 2012 held its Awards Ceremony this past Sunday, May 20th, in the John B. Moore Auditorium. Many

Farmers Market in Iuka Opening Next to Walmart on June 1st

The value of fresh, homegrown produce has become more apparent the last few years because

If it is locally grown, it is reasonably safe and healthy. We hope this new location will spur more interest in locally grown produce. We need PRODUCERS—the more the better. If there is no one there to sell then people won't come and vice-versa. If you plan to have a garden, large or small, and you would like to make a little extra money, this market is for you. If you have ques-

1. Operation of the Iuka Farmers Market will be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. 6 days a week- Mon-Sat. NO SALES BEFORE 7:00 A.M. Failure to comply will constitute forfeiture of permit.

2. Permit with photo Id is required and can be attained at the Farm Bureau Office in Iuka during office hours Mon-Fri. at NO CHARGE. There may be a fee to replace a lost permit.

3. Produce, flowers,

or arts & crafts sold at the Market must be produced at the vendor's home or farm in Tishomingo County or an adjacent county. No items will be allowed to be resold after purchase from another venue.

4. Vendors must display Permit in clear view of customers and inspectors.

5. Produce should not be sold by weight UNLESS the vendor has scales certified by the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce. Produce must be sold under health department guidelines.

6. Prices are con-

trolled by the individual vendor.

7. The vendor is responsible for keeping his/her area clean. Littering will constitute forfeiture of permit.

8. No profanity or alcoholic beverages will be allowed. This will constitute forfeiture of permit.

9. Vendors must provide their own tent or canopy for shade if desired. NO LARGER THAN 12'X12'.

10. Locations inside market will be first come-first serve.

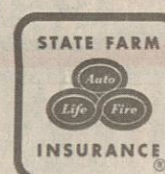

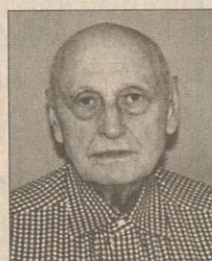

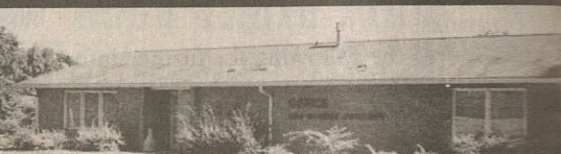

The Board of Supervisors acting for and on behalf of Tishomingo County, Mississippi took up for consideration the matter of authorizing and approving a loan on behalf of the County from the Mississippi Development Authority (the "Department") for the purpose of completing capital improvements identified as:

PUBLIC BUILDING INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS
RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Governing Body of Tishomingo County does hereby declare its intention to enter into a loan agreement with the Department in the principal amount not to exceed Two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) for the purpose of completing the capital improvements identified above.

Section 2. The Loan will be secured by a Note executed and delivered by the County to the Department. Failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due until such time as the indebtedness has been discharged or arrangements to discharge such indebtedness satisfactory to the Department have been made.

Section 3. The Governing Body proposes to authorize and approve the Loan from the Department in the amount and for the aforesaid purposes at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at its regular meeting place at the Tishomingo County Board room in Iuka, Mississippi at 10:00 a.m. on the 4th day of June 2012, or at some meeting held subsequent thereto. This date assigned to authorize and approve the aforementioned loan documents has been set to meet program requirements which mandate that four public notices be issued prior to loan closing. This will allow sufficient time for public comments.

The motion having received the foregoing vote of the Governing Body, the President declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted, on this the 7th day of May, 2012.

What Is the Significance of "Pomp and Circumstance"?

The famous tune, created by Sir Edward Elgar, became a graduation ceremony mainstay in 1905 at Yale University. It was there that Elgar received an honorary degree from his friend, music professor Samuel Sanford. At Sanford's request, the ceremony paid homage to Elgar's various works, and "Pomp and Circumstance" played as the graduates filed out of the auditorium. Other schools, such as Princeton and Columbia, adopted the song and made it part of their own ceremonies, and before long the majority of schools used it as the official processional graduation song.

What Is the Meaning of the Cap and Gown?

The cap and gown are traditional elements most commonly associated with graduation. Plenty of background information exists on these two pieces, not surprising considering their origins date back centuries. In the 1300s, scholars and clerics at European universities would wear long robes to stay warm and comfortable in the largely unheated buildings. The practice became so common that, eventually, the robes and gowns were recognized as "official" attire, with little to no room allowed for leeway.

The mortarboard cap is a structured headpiece with a flat top and fitted bottom. Its origins date back centuries as well, to the time when clergymen would wear them as protective head coverings and they were ideal for staying warm in cold temperatures. As with the gown, the cap eventually became official graduation attire. Interestingly, the cap also came to symbolize learned individuals, such as doctors and teachers, and was worn

frequently across varying professional industries.

Science Competition at Northeast Community College; 3rd overall team at the 2011 University of MS Engineering Competition; scored in the top 2 percent in math and top 10 percent in physics at the 2012 Mississippi College Math and Science Competition, and participated in the Appalachian Regional Commission/Oak Ridge National Laboratory 2011 Summer High School Math/Science Institute.

Luke has placed 1st place at local level, and 1st place at regional level science and engineering fairs all four years, each year.
