New Iuka Farmers' Market Opens Friday

The new Iuka Farmers' Market will open for the first time this year this Friday, giving local farmers a place to sell their fresh fruit, vegetables, and other items near one of the busiest places in town, beside Walmart.

Hoping that the new location, between the Old Jail and Walmart, will improve visibility and traffic for the market, organizers plan to be open every day but Sunday, according to MSU Extension Service Agent Danny Owen. Right now, the market is scheduled to be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

A committee of some local producers, some Farm Bureau

folks, and the Extension Service got together to set some guidelines for the new market's operation.

"This is what we've come up with right now, we'll see how it works," said Owen.

County crews cleared off the grassy area with their equipment.

One of the vendors who plans to offer fresh blackberries and other items throughout the season is Richard Starkey. He opened his you-pick blackberry patch last week and had dozens of pickers come from the local area, and from a few other states - they were visiting Tishomingo State Park and saw the signs

advertising the blackberries at Starkey's place, in Dennis.

All the produce and goods sold at the market must be grown or made in Tishomingo County, or in an adjacent county, and the market opens at 7 a.m. for farmers/vendors to come set up. Produce should be available to purchase shortly after vendors get set up.

There is no charge for vendors at the market, but they must have a permit, which they can get for no charge at the Farm Bureau office, where they can get a complete set of the new guidelines.

Arrests Made in Burglary and Arson of Locke Home in Iuka

Three people are charged in the May 10th burglary and arson of the Locke home in Iuka.

According to Deputy Jeff Palmer of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, Zeaf Clark, 20, and Mary Elizabeth McKee, 28, both of Iuka, and Robert Shane Parker, 39, of Alcorn County, have been charged with burglary of a dwelling and arson in connection with the destruction by fire of the Robert and

Tacey Locke home.

The Tishomingo County Fire Investigator and sheriff's deputies investigated, assisted by the Corinth Police and Alcorn County Sheriff, and they were able to recover, from an Alcorn County location, multiple televisions and firearms that were alleged stolen from the Locke home, said Palmer.

Parker was already out on a felony bond from Alcorn County, said Palmer.

U.S. Marshals Check County Sex Offenders for Compliance

Only two persons required to register as sex offenders were not where they were supposed to be Tuesday, according to Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock. Tishomingo County hosted about a dozen U. S. Marshals who came to help verify compliance requirements of sex offenders in the county.

According to Richard Upchurch, of the U.S. Marshal's north Mississippi division, 32 persons in Tishomingo County are required by court order to register as sex offenders. Usually, he said, when they do these compliance checks, about one in five or six are not where they are supposed to be, but in Tishomingo County, only two of those checked on Tuesday were not available.

Arrests of the two who were not available Tuesday are expected in the near future, said investigator Jeff Palmer.

Tuesday, the new federally-appointed U.S. Marshal for the Northern District of Mississippi, Dennis Irby, was along for the Tishomingo County visit.

The marshals have randomly checked several counties in north Mississippi since January.

The compliance checks are simple checks of the registered person at the residence they have on record. If they are home, they sign a form. If the person is not at home, they ask neighbors about the person who is supposed to live there.

"The Marshal's office is great, they come in and help with larger operations, and ones like these," said Sheriff Glenn Whitlock. "We really like it when they come, they are good law enforcement partners."

There are about 7,000 registered sex offenders in Mississippi.

June 4th - Last Date To Qualify For County Election Commissioner

The position for Tishomingo County Election Commissioner will be on the November 6th General Election ballot. There is an Election Commissioner for each supervisor's district in the county. The qualifying deadline to run for these offices will be Monday, June 4th at 5 p.m.

People interested in these positions must complete the following steps to be eligible to seek this office:

1. Must live in supervisor's district that they are seeking election;
2. Must get 50 registered voters in the district in which they live to sign a petition for them to become a candidate;
3. Must bring Petition with 50 signatures to the Circuit Clerk's Office for signatures to be certified that they are registered voters in that particular district;
4. Must file Statement of Intent along with certified petition of names with Chancery Clerk's

Office by 5 p.m. on Monday, June 4, 2012, which is the last date to qualify for office;

5. Once papers are filed, must file Campaign Finance Reports in accordance with State Law with the Circuit Clerk's office by 5 p.m. on date due;

6. After election is over, must file a termination report for Campaign Finance with the Circuit Clerk's office.

All necessary forms, the Petition, Statement of Intent, and Campaign Finance Reports, may be picked up at the Circuit Clerk's office.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors must rule on Election Commission Candidate qualifications. Names of qualified candidates will be released after the Board has ruled on all candidates.

There will be a runoff election, if required, on November 27th, which is three weeks later.

Iuka Man May Face Destruction of Government Property Charges After Larceny at Segars Field

An Iuka man faces grand larceny charges and will face charges destroying government property after an incident late Saturday early Sunday.

According to the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, Zachary Puckett, 25, of Iuka, allegedly stole a 1996 Jeep Cherokee from the Sunset Lodge Iuka sometime late Saturday night, and apparently wrecked it at the airport.

Officers responding to a 5:05 a.m. ambulance call regarding someone intoxicated and injured at a residence on County Road 201 (near Segars Field/Iuka Airport) noticed a Jeep Cherokee

had apparently flipped through the airport fence, taking down nearly 100 feet of fence. Puckett already had an outstanding warrant for failure to appear on a driving-without-a-license charge, so he was arrested at the home, and then taken to the Iuka Hospital for treatment of minor injuries, said deputy Jamie Reynolds.

While Puckett was at the hospital, county officers investigated the apparent wreck at the airport, and noticed the 22-foot automatic rolling gate had been driven through, and several pieces of a vehicle were scattered around. Officers matched the debris to a Pace Arrow motor home they had seen parked at the residence

on County Road 201.

The recreational vehicle/motor home was owned by Dale Edmondson, who was keeping at the airport.

Puckett is still in custody with the Tishomingo County Jail, and Hardin County authorities have also questioned him about a vehicle theft at the paper mill in Tennessee.

According to airport engineers, the gate alone is valued at \$12,000, and the fence will have to be replaced at a cost of at least \$6 a foot.

Ironically, the gate was an automatic one that opens from the inside when a vehicle rolls up to it.

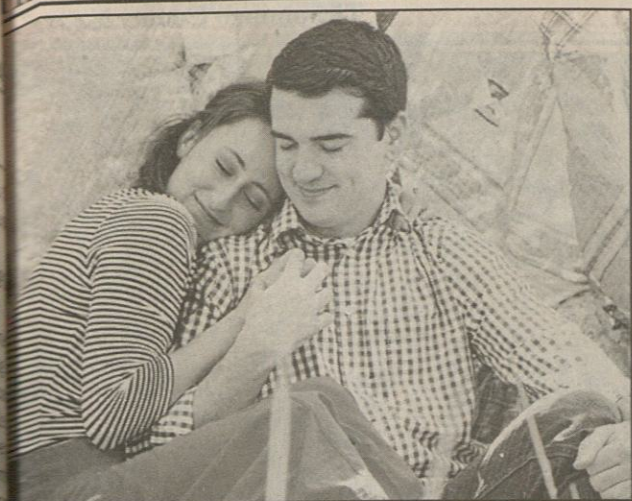

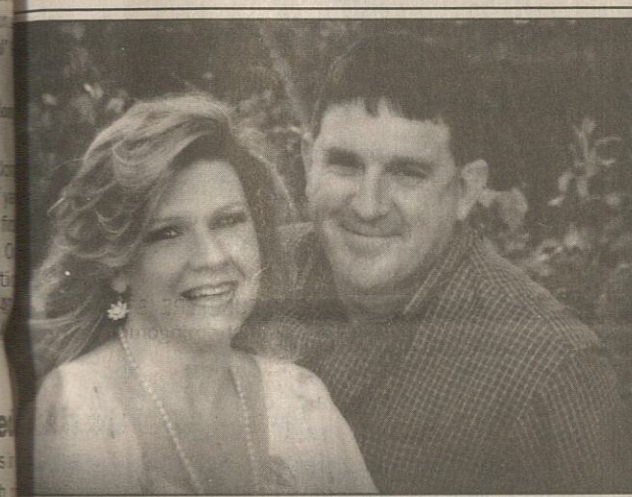

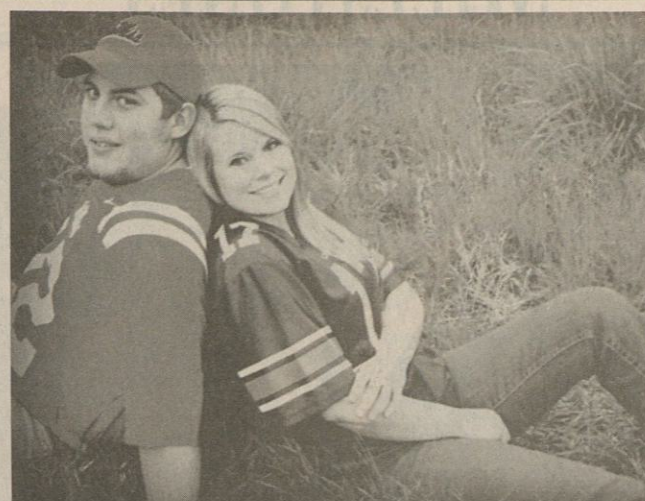

If You Don't Read This You Will Miss The Point

I do not know what it will take to get the people of Tishomingo County to understand how much tax dollars that we are losing everyday to other counties and other states. I did not personally talk to the business owners that are across the state lines but I had another person to talk to them. I had them to ask the store-owners what they thought about Tishomingo County going wet for alcohol. They said that it would close our businesses down. The majority of our customers are coming from Tishomingo County. The stores across the Alabama state line and the Tennessee state line said if it were not for the Tishomingo County customers, they would have to close their doors. I also sent this person to Baldwin, MS and asked the store-owners what they thought about if the city of Corinth voted whiskey wet back in and if the county of Tishomingo goes wet. They said they would lose over half or more in tax revenue if that happened. They said if the city of Corinth went wet for whiskey again that they would lose big money in tax dollars off of Alcorn County in the whiskey sales alone. They also said they would lose a lot of business from Booneville. They said that the people that were from Booneville that were coming over there instead of coming to Baldwin to buy their liquor they would go to Corinth and get it. Baldwin does not have very many shopping stores so most of the people from Booneville will be going to Corinth. They also said if Tishomingo County went wet for beer, whiskey, and wine they would really lose a lot of customers. They said that about 40% of their customers came from around the Belmont area. People, I do not know any other way to explain this. All of you folks that say this is a dry county all of the businesses across the Alabama line, Tennessee line, and all of the counties like Baldwin, MS have plainly said Tishomingo County is one of their biggest customers. Why do you people want to sit back and keep giving them thousands and thousands of dollars a year in tax revenue money to where their counties and states can keep on growing and having better businesses, roads, and other better things than Tishomingo County has got. Look at the job opportunities that there are in those other places. Look at what we got in Tishomingo County. Alcohol is all around us. People are going to drink it whether other people like it or not. The only way that this could be stopped is if the federal government outlaws it all over the whole world and that isn't going to happen. The reason that it is never going to happen is because the government and the states are making too much money off it. Without those tax dollars coming in these folks wouldn't have high paying jobs. Do you think these folks are going to let that happen? No. It is time that Tishomingo County stops trying to live back in the 1950's. It is time that the people of Tishomingo County wake up, and realize that this is the year of 2012 and quit trying to live as if we are 40 or 50 years behind time. If anyone out there thinks what I have said in this letter is not the truth I would love for you to write me a letter and post it in the Tishomingo County Newspaper in the "Letter to the Editor" and explain to me where I did not tell the truth at. I look forward to hearing from ya'll. I turned in 37 more signatures to the courthouse last week. Before I turned them in, I needed 422 more. This is to the people that would like to see this go to a vote. Take this petition that is in the paper right here and see if you can get more people to sign it. It is very hard for me to get to everybody in Tishomingo County. If you are for this petition, I need your help with this. There are many people that do not get a newspaper. I run up on elder people from time to time and they have told me that they had been trying to get a petition to where they can sign it. I you know any elder people that do not get out and stir around a lot please ask them if they would like to sign it or ask anyone else if they would like to sign it. I have been at this over two and a half years and I really need some help with it now. If 400 people will get just one more person to sign this then I will have enough to do it with. If I can get these signatures by the last of August then we can put this on the general election. That would save Tishomingo County around \$20,000 dollars by not having to do a special election. I know some people out there think that this will make Tishomingo County worse than what it already is if it goes wet. The only difference that it will be in this county will be that we will be collecting tax dollars off it. These other counties and states have already verified that there is plenty of alcohol being brought into Tishomingo County. I did not see this and don't know for it to be 100% true but I was told this past weekend, Memorial Day weekend, that the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department on Friday confiscated about 160 cases of beer. This is not counting the whiskey, but Tishomingo County is a dry county. People, being as it is a proven fact that it is already in this county why don't we get the tax sales off of it instead of just getting it and the garbage and no money? Last Friday I sat up on Hwy. 25 going towards TN and collected some signatures. I got to counting the Tishomingo County car tags as they went by and I counted 1,961 tags in a three-hour period. I do not know what they went over there for but they were not gone very long. This tells me that TN is getting many tax dollars off Tishomingo County. I checked with the Tishomingo County Courthouse on Tuesday, May 29th, as of now, we only need 324 more signatures.

Paul's Athletic Activity

I Corinthians 9:24-27 says, "Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain. And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible. I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air; But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway."

Paul was not necessarily an athlete in the sense that we may use that term today, but he was an athlete in keeping his body under subjection to his spirit, as well as to God's Spirit. Notice that all do not receive the prize in athletic events, neither do all receive the prize in spiritual "athletic efforts". Paul is not speaking about salvation here, rather, he is speaking about service that brings glory to God and souls to salvation by preaching the gospel, accompanied by godly living. The athletes in physical feats seek to obtain a crown that will fade away, a wreath of flowers in Paul's day, but the good apostle was seeking to obtain an incorruptible crown from God.

Paul's efforts to keep his body under subjection was more than shadow boxing; it was a real battle against the lust of the flesh; the lust of the eyes and the pride of life. The apostle was aware that his preaching of the gospel was not a guarantee that he would not be rejected from service, should he fail to discipline himself concerning the physical body. This may seem strange to some people, but our physical bodies are a part of the equipment needed to carry the message of the cross of Christ. If we misuse the body, or if we allow its desires to get in our way, we will not get the job done for God that He has assigned us! The word "cast-away" in our verses does not indicate a loss of salvation but a rejection from service. Those who have been chosen of God for His service should have a healthy fear of being put out of that service by disobedience and lack of discipline!
