Storms Cause Power Outages for 2,500 Customers

About 2,500 power customers in the county were without power the height of severe thunderstorms late Sunday night through Monday morning.

According to Tishomingo County Electric Power Association manager Robert Grisham, power crews worked from 11:30 Sunday until about 3 o'clock Monday restoring power outages in one end of the county to the other.

The outages were caused by wind-blown trees falling on lines, which caused poles to break in some cases. The storms were caused by two fronts that came through the county, explained Grisham. One storm, with wind gusts high enough to blow a metal roof off a home near Turnpike Mountain, was about 11:30 Sunday night, and another fierce lightning storm hit the county about 4:30 Monday morning.

Iuka Man Arrested on Heroin Charges in Alcorn County

An Iuka man was arrested Monday night for possession of heroin by the Alcorn County Narcotics Unit.

According to reports from the unit, and the coroner, Jonathan Fredrick, 24, of Iuka, was apparently driving from Memphis with his father, Greg Frederick, 51, in the car when the elder Frederick started having some kind of medical trouble.

Someone, possibly a passer-by, called 911, and Greg Frederick was taken from the scene on County Road 611 on the Alcorn-Tippah county line by ambulance to Magnolia Hospital in Corinth,

Commemorative Ornaments Pay Tribute to 150th Anniversary of Battle of Iuka

The Iuka United Methodist Women's organization is offering ornaments this year in honor of the 150th anniversary of the battle of Iuka that the city will be celebrating this year.

Annually, the IUMW design and sell a commemorative ornament featuring a historic feature about Iuka or the county. This year there is a special Battle of Iuka sesquicentennial ornament, one featuring Twin Magnolia, now the home of Neil and Davis of Iuka.

Twin Magnolias, referred to as the Coman House in some places, was the home of Major J. Coman, who was an early settler and one of the county's first elected officials. The house was moved from Eastport, as were many in those early days of settlement. It was in this house that the flag of Company K Second Mississippi under command of Captain Stone, later governor of the state, was made. In this home was instituted the first nursing association of the town under direction of Mrs. Elizabeth Coman, where the women of the town made first aid kits and bandages for the Confederate soldiers.

After the Battle of Iuka, when the home in the town was open to the wounded and dying of both sides, many were brought to the house and all the beds were turned over to the wounded. General Henry Little, of Maryland, used it as his headquarters, and when he was killed at the beginning of the battle, he was buried in the flower garden until after the



The Battle of Iuka ornament is offered this year in recognition of the sesquicentennial anniversary.

The Battle of Iuka ornament honors the historic Civil War skirmish in September of 1862. Iuka, under the leadership of the Battle-field Commission, and the Heritage Day committee will present a historic remembrance of the events surrounding the battle, including reenactments of the skirmish itself, over the Labor Day weekend later this year.

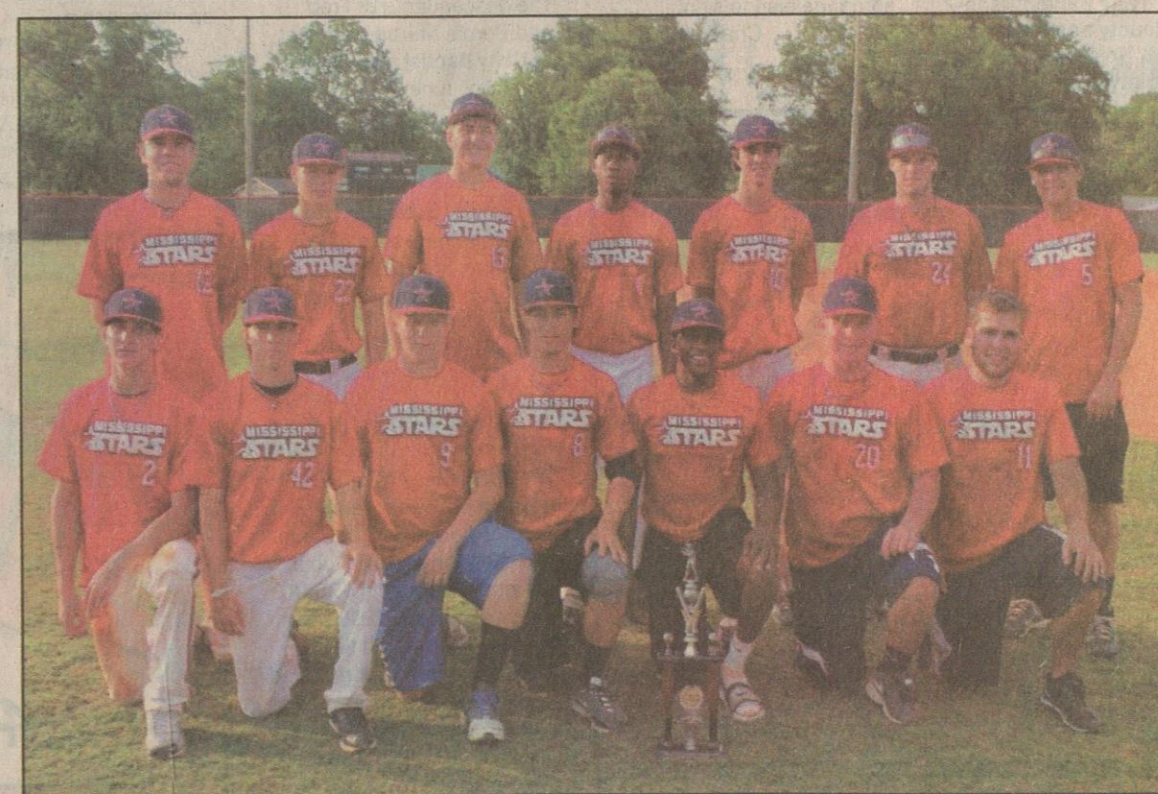

where he was pronounced dead.

Alcorn County Sheriff's Department personnel who responded to the medical call found four bundles of heroin in a cigarette pack along with other paraphernalia for injecting the drug, according to the Alcorn County narcotics investigator.

Jonathan was charged with possession of narcotics and bonded out of the Alcorn County jail on a

\$10,000 bond.

Toxicology tests are pending and the incident is still under investigation, said investigators with the Alcorn County Sheriff's Department. Initial investigation indicated cause of death of Greg Frederick to be cardiac pulmonary arrest, but an actual ruling will be made after toxicology results are received, said Jay Jones, Alcorn County Coroner.

Petition Only Needs about 300 Signatures!

On May 29th, I went to the Tishomingo County Courthouse to turn in about 39 more signatures. Thanks to everyone that has signed the petition to vote Tishomingo County wet the people that have signed the petition in the last three weeks have made a big drop in how many more signatures we need. Three weeks ago, we needed 424 more, now we need 322, so people, keep the good work up and we will get to go to the polls and vote on this.

Since I first submitted signatures at the courthouse for them to start counting, we have had 105 people that had already signed it that have either passed away or moved away. Either way, their names have been removed from the petition. The longer it takes for us to get this to the polls the more people we are going to lose. It also means that when it gets to a vote, we have definitely already lost 105 people that were going to vote "yes" for the county to be wet. It is critical that if you want to see this go to the polls and be successful, I must get 324 signatures by September 1st. I can put this on the presidential election and not cost the county another special election.

Even if I do a city election in the city of Iuka only, that does not mean that I will stop the county petition. I will continue with the county petition even if it takes another ten years, because I feel like everyone that lives in Tishomingo County should have the right to vote yes or no on this.

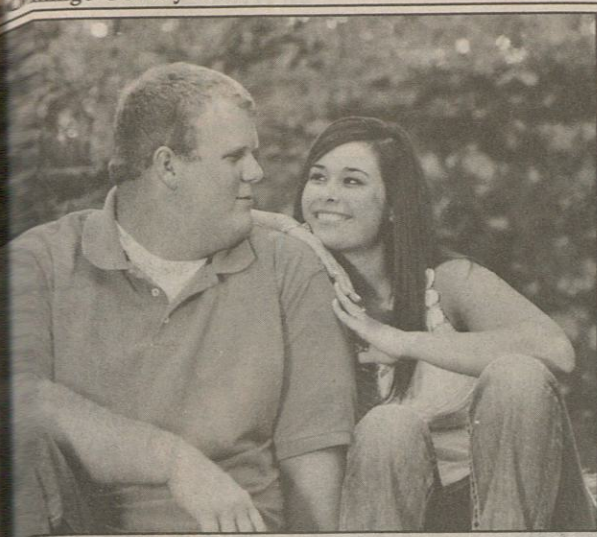

New Regulation Passes for Boat Creel Limit on Crappie for North Mississippi

JACKSON - In May, the Commission on Mississippi Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks passed Public Notice of Intent F-3818, which adopted a boat creel limit on crappie for Arkabutla, Sardis, Enid and Grenada Flood Control Reservoirs in North Mississippi.

The new regulation established a daily boat limit for boats with three or more licensed or exempt anglers. The limit will be 50 crappie larger than 12 inches per boat.

Crappie catch rates have been at an all time high on these lakes due to a large 2009 year class, but most of these crappie were just under 12 inches this spring. Influenced by an unusually warm, dry winter significant portions of keepers were harvested before the spring spawn.

"With the extreme low water this year, fish are being confined in these lakes. Crappie anglers and our biologists are concerned the

2009 year class will be harvested as soon as they reach 12 inches," says Fisheries Bureau Director Ron Garavelli.

Recent studies show crappie have exceptional growth rates. Most of the 2009 year class should reach legal size in 2-4 months. The intent of this new regulation is to slow the harvest of this important resource during the 2012 fall and winter seasons. The survivors of the 2009 year class will contribute to the 2013 spawn and harvest. Hopefully, water levels next year will be higher and the crappie will not be as vulnerable to harvest.

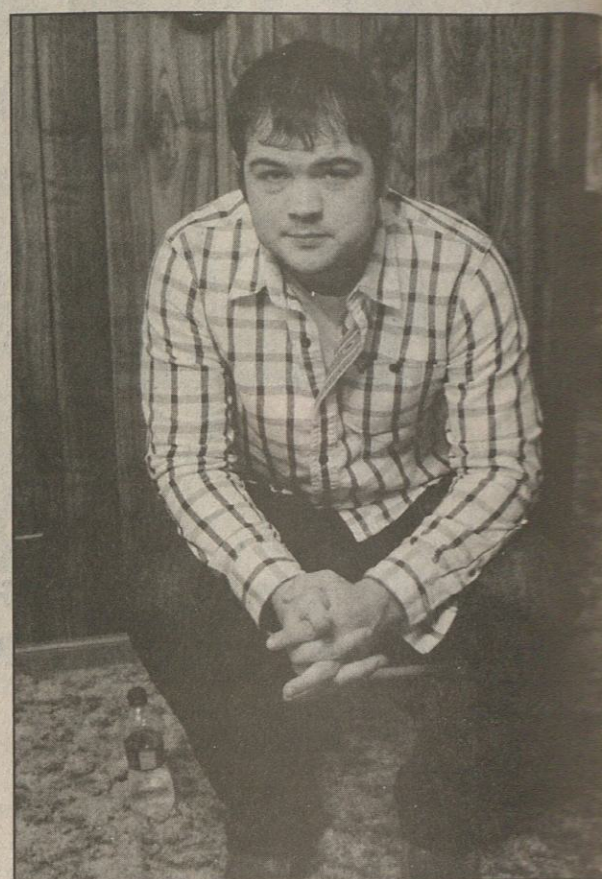

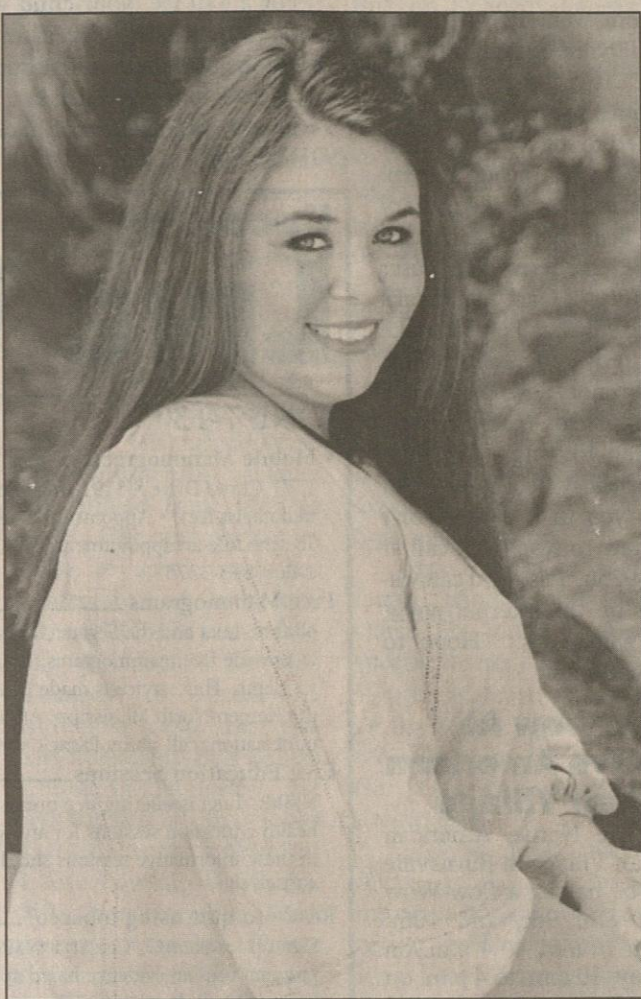

Kennedy Family Gathers to Dedicate Marker to John & Hannah Kennedy

The Kennedy Family gathered on Saturday, May 26th, to dedicate a marker for John and Hannah Kennedy. John's family came from Ireland. He was born in Spartenburg, SC in 1793. Hannah was born in Ireland in 1796. She crossed the Atlantic with her family settling in SC. John and Hannah married in SC in 1816. Their first child was born there. As a young family they traveled SC through Indian country, arriving in Iuka in the 1830's. They settled where Mt. Gilead Baptist Church was established in 1844.

One of their sons, John Gipson Kennedy was in the Civil War. While he was away from home, fighting the war, Federal troops came to the Kennedy's home. Hannah and John Gipson's wife, Martha Youth Kennedy prepared a good meal and provided feed for their horses. After they ate, they left without harming anything or anyone. John Gipson returned safely from the war. The Civil War ended in April of 1865 and John Kennedy died in September 1865. Hannah Kennedy died in 1867. Their son, John Gipson was ordained a minister in 1876 and became pastor of Mt. Gilead Baptist Church from 1882 until the year he died in 1884.

Faith in God and love for each other have always been important in the family. This was very evident in the fifty-four members of the family met.

The dedication began with the song "I Have Returned To The God Of My Childhood". This was followed by a family history given by Faye Kennedy Robinson. Teresa Aldrete White played "Amazing

Grace" on the piano. She was accompanied by her son, Drew White (a member of the band at the University of North Alabama) on the trumpet.

In the family, we have many deacons and ministers. Two of our ancestors pastored this church. The nine ministers present felt it was an honor to speak in the church where so many of our ancestors worshipped.

Our first speaker was Dr. W.E. Johnson of Belmont. His grandfather, Darling Robinson pastored Mt. Gilead from 1907 to 1909. Our next eight ministers to speak were the descendants of both John Gipson Kennedy and Darling Robinson. Dr. Ben Kennedy of Charleston, MS spoke next. Ben pastors Friendship East Baptist Church in Charleston. He was followed by Bro. Bobby Justice, Pastor of Word of Life Fellowship in Omaha, NB. Next was Bro. Mark Justice, Associate Pastor of Word of Life Fellowship in Omaha, NB. Next was Bro. Billy Glover of Iuka. Next was Bro. Joe Fields, a Chaplain for hospice from Gardendale, AL. Next was Bro. James Wroten the founder of Wake Up America Ministries in Booneville, MS. He has a TV and radio program. Next was Bro. Ed Kennedy of Iuka. Ed is Pastor of New Liberty Baptist Church near Burnsville, MS. The last speaker, Seth Kennedy, Youth Pastor at New Salem Baptist Church near Iuka. Seth has three ancestors who pastored Mt. Gilead. John Gipson Kennedy (1882-1884) and Darling Robinson (1907-1909) on his father's side and Jiddy Skinner (pastor during the late 1800's) on his mother's side.

The last song was Marty Phillip's song "What A

Meeting In The Air". The service was dismissed by Bro. Ed Kennedy. A very mournful "Danny Boy" was played by Drew White on the trumpet as people left the church.

The group made their way to the cemetery to place an Irish Flag wreath on the graves of John and Hannah. The wreath was placed by Seth Kennedy (a seventh generation descendant). Bobby Justice made the closing remarks and led the family in reciting The Lord's Prayer. The group departed for the Country Squire Restaurant.

Special thanks to our family photographer, Michael H. Miller. Also, special thanks to Deborah Wright, who was in charge of the music. Deborah is the pianist at Mt. Gilead (she is a seventh generation descendant).

Elsie Kennedy Justice Shaw had the most family members present. All three of her children were there. Elsie's son, Tommy Justice of Corinth, MS; her daughter, Kathryn Glover and her two children, Barbara Tawney and Billy Glover, all of Iuka; her son, Bobby Justice of Omaha, NB; Bobby's son, Mark Justice and his wife, Sandy Justice, their children Brandon, Marissa and Cassidy; Bobby's daughter, Michelle Nieves and her husband, David Nieves, their children, Ciara Paugstat, Savannah Paugstat, and Mia Nieves, also with them was Alex Horak, all of Omaha, NB.

I cannot start the Iuka city petition drive until after August 1st, 2012. Which if I do, this city petition, it will not effect the petition for Tishomingo County. This is two separate petitions. This petition is for Tishomingo County. It is not a city petition. It doesn't matter if you live in the city or county, as long as you are a registered voter of Tishomingo County, you can sign this petition here. People, this petition is so close to having enough signatures to do this. If I can get the rest of these signatures I need by the 1st of September, then I can put this on a general election, which will be on the Presidential election day. If it's on a general election, it won't cost the county anything. If I don't get it on the general election and I do a special election, it will cost the taxpayers of Tishomingo County. According to one of our supervisors, it will cost \$20,000 to do a special election. This is to the people that have had a felony conviction, they think they can no longer vote. In some cases, this is true, but in some cases you can still vote. So if you have been charged with a felony and you were a registered voter and voted before being charged with a felony, and you would like to sign this petition, then be sure to sign it. If your name has been removed from the books, they will deny it. If your name is still on the books, it will be accepted. So, if you have a felony record and you would like to see this go to the polls and be voted on, sign this petition and mail it to me. There are 22 felonies that will keep you from being eligible to vote. I got a list of them from Donna Dill at one time. I can't recall what they all were. If you'd like to know, just call Donna Dill's office and ask if you can sign the petition.

A person called me on June 3rd, 2012 and asked me to come to his house. Nineteen people signed the petition.
