A shooting during a domestic aisturbance near Tishomingo last hursday left one dead, and one harged with murder.

ounty Coroner Mack Wilemon, cevin Douglas Long, Jr., 28, died a result of a gunshot wound to he chest, following an altercation uly 19th at a manufactured home n Hill Road just west of the town of Tishomingo.

Mike Kemp said officers responded to a call around 9 p.m., where they found that Long had apparently been shot by Christi Knight, 47, with a 20-guage shotgun af-According to Tishomingo ter a disagreement involving her daughter, Stephanie Trulock, who was living with Long in a trailer next to Knight.

> Knight was charged with murder, said Kemp.

Chad Reed, who was living with Knight in one of two trailwas also charged at the scene with failure to comply/disorderly con-

Stephanie Trulock was charged with child neglect in connection with her 9-month-old child that was left alone in the other trailer, while the four adults were in the Reed-Knight trailer, apparently drinking, said Kemp. The child was taken from the scene by Department of Human Services personnel.



So Who Won?

Battle of luka Basics for the Battle-History Challenged by Pamela McRae

For those of us who are not Civil War scholars, or those who might not have lived in Iuka all our lives, (and apparently a good many of those who have), all the carryin'-on about the 150th Battle of Iuka might seem a bit overwhelming.

Well, at our house, we've got Shelby Foote's Civil War trilogy and Shiloh on the bookshelf together they take up about 18 nches of the shelf-exhaustng just to look at), and we live n a house built by the son of a Civil War veteran, but this actual Battle of Iuka – well, it's always been a bit of a mystery to me.

So for those of you who might not have spent time actually studying the battle, here are some things you need to know:

When was it?

During the late summer of 1862, Confederate forces atempted a three-pronged strateic advance into the North. The outcome of this offensive—the nly coordinated Confederate ttempt to carry the conflict to he enemy—was disastrous. The esults at Antietam and in Kenucky are well known; the third ffensive, the northern Missisippi campaign, led to the devstating and little-studied defeats t Iuka and Corinth - defeats that vould open the way for Grant's ttack on Vicksburg.

Who fought?

Actual fighting was between he forces of General Sterling Price on the Confederate side, nd those of Union Major General William Rosecrans. The Federal troops were supposed o have been supported by those of Major General E. O. C. Ord,

who was nearby, and ordered by Confederates were entrenched in Union Major General Ulysses ravines where the new Jack's res-S. Grant to join in the fighting taurant is," explains Lomenick. when he heard it, but due to an "acoustic shadow," neither he, in the considerable task of housnor Grant (re-

portedly in Burnsville) ever heard the fighting.

About 6,000 men made up the combined forces, and of those, about every third

man died, making it one of the War up to that time. Confederate General Henry Little was killed in the fighting and temporarily buried in the rose garden at Twin Magnolias.

The troops who fought were mostly not from the Iuka area, but included Confederate divisions from Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana, Alabama, and four Mississippi infantry units.

From the North, troops were from Iowa, Ohio, Missouri, Indiana and Minnesota.

Who won?

Well, technically, the Union carried the day, and they occupied Iuka after the battle, but Price's army was able to escape during the night and join forces with Major General Earl Van Dorn for an assault on Union forces at Corinth a few weeks later.

Where was it?

The simplest explanation has been one offered by Harold Lomenick, who heads up the Iuka Battleground Commission.

"The easiest way to understand is that the Union forces were up on the hill where the current Sunset Motel sits, and the

Labor Day Weekend 2012 The McDonald house, was where the Iuka bloodiest battles of the Civil Middle School gym is currently located, was the headquarters of first Price, and later Rosecrans, according to local references.

Many other homes in the town were used after the battle to house soldiers, and Iuka United Methodist Church was used as a hospital to the many casualties from the Battle.

Iuka's Battleground Heights was an area where many of the Confedate forces were camped.

What's Shady Grove?

Shady Grove is a cemetery where many unidentified soldiers from the Battle were buried in a mass grave. Some are identified, and available through documents from the Tishomingo County Archives and Historical

These documents are required before students

can register and attend any Tishomingo County School. Shots for 7th Graders







FINANCIAL FOCUS Even with Low Rates, You Can Invest for Income

Not long ago, the Federal Reserve (Fed) announced that it plans to keep shortterm interest rates near zero until late 2014. The Fed initially pushed rates to that level in 2008, in an effort to stimulate economic growth. Clearly, low interest rates have a wide-ranging impact - but what effect will they have on you, as an individual investor?

If you need income from your investments, then the continuation of ultralow interest rates may be a matter of some concern, particularly if you own certain types of fixed-income investments, such as certificates of deposit. · Refinance your mortgage. Today's low rates are good news for borrowers. 
