One of the most exciting events planned in conjunction with the commemoration of the 150th anniversary of the Battle of Iuka will be a Grand Ball at Dr. Ben Kitchens' farm at Mill Creek. The "Most Entertaining Dance Band in Civil War Re-enacting," the 52nd Regimental String Band, will provide the music and everyone is invited to, but not required, to dress in period dress.

The Ball is free to the public and will be from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m.

The 52nd Regimental String Band formed in 1990 and is based in Memphis. They have provided Civil War era music and entertainment to audiences from Iowa to Georgia and Virginia to Louisiana. Dressing in reproduction Civil War era clothes, these talented re-enactors use

## Tishomingo Begins Construction on Community Center

Thanks to the generosity of a citizen and a Community Development Grant the Town of Tishomingo has begun construction on a new community center. The building will be located in downtown on what the citizens call "the yard" where the town's cotton once stood. Lifelong resident Jim Burns, who passed away in 2009, left in his estate money to be used specifically toward the purchase and construction of a multipurpose building for the use of the people of Tishomingo. In addition to being born and living most of his life in Tishomingo, Burns was a teacher at Tishomingo High School and served for many years on the Tishomingo Board of Aldermen.

The building will contain both large and small meeting spaces as well as a kitchen. Special spaces will display town history as well. It has been designed to allow for expansion as the town grows and money becomes available. It will



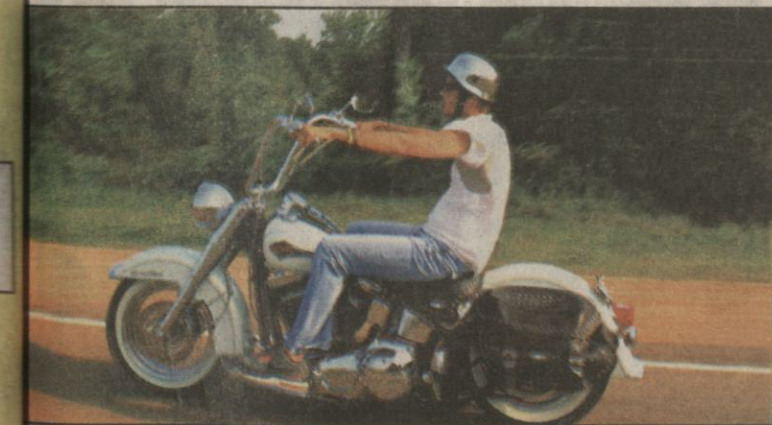
An architectural rendering of the new Tishomingo Community Center. Construction began last week on the public building.

add to and enhance the downtown area by featuring Tishomingo stone, siding reminiscent of the gin building and the Chief Tishomingo logo.

Master Craft Builders of Booneville won the construction bid and have begun foundation work. Kirby McRae is the project engineer and Justin Taylor is the building architect.

Mayor James Tennyson said,

"We have been working on this project for a long time and Jim Burns was part of the early process and dreaming. I think he would be extremely proud to see the work begun."

## Iuka Man Charged on Multiple Drug Counts After Raid

An Iuka man faces multiple charges for selling prescription drugs after a task force raided his home last Wednesday.

According to TCSD Assistant Chief Deputy Jeff Palmer, agents with the sheriff's department, Iuka Police, DEA, MS Bureau of Narcotics and the North MS Narcotics Unit arrested Freddie Dobbs, of 403 CR 172, after

a two-year investigation. Dobbs is charged with five counts of sale/barter/transfer of controlled substances, and possession with intent to distribute Diazepam, Dilaudid, and Fentanyl. The North MS Narcotics Unit seized five firearms, and \$7,000 in cash.

Bond was set at \$20,000. The investigation continues, and additional arrests are expected.

Vaughn was the son of Ranae Vaughn, and Walter Vaughn, of Iuka.

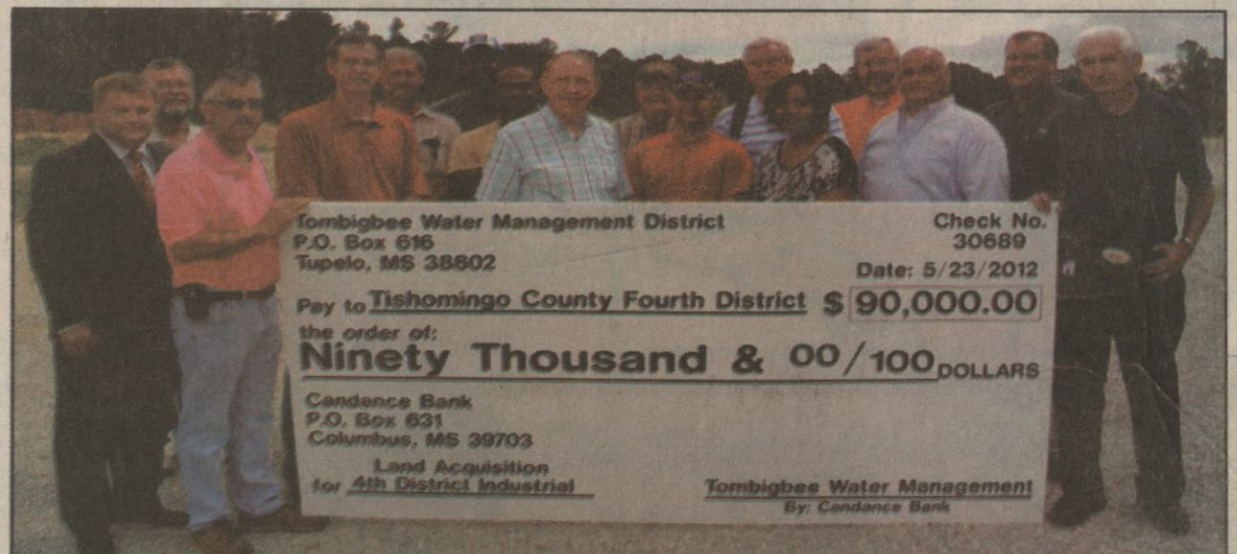

## Fourth District Receives \$90,000 Grant

Last week local officials gathered for a presentation of a \$90,000 grant award to Tishomingo County District 4 for the acquisition of 43 acres of industrial property north of Tishomingo.

The Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District provided the funding for the purchase, which officials hope will attract industry to the Tishomingo area. The site has a high pressure natural gas line and other major utilities on the site, explained 4th District Supervisor Steve Thorne.

"We appreciate the assistance

of Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District in funding this important project," said Thorne.

"The trust funds come from private sources and no tax dollars are involved," said District 1 Representative Lester "Bubba" Carpenter. "We hope that this grant will eventually lead to job creation in District 4 of Tishomingo County."

The Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District and its 12-county membership benefits from an economic develop-

ment trust established to help the Tombigbee Basin. It is not funded by any local tax, but it does benefit and assist the local economy in many ways.

Grants from the Tombigbee River Valley Water Management District are up to a total of \$150,000 per county on a non-recurring basis. The request must come through the local board of supervisors, be approved from the TRVWMD executive committee and the Mississippi Development Authority.

## New Green Space Downtown Taking Shape

Nearly five years ago, on August 12th, Iukans stood and watched as two buildings at the corner of Main and Front Street burned early one Sunday morning. This past Friday, many Iukans stopped to look as sod was laid in "the empty lot," that had become an eyesore in recent years in preparation for its use during the Battle of Iuka Sesquicentennial.

Plans for the space, recently purchased by an area businessperson, include using it as a green space for the increasing number of downtown events, and during festival times like the upcoming Heritage Day/Battle of Iuka events. The owners have permitted the Battlefield Commission permission to improve the lot, and soon, a large mural depicting scenes from the Battle of Iuka, painted by

Corinth artist Tony Bullard, will be hung on the wall.

Under the direction of Harold Lomenick, chairperson of the Battlefield Commission, volunteers have arranged to have the lot leveled and improved with several loads of topsoil courtesy of Mike Nelson Construction. Tim Bivins is repouring the heavily damaged sidewalk on the Main Street side in the next few weeks.

Last Friday, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's department donated the labor of about nine of the state prisoners to lay ten pallets of sod (also donated by a businessperson), and the Iuka Fire Department is keeping the grass watered for the next couple weeks, until the grass is established.

The space will be named "Sesquicentennial Park," said Lomenick, and after the Battle commemoration, and the IDEA (Iuka Development & Economic Association) group plans to use the part of the wall not covered by the mural to show outdoor movies for families.

The development of the new greenspace coincides with several other improvements and renovations taking place downtown, including a roofing project at Iuka Methodist, two buildings being renovated, and land being cleared for future development by Iuka Baptist where First American used to be.

"It's so nice to walk down to lunch, and stop in several places to visit or shop," said one downtown worker recently, of the area.

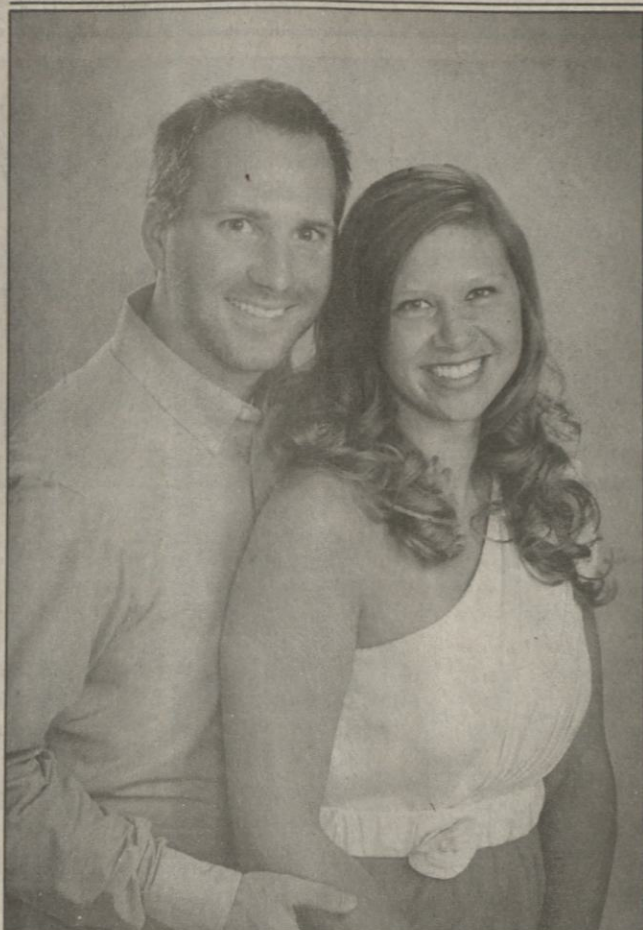

## Dr. Joslin Lobbies Lawmakers to Reauthorize ESEA, Protect Education Funding

Dr. Tina Joslin, principal of Iuka Elementary School, recently joined elementary and middle-level educators and leaders from across the country in the nation's capital during the National Association of Elementary School Principals' National Leaders Conference to advocate for fair policies that strengthen schools.

Dr. Joslin took the critical needs of Mississippi schools directly to lawmakers on Capitol Hill during meetings with Sen. Cochran, Sen. Wicker, and Rep. Nunnelee. Principals stressed that Congress must complete the long-overdue reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act so every state can develop the best

policies to build the capacity of principals.

Principals also called on Congress, in this time of strained budgets, to protect education funding and defend vital programs by taking a balanced approach to implementing the looming across-the-board budget cuts known as sequestration.

## The November Election Is Coming Up Pretty Soon

This is to everyone that has not signed the petition to vote Tishomingo County wet to legalize the sale of alcohol. A lot of you people are still undecided on whether or not to sign the petition or not. Like I have said before, if you sign the petition that does not mean that you are for legalizing the sale of alcohol. This only means that you feel like that the people of Tishomingo County should have the right to vote on it. Some people think that I am doing this to where alcohol will be an easy access for people to get. The people that are going to drink alcohol are going to get it one way or the other. If you people do not believe that it will reduce drunk drivers off of the highways, just ask any state troopers and they will tell you that they have worked wet counties and dry counties. Five different state troopers told me that they wrote more DUI accidents and have written more DUI tickets in dry counties than in wet counties. Many of these state troopers have signed the petition. If Tishomingo County goes wet for alcohol it will not stop everyone from drinking and driving. According to these state troopers and other law officials that I have talked with, they told me that they believe it will reduce the DUI's on the highways by 60 percent if it is legalized all over Tishomingo County. The number one reason is that people have to drive long distances to get their alcohol. People that live around the Iuka area, North Crossroads, and the Burnsville area do not have to drive far to get it. The folks that live on the south end of the county have a pretty good drive. These people that live on the south end of the county have to drive over to the Alabama state line located on Hwy. 72 or drive to Hwy. 247, which is on the other side of Red Bay, AL or drive to Baldwyn, MS to get their alcohol. Either way the people that live on the south end of the county is still going to have to drive 25 miles one way or other. If I do a city election only and it goes wet for the sale of alcohol then we will still have the same problem with people drinking and driving up and down the highways. If the rest of Tishomingo County doesn't go wet, don't get me wrong, we will still have some folks that will still do it. The people that live on the south end of the county are going to have a 25 mile drive one way to get their alcohol if the city of Iuka goes wet only. This is the reason that this is so critical to do the whole county, not just the city of Iuka. There have been several statements made in the paper that all I wanted was an easy access to alcohol. If you can find in any records anywhere that states in the United States of America that I have been charged with an alcohol offense crime since 1998, then I would love for you to publish it in the paper. This petition drive is not for me to get a drink of alcohol. Just about every day of the year I am in a store somewhere or another that sells alcohol. I choose to get me a Pepsi Cola. If alcohol is in the store for sale and you do not drink it, you do not have to buy it. Just because it is in that store there is no law that says you have to buy it. Look at all the tax dollars we are losing. We are also losing jobs off of this. I do not know the exact number of how many signatures that I lack but I have taken some more signatures to the courthouse. I do know that it is under 283 that we lack. I do know that if we do not get this on the November ballot of this year that it is going to cost the tax payers \$20,000 to do a special election. The next general election will be three years after this November election. I have told everyone time and time again that I do not have a deadline on this. I know without a shadow of a doubt with in the next two to three more years that I will be able to get that 240 or 250 more signatures that I need to put this on the ballots with. People, let's go ahead and do this and save this \$20,000 dollars. I have got to have these 240 or 250 more signatures in the circuit clerk's office by the first week of September of 2012. That only leaves four weeks to get this done. If you are one of the people that have not signed the petition, ask yourself do you want to set back and cost the county \$20,000 dollars or do you want to go on and sign the petition and get this behind

us. I hope that no one has misunderstood this or took this in the wrong way. I truly believe that this will help our county and our young generation. If I did not, I would not have spent the money or the time that I did on this. If you people think that this is cheap then you are bad wrong. I pay for these advertisements just like all the businesses do. I will either get this on the polls to be voted on or I will go to my grave trying to. I have been at this for two and a half years for now. Why would I give it up now? If you do not think that alcohol is here then look at this picture with the sheriff and his deputies pouring it out.

### How To Write Your Own Spiritual Resume

It is interesting that we humans are often looking for ways to get recognition within certain circles. It is not uncommon, even among preachers, for some of us to desire that another preacher recommend us to a certain church or group of people. I am not really saying that this is wrong, because Paul often recommended other preachers. I am saying, however, that Paul himself mentioned what method he used to "commend himself" to others. II Corinthians 4:1-2 will give us that method: "Therefore, seeing we have

this ministry, as we have received mercy, we faint not, But have renounced the hidden things of dishonesty, not walking in craftiness, nor handling the word of God deceitfully; but by manifestation of the truth commending ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God."

Paul realized that God had given him a ministry through His mercy. Like the rest of us, Paul deserved judgment, but he received mercy. I praise God that I too have received this mercy from God, so that I have been forgiven for my sins and have been given a ministry. Actually, all Christians

have some kind of ministry that God has given them to do. Paul had renounced the hidden things of dishonesty, meaning that he was not going to be dishonest in his approach to preaching and teaching the Word of God. He was not going to be crafty or deceitful in his ministry, with ulterior motives of lining his own pockets with the money others might give him. His method was a simple manifestation of the truth, which would be his recommendation to the consciences of others. I wonder when some modern preachers will learn that this is still God's plan for preachers.

He wants us to make the message clear and plain, so others will hear, understand and receive Jesus Christ, Savior and Lord!

There is room for illustrations and stories in preaching, but those should not be the main body of what we are trying to convey. Although such things may serve as windows shed light on the truth, they are not the same thing as truth. A house may have windows to let in the light, but the bulk of the house should not be windows, for then should the bulk of our messages be stories and illustrations!

I will never be as smart as my new Smart Phone. My computer consistently loses the password for Facebook and E-mail. I just make-do until a teenager visits. I get too frustrated trying to set a new password to bother. I just adjust to these new conditions, using the electronic equipment as best I can and certainly not to their full capabilities. But I'm trying to adjust to these new devices which is required if one is to communicate these days. Yes, at 70, using this technical equipment does not come easy.

Yesterday I had the most horrendous tests to determine why my legs and feet hurt almost constantly. How long have I had this problem? The first time I saw a doctor for this problem was back in 2007. How many doctors have I seen; a good half dozen have determined different causes. Am I cured? No, not yet.

I drove last week to Chicago suburbs to see my granddaughter because I am afraid that I might become unable to do so. A friend, my age, with family nearby to my relatives rode with me the 550 plus miles. We did great for two elderly ladies out on an adventure. We, complete with bathroom stops and eats, made the trip there in less than 12 hours. We had our 3 day visit then returned in about the same time frame. Were we ever so glad to get home? The visit with family was awesome but getting home was almost as great. We both are aware that we will not be making trips like these as often as in the past.

I unpacked, rested for a day, then headed to Tupelo for an 8:00 a.m. appointment where electrical shocks were applied to my back, legs and feet. Enduring this was not as hurtful as I had expected. At 10:00 a.m. I was at the hospital for a "Lumbar Spine Interpretation" which required the pumping of dye through the skeletal part of my back to determine cause of pain. The tests were completed by noon. Going home seemed like returning to Heaven after a journey into the unknown. Now I wait for the results before further treatment.

These are the encumbrances of age I never anticipated. I believe I expected to go along happily, and healthily until one day I would just topple over in death. I understand that there are very few aged people who do not encounter health problems during the final years of life. In spite of this, there are joys untold in the little things around us.

My musings are not profound. I am still continually amazed as I travel life's road. Even when there are trials, life is still worthwhile.
