There is a limit of 6 poultry exhibits and 5 rabbits per person. Animals must stay in place Monday through Saturday and picked up no later than 12:00 noon on Saturday, October 13th. Bedding will be provided, but the owner must provide feed/hay. It is also the responsibility of the owner to clean pens and feed/water for your animals throughout

the week. Please note that all poultry exhibits will be blood tested by the Mississippi Board of Animal Health for diseases. All miniature equine exhibits must have a current and valid coggins before entering the gate.
