Iuka Loses Civic Pioneer

Judy Walker, the lady that brought many civic-minded projects to the City of Iuka during the 1980's and 90's died Sunday evening, September 9th, 2012 at the Tishomingo Manor Nursing Home where she had made her home since suffering a stroke in 2004.

Until bad health slowed her down, Judy was known throughout the area for her untiring work, and her persistence in getting things done, whether it be starting the first Red Hat Society in Iuka; starting the Food Pantry or as co-founder of the annual Heritage Day celebration in Mineral Springs Park.

She and her husband Jim moved from Indiana to Iuka, her hometown, in 1978. Her retirement did not last long, she continued her career as a hair dresser working with Debbie Hensson at the Style Shop in Burnsville and soon became a real estate agent working for Grace Long. She became very active in the life of the town, working with the people of Iuka and helping in promoting Iuka and the surrounding area. Jim and Judy spent their summers operating the concession stand at the Spring Park, selling snow cones and Jim's homemade pork chops in the old log cabin.

Lady Braves Defending Division Title

The Tishomingo County Lady Braves slow-pitch softball team begins the home stretch of their schedule this week, opening Division 1-4A play at Corinth Thursday afternoon. The Lady Braves improved to 9-6 overall after their latest victory of the season against Booneville last Thursday.

Three returning seniors lead this team that is the defending division champion and MHSAA Class 4A North Half runner up. Anna Claire Griffin leads the

team with five home runs at the plate while Chelsi McGee guides the defense from the pitcher's mound.

Four scheduled home games remain in the last three weeks of the season against Amory (Sept. 18), Corinth (Sept. 25), Saltillo (Oct. 1) and IAHS (Oct. 2).

All home games begin with varsity at 5:30 p.m. with a junior varsity game following that in the newly renovated Lady Braves softball field.

Comfort Revolution to Locate Operations in Belmont

Officials from Comfort Revolution, developer of high-end sleep products, have announced the company is locating manufacturing operations in Belmont, Mississippi, in Tishomingo County. The company will locate in the 432,650-square-foot building formerly occupied by Schnadig Furniture Corporation.

The project will create 200 jobs. Sealy will locate distribution operations in the same facility as Comfort Revolution.

"We looked at sites throughout the southeast for the new plant but were most impressed with Belmont," said Comfort Revolution Founder and CEO Michael Fux. "The outstanding quality of the workforce in Tishomingo County and the community's support made us conclude this is the best spot for our investment. We've wanted for a long time to produce products in the United States, and we're eager to get started."

"This is a great day for Belmont and Tishomingo County, and I am grateful for the 200 jobs being created as a result of this project," Governor Phil Bryant said. "The decision to locate this manufacturing operation in Mississippi is further testament to the fact that our state is a great place to do business, and I look forward to watching Comfort Revolution grow in Tishomingo County in the coming years."

The Mississippi Development Authority (MDA) provided assistance in support of the project through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. Tishomingo County provided assistance for the project, as well.

"Comfort Revolution's decision to locate in Belmont is great news not only for the local community, but for the entire state of Mississippi. I thank the company for its investment in our state and especially for creating new job opportunities for our workforce," said MDA Executive Director Brent Christensen. "I am grateful to our partners in Tishomingo County for working so hard to bring Comfort Revolution to Mississippi."

She was also instrumental in starting the Christmas in the Park celebration; the Christmas Party for the Senior Citizens at Tishomingo State Park; and the Birthday Party for Jesus at the Youth Center. Judy was very active in

the local V.F.W. auxiliary; started the first Bunco Club in Iuka in 1988; organized a Civitan Club; formed Make a Difference Day; and was Citizen of the Year in 1991. In 1992, she was presented a plaque of appreciation for her dedication and leadership as founding Chairman of the Iuka Heritage Day Festival.

Judy was a devoted mother and grandmother. She was quick to tell you about her children and grandchildren and believed her grandchildren were all geniuses and destined to be great. Despite all her charitable work her family came

first. She was a Christian and a very active member of her church.

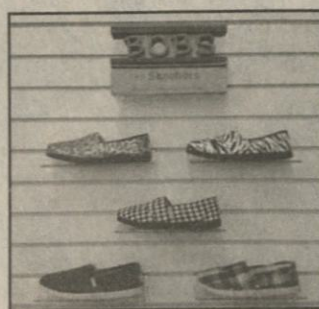

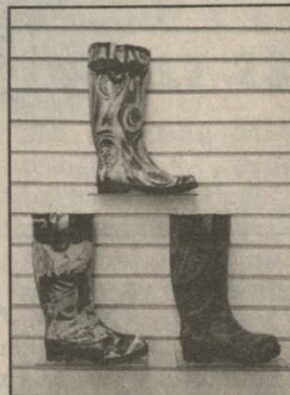

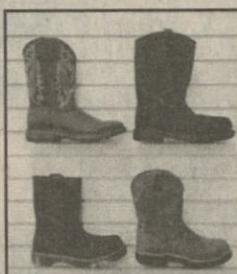

Youth ages 5-18 as of January 1st of the current year and adults may enter livestock exhibits. All livestock exhibits MUST be pre-registered no later than September 25, 2012 in order to be exhibited to ensure that we prepare sufficient space for everyone. You can pre-register your livestock, poultry, and rabbit exhibits by calling the Extension Office at 662-423-7016. All livestock, poultry, and rabbit exhibits must be brought to the fairgrounds on Monday, October 8th from 11:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. All animals must be checked in and in place no later than 9:00p.m. on Monday, October 8th. There is a limit of 6 poultry exhibits and 5 rabbits per person. All livestock exhibits will be judged on Tuesday, October 9th and ribbons will be placed on pens for viewing during the opening night of the fair. Animals must stay in place Monday through Saturday and picked up no later than 12:00 noon on Saturday, October 13th. Bedding will be provided, but the owner must provide feed/hay. It is also the responsibility of the owner to clean pens and feed/water for your animals throughout

the week. Please note that all poultry exhibits will be blood tested by the Mississippi Board of Animal Health for diseases. All miniature equine exhibits must have a current and valid coggins before entering the gate.

We are also excited to offer a livestock show again this year. The Tishomingo County Youth Livestock Show will be held at 1:00 pm on Tuesday, October 9th. The show is open to beef cattle and dairy goats. We will also be offering

a Tishomingo County Open Dairy Goat Show. This show is open to both youth and adults of all ages. Roth IRA: For Your Retirement & Beyond

If you're somewhat familiar with investing, you may know that the Roth IRA is a great retirement-savings vehicle. But are you aware that some of its benefits can also pay off for the next generation of your family?

To understand why this is so, it's necessary to be familiar with a Roth IRA's features. For starters, when you contribute to a Roth IRA, your earnings have the potential to grow tax free, provided you don't start taking withdrawals until you're 59½ and you've had your account at least five years. The amounts you contributed aren't taxed when withdrawn because you've already paid taxes on the money you put in. And the potential for tax-free earnings can continue even when your beneficiaries inherit your Roth IRA, though you'll need to consult with your tax advisor on this issue.

A Roth IRA also offers other features that can help you build resources for retirement while possibly helping your surviving family members. For one thing, you can contribute to your Roth IRA for as long as you have some earned income, up to the contribution limits, and as long as you meet certain income limitations. Even if you've officially "retired," you might do some consulting or part-time work. So you could put some of your earnings into your Roth IRA. This ability to keep funding your Roth IRA virtually indefinitely can give you more flexibility in managing your retirement income - and, depending on how you do manage that income and what your other objectives may be, you may also end up with more money that could be left to your beneficiaries.

Also, unlike a traditional IRA or a 401(k), a Roth IRA does not require you to start taking minimum distributions at age 70½. In fact, you are never required to withdraw money from your Roth IRA. And by leaving your account intact for as long as possible, you'll potentially have more money available for a variety of options - one

of which may involve leaving sums to your beneficiaries. Your non-spouse beneficiaries must take annual required minimum distributions, but they have the option to take the distributions over their lifetime.

Keep in mind, though, that your Roth IRA is part of your estate for purposes of federal estate taxes. In 2012, your estate would be subject to these taxes if it were worth more than \$5.12 million (or less, if you made certain gifts). In 2013, however, this amount is scheduled to drop to \$1 million unless Congress acts on this issue. (Some states also have estate taxes that apply at amounts less than the federal amount.) In any case, if you have a sizable estate, you should consult with your tax and legal advisors.

When you invest in a Roth IRA, your goal, first and foremost, is to help fund your retirement. In fact, basically all your decisions regarding your Roth IRA - how much to contribute, where to invest the money and when to begin taking withdrawals - should be based on your own retirement goals. However, as a side benefit to investing in a Roth IRA, you may find that you could help out the next generation, or two, of your family.

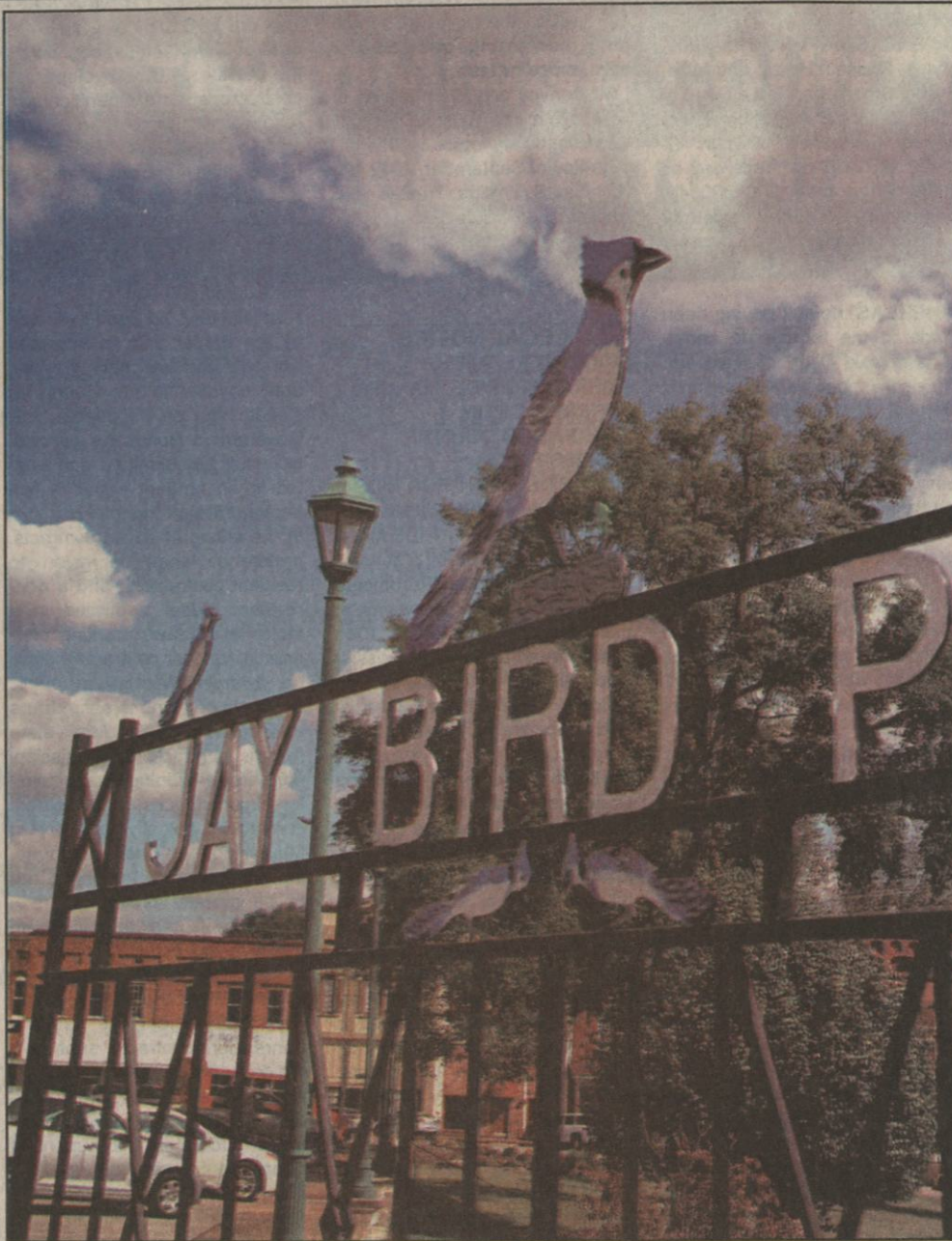

Anyone that wants alcohol to drink can go somewhere and buy it. A whole lot of people saw these two thirty packs sitting in the back end of my pick-up truck. I was all over Tishomingo County with it. They asked me what I was doing with all that alcohol. They said, "I thought you said you didn't drink." I told them that I did not drink anymore and hadn't in five years or longer. I asked them if I looked like I had been drinking and they told me "no". They asked me what I was doing with the beer in the back to prove to the people of Tishomingo County that anybody that wants a drink of alcohol can buy it if they are at the legal age of buying it. This is just to prove a point to the people of Tishomingo County. Just because alcohol is not sold in Tishomingo County it does not stop people from bringing it into Tishomingo County. Since the people are going to buy it in other states and other counties and bring it back into Tishomingo County and drink it why don't we, the people of Tishomingo County, vote Tishomingo County wet for the sale of alcohol so we could at least get the tax money. You are not going to stop people from buying it in other counties or other states and bringing it back to Tishomingo County. I have just proven how easy it is to buy it somewhere else and bring it right back into Tishomingo County. Just on the two thirty packs that I bought Tishomingo County lost \$2.66 in tax money. For every one-hundred people that spend \$38 on alcohol in other counties and states Tishomingo County loses \$26 thousand and 600 dollars in tax money. That is just on 100 people. To my understanding there is between 20 and 25 thousand people that live in Tishomingo County. For instance if 1,000 of these people spend \$38 dollars a month on alcohol that would be \$26 thousand and 600 dollars in tax money in one month. In one year that would calculate up to \$319 thousand and 200 dollars a year. If these 1,000 people spend 76 dollars a piece a month instead of 38 dollars a month, then the taxes would be \$638 thousand and 400 dollars a year in tax money that Tishomingo County is losing. If a thousand people spent \$114 dollars a month on alcohol then Tishomingo County would take in 957 thousand and 800 dollars a year in tax money. I can't read or write too well, I am not too good in math either. If anyone wants to check these figures and I have got them wrong feel free to correct me on this. If I made a mistake I would like to know if I did. This ought to give you people of Tishomingo County a good idea on just how much tax dollars we are all losing to Tennessee, Alabama, Corinth, MS and Baldwin, MS. I can't help but believe that Tishomingo County could use these tax dollars to help benefit this county. It is the older generation's place to try to make Tishomingo County a better place for our kids and grandchildren to grow up in. Back in my day, we grew up pickin cotton, pulling corn, and just barely getting by. In the last 40 years Tishomingo County has went downhill. Twenty years ago there were all kinds of jobs in Tishomingo County. How many jobs do we have in Tishomingo County now? If something isn't done all of our youth are going to have to move away from Tishomingo County to find work. It is too late to get this on the November ballot so I am going to have to call for a special election. I only need 219 more signatures. I have some more to turn in to the courthouse. I do not have a deadline on this petition. If it takes me another year or another ten years and I live I am going to see this be put on the ballot to be voted on. I truly believe that it will win, 70% for it, and 30% against it. One day we are going to get to see which way it goes. If you would like to see this happen fill this petition out that is on the bottom of this page.

I believe that this will win by 70% for it and 30% against it. What do you think? I received 16 more signatures on September 7th, 2012, from the Tishomingo County Newspaper.

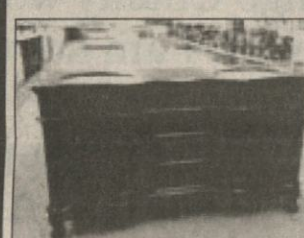
